## Spring Leaf Counting Activity

This counting activity is great for children to collect and handle the leaves whilst developing their fine motor skills and hand eye co-ordination. It also develops counting skills and number recognition. It can be adapted to the season by using different types of leaves and adding flowers during spring/summer. Add the pegs to the leaves to match the numbers written on them.

### What you'll need

- Leaves/Flowers collected outside
- Wooden pegs
- 754730 Sharpie Permanent Fine Marker Pen
- 230741 Round Polywicker Baskets



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## Scavenger Hunt

A great collecting and counting activity to help develop fine motor skills and encourage the children to hunt for flowers, twigs and leaves whilst exploring different sizes and textures. You can also use a selection of natural products which we have used. Children will love collecting all the objects and sorting into the wooden bowls/baskets. Then they will need to count the objects by each number.

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## Making Shapes

This outdoor activity helps your little ones put into practice the creation and classifying 2D shapes from using outdoor natural objects. To take this further they can make patterned blocks by joining several shapes together.

- 230739 Oval Polywicker Basket



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

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## Rock Sums
