EYFS Fee Schedule Jan - May 2025



Our EYFS Fee Schedule reflects our fee profile for students aged between 3 and 5 years. Students younger than 3 years are not eligible for entry to Barnet Hill Academy. Students between the ages of 3 and 5 years are eligible for state funding. This outline captures the fee profile for students in our Nursery and Reception classes.

Funding:

All 3-4-year-olds in England are eligible to receive 15 hours per week of free childcare with an approved childcare provider. This entitlement expires when children reach compulsory school age, which is the term after their 5th birthday; consequently, depending on their date of birth, students will receive funding for part of their year in the Reception class. Some children may be eligible to receive 30 hours of free childcare per week depending on their circumstances. Please check <u>www.gov.uk</u> for further details.

The annual fee for Year Reception is charged upfront. Fees are then reviewed in the Autumn and Spring Terms once funding is confirmed via local council, and adjustments are duly made to take into account government funding based on the student's date of birth.
