IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY

- The Demon Deacons have the third-best record vs. non-ACC teams over the past six years with a record of 18-7 (.720) with only Duke and Clemson having a better record in that time:

SUSTAINED SUCCESS

- Under the leadership of head coach **Dave Clawson**, Wake Forest has not only had historic success as a program.
- Since the start of the 2016 season, the Deacs have the fifth-most wins in the ACC not counting the COVID-shortened 2020 season:
 - Clemson -- 90
 - NC State-- 58
 - Miami-- 57
 - T4. Pitt -- 56
 - T4. Wake Forest -- 55**
- Wake Forest's run of 37 wins from 2018-22 ranks as the second-most in a single five-year period in program history:
 - 38 Wins (2017-21)
 - 37 Wins (2018-22)
- The current five-year period of 2020-24 has 29 wins.

WINNING THE THIRD PHASE

- During the **Dave Clawson** era, Wake Forest has been the best team in the nation at converting field goals, connecting on 184-of-224 field goal attempts in the last 11 years (82.1 pct.) with the next closest being Stanford at 81.9 percent. That margin has been even highest

over the last seven seasons since the start of the 2018 season:

- This season, **Matthew Dennis** is 9-of-10 FG and was a perfect 18-of-18 in extra points. Over the course of his career, Dennis is 35-of-44 FG. His 79.5 career percentage ranks second in program history.
- Ivan Mora** is having his best punting season of his career, averaging 45.9 yards per punt including seven punts of 50+ yards. His 42.2 career averaged ranks fifth in program history.
- With the help of punter Mora, the Deacs were elite in punt coverage in 2023, ranking 20th nationally with 4.44 yards allowed on opponent attempts. His 21 punts inside of the 20 also ranked 19th nationally in 2023.

JD LIVING IN BACKFIELDS

- Jasheen Davis** has now recorded at least 0.5 tackles-for-loss in the 24 of his last 25 games.
- Over his last 21 games dating back to last season, Davis has collected 32.0 tackles for loss and 14.0 sacks.
- With 0.5 sacks against Clemson, Davis has now tallied 21.5 sacks in his career and that ranks fourth in program history and is 2.0 sacks away from the Clawson era record:

NOTING THE HUSKIES

- UConn is coming off a 29-20 win over the Temple Owls.
 - The Huskies returned a fumble 96 yards for a touchdown as time expired to hold on to beat the Owls.
 - The UConn defense forced three turnovers against Temple, including two fumbles and an interception.
 - Senior quarterback Joe Fagnano threw for 272 yards and a touchdown.
- The Huskies have rushed for 1,376 yards and 12 touchdowns through the first six game of the season.
 - Redshirt freshman Durrell Robinson has led the team in rushing with 421 yards and two touchdowns.
 - Redshirt sophomore Cam Edwards has added 320 yards and three touchdowns to add to the balanced run game.
- Maine transfer Joe Fagnano has thrown for 999 yards and 11 touchdowns to lead the Huskies, while leading the nation in yards per completion (17.5).
- Redshirt junior Skyler Bell has been the main target for the Huskies, tallying 508 yards and four touchdowns on the year.
- The Huskies defense has been dominant on third down, holding opponents to a 25% conversion rate.
 - Seniors Jayden McDonald and Tui Faumuina-Brown, who have 50 and 49 tackles respectively, as well as 4.5 tackles for loss each.

SERIES INFO

- Saturday's matchup between Wake Forest and Clemson will be the fourth matchup in series history, with the last matchup coming in 2007.
- Wake Forest has won the previous two meetings against the Huskies.
- In the most recent matchup in 2007, the Deacs defeated the Huskies in the 2007 Meineke Car Care Bowl in Charlotte 24-10.
 - After being down 10-0 going into half, the Demon Deacons scored 24 unanswered points to the cap off the 2007 with a bowl victory.
 - Wide receiver Kenneth Moore was named player of the game, leading Wake Forest with 11 receptions for 112 yards while also setting a new single-season reception record with 98 catches on the year.
- The only road matchup in the series for Wake Forest came in 2006, where the Demon Deacons defeated the Huskies in East Hartford 24-13.
 - Defensive end Jeremy Thompson returned an 86-yard interception for a touchdown to move the Deacs to 3-0.
 - Jon Abbate and Patrick Ghee led the team with ten tackles as the Demon Deacon defense combined for nine tackles for loss.
 - Wake Forest would go on to win the ACC Championship and make an Orange Bowl appearance in the 2006 season.

NOTING THE DEACS

KICKING IT OFF

- With their win against Boston College in week eight 2022, the Demon Deacons extended the conference's second-longest bowl streak to seven-consecutive seasons. This was also the 11th longest streak in the country.
- On Oct. 23, 2022 when Associated Press Top 25 Poll came out, the Deacons were ranked inside the top 15 for the eighth time in the past calendar year. Prior to that run, Wake Forest had only been ranked that high just three times since 1950. The Deacs latest top 15-ranking came after their third-straight win over Florida State. That victory was our first in Tallahassee since 2008 and was Wake Forest's sixth win over a ranked opponent in the last seven years.
- Additionally the Demon Deacons were ranked in 22-consecutive polls from Sept. 24, 2021 and ending on Nov. 6, 2022. It was tied for the sixth-longest streak in the country and more than doubling the previous program record of eight-consecutive weeks.
- Since the start of the 2016 season, the Deacs have the second-most wins in the ACC not counting the COVID-shortened 2020 season. Additionally over 2018-22, the Deacs have recorded the second-most wins in a single five-year period in program history, 37. The current five-year period of 2019-23 ranks fifth in program history with 35 wins.
- Under Dave Clawson, Wake Forest set a new standard of success that includes qualifying for its program record seven-straight bowl games from 2016-23. He also owns the school record with five bowl victories.
- Additionally, his five bowl wins are tied for the fifth-most Bowl/CFP victories in ACC history and with one more he would move into the top three in league history.
- The five Bowl/CFP Victories are also the second most among active ACC coaches.

PACE AND SPACE OFFENSE

- From 2017-22, Wake Forest has produced the five highest scoring seasons in school history with each club scoring better. With Nick Sciba's third quarter field goal against Clemson in 2021, the Deacs broke its all-time scoring record for a single season with 474 combined points in 11 games, besting the previous record of 459 points set in 2017, finishing the season with 574 points. They also set the school record with 41.0 points per game in 2021.
- Wake Forest became just the 20th ACC team in the college football modern era (Post-WWII) to cross over the milestone of 500 points scored in a single season. The Deacs finished seventh in ACC scoring history.

- Since the start of the 2017 season, Wake Forest's 208 touchdown passes are the second-most of any school in the ACC and that total is 14th nationally during that span. Additionally during that span, the Deacs 382 total touchdowns are the fourth-most in the ACC and 25th nationally.
- North Carolina (205) and Clemson (199) trail the Deacs in passing touchdowns during that span. Only SMU, who joined the ACC in 2024, leads Wake Forest, totaling 239 passing touchdowns in that span.
- The Tigers enter the week with 484 total touchdowns, SMU ranks second with 454 and the Tar Heels rank third with 398.
- Wake Forest's 105 touchdown passes from 2021-24 ranks 10th nationally in that time period and is second in the ACC, trailing just SMU (117).

TURNING OVER THE OPPOSITION

- In the 2019 season, the Demon Deacons finished the year with 14 interceptions by 10 different players. In nine games in 2020, Wake Forest nearly matched that mark as nine different players have accounted for the Deacs' 13 total interceptions. At the end of the 2020 FBS season, Wake Forest is the one of just six teams in the country to have three or more interceptions returned for touchdowns.
- The Deacs got off to a fast start in 2021, forcing six turnovers in their week three victory over Florida State (three fumbles and three interceptions), the most in the Dave Clawson era. ■ With the help of punter Ivan Mora, the Demon Deacons were elite last season in punt coverage, ranking 24th nationally with 4.34 yards allowed on opponent attempts this season. His 21 punts inside of the 20 ranked 14th nationally.

■ Mora is having his best punting season of his career, averaging 45.9 yards per punt which ranks eighth in the country including 10 punts of 50+ yards. His 42.2 career average ranks fifth in program history.

CLIMBING THE CHARTS

■ In the season opener against NC A&T, Taylor Morin had a career night, posting a career-best 217 all-purpose yards including his first career punt return touchdown.

■ Morin was the first Power-4 player to have a punt return touchdown in 2024. Additionally, it marked Wake Forest's first since Sept. 8, 2018 vs. Towson when Greg Dortch had a 60-yard scoring return.

■ His 217 all-purpose yards were the sixth most in FBS for week one and marked the first Demon Deacon to finish with 200 or more APY since Matt Colburn against Louisville on Oct. 27, 2018.

■ Morin followed that up with another strong performance, pulling in seven catches for 91 yards against Virginia. He has now had six or more receptions in the last three games, dating back to last season and his 176 career receptions ranks 11th among active FBS players heading into week three.

■ After pulling in a career-best nine touchdowns during the 2022 season, which ranked 19th nationally and fourth in the ACC, Morin entered the 2023 season already ranked in the top 10 in school history in receiving touchdowns. He added to his total with a pair of touchdown receptions in the win over Old Dominion:

When Dave Clawson was named Wake Forest University's 32nd head football coach on Dec. 10, 2013, he set out to build the top program in North Carolina and compete for championships.

After reaching a program record seven-straight bowl game in 2022 and capturing the 2021 ACC Atlantic title and winning the Deacs' eighth Big 4 Championship in 2019, Clawson is realizing the vision of what he set out to create.

Clawson has also engineered an offense that has rewritten the record books at Wake Forest. The Deacons have set nearly 400 school records including marks for points scored, points per game, total offensive yards, first downs and passing yards over the past four seasons.

Clawson owns the school record for bowl victories, has climbed to the third-most wins in school history, and has led Wake Forest to a six-year period (2017-22) of success that had been unmatched in school history, winning 46 games over that period.

Meanwhile, the long-awaited Sutton Sports Performance Center opened in fall 2019 and gave Wake football a state-of-the-art facility that features a world-class strength and conditioning complex to go with 16,000 square feet of space for coaches' offices, recruiting space and team meeting areas as well as a specialized nutrition center. Additionally, the new McCreary Football Complex opening this fall.

Clawson joined the Demon Deacons after five seasons as the head coach at Bowling Green State University where he led the Falcons to the 2013 Mid-American Conference championship with a 47-27 win over No. 16 Northern Illinois.

In his 24 years as a head coach, Clawson has delivered a conference championship at each of his first three stops. Prior to the 2013 MAC title, Clawson helped Richmond to a pair of Colonial Athletic Association titles in 2005 and 2007. His first championship as a head coach came in 2002 when he led Fordham to the Patriot League title.

He has also earned numerous Coach of the Year awards. He was the Patriot League Coach of the Year in 2001 and 2002 and was awarded the 2005 Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year award in just his second year in the league. The 2007 CAA Coach of the Year award marked his fourth conference Coach of the Year honor in his first nine years as a head coach.

In 2002, Clawson was the Schutt Sports/American Football Monthly I-AA Coach of the Year and a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award. In 2005, Clawson earned National Coach of the Year from I-AA.org and was again a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award.

A 1989 graduate of Williams College in Massachusetts, Clawson earned a degree in political economy and played defensive back.

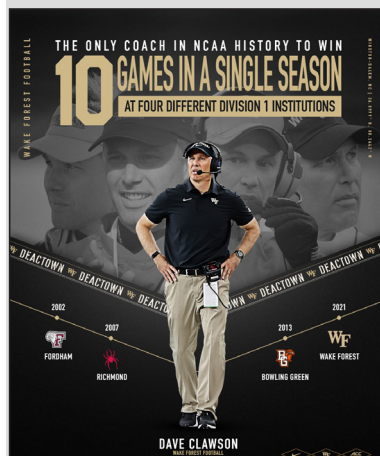

The Deacs are the only football program in the ACC to average at least 30 points per game each year since 2017.

Since the start of the 2017 season, WFU's 185 touchdown passes are the most of any school in the ACC and that total ranks tied for seventh nationally.

Five of the 10 assistant coaches on the current Wake Forest football coaching staff have been in Winston-Salem since head coach Dave Clawson arrived ahead of the 2014 season.

Defensive Coordinator Brad Lambert, Safeties Coach James Adams and linebackers coach Glenn Spencer all enter their second season on staff. Adams has previously served under Lambert during three different stops at Wake Forest, Charlotte and Purdue while Spencer was on Lambert's staff in 2018 as the defensive coordinator. Additionally, Chip West coached with Dave Clawson when he was at Fordham and with Brad Lambert when he was at Charlotte.

Before coming to Wake Forest at the start of Dave Clawson's tenure in 2014, Coach Hunter spent the previous five seasons working on Clawson's staff at Bowling Green. He served both as a recruiting coordinator and running backs coach during their tenure, helping guide the Falcons to a 2013 Mid-American Conference title.

PRO DEACS

STRNAD RECORDS FIRST CAREER SACK IN WIN

- Linebacker Justin Strnad made his presence felt early in the Broncos' 10-9 road win over the New York Jets on Sunday. Making the start at inside linebacker, Strnad came off the edge to bring Aaron Rodgers to the turf on the very first play of the game, earning his first career sack in the NFL.
- Sunday also marked the first time that Strnad had taken a snap from scrimmage since Oct. 31, 2021 against Washington. Strnad finished the game with four tackles, including three solo tackles and two tackles for loss.
- Through the first four games this season, Strnad has recorded six total tackles, including five solo tackles.

WHITEHEART MAKES BROWNS DEBUT, HAULS IN FIRST CAREER TOUCHDOWN

- After being signed to the active roster last week, Blake Whiteheart made his appearance for the Cleveland Browns against the Las Vegas Raiders. In the process, Whiteheart secured his first career touchdown pass off a one-yard toss in the first quarter, which turned out to be Cleveland's lone offensive touchdown, as the Browns fell to the Raiders 20-16.
- Whiteheart, who spent last year primarily on the Arizona Cardinals practice squad, was signed from the Cleveland Browns practice squad this past week to add extra depth to the tight end position.
- Whiteheart finished the game with three catches for 13 yards to go along with his touchdown catch.
- On the opposite side of the field, Raiders linebacker Luke Masterson tallied six tackles in the win. Las Vegas also elevated wide receiver Alex Bachman to the 53-man



roster as he made his season debut Sunday. After the game the three Demon Deacon alumni met at midfield.

BATES III CONTINUES TO SHINE FOR FALCONS

- Jessie Bates III continued his dominant 2024 season for the Atlanta Falcons on Sunday as he recorded five tackles as part of Atlanta's 26-24 win over the New Orleans Saints in a pivotal NFC South battle.
- Through the first four weeks of the season, Bates III has played a pivotal role for the Atlanta defense, ranking third on the team in tackles with 24, while ranking first in solo tackles (17), passes defended (3), and interceptions (1) for the Dirty Birds.

Bates III also ranks ninth in the league amongst all defensive players for solo tackles, as well as fifth for interceptions.

BEEF BOYS UPDATE

- Zach Tom and the Green Bay Packers came up just short in a miraculous comeback effort, as they fell to the visiting Minnesota Vikings 31-29. Tom has built himself into an integral part of the Packers' offensive line, as Tom has played 276 total snaps through the first four games of the season, which is tied for the most snaps played in the league. Tom is also ranked as the ninth-highest rated tackle in the league with a 82.5 PFF rating.

LIGHT THE DORTCH

- Arizona Cardinals wide receiver Greg Dortch continued his solid 2024 season against the Washington Commanders, hauling in four catches for 38 yards in Arizona's 42-14 defeat.
- Through the first four games this season, Dortch is already on pace to pass his totals from last season, having already caught 15 passes for 131 yards. Dortch is also averaging 10 yards per punt return and his 66.2 PFF is the second highest of his career (68.2 in 2023).

THE NFL DRAFT



The Deacs has a long and rich history of players being selected in the NFL Draft:

Wake Forest has had 145 players drafted in its history including one in each of the last seven seasons.

During the course of the 2024 NFL Draft, Wake Forest saw a Clawson era record three players selected as defensive back Malik Mustapha was taken by San Francisco in the fourth round, 124 overall, defensive back Caalen Carson by Dallas in the fifth round, 174 overall, and offensive lineman Michael Jurgens by Minnesota in the seventh round, 230 overall.

In 2023, defensive tackle Kobie Turner was taken in the third round, 89th overall by the Los Angeles Rams while wide receiver A.T. Perry was selected by the New Orleans Saints in the sixth round, 195th overall.

Since Dave Clawson took over the program ahead of the 2014 season, 15 Wake Forest players have been taken in the NFL Draft including 11 in the past SIX drafts combined.

After just one season playing under Coach Clawson, defensive back Kevin Johnson was taken with the 16th overall selection by the Houston Texans. He became the fifth Demon Deacon to be selected in the first round and the third since 2003. Linebacker Aaron Curry went fourth overall to Seattle in 2009, defensive lineman Calvin Pace 18th overall to Arizona in 2003, quarterback Norm Snead second overall to Washington in 1961 and running back Elmer Barbour 10th overall to the New York Giants in 1945.

A NEW NAME FOR THE DEACS' HOME

- In June 2023, Wake Forest University announced a historic, long-term agreement with Allegacy Federal Credit Union, a leading financial institution and a longtime, trusted partner with mutual deep roots in Winston-Salem. The new, multi-year commitment deepens Allegacy's existing partnership with Wake Forest University by establishing the home of Wake Forest football as Allegacy Federal Credit Union Stadium.
- For more than 20 years, Allegacy has partnered with the Wake Forest family to advance the community's wellbeing. One example of this is the Allegacy Center for Leadership and Character at Wake Forest's School of Business. The ACLC accelerates the School's mission to develop leaders of character to serve the greater good through a proven track record of thought leadership, practical relevance, and partnership across Wake Forest and the broader community. Primary focus areas include creating and publishing new knowledge in top academic journals across the world, and integrating ethical leadership and character strengths into courses, academic programs, co-curricular activities, and faculty and staff development programs.

NOTABLE UPDATES OVER THE YEARS

- 2005 - The facade along the sidelines and south endzone were re-faced with approximately 89,000 bricks, specifically created for this project by Pine Hall Brick Company
- 2006 - FieldTurf surface was installed
- 2007 - McCreary Tower, which was built at a cost of \$48 million, houses luxury suites, club seats, boxes for the University President, home and visiting athletic directors and print and electronic media.
- 2011 - A state-of-the-art video board to the South end zone was put in. The board measures 42 feet in height and 90 feet in width. It contains over 1.5 million pixels and 3,780 square feet of active video area.
- 2023 - Athletics installed new LED Lighting, Handrails Between Sections & Stairs on Deacon Hill and a new LED Videoboard on Bridger Field House.

PROVIDING THE HOME EDGE

- Wake Forest is an astounding 24-8 at home since the start of the 2019 season. The Deacs won a program record 11-straight contests from Oct. 2, 2020 until Sept. 17, 2022. Wake Forest's perfect 6-0 mark in 2021 is the program's first undefeated home record since 1979 and it is just the third time that this feat has been accomplished since its 1970 ACC Championship team.

HISTORY

ABOUT ALLEGACY STADIUM

After playing football in Groves Stadium since 1940, Wake Forest renamed its facility BB&T Field from 2007-19 season. Ahead of the 2020 season, it was renamed to Truist Field at Wake Forest. Now, prior to the 2023 season, Allegacy Federal Credit Union dons the stadium's name.

Wake Forest began playing intercollegiate football in Groves Stadium in 1940 when the school, then located in Wake Forest, N.C., first dedicated a 20,000-seat facility by that same name on its original campus. When Wake opened its current facility in 1968, the school kept the Groves name.

The stadium was named in honor of Henry H. Groves, Sr., who passed away in 1985. It was his generous gift that made possible the construction of the original stadium, which would be the site of some of the finest moments in Wake Forest athletic history.

The Deacs played their final game in old Wake Forest in 1955 before the school moved to Winston-Salem. After several years of playing at Bowman Gray Stadium, the Deacs moved to Groves Stadium in 1968.

In 1957, the original Groves Stadium was sold to Wake Forest High School for the sum of \$10 and became the home of high school football and other community events. It was later renamed Trentini Stadium, in memory of the late Tony Trentini, a Wake Forest football player and 1956 graduate, who later returned to serve as the high school team's coach.

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. -- Opening Night at Allegacy Federal Credit Union Stadium was the place to be on Thursday evening as head coach Dave Clawson and his 2024 football team began the season in style with a dominant victory over North Carolina A&T, 45-13.

This event, which was sponsored by the Winston-Salem Police Department and the Winston-Salem Police Foundation, brought the entire Wake Forest, Winston-Salem and Triad Community together in a unique and innovative way. From the "Deacon Dash" and community legend Bill Hayes Opening the Gate pregame, to Taylor Morin's 217 all-purpose yards helping lead the Deacs to victory on the field and the joint performance by Spirit of the Old Gold & Black and A&T's Blue & Gold Marching Machine at halftime, these are just a few examples of the way a spirited crowd at Allegacy Stadium were entertained on Thursday evening.

Additionally, the energy inside the stadium was at a fever pitch for the majority of the first half and into the second stanza as the Screamin' Demons continued the fun from last night's Wake the Demons Pep Rally on Hearn Plaza where more than 1,500 students attended.

In addition to the aforementioned pageantry and atmosphere, the Deacs recorded more than 500 yards of total offense, led by 135 rushing yards and a touchdown from Demond Claiborne while three different Deacs hauled in receiving touchdowns including the returning Donovan Greene. Quarterbacks Hank Bachmeier and Michael Kern combined to go 24-of-37 for 322 yards and three touchdowns.

Morin would record six receptions for 100 yards, while logging his first career punt return touchdown in the third quarter.

Defensively, the Deacs held the Aggies to one touchdown on the evening as Nick Andersen led Wake Forest in total tackles (14) and solo tackles (nine). Jasheen Davis, Kevin Pointer and Branson Combs each recorded sacks as the Deacs registered six tackles for loss on the night.

With the win, Wake Forest (1-0) now holds a 2-0 lead in the series with North Carolina A&T (0-1). Between the two meetings, the Deacs have outscored the Aggies A&T in its series history, 87-26.

Dating back to 2000, Wake Forest has won its last 19 games and has gone undefeated against non-Power-4 North Carolina schools since 2000. Also, the Demon Deacons are 16-0 during that time against non-Power-4 North Carolina schools. Overall, Wake Forest has an impressive 48-26 record against all in-state opponents during that time.

Over the last 14 years, Wake Forest is 11-3 in season openers including a 9-2 record in head coach Dave Clawson's tenure. Finally, The Deacs hold a mark of 10-1 in home openers in the Clawson era.

Wake Forest will look to continue its winning ways at home next week when historic ACC rival Virginia comes into Winston-Salem for a 7 p.m. kickoff that will be nationally televised on ESPN2. Less than 2,500 tickets remain for both teams' conference opener and single-game tickets can be purchased here. Additionally, next Saturday's game will serve as Wake Forest's "Gold Rush" game. Fans are encouraged to watch this video recap of our football student-athletes visiting Atrium Health Wake Forest Baptist's Brenner Children's Hospital just over a week and there are many other exciting initiatives with this partnership and promotion.

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. -- In the Atlantic Coast Conference opener for both programs, the Wake Forest Demon Deacons (1-1, 0-1 ACC) and Virginia Cavaliers (2-0, 1-0 ACC) battled on Saturday night inside Allegacy Federal Credit Union Stadium among a near-capacity crowd of 30,012 fans and over 4,000 Screamin' Demons as the Deacs dropped a heartbreaker to the Hoos, 31-30.

This game, which was sponsored by Allegacy Federal Credit Union and Strickland Brothers Oil Change, served as Wake Forest's 'Gold Rush Childhood Cancer Awareness Game' where fans had the opportunity to purchase a specific ticket package for \$35 that included a game ticket, commemorative t-shirt, a \$20 gift card to Strickland Brothers Oil Change, and a \$15 donation to Atrium Health Levine Children's Brenner Children's Hospital. Additionally, Dr. Lindsay Thompson, who is professor and chair of pediatrics at Wake Forest University School of Medicine and co-leader of Atrium Health Levine Children's, served as the Open the Gate Honoree and Lane Patrick, who was diagnosed with acute lymphoblastic leukemia when he was 5 years old, was the Atrium Health Wake Forest Baptist coin toss kid prior to kickoff.

On the field, in his first career start for Wake Forest, quarterback Hank Bachmeier Skip Ad

recorded a 400-yard passing performance, as he connected on 27-of-42 attempts with a three-yard touchdown completion to wide receiver Donovan Greene in the third quarter. Greene finished the night leading the Deacs with 11 receptions for 164 yards, while running back Demond Claiborne recorded two touchdown runs and 86 yards on 21 carries.

Defensively, tackle Kevin Pointer recorded two tackles, one sack and a third quarter interception while cornerback Jamare Glasker also nabbed his first career interception. Linebacker Branson Combs led the Deacs with 13 total tackles and seven solo tackles.

Wake Forest will return to Allegacy Stadium next week when No. 6 Ole Miss from the Southeastern Conference comes into Winston-Salem for a 6:30 p.m. kickoff that will be nationally televised on The CW. Next weekend is Homecoming for Wake Forest University and less than 100 tickets remain for this ACC-SEC clash.

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. -- The Wake Forest football team (1-2, 0-1 ACC) dropped a 40-6 contest to No. 5 Ole Miss (3-0, 0-0 SEC) on Saturday evening inside Allegacy Stadium.

This game served as the centerpiece of Wake Forest University's Homecoming Weekend as the reunions and celebrations brought together a sellout crowd of 32,849 fans to witness this game. This was the 10th sellout crowd since the 2021 season and the student crowd on Saturday totaled 4,702, which is the highest on record in school history passing the 4,584 tally that attended Wake Forest's win over NC State on Nov. 13, 2021.

Saturday's game against the fifth-ranked Rebels, which was presented by Pepsi, saw 10 different Demon Deacons record a reception, led by redshirt senior wide receiver Taylor Morin's five catches for 77 yards. In the first quarter, Morin became the all-time leader for receptions in the Dave Clawson era. Redshirt senior quarterbacks Hank Bachmeier and Michael Kern finished the evening completing 24 attempts for 265 yards.

Defensively, the Deacs were led by junior safety Nick Andersen's 12 tackles (seven solo) while senior defensive tackle Bryce Ganius recorded his first sack of the season. As a team, the Deacs recorded a pair of turnovers: redshirt junior defensive lineman BJ Williams Skip Ad

recording a fumble recovery in the first quarter and a third quarter interception by redshirt junior linebacker Dylan Hazen.

The Deacs will be idle next week with the first of two byes this season. Wake Forest is back in action in two weeks on Sept. 28 for its penultimate non-conference game of the season as Louisiana comes to town for "Family Weekend."

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. -- Despite a trio of rushing touchdowns from redshirt sophomore running back Tate Carney and more than 400 yards of offense, Wake Forest football (1-3, 0-1 ACC) dropped a hard-fought 41-38 contest to Louisiana (2-1, 0-0 Sun Belt) on Saturday afternoon inside Allegacy Stadium.

Saturday's game inside Allegacy Stadium served as the centerpiece of Wake Forest University's Family Weekend as the gathering of undergraduate students and their loved ones brought together a crowd of 31,061 fans.

Saturday's game against Louisiana, which was presented by Lowes Foods, featured five Demon Deacon touchdowns on offense, as individually Carney recorded the first multi-touchdown performance of his career, carrying the ball eight times for 65 yards and the three aforementioned scores. Junior tailback Demond Claiborne also recorded the longest run of his career - a 60-yard third quarter touchdown. Redshirt senior quarterback Hank Bachmeier connected on 29-of-35 attempts for 254 yards and one touchdown.

Defensively, the Deacs were led by defensive back Nick Andersen's 13 tackles (five solo). As a team, they tallied two tackles for loss.

The Demon Deacons hit the road next week for the first time this season, heading to Raleigh for a Big Four matchup at NC State (Oct. 5) that will kickoff at 12 p.m. on The CW. Wake Forest's next home game will be on Saturday, Oct. 12 against No. 17 / 15 Clemson. Fans can purchase tickets now while supplies last.

RALEIGH – Behind a standout offensive performance from junior tailback Demond Claiborne and timely defensive plays by redshirt junior Nick Andersen and senior linebacker Branson Combs on Saturday inside Carter-Finley Stadium, Wake Forest football (2-3, 1-1 ACC) earned a come-from-behind 34-30 victory over its Big Four rival NC State (3-3, 0-2 ACC).

Following these aforementioned performances, Wake Forest has won five of its past eight games during this historic rivalry and the Demon Deacons won their first game in Raleigh since 2018 on Saturday. Additionally on the rivalry, Saturday was the 118th meeting between these two storied programs and they have met each year since 1910 - making it the second-longest continuously played series in college football.

It was a game of swings as Wake Forest led by 10 points in the first quarter (10-0) and trailed by 10 in the fourth quarter (30-20), but the Deacs were unphased in their comeback effort.

Coach Dave Clawson's team earned their 10th fourth quarter come-from-behind win since 2017, including a memorable 10-point comeback in the aforementioned win in 2018. The two victories over NC State inside Carter-Finley Stadium are the only two double-digit comeback victories in the Clawson era over a Power 5 program.

These are only two known fourth-quarter, double-digit comeback victories in program history against Power 5 teams. With that, the only other occurrence of this magnitude happened in 2023 when the Deacs overcame an 11-point deficit at Old Dominion on Sept. 16.

Individually, Claiborne paced the Wake Forest offense with 136 rushing yards on 20 carries and a pair of rushing touchdowns. Additionally, the Aylett, Va. native caught two passes for eight yards and recorded his first-career receiving touchdown in the opening stanza. Also on offense, redshirt senior Hank Bachmeier was under-center for the Demon Deacons and passed for 154 yards and a pair of touchdown passes.

The other receiving touchdown was made by redshirt junior Horatio Fields on a 23-yard contested catch prior to halftime.

Defensively, the Deacs were led by Andersen's game-high 11-tackle performance. The Deacs recorded a pair of key turnovers in the game with redshirt junior Quincy Bryant forced fumble leading to an Evan Slocum fumble recovery that he returned 88 yards leading to a Demon Deacons touchdown. Also, Combs recorded his first-career interception at Wake Forest to seal the victory on NC State's final drive.

Redshirt sophomore Matthew Dennis continued his great 2024 season as he is now nine-for-ten on the season after going a perfect two-for-two at NC State. He has made five 30-plus yard field goals and two 40-plus yard field goals in 2024.

Also with the win, the Deacs now boast a record of 33-25 against North Carolina, NC State and Duke since 2001 where Wake leads the Big Four in winning percentage during this stretch. In addition during that span, Wake Forest is 48-25 against all in-state opponents.

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. -- Wake Forest football (2-4, 1-2 ACC) dropped a 49-14 contest to No. 10 Clemson (5-1, 4-0 ACC) on Saturday afternoon inside Allegacy Stadium.

Saturday's game inside Allegacy Stadium, which was sponsored by Allegacy Federal Credit Union, brought together a sellout crowd of 31,553 fans to witness the game. This was the 11th sellout crowd since the 2021 season.

The contest featured redshirt junior Horatio Fields hauling in a touchdown for the second-consecutive week for his third score of the year. He finished the contest with three catches for 48 yards. Also on offense, redshirt junior tight end Michael Frogge recorded his first-career reception on a six-yard touchdown catch, while redshirt freshman wideout Deuce Alexander led the Deacs with 60 receiving yards on three receptions.

Defensively, redshirt freshman defensive back Davaughn Patterson led the team with a career-high 12 tackles and he tallied a forced fumble and one tackle-for-loss.
