Me and my Community

This project teaches children how they are unique and special, the importance of friendship and how people in their family, school and local community are important and can help them.

Exploring Autumn:

This project teaches Reception class children about the natural changes that happen during the season of autumn.

Literacy:

Listening actively to rhymes, songs and stories.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development {PSED}:

Children to learn about the importance of friendship and being helpful.

Children follow instructions involving several ideas or actions. They answer 'how' and 'why' questions about their experiences and in response to stories or events.

Things children could do with parents:

Parents can help children to be helpful, kind and thoughtful

Stomp through crunchy leaves

Make a footprint trail through dewy grass

Collect conkers.

Physical Development {PD}:

Children will participate in rhymes and songs. They will partake in physical activities both indoor and outdoor.
Children to show good control and co-ordination in large and small movements.

Understanding the World {UTW}:

Children play cooperatively, taking turns with others. They take account of each others ideas and about how to organize their activity. They show sensitivity towards others' needs and feelings and form positive relationships with adults and other children.

Communication and Language {C&L}:

Offer explanations for why things might happen, making use of recently introduced vocabulary from stories, non-fiction text, rhymes and poems when appropriate.

Expressive Arts and Design {EAD}:

Provide a variety of mark making tools for the children to explore making patterns with as well as using various textures and mediums.

Encourage the children to look very closely at the special features of plants, their colour, tone and texture.

Some plants and trees change with the seasons. For example, new leaves grow in Spring and some leaves change colour in Autumn and fall from the trees.

Mathematics:

Children count reliably with numbers from one to ten, place them in order and say which number is one more or one less than a given number.
