History

This half term in topic children will be learning about African kingdoms and Empires. They will draw comparison and contrast between the kingdoms of Africa and life in Britain during the same time periods. The children will also be focusing on the varied causes of the growth of the slave trade, the hierarchy of involvement and the devastating human consequences. The children will learn the causes and consequences of Maafa, Britain's role in Maafa and impact of triangular slave trade on African people.

Geography

This half-term, the children will: locate African kingdom and Empires on the map.

- · evaluate the human impact of war, oppression, conflict and rebellion on the everyday life of a past or ancient society.
- · Identify different types of bias in historical sources and explain the impact of that bias.
- · To identify the human impact of the triangular slave trade

PSHE

This half-term, the children will explore different case studies to prompt discussions and develop their debating skills. The topics include the case of Nelson Mandela, Ghandi, caring for the elderly and child slavery.

Welcome to Africal Children will learn about the past and present. They will explore Britain's role in the trans-atlantic slave trade, the causes and consequences of the European colonisation of Africa and the worldwide communities that make up the African diaspora.

Science


