History

In this topic, the children will explore the ancient Maya civilsation, from their impressive architecture to the Maya writing system and examples of the Maya 'glyphs'. Children will delve into their history to find out what happened during the invasion by the Spanish conquistadores!

In addition, the children will find out about Charles Darwin and why his work is so important to us today when understanding evolution and inheritance.

Geography

This half-term, the children will:

- Use world maps and satellite images to locate Mexico, identifying which hemisphere it is in and the countries that surround it.
- Locate some of the main cities of the ancient Maya civilisation on a map of South America.
- Explore the Galápagos virtually! Use photos, videos, websites, maps and digital mapping tools to identify the unique climatic conditions and geological make up of the Islands.
- Use digital conservation maps, websites and books to identify and list animal species that are at risk of extinction.
- Summarise, in their own words, why they think the Galápagos Islands developed such rich biodiversity.

PE

Children will be developing their athletics and rounders skills this half-term in preparation for Sports Day!

PSHE

This half-term, the children will be starting an exciting entrepreneurial challenge to make something, sell it and make a profit with a limited budget. A portion of the proceeds will then be donated to the well-known charity Barnardo's. Let's see who can rise to the challenge! Welcome to Mexico! Explore this unique country with its towering temples and stunning geography. Rich in history belonging to the Maya civilisation, get ready to be amazed and have your taste buds tantalised!

In this topic, the children will:

- Read a range of recipes for traditional and contemporary Mexican fruit drinks and choose one to make.
- Find out about the Maya chocolate making process and then make their own chocolate experimenting with different flavours.
- Taste foods enjoyed and in some cases introduced to the world by the ancient Maya civilisation, including avocado, guacamole, tortilla, sweet potato, squash, papaya, a Horchata drink (a blend of milk, sugar, ground almonds and vanilla) and salsa.
- Work outdoors to sketch plants, flowers and trees, looking carefully to accurately capture their shape, form, pattern and colour.
- Use fine ink pens to make detailed drawings in their sketch books of different types of shells.

Science

This half-term, children will be focussing on the topic evolution and inheritance, whilst revising over the topics covered in Year 6. These include classification and adaptation, light, blood and heart, and electricity. In addition, they will also be extending their investigation skills whilst carrying out various experiments.





Maths

This half-term, year 6 will be focussing on:

- The mean average
- Pie Charts
- Line graphs
- Negative numbers
- Conversions of miles to kilometres

Literacy

Children will be reading the novel Journey to the River Sea by Eva Ibbotson and composing various pieces of writing. Year 6 children will also create a holiday brochure for Mexico.
