Feel free to call us East Carolina or ECU. However, we respectfully ask that the erroneous designation of Eastern Carolina or flawed abbreviations such as E-Carolina, East Caro, ECaro, EC never be used.

THE GAME

East Carolina will play in its first bowl game since the 2014 season when it faces off against Sun Belt member Coastal Carolina in the TicketSmarter Birmingham Bowl on Tuesday, Dec. 27 at Protective Stadium ... The Pirates will also attempt to secure their eighth win of the season, ECU's highest single-season victory total since 2014 ... The Birmingham Bowl will mark the second consecutive bowl appearance for ECU following the 2021 Military Bowl, which was canceled due to COVID-19 issues within the Boston College Program, a first since a run of three consecutive appearances from 2012-24.

EAST CAROLINA RECORDS, STREAKS & TRENDS

- ▶ Earned bowl eligibility for second-straight year under Mike Houston (first since 2012-14) ...
- ▶ Has won 8 of last 13 non-conference games dating back to 2019 ...
- ▶ Has not had an offensive TD in six-straight contests (longest streak in program history) ...
- ▶ Has not had an offensive TD in 8 of 12 games (most games w/o in program history - season) ...
- ▶ Has allowed only 12 4th-quarter offensive TDs in the last 18 games dating back to '21 ...
- ▶ Has surrendered just 20 points in the fourth quarter in the last five contests ...
- ▶ Has outscored its opponents 186-156 in the second half and in OT this year (+30 in points) ...
- ▶ Has forced at least one turnover in 28 of the last 32 games (and in 39 of the last 44) ...
- ▶ Snapped more offensive plays than their 12 opponents (835-798/+37) ...
- ▶ Has averaged 508.3 total yards and 330.7 passing yards in its last three bowl games ...

FAST FACTS

Record – 7-5 (.583); **AAC Record/Standing** – 4-4 (.500)/t6th; **Last 5 Games** – 3-2; **Last 10 Games** – 6-4; **Last 15 Games** – 9-6; **Streaks** – East Carolina will play the 46th game of the Mike Houston Era when the Pirates face off against Coastal Carolina. ECU's contest against the Chanticleers will be the Pirates' 917th since the start of football in 1932 (461-444-11/.509).

THE COACHES

MIKE HOUSTON (Mars Hill '94) is in his 12th year as a collegiate head coach with a 101-49 (.673) mark, while he is 21-24 (.467) during four seasons at East Carolina. When he officially became the Pirates' 22nd all-time head football coach on Dec. 4, 2018, Houston finished a three-year stint directing the James Madison program. Houston signed a contract extension with the Pirates securing his position through the 2026 season.

Houston guided the Dukes to a 37-6 mark, which included three NCAA FCS postseason appearances (2016 national champions, 2017 national runner-up, 2018 second round) and a pair of Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) titles. He was named the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) FCS National Coach-of-the-Year in 2016 after JMU turned in a 14-1 campaign.

The appointment to the top Dukes' football position followed brief head coaching assignments at Lenoir-Rhyne (2011-13) and The Citadel (2014-15). He led the Bears to a 29-8 ledger and a pair of NCAA Division II playoff showings before guiding the Bulldogs to a 14-11 record, a Southern Conference co-championship and a venture into the FSC playoffs in 2015.

Houston, a Franklin, N.C. native, began his collegiate coaching career as defensive coordinator at Brevard College in 2006 before serving in a similar capacity at L-R from 2007 to 2010.

CHAD STAGGS (USC Upstate '00) will serve as the interim head coach for Coastal after being elevated to the position following Jamey Chadwell's departure on Dec. 4, 2022 ... No stranger to coaching in the state of South Carolina, Staggs, who from 2013-16 guided some of the nation's top defensive units at Charleston Southern under Chadwell, joined the Coastal football staff as the linebackers coach in February 2019. He was promoted to defensive coordinator in July of 2019 ... Since coming to Coastal, Staggs has helped mentor three All-Americans on the defensive side of the ball in Tarron Jackson (2020), C.J. Brewer (2020), and Josaiah Stewart (2021) ... In 2021, he switched to overseeing the safeties group after coaching the inside linebackers in 2019 and 2020.

THE SERIES

The 2022 TicketSmarter Birmingham Bowl will be the first-ever meeting (0-0) between Coastal Carolina and East Carolina in the sport of football ... On the diamond, the Pirates are 6-8 and the two clubs recently played in the 2022 Greenville Regional Championship where ECU took the title game 13-4 advancing and hosting the Greenville Super Regional ... The Pirates own a 5-3 record in men's basketball.

MIKE HOUSTON AGAINST THE CHANTICLEERS

Mike Houston has faced off against Coastal Carolina two prior times in his 12-year coaching career where he owns a 1-1 all-time record ... As the head coach at The Citadel, Houston's squad lost to the Chanticleers 31-16 in 2014, but avenged the loss the following year during the opening round of the FCS Playoffs with a 41-38 victory over ninth-ranked Coastal Carolina.

CHAD STAGGS AGAINST THE PIRATES

Tuesday's tilt will mark the first time Chad Staggs has faced the Pirates.

EAST CAROLINA AGAINST THE SUN BELT CONFERENCE

East Carolina has compiled an all-time record of 49-62 (.441) against current members of the Sun Belt Conference ... The Pirates are 12-20 against Appalachian State, 2-0 vs. Arkansas State, 3-0 Georgia Southern, 0-1 vs. Georgia State, 0-1 vs. James Madison, 4-7 vs. Louisiana-Lafayette, 1-1 vs. Louisiana-Monroe, 11-5 vs. Marshall, 3-0 vs. Old Dominion, 12-27 vs. Southern Miss and 1-0 vs. Texas State ... ECU has enjoyed a recent run of relative success against the SBC, winning eight of the last 12 matchups (dating back to Sept. 1, 2012).

THE MONARCHS: A COMMON 2022 OPPONENT

Both East Carolina and Coastal Carolina had Old Dominion on its schedule this season ... The Pirates defeated the Monarchs in early 2022 coming away with a 39-21 victory, while the Chanticleers dropped their October contest 49-21.

AGAINST NON-CONFERENCE OPPONENTS

The Pirates have produced a 43-59 (.422) regular season non-league record, which includes an 3-1 clip in 2022 ... Last year the Pirates split their four non-conference games falling to Appalachian State and South Carolina to open the season before rallying back to post victories against Marshall and Charleston Southern ... During his first season as head coach at ECU in 2019, Mike Houston led the Pirates to a 3-1 record - the program's first winning non-conference ledger since 2014.

HOUSTON IN THE POST-SEASON

The 2022 TicketSmarter Birmingham Bowl marks the second consecutive bowl appearance for Mike Houston and his staff at East Carolina ... While the 2021 Military Bowl served as his first FBS post-season game, it was canceled due to COVID-19 protocols within the Boston College program ... Houston does own an impressive 12-5 (.706) mark in post-season matchups at the NCAA Division II and NCAA FCS levels with three different programs - Lenoir-Rhyne (DII/4-2), The Citadel (FCS/1-1) and James Madison (FCS/7-2) ... NON-SATURDAY MAYHEM

East Carolina is 22-30 in non-Saturday games since 2000 ... Oddly, the Pirates have fared better on the road (15-15; 7-15 at home) ... In terms of days (including bowls), ECU is 5-1 on Sundays, 1-1 on Mondays, **2-1 on Tuesdays**, 0-3 on Wednesdays, 8-12 on Thursdays and 6-12 on Fridays ... Most recently, ECU is 11-15 when deviating from the normal Saturday routine since 2010 ... In 2022, ECU has played a pair of non-Saturday contests posting a 1-1 ledger (win at BYU/27-24; loss at Cincinnati/27-25) ... With their win in Provo, Utah the Pirates became bowl eligible for the second-straight year under Mike Houston.

ANALYZING THE 2022 OVERALL SCHEDULE

ECU's 2022 opponents tallied a combined 79-71 (.527) record in 2021 ... The Pirates' four non-conference foes were a collective 28-21 (.571), while the eight AAC teams posted a 51-50 (.505) mark ... Five programs had seven (7) or more wins - Cincinnati (13-1), Houston (12-2), BYU (10-3), UCF (9-4) and NC State (9-3).

WHO WENT BOWLING ... The Pirates' current slate features contests against seven teams who were invited to bowl games in 2021, including Cincinnati, who earned the AAC's first College Football Playoff berth ... NC State (San Diego County Credit Union Holiday), Old Dominion (Myrtle Beach), Memphis (Hawaii), UCF (Union Home Mortgage Gasparilla), BYU (Radiance Technologies Independence), Houston (TicketSmarter Birmingham) and Cincinnati (Goodyear Cotton) ... Five of the Pirates' seven home games are against 2021 bowl qualifiers.

IN THE FINAL POLLS ... Four of ECU's 2022 opponents finished the 2021 season in college football's two major polls (*Associated Press* and *USA Today* Amway Coaches) - league champion Cincinnati (4/4), Houston (17/17), NC State (20/19) and BYU (19/22).

2006 PAPAJOHNS.COM BOWL RECAP

South Florida 24, East Carolina <Dec. 23, 2006 @Legion Field, Birmingham, Ala.>

Benjamin Williams used a short field to rush for a pair of early first quarter touchdowns while the Bulls' defense matched the Pirates' lowest scoring total in the Skip Holtz Era as South Florida rolled to a 24-7 win in the inaugural Papajohns.com Bowl ... USF benefitted from an average field position start at the ECU 41-yard line to score on four of its first five possessions of the game ... On the other hand, the Bulls limited the Pirates to a paltry 14-yards-per-drive average on all seven of their first half possessions ... Excluding ECU's only scoring march of the day, which went for 79 yards and was capped by a 48-yard TD toss from James Pinkney to Bobby Good, the Pirates managed only 3.2 yards per drive the remaining six times they had the ball in the opening 30 minutes ... East Carolina bounced back in the second half to keep USF off the scoreboard defensively but couldn't cash in three straight redzone visits on its last trio of possessions in the fourth quarter ... A fumble stopped the Pirates at the USF 15-yard line (13:18 left), a pair of sacks halted ECU at the four-yard line (3:19) and the clock ran out at the 12-yard line ... The Bulls held East Carolina to -6 rushing yards (103 total) in the opening half before Dominique Lindsay sparked the Pirates with 81 ground yards in the third and fourth quarters ... With the exception of his 48-yard scoring strike to Good, Pinkney finished his collegiate career in frustrating fashion, completing just eight-of-25 passes for 125 yards while tallying -9 rushing yards ... Reserve signal-caller Rob Kass fared better in the fourth quarter, trying to rally East Carolina on 10-of-19 passing (game-high 138 yards).

BIRMINGHAM BOWL PART I

Despite surrendering 536 total yards on 101 plays, the Gators' vaunted defensive unit forced three timely turnovers and netted four sacks to help Florida hold off East Carolina 28-20 in the Birmingham Bowl at Legion Field ... Nickel back Brian Poole erased an early 7-0 deficit with a 29-yard interception return for a touchdown, while cornerback Vernon Hargreaves III ended any hopes of a Pirate comeback by picking off ECU quarterback Shane Carden in the Gator endzone with 1:20 remaining in the game ... In between, Poole also pounced on a fumble at the UF one-yard line to snuff out another East Carolina scoring threat with 3:23 to play in the second period ... The Pirates had little diffi culty moving the ball between the 20s, but managed only two touchdowns in seven redzone visits ... The loss spoiled the final collegiate contest for Carden and record-setting ECU receiver Justin Hardy, who connected 11 times for 160 yards and a score during the rainy afternoon ... Carden completed 34 passes on a career-high 66 attempts for 427 yards and two touchdowns ... With the exception of one play - Ahmad Fulwood's 86-yard TD reception - the Pirate defense enjoyed a solid second half by forcing three turnovers and six three-and-outs, while allowing just 97 yards on 10 Gator possessions ... A pair of Warren Harvey 24-yard field goals pulled ECU to within eight early in the fourth quarter, and with 3:28 left on the clock, the Pirates began a 53-yard march to the Florida five-yard line before Hargreaves ended the threat on a second-and-goal snap ... ECU managed just 109 rushing yards playing without starter Breon Allen and key reserve Marquez Grayson.

Heading into the bowl game, East Carolina is currently +10 on the season in take aways ... The Pirates have forced seven fumbles, recovering five and picked off 11 passes for 154 return yards ... In its last home outing (vs. UCF), ECU forced a season-high four turnovers (3 INTs, 1 fumble) and registered its fourth multi-turnover game of the season ... Despite its impressive 45-3 win, East Carolina's 16-game streak of forcing at least one turnover came to a halt against Temple on Nov. 6 (2021) ... The run, which began on Oct. 3, 2020 at Georgia State and produced 36 takeaways (22 interceptions, 14 fumble recoveries), was the program's longest since a 33-game streak (from 2007 to 2010) ... In all, ECU still has at least one takeaway in 28 of the last 32 (and 39 of 44) contests, as well as 10 of 12 games in 2022.

ON THE ROAD

Since becoming a conference member in 1997, East Carolina is 65-99 (.396) when playing away from Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium ... The Pirates have a 3-2 road slate in 2022 (wins at South Florida/Boca Raton, BYU and Temple; losses to Tulane and Cincinnati) ... From a non-conference standpoint, ECU snapped a seven-game skid when it topped Old Dominion 24-21 on Sept. 28, 2019 but has only played four road non-AAC tilts since (2-2).

AT DOWDY-FICKLEN STADIUM

East Carolina's all-time record at Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium is 200-114 (.637) ... The Pirates opened the facility on Sept. 21, 1963 with a 20-10 win over Wake Forest in front of 17,000 fans, celebrated the stadium's 50th anniversary in 2013 and recently hosted its 300th game vs. Tulane in 2020 ... Before a 4-2 clip in 2021, a 1-3 record two years ago and a collective 13-19 mark from 2015-2019, ECU was 5-1 in 2014, 2013 and 2012 (15-3) and won a combined 10 of 12 home matchups in 2009 (6-1) and 2008 (4-1) ... With its 34-13 win over UCF (Oct. 22, 2022), ECU has posted 41 winning campaigns at DFS since 1963 - 4-3 in 2022.

THE PIRATE NATION - OVER 9 MILLION STRONG

East Carolina has usually been able to claim plenty of hometown support when playing at Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium - establishing itself among conference attendance leaders on a near annual basis ... In all, a total of **9,411,430** fans have seen the Pirates in action since 1963, and since the completion of a 7,000-seat expansion project in 2010 (to push capacity to 50,000), the Pirates have drawn 3,140,141 fans.

2022 MISC... FROM THE TREASURE CHEST (PLAYERS/TEMPLE)

QB Holton Ahlers completed 25 of 37 attempts for 314 yards with 3 TDs and no INTs ... Upended his season passing yards total to 3,408 - the fourth most in a single season in program history ... Now owns three of the top 10 ECU single-season passing yards performances ... Moved into second place on the American Athletic Conference passing touchdowns list with 92 ... **RB Keaton Mitchell** tied his career highs in rushing yards (222) and rushing touchdowns (three) ... Set a new personal single-game best with four total touchdowns by adding his third career receiving score ... Surpassed 100 yards for the sixth-straight game (7 season/14 career) ... Raised his regular season total to 1,323 yards, second only to Leonard Henry's 1,432 in 2001 ... Stands fifth on the program's career rushing yards list, finishing the afternoon with 2,900 - one behind Carlester Crumpler for fourth ... Added 78 yards receiving, one short of his career high and finished the game with 300 all-purpose yards ... His 73-yard TD reception marked the longest catch of his career ... **WR Isaiah Winstead** notched his fifth receiving TD of the season while **WR Jaylen Johnson** notched his fourth ... **SAF Jireh Wilson** collected a team-high 12 tackles (six solo) ... He led four Pirates in double figures ... **KR/WR Jsi Hatfield** produced his first career kickoff return TD (97 yards) in the second quarter, marking the first for ECU since Tyler Snead's 95-yard TD return against Temple back on Nov. 21, 2020 - a span of 25 games ... **CB Malik Fleming** hauled in his third interception of the season and the sixth of his career ... **DL Elijah Morris** registered two of the Pirates' eight quarterback hurries.

2022 MISC... FROM THE TREASURE CHEST (TEAM/TEMPLE)

East Carolina improved to 11-9 all time against Temple and 6-4 against the Owls in Philadelphia ... Finished the regular season with a 3-2 record away from home ... Clinched a seven-win season for the second-straight year as well as a 500 or better record in conference play (5-3 in 2021) ... Concluded the regular season with a 3,000-yard passer (Ahlers/3,408), 1,000-yard rusher (Mitchell/1,325) and 1,000-yard receiver (Winstead/1,013) for just the third time in program history (2012-13) ... Surpassed 500 yards of total offense for the fourth time this season ... Did not turn the ball over for the sixth-straight contest ... Tied its season high in points scored (49/Campbell).

East Carolina will enter its bowl game with an active streak of 311 games of not suffering a shutout - a school record (previous mark was 110 set from '71-'81) ... The last time the Pirates were blanked was on Oct. 4, 1997 (56-0 at Syracuse) ... ECU's 311-game run currently ranks among the Top 10 nationally (Florida is first with 434).

AMONG TOP PASSING UNITS IN AMERICAN HISTORY

Since joining the AAC in 2014, the Pirates stand second in passing yards over a combined eight-plus year period despite utilizing nine starting quarterbacks, four offensive coordinators and three head coaches: **1. Memphis (36,296), 2. East Carolina (31,696), 3. SMU (29,641), 4. Houston (29,519), 5. UCF (29,245), 6. Cincinnati (28,517), 7. Tulsa (27,330), 8. Temple (25,448), 9. South Florida (22,575), 10. Tulane (21,005) and 11. Navy (8,921)** ... However, the Pirates top the league in completions (2,677) and attempts (4,385) ... **ECU has also accounted for a conference-high 20 400-yard passing games** and surpassed the 300-yard mark on 54 occasions during the 102-game span ... The top two receivers in NCAA FBS history by career receptions - **Zay Jones** (399 from 2013-16) and **Justin Hardy** (387 from 2011-2014) - are former ECU players.

BIG PLAY MAGIC IN 2021 & 2022

Over the last two seasons, Keaton Mitchell has led the Pirates with 31 carries that have surpassed 20 or more yards (12 in 2021, 20 in 2022), six of which have eclipsed 50 (88-TD/Marshall '21, 74-TD/Charleston Southern '21, 68-TD/Tulane '21, 62/Tulane '21, 57-TD/Temple '21 and 81-TD/Old Dominion '22) ... His 222-yard performance at Temple (2022) tied his career-high rushing output (other: vs. Tulane 10/02/21) ... The previous total against the Green Wave were the most by a Pirate RB since first-round draft choice Chris Johnson racked up 223 against Boise State in the 2007 Hawai'i Bowl ... Mitchell, who ranked 9th nationally and 2nd in the American Athletic Conference with a 6.5 yards-per-carry average in 2021, currently stands second among all FBS running backs and is first in the AAC with a 7.40 average per carry entering the bowl game.

DEJA VU - A COMEBACK FOR THE AGES

For the second time under head coach Mike Houston, the Pirates rallied from a 17-point deficit in their thrilling 47-45 four-overtime win against Memphis on Oct. 15, 2022 ... Trailing 17-0 with 5:45 remaining in the opening period, ECU scored a pair of touchdowns in the last 96 seconds before half, cutting the Tigers lead to 17-13 ... ECU would then tie the game at 20-all (5:28/3Q) and 23-all (5:30/4Q) before going to overtime ... Last year, the Pirates put together its biggest fourth-quarter comeback (-17, 38-21 with 7:30 left) in ECU history during Pirates' 42-38 win at Marshall on Sept. 18 since rallying past NC State 37-34 (-17, 34-17 with 7:26 left) on Jan. 1, 1992 to capture the Peach Bowl at Atlanta-Fulton County Stadium ... GREENVILLE, N.C. – Following his first game as East Carolina's football coach, a decisive loss at NC State on the last day of August in 2019, Mike Houston vowed to bring a vastly different team into battle the next time the teams met.

That day came on a steamy Saturday afternoon before a record crowd of 51,711 Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium to open the 2022 season. And Houston's words proved prophetic down to the final seconds when Owen Daffer's 41-yard field goal attempt sailed right, leaving the Pirates heartbroken and on the end of a 21-20 loss.

ECU, bolstered by two goal-line stands and an interception, clawed back from a 21-7 halftime deficit and had a chance to tie with 2:58 left, but Daffer hooked his extra-point kick. A chance at redemption came with nine seconds showing, but the miss ended an upset bid of the nation's 13th-ranked team.

The Wolfpack, playing their first true road game season-opener since 2008 (at South Carolina), escaped with their third straight and just their second win in six trips to Greenville. N.C. State had won the previous two meetings by a combined 92-9 score, including Houston's debut.

Saturday's heart-wrenching finish hit hard for Houston, who is 0-4 in season-opener at ECU and has dropped five straight.

"The kids fought their tails off," he said. "They inspire me with the way they play. I know nobody outside of Greenville gave us much of a chance, but those kids never doubted. We should have won the ballgame. We outplayed them. We dominated them physically in the second half. I'm just really hurt for those kids in that locker

room right now

"They've brought this program from the depths back to where it was today."

Senior quarterback Holton Ahlers and linebacker Myles Berry remember those days and take pride in resurrecting the program. Both served as game captains and soaked in the moment as they walked out before an electric crowd for the coin toss.

"We were both here in 2018 when Coach Mo (Scottie Montgomery) got fired, actually in this room before the State game, and then we went on to lose, I think it was 58 to 3 at State," Ahlers said. "The program that it is now, it just makes me proud – I'm about to tear up even thinking about it. I looked at Myles when we were walking out there, and I was like, 'Dude, we did it. We brought ECU football back.' Whatever happens in game, look around, the energy's back in Greenville and around this team."

Berry and his defensive mates made a statement by ending the Wolfpack's streak of 10 consecutive games with at least 27 points, including a second-half shutout. The Pirates limited quarterback Devin Leary to 211 yards passing, his lowest total since Oct. 17, 2020, when he suffered a season-ending injury against Duke.

"The standard that we play with has risen tremendously," Berry said. "We knew it was going to be a big task, but a game is a game. We fear no one. It was just great to see, and I'm proud of the guys and how we competed today."

Ahlers, on track to eclipse nearly every school record for a quarterback, became the American Athletic Conference leader in career completions (833) after connecting on 25 of 41 passes for 267 yards. He overcame an interception on the opening drive to toss a 59-yarder to former high school teammate C.J. Johnson for a 7-0 lead. The offense stalled against an aggressive Wolfpack defense the rest of the half, and State stormed back on a 12-yard pass from Leary to Thayer Thomas and a 24-yard run by Demi Sumo-Karngbaya sandwiched around a blocked punt that Sean Brown recovered for a touchdown.

That special-teams hiccup looked to be a backbreaker, but ECU found life in the second half.

A 13-play, 79-yard drive highlighted by a one-handed catch by at the 1 by Isaiah Winstead (10 catches, 58) yards and capped by Shane Calhoun's 1-yard catch drew ECU within 21-14.

A quick answer by the Wolfpack vanished on a third-down play from the 2 when Jordan Houston's fumble wound up in the hands of Gerard Stringer. Moments later, the ECU defense responded yet again, denying Sumo-Karngbaya on four tries from the one.

"That's what we play for as a defense," Berry said. "We play to get those stops. We play to get put in those bad situations and then winning those situations."

Winning the game would have made those stands legendary, Houston said.

"If we hit that kick at the end, we're sitting here saying those are historic plays in the history of the program," he said. "Everybody in the stadium has to respect what those kids did down there. You don't do that. You don't do that to a 13th-ranked team, you don't do that to one of the better teams in the ACC. Nobody does that to them. I think that says a lot about those kids, says a lot about the heart they've got, says a lot about the toughness they've got."

The stalwart stands did set the stage for a dramatic finish. After Jireh Wilson picked off a Leary pass and returned it 34 yards, Rahjai Harris scored four plays later from the 3 to make it 21-20. Daffer's attempt to tie hooked low and left.

ECU then forced a three-and-out and started one final drive from its 29 with 2:27 to play. A 37-yard catch and run by Keaton Mitchell got the Pirates in field-goal range at the 31. An Ahlers keeper to the 24 on third down set up the potential game-winner. After an NC State timeout, Daffer pushed his kick right of the upright.

"He's hurting worse than anybody right now," Houston said. "We've got to support him, and he's got to rebound from this."

Ahlers, always under the microscope as a quarterback, offered his support.

"We're going to need him to win a conference championship; we feel like we have a team to do that," Ahlers said. "I believe in him. I've been through a lot here too. I've been through all sorts of scrutiny and all that too, so I told him I was there for him."

GREENVILLE, N.C. – First came the rain. Then came the lightning and thunder. The electrifying show didn't materialize in the night sky above Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium on Saturday, however, but on the soggy turf below.

Sparked by Keaton Mitchell (lightning) and Rahjai Harris (thunder), East Carolina transformed a tight contest into a dominant 39-21 win over Old Dominion, rebounding from a season-opening heartbreaking loss to N.C. State and even its record at 1-1.

Mitchell's 81-yard dash early in the fourth quarter delivered a staggering blow to the Monarchs (1-1), who were coming off an upset of Virginia Tech, then Harris landed the knockout just 24 seconds later. ECU outscored ODU 23-7 after clinging to a 16-14 lead in the third period.

"I loved the way we played in the second half tonight," fourth-year head coach Mike Houston said. "That's what we want to be. That performance in the fourth quarter, that's what it's supposed to look like. The good football teams, that's what they look like."

"I'm kind of ticked off that the score was as close as it was. That was a pretty dominant performance by our kids."

A glance at the stats reflects that dominance. ECU had a decided advantage in total plays (86-43), first downs (30-12), total yards (531-290), rushing yards (261-15) and

time of possession (40:52-19:08). The Pirates also played a turnover-free game while forcing a pair of second-half turnovers.

The running game, limited to 49 yards in the first half, found its footing in the second half as the ODU defense began to wear down. Mitchell, the Pirates' speedster, finished with 160 yards on 18 carries, eclipsing 100 yards for the seventh time in his career, and scored a pair of touchdowns.

Harris, more of a bruiser, finished with 61 yards on 16 carries and added four catches for 14 yards.

"That's a huge thing for us, getting Keaton and Rahjai and those guys rolling," said quarterback Holton Ahlers, who threw for 270 yards and a pair of touchdowns.

Houston knows the importance of having the complementary backs both producing.

"I'm happy for both of them, having that success there in the second half," he said. "And we all know that success comes from our offensive line wearing down Old Dominion in the second half."

Mitchell's run provided the catalyst and followed the pattern of many of his game-breaking runs – he now has 15 plays of 20-plus yards and six of 50 or more in the last two years. With the Pirates leading 22-14 and starting a drive at the 19, Mitchell darted through a hole on the left side and left the ODU secondary in his tracks.

"I told the line to keep going, keep doing what y'all got to do, and they kept chopping," Mitchell said.

Houston said he sensed a big play from Mitchell coming soon.

"No joke, 30 seconds before he popped, I'm sitting here thinking, 'One of these has got to pop at some point because you felt like you were close,'" Houston said. "Once he got in the secondary you knew what was going to happen. It was a great job by him of being patient all night and not getting frustrated."

Harris cashed in a fumble recovery by J.D. Lampley moments later with a 15-yard run for a 36-14 lead.

ODU simply didn't have enough firepower to keep up. The Monarchs' rushing game didn't hit positive yardage until midway the fourth quarter and wound up with just 15 yards on 14 attempts. West Virginia transfer Ali Jennings provided the lone ODU threat, hauling in eight Hayden Wolff passes for 200 yards, including touchdown grabs of 16, 18 and 35 yards.

ECU countered with a couple of big-play transfers that came up clutch in first-half scoring drives. Georgia transfer Jaylen Johnson finished with nine catches for 93 yards, and Toledo transfer Isaiah Winstead added five catches for 89 yards.

"They made some crucial catches for us. It's cool to see them do as well as they did, but we've got a lot more playmakers that we can disperse the ball to," Ahlers said.

Johnson established himself early with three receptions for 27 yards on an opening 17-play drive that ended with an Owen Daffer field goal. An 11-yard catch on fourth-and-6 moved the Pirates to the 19, but they stalled at the 5.

Daffer, who missed an extra point and field goal in last week's 21-20 loss, received a rousing ovation from the crowd of 36,853 and then knocked through a 22-yarder for a 3-0 lead. Daffer also hit a 32-yarder to cap the Pirates' scoring. He had a pair of PAT attempts blocked, but Houston pinpointed a protection breakdown as the culprit.

"I thought it was pretty special when Owen took the field," Houston said. "He's had a tough week. He takes a lot of pride in what he does. But for our fan base to cheer him, give him an ovation when he took the field tonight, that was pretty special."

Winstead helped key the second scoring drive with a pair of catches, including a 19-yarder to convert a third-and-5. He and Johnson each had a pair of receptions as the Pirates stretched their lead to 16-7 in the second quarter. Winstead picked up a first down with an 18-yard catch on third-and-10 from the ECU 10, and Johnson converted a fourth-and-8 with a 12-yard catch. His 27-yard catch and run on a crossing pattern set up Mitchell's 1-yard run.

"When you get those touches from the jump, it just boosts your confidence and gets you going," Johnson said. "It helps you want to get involved every play."

Ahlers, already the American Athletic Conference career leader in total plays and completions, added to his list of accolades with another solid night. His 39 pass attempts give him 1,468 for his career and move him into first ahead of Temple's Phillip Walker. He also moved up to second in AAC career passing yards with 10,756, trailing only Tulsa's Dane Evans (10,782).

GREENVILLE, N.C. — East Carolina senior quarterback Holton Ahlers knows many tense moments lie ahead this season, especially with American Athletic Conference play beginning next week. So, he savored the opportunity Saturday evening to spend the bulk of the final quarter of a 49-10 win over visitor Campbell watching from the sidelines of Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium.

Before turning over the reins to backup Mason Garcia and a host of other reserves, Ahlers turned in a sensational performance that included three passing touchdowns, one rushing score and a few more records to his collection, including most total yards in school history and passing yards in the AAC.

"Heck yeah it was," Ahlers said of taking the rest of the night off after Rahjai Harris scored on a 1-yard run with 11:11 to go, the fourth consecutive scoring drive of the half and sixth in a row overall as ECU erased an early 10-7 deficit. "I think my body will appreciate it a little bit tomorrow, too.

"It was cool to see (Mason) go out there. He's been great. Obviously, a lot of us see him as the future of the program. He's a super-talented kid. He just needs experience."

Experience is what Ahlers brings now and what has been the centerpiece of

elevating Houston's program. The fourth-year coach remembers meeting Ahlers at his introductory press conference and maintained his confidence in the Greenville product through highs and lows.

"He's one of the first kids I met; he was sitting on the first row when I was introduced to the team," Houston said. "He's been the steady constant since I've been here. He's a great leader in the locker room, he's a phenomenal role model in the community; he's a role model to my two sons. He's a pleasure to be around every single day. You couldn't ask for someone to be more than what he's been."

With at least nine more games to play, Ahlers already owns a bevy of school and AAC milestones, which he increased on a pleasant Saturday night before a home crowd of 43,036. Ahlers picked apart the Camels by completing 17 of 20 passes for 263 yards as the Pirates (2-1) piled more than 500 total yards for the second-straight week, finishing with 572.

His 12,332 total yards vaults him past Shane Carden for first in school history, and he needs just 86 yards to supplant Cincinnati's Desmond Ridder (12,418) at the top of the AAC list. Ahlers also took over first in AAC career passing yards with (11,019), passing Tulsa's Dane Evans (10,782). He already holds AAC marks for passing attempts (1,934) and completions (879).

The three touchdowns against Campbell give the left-hander 22 for his career, just one behind Carden on the school's list.

Ahlers said the records are gratifying, especially since they contribute to helping rebuild the program.

"It means a lot," he said. "Being from Greenville, growing up here and obviously playing quarterback here has been a dream come true for me. The team that we've got this year is going to be really special. There's going to be a couple of records broken and stuff like that, but I'm just going to focus on the main thing, and that's going to keep winning every single game and going 1-0 each week. As these records come, it will be pretty cool to look back on. But I'm just super blessed to be in the situation I'm in. It says my name on it, but there's a million people that put in a lot of hard work for my name to go there."

Houston said Ahlers deserves the recognition, not only for his performance on the field but for his leadership.

"I'm very, very proud of him," Houston said. "He had a phenomenal night tonight.

"I've coached a lot of guys over the years, and he's one of the more enjoyable players I've ever had," Houston added. "I just respect him so much for the way he plays. He's a tough freaking kid. He's a great player, and he's just a phenomenal human being. I'm blessed that God has allowed me to have a few years with him, and I'm going to enjoy every day I've got with him until he's done."

Houston also is enjoying having speedster Keaton Mitchell among his offensive weapons. The sophomore from McDonough, Ga., torched the Camels for 185 yards on 13 carries, collecting his eighth career 100-yard game. Mitchell scored on an 18-yard sprint after Campbell grabbed an early 3-0 lead then gained 70 yards on five carries, including a 42-yard dash, to set up a 1-yard pass from Ahlers to Ryan Jones for a 14-10 lead.

The Pirates reeled off 42 consecutive points after the Camels scored on their first two possessions. Campbell, led by elusive quarterback Hajj Malik Williams, piled up 403 yards but failed to score on their last nine possessions. Chance Bates ended one threat with an interception. Another threat ended with a missed field goal.

Williams completed 23 of 38 passes for 300 yards, including a 61-yarder to Jalen Kelsey on a short hitch route.

"I wish we hadn't missed that tackle on the hitch route that gave them the long touchdown, but I thought we responded and played well in the second half," Houston said. "That was good to see."

ECU's offense also responded by scoring on its final two possessions of the first half and first four of the second. Two of those scores came on fade patterns to the right front corner of the end zone, a 23-yarder to C.J. Johnson and a 28-yarder to Jalen Johnson on a fourth-down play.

"I thought Jalen had a great matchup, and Holton knew right where he was," Houston said. "It was really good to see us win those one-on-one matchups down the field because we're going to have to throughout the year this year."

That includes next week in the fourth-straight home game and AAC opener against Navy.

"We've got a good Navy ballclub coming in here next week," Houston said. "They've had two weeks to get ready for us. We're going to have to play our best ball of the year to have a shot."

GREENVILLE, N.C. - For the second time in the first month of the season, East Carolina will have to find a way to recover from a heart-wrenching, last-second loss. The latest gut punch came at the hands of one of its biggest nemesis in Navy.

When Owen Daffer's 37-yard field goal attempt hooked left of the upright, the Midshipmen celebrated a 23-20 double-overtime victory on a Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium turf where they have never lost in five trips. The loss on a comfortable Saturday evening denied the Pirates (2-2, 0-1 AAC) a third straight win to close out a four-game homestand and puts them at 0-1 in the American Athletic Conference heading into a pair of road games.

ECU lost its opener to NC State 21-20 when Daffer missed both an extra point and a field goal in the fourth quarter. Quarterback Holton Ahlers said fingers should not be pointing at Daffer for this loss considering the mistakes and missed opportunities.

"If you want to put that game on anyone, put it on Holton Ahlers, don't put it on Owen Daffer," Ahlers said. "It's a full game. It came down to one kick because we missed a bunch of plays. It should have come down to a kick at the end of regulation. He should have had a chance to win it instead of trying to tie it in double overtime."

The Pirates seemed poised to repeat last year's thrilling victory at Navy when Daffer nailed a career-long 54-yarder as time expired, taking possession at their 14 with 3:17 to play in a frantic fourth period featuring four touchdowns.

Three completions by Ahlers moved ECU to the Navy 46, but Tyler Fletcher snuffed out the threat with an interception with 25 seconds showing. Ahlers said he should have tucked the ball and run as he scrambled out of the pocket on second-and-1 instead of throwing into coverage downfield.

"I should have just run and took as many yards as I could and got out of bounds," Ahlers said. "That's 100 percent on me. If I put us in field goal range there, it gives us a chance to win it, so I take full responsibility of that whole entire game honestly."

The Pirates' other turnover also proved costly, a fourth-quarter fumble at their 25 that Navy cashed in for a brief 17-10 lead. Six penalties - twice their season average - also proved costly for the Pirates. Navy (1-2, 1-1 AAC) had just one penalty for five yards.

"One down deep in our territory was big," head coach Mike Houston said of the turnovers. "... The one at the end of regulation was big because we had a chance to win it at the end of regulation."

"Like I said before the game, turnovers and penalties were going to be paramount in this ballgame because I did very much feel like this game was going to come down exactly the way it did. It's just what you expect when you play that bunch."

A grind-it-out game where possessions are limited are also a near guarantee. Navy owned the time of possession, keeping the ball 37:02 of regulation. The Midshipmen put together three 11-play drives and a 13-play drive in their first six possession but managed only three points.

ECU stuffed Navy's first drive at the 1, the third time the Pirates have stopped a team inside the 3-yard-line this season. Another drive also ended on downs, and a fumble ended yet another drive.

But ECU couldn't muster much on offense, struggling to find a rhythm against Navy's blitzing defense and missing its big-play threat with Keaton Mitchell sidelined with an injury (he had 5 yards and five carries). The Pirates settled for a 19-yard Daffer field goal after a 96-yard drive to the 2 in the first quarter but didn't strike again until the fourth quarter.

After two straight games with more than 500-plus total yards, ECU managed just 370 against Navy. Ahlers, who eclipsed Cincinnati's Desmond Ridder's as the AAC's all-time total yards leader, threw for 267 yards and a pair of touchdowns, completing 22 of 34 passes. Isaiah Winstead finished with 11 receptions for 143 yards, including a dazzling 67-yard catch and run to tie the score at 17-17 in the fourth quarter.

Rahjai Harris led the rushing attack with 78 yards on 15 carries, highlighted by a 41-yard run in the first period.

"They had two weeks to prepare for us," Ahlers said of Navy's defense. "They called a great defensive game and kept us on our toes, really the whole game. They did a couple of new blitzes that we hadn't seen with coverage behind it that we hadn't seen. Hats off to them, but it comes down to us, and we've just got to execute better."

Houston said the Pirates missed the big play potential of Mitchell, who has 17 career plays of at least 20 yards, including five this season.

"It's not serious, but obviously it hurts you," Houston said. "We're fortunate to have Rahjai, but obviously you want a fresher 1-2 punch right there. I thought Rahjai did a lot of good things."

Harris did cough up a fumble that set up Navy's go-ahead touchdown in a fourth-quarter shootout. The teams entered the final period locked in a 3-3 tie before reeling off 28 points. Ahlers hit Ryan Jones with a 14-yard pass for a 10-3 lead, but Navy quickly answered with a rare pass as Tai Lavatai teamed up with Vincent Terrell Jr. on a 65-yard strike.

Anton Hall scored five plays after the Harris fumble for a 17-10 lead, but ECU had its own quick reply with Ahlers throwing a 67-yarder to Winstead.

Daffer gave ECU a 20-17 lead in the first overtime, and Davies answered with a 43-yarder. Navy again turned to Davies on its second possession and took a 23-20 lead when his 29-yarder slipped just inside the upright. Daffer's attempt to force a third overtime missed.

Now ECU must regroup.

"It's not just the missed kick; it's a lot more than that," defensive lineman Jeremy Lewis said. "You've just got to keep going, keep grinding. We're going to come back tomorrow, practice and get better and keep stacking days. It's all about the next play, next game, next day."

Houston said the loss does not change the Pirates' goals.

"In 2012, we lost our first conference game of the season in a hard-fought battle, and we won the conference championship," said Houston of his previous stop at Lenoir-Rhyne. "It's not like you're out of it. They're going to be in a bunch of ballgames like this. Week in, week out, this is what the league's going to be like. You're going to be in a bunch of situations where it's going to come down to the very end of the ballgame, it's going to come down to the last drive."

BOCA RATON, Fla. — After a week of distractions, disruptions and adversity, East Carolina considered a quick start essential in its first road test of the year.

The “Conley Connection” made sure it happened.

Senior quarterback Holton Ahlers and junior wide receiver C.J. Johnson, high school teammates at Greenville’s D.H. Conley, teamed up for four touchdowns — three in a decisive first half — as the Pirates seized control early on an overcast Saturday afternoon and held on for a 48-28 American Athletic Conference win over South Florida.

The Pirates (3-2, 1-1 AAC) unleashed a dominant first-half performance, building a 41-7 lead, on the heels of a double-overtime loss to Navy that ended a season-opening, four-game homestand and a week of uncertainty surrounding Hurricane Ian. The powerful storm forced a South Florida team already wobbled by a rash of injuries and a 1-3 start to shift its practices to Fort Lauderdale and prompted the game to be moved from a 7 p.m. start in Tampa to a 2:30 kickoff at FAU Stadium in Boca Raton, where a Covid-like crowd of about 300 gathered.

None of that seemed to faze ECU.

“It’s great to get the win with the challenges this week,” fourth-year head coach Mike Houston said. “Some of our players had some personal challenges this week. Just the way that they’ve handled everything, some of the unknowns, some of the

changes in schedules, the flight (Friday), just really pleased with the way we played to get the win.”

Especially in the first half, when the Pirates piled up 397 total yards and scored on six of their eight possessions. Ahlers tossed five first-half touchdown passes on the way to equaling the six he compiled against SMU in 2019, raising his career total to 84. He completed 31-of-41 passes overall for a season-high 465 yards, the sixth time he has eclipsed 400 in his career, and the first time since that same 2019 game against SMU.

Johnson hauled in four of those — covering 9, 14, 60 and 74 yards — to tie the single-game school and American Athletic Conference record, giving him 17 career touchdowns and 130 total receptions. Ahlers, who needs just 141 yards to unseat Shane Carden as the school’s all-time leader in passing yards, also threw scoring passes of 21 yards to Ryan Jones and 22 yards to Isaiah Winstead.

Jones finished with six catches for 84 yards and now has multiple catches in 13 straight games. Winstead had six receptions for 73 yards. Johnson had team highs of seven catches for 197 yards, and now trails Tyler Sneed by 121 yards for fifth place in school history.

“The offensive line gave us a lot of time,” Ahlers said. “We’ve always felt like we had really good matchups at receiver, and they just went out there and performed really well. I’m just super proud of the guys.”

The Pirates finished with a season-high 575 total yards, eclipsing 500 yards for the third time this season. They leaned heavily on the air attack with leading rusher Keaton Mitchell sidelined with a hip pointer and Rahjai Harris being limited to 40 yards on 11 carries before leaving late in the fourth quarter with a knee injury.

Freshman Marlon Gunn Jr., used in a couple of late-game mop-up duties, provided some punch with 61 yards on 15 carries, including a 34-yarder.

“We felt very comfortable with him going into the ballgame,” Houston said. “I knew he was ready to play, I could just tell. He’s going to be special, and it was great to see him get some significant carries today.”

But the Ahlers-Johnson combo set the tone as ECU looked laser focused from the outset and delivered an early knockout punch.

Ahlers and Johnson teamed up twice on the opening drive, both converting third downs, as ECU grabbed an early 7-0 lead. The touchdown came on a 60-yarder as Johnson got behind defensive back Jaalen Stokes and hauled in a perfect toss from Ahlers.

The Pirates boosted the lead to 14-0 on their third possession, converting two third downs and a fourth down before Ahlers hit Winstead, a Toledo transfer, with a 22-yard scoring strike.

The Bulls, limited to two yards in their first two possessions, threatened to cut their deficit in half late in the first quarter, but Julius Wood stripped the ball from quarterback Gerry Bohanon at the ECU 2, where Xavier Smith recovered. The Pirates needed just three plays to cash in the turnover, with Ahlers and Johnson teaming up for their second touchdown — this time covering 74 yards.

South Florida countered in just two plays and 47 seconds, scoring on a 91-yard catch and run by Jimmy Horn Jr. that gave Bohanon his first touchdown pass of the season and first of three on the day.

The Pirates controlled the remainder of the half, scoring three more times in the final seven minutes for a 41-7 halftime lead. A 21-yard touchdown catch by Jones capped a seven-play, 71-yard drive, then Harris bulled in from five yards on the first play following a 60-yard punt return by Malik Fleming.

Johnson registered his third touchdown just 18 seconds before the half on a 14-yard toss from Ahlers.

Bohanon and the Bulls, who lost their fourth-straight AAC opener, showed some life in the second half by scoring on their first two possessions to draw within 41-21. Bohanon and Horn (8 catches 180 yards) hooked up for the second time on a 21-yard pass, then Sean Atkins caught a four-yard pass.

Johnson’s nine-yard touchdown catch with 3:40 left in the third quarter briefly stopped the momentum. Bohanon, who completed 18 of 28 passes for 253 yards and rushed for another 74 yards, scored on a one-yard run on the first play of the fourth quarter.

The Bulls, who finished with 455 total yards, threatened to get within two touchdowns after Jayden Curry recovered a Jones fumble at the ECU 35. Clemson transfer Michel Dukes apparently scored as he dove for the pylon, but a review placed the ball inside the one.

ECU then stuffed three-straight plays — their fourth goal-line stand this season. The Pirates stopped N.C. State inside the 2 twice in a 21-20 loss in the opener and stopped Navy at the one on the opening possession last week.

After rebuffering the Bulls, the Pirates were able to run out the clock.

“Thank goodness we finally had a goal-line stand and won the ballgame,” Houston said. “I thought that was the ballgame right there — the goal-line stand and then the drive by the offense.”

NEW ORLEANS, La. — Too many critical mistakes against a quality team playing on its home turf added up a momentum-draining loss for East Carolina on Saturday afternoon.

The Pirates committed two crucial first-half penalties, threw a pair of second-half interceptions and continued to struggle on special teams with a couple of missed kicks in a 24-9 setback to Tulane on a warm and windy afternoon at Yulman Stadium.

The Green Wave pitched a shutout the final 42:08 in remaining unbeaten in American Athletic Conference play at 2-0 and improving to 5-1 overall. The Pirates, looking to build on last week's 48-28 rout of South Florida, drop to 3-3 overall and 1-2 in the AAC with consecutive home games against Memphis and UCF coming up.

"They made the plays and we didn't," fourth-year ECU head coach Mike Houston said. "That's the disappointing thing. We had our opportunities all day. It's frustrating. I thought we played hard, but we just made some mistakes that you just can't make in a tight ballgame."

For nearly every error the Pirates made, Tulane made them pay.

The first came on ECU's second drive and wiped a touchdown off the board. Quarterback Holton Ahlers zipped a nine-yard pass to Ryan Jones, who came into the game with touchdown catches in four consecutive games, but a penalty for an ineligible man downfield wiped it out.

ECU instead settled for a 27-yard Owen Daffer field goal and a 3-0 lead.

Another penalty on the ensuing possession handed the Green Wave the lead. After

Jha'Quan Johnson's 46-yard reception set Tulane up at the 10, the Pirates stymied three plays to apparently force a field goal, but an unsportsmanlike conduct flag on Xavier Smith provided new life.

Two plays later, quarterback Michael Pratt rolled right and flipped a two-yard pass to Tyrick James for a 7-3 lead.

ECU's ongoing kicking woes the surfaced again. A 24-yard pass from Ahlers to C.J. Johnson capped a five-play drive that propelled the Pirates back in front 9-7, but Daffer missed the PAT.

The sophomore kicker, who has now failed on five PAT kicks and a pair of game-deciding field goals, also misfired on a 46-yard attempt to end the half.

Tulane took the lead for a good with a time-consuming, 16-play drive that ended with a five-yard Pratt scamper for a 14-9 lead.

The Green Wave cashed in two Ahlers interceptions into 10 second-half points. ECU's final eight possessions after the second-quarter score resulted in three punts, two turnovers, a missed field goal, turning the ball over on downs, then ending the game at the Tulane 22.

"Tulane's a good football team," Houston said. "They did a great job of executing. I thought Pratt made the big plays down the field in the passing game. I thought their defense did a good job of bend but don't break. They played to keep everything underneath them, so hats off to them. They won the ballgame."

Pratt, despite being sacked five times in the second half, took the upper hand in the battle of veteran quarterbacks. The junior from Boca Raton, Fla., who sat out an overtime win over Houston with an injury, completed 27 of 34 passes for 326 yards and a pair of touchdowns. Six of his completions gained at least 20 yards, including consecutive throws of 33 and 44 yards to Duece Watts to put the Green Wave in the end zone following Larry Brooks' first interception of the year.

Ahlers, pressured often but never sacked, connected on 32 of 51 passes for 288 yards. He now has 12,039 career passing yards to move past Shane Carden as the school's all-time leader. He also now stands first in pass attempts with 1,614.

"I think he did some good things, and I think he made some mistakes," Houston said of his fifth-year senior quarterback. "I don't think it's his best game in his career, and I don't think it's his worst. I would say his day's probably a lot like our team's. You've got to play cleaner, can't make some of those mistakes and have to execute better if we want to win these big ballgames."

ECU's offense lacked some of its firepower with running back Rahjai Harris and receiver Jalen Johnson out with injuries. Running back Keaton Mitchell returned after missing one-plus games with a hip pointer, but never ripped off one of his signature plays.

Mitchell alternated possessions with freshman Marlon Gunn Jr. until Gunn suffered a minor injury. Mitchell finished with 47 yards rushing on 10 carries and caught eight passes for 57 yards while Gunn gained a team and career-high 67 yards on seven carries. He added three catches for 25 yards.

Tulane's physical secondary blanketed ECU's receivers and allowed only two completions more than 20 yards.

"They were showing us drastically different looks every single snap," Houston said. "They were taking away anything down the field for the most part and forcing the ball underneath and to the sidelines. It had to be a game where you had to have some patience and had to execute at a high level, and we didn't do a good enough job."

The Pirates get a chance to change that next Saturday when Memphis comes to town for a 7:30 p.m. kickoff in Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium. The Tigers let a 26-7 lead slip away and fell 33-32 to Houston on Friday.

"We have to grow from this, we have to learn from this," Houston said. "It's frustrating because some mistakes you see repeated, you just can't repeat them."

GREENVILLE, N.C. — East Carolina already experienced a couple of crushing last-second losses on its home field this season. A wild four-overtime victory over Memphis on Saturday night gave the Pirates a chance to celebrate.

After digging out of an early 17-point hole and then letting the lead slip away in the final minute, the Pirates endured an overtime shootout to send a Homecoming crowd home happy with a 47-45 victory. C.J. Johnson's catch of a Holton Ahlers pass put ECU up for good, then an overthrow by Memphis quarterback Seth Henigan sealed it.

"Throughout a season you usually lose one you shouldn't, win one you shouldn't, and then the rest of them kind of balance out," fourth-year ECU Head Coach Mike Houston said. "We've lost a couple I didn't think we should have. You won tonight

against a very good Memphis squad, and you won it in dramatic fashion, so obviously this is an incredible just moral boost to our kids but also a confidence boost." The Pirates dropped their opener 21-20 to NC State and fell to Navy 23-20 in two overtimes the last time they were in Dowdy-Ficklen. Junior defensive lineman Jeremy Lewis certainly did not want to repeat those feelings.

"Losing in overtime, that was a heartbreaker," Lewis said. "You don't ever want to feel that again."

The Pirates avoided that on the strength of momentum-swinging interceptions by Malik Fleming and Julius Wood, a solid performance by senior quarterback Holton Ahlers and the return to form by running back Keaton Mitchell.

Ahlers completed 26 of 34 passes for 304 yards, tied Shane Carden for career touchdown passes at 86 and teamed up with C.J. Johnson on what proved to be the winning points. Mitchell, working his way back from a hip pointer, rushed for 149 yards – 132 of which came after halftime – and scored a career-high three touchdowns. He also had a two-point reception in overtime.

Mitchell now has nine career 100-yard games, including three this season.

"Everybody loves his break-away speed and all that, but the thing I loved about tonight is we talked about dominating the point of contact no matter what position we played this week," Houston said. "I thought he did a great job of running behind his pads; he did a great job of running between the tackles tonight. He made some great moves in the open field, but he also had a lot of plays where he had contact after two or three yards, but he would surge forward for five or six."

Mitchell's 24-yard run in overtime last year proved the difference in a 30-29 win at Memphis. The Tigers (4-3, 2-2 AAC) failed on a two-point gamble to drop that game. Saturday's loss came on the heels of blowing a 22-point lead and falling 33-32 to Houston.

"As long as we win, I don't care," Ahlers said of another OT battle with Memphis. "We won both of them. I told the media after last week's loss we would figure out what type of team we have in that locker room. I already knew what type of team we had, but we showed it there tonight."

Ahlers referenced a 24-9 setback at Tulane last week in which the offense sputtered, and the Pirates appeared to still be slogging along as Memphis shot out to a 17-0 lead. But momentum drastically shifted in the final two minutes of the half.

ECU (4-3, 2-2 AAC), which came up empty on fourth down from the 3 and failed on a fake punt on its previous two possessions, pieced together a 75-yard drive to get on the board, then scored one play after Malik Fleming's interception and return to the Memphis 16.

Ahlers scored the first touchdown on a 3-yard run then zipped a pass to Isaiah Winstead to tie Carden's milestone.

"What a second quarter, I mean holy cow," Houston said. "The drive by the offense, the interception by Malik Fleming, a great defensive call finally getting some pressure on Henigan. Then the return to set us up, and then the strike from Holton to Isaiah Winstead. All the momentum completely swung back going into the half, which I thought was huge."

Wood made sure the surge didn't stop in the second half. After Chris Howard booted the second of his three field goals for a 20-13 lead – he is now 14 of 14 on the year – Wood corralled a tipped pass and weaved his way through arm tackles 47 yards for the tying score. Henigan entered Saturday's game with just one interception this season but threw two against the Pirates.

"We got some pressure on Henigan, and he airmailed the dig route a little bit, and Julius was right there to make the play," Houston said. "We work interception return drill each week, and I thought our kids did a great job of setting up kind of a wall on the sideline and Julius did a great job of getting in the end zone."

Wood, a 6-2 safety in his second year after transferring from Blinn Community College, said he was in the right spot for his second career interception.

"He tipped it, and I just had to go get it out of the air," Wood said. "Once I saw green grass, I knew it was time to go to the house. There were people trying to tackle me while I was on the way there, and they didn't do a good job."

Andrew Conrad, a freshman from Kernersville replacing kicker Owen Daffer, gave ECU its first lead at 23-20 with a 22-yard field goal, but Howard answered with a 46-yard boot.

The Pirates drove for a potential game-winning touchdown with Mitchell slipping in from the 1 for a 30-23 lead with 1:45 go. Henigan, who threw for 407 yards and a pair of touchdowns, didn't flinch and led Memphis 75 yards in eight plays and just 1:26, hitting Joe Scates with a 13-yard scoring pass.

Asa Martin's 9-yard run and Mitchell's 1-yard plunge forced a second overtime. Mitchell put the Pirates on top 43-37 in the second overtime with a 12-yard run, but the required two-point conversion pass failed.

The Tigers needed five plays to answer with Henigan sneaking in from the 1. Martin's run for two never had a chance.

A shootout with one play from the 3-yard line ensued. Memphis scored on a pass from Henigan to Skates for a 45-43. Ahlers, after surveying the field, finally found Mitchell along the right sideline, and he sidestepped a diving attempt by Sylvontan Oliver and tied it.

Ahlers said he was running out of options before finding Mitchell.

"Once you get to that last read, it's either him or you've got to run it or something," he said. "I'm glad he caught the ball and made a play there and got us in the end zone."

In the fourth OT period, Ahlers teamed up with Johnson, who made a spectacular grab with Joshua Hastings draped over his back.

"We hadn't run that play all year," Ahlers said of the winning play. "We hadn't practiced it all year. He runs that route really good, just a slot fade. I told him on the sideline I thought we could have it all game and they waited for the right time to call and obviously he made a great catch."

GREENVILLE, N.C. — If East Carolina never lines up against UCF again, Saturday's thorough 34-13 dismantling serves as an emphatic parting shot.

On a "blackout" night in Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium, the Pirates bruised and eventually buried the explosive Knights with their most complete performance in coach Mike Houston's four-year tenure. The Pirates operated with precision and efficiency on offense, forced four turnovers while playing suffocating defense and dealt a severe blow to the Knights' hopes of a title in their final year in the American Athletic Conference.

UCF heads to the Big 12 next year along with Cincinnati and Houston.

"This is one of the conference games I wanted to win the most," said safety Jireh Wilson, who came up with one interception and recovered a fumble. "Since I've been here, they have beat us four-straight times, they put up 50 a couple of times. This is one of the games I really wanted a lot."

Quarterback Holton Ahlers, who became the school's all-time leader in touchdown passes with 87, shares those sentiments. UCF, playing its first game outside of Florida this season, came in with six consecutive wins in the series and had won in its last four visits to Greenville.

ECU now holds an 11-10 edge in the series.

"We're a senior-led football team," Ahlers said. "We've got a lot of fifth years here and we've been through a lot of stuff. We've been through a lot of losses versus them too. We hadn't beaten them and we took that kind of personal, especially with them going to the Big 12 next year. We wanted to send them off the right way."

The Knights (5-2, 2-1 AAC) may want to erase this one from their memories.

UCF, coming off a 70-13 rout of Temple, strutted in as the league leader in both offense and defense, averaging 41.3 points and allowing just 14.3. The 13 points scored represented a season-low, and ECU became the only team to rack up more than 20 points against the Knights (they surrendered 20 in a loss to Louisville).

A vaunted rushing attack that averaged 261.2 yards per game managed just 130 on 32 carries. Quarterback John Rhys Plumlee threw for 296 yards but was picked off three times — matching the number he had in the previous six games.

An aggressive ECU defense harassed Plumlee the entire evening, keeping him on the run and coming up with four sacks.

On the flip side, ECU frustrated and wore down the UCF defense, piling up 35:11 in time of possession and scoring on six of seven drives after a missed field goal to open the game.

Ahlers, foiling a constant blitz, completed 30 of 36 passes for 311 yards — his 17th career 300-yard-plus performance and the third this season. Running back Keaton Mitchell rushed for 105 yards on 16 carries, reaching the century mark for the fourth time this year and joining four other Pirates with at least 10 career 100-yard games.

He punctuated his night with a 37-yard scoring dash with 3:21 to go that delivered the final blow to the Knights.

Receiver C.J. Johnson prevailed in one-on-one battles throughout the night and finished with 11 catches (one shy of matching a career high) for 140 yards, including a 39-yard touchdown for a 17-0 lead in the first half. Isaiah Winstead continued his stellar play with seven catches for 89 yards and now has at least five catches in every game this season.

"I thought all three phases, our coaches had tremendous game plans," Houston said. "They all worked together, how we wanted to play this game. We wanted to control the ball on offense, we wanted to be aggressive and drive and score. ... We knew we had to try to limit the explosive plays defensively."

The Pirates could not have scripted the first half any better — minus the final 41 seconds — forcing turnovers on UCF's first three possessions and turning all three into points for a 17-0 lead.

ECU missed a chance to take the lead on its first possession when Andrew Conrad's 25-yard field goal bounced off the left upright.

The first turnover came one play after Plumlee overthrew a wide-open Jaylon Griffin for a sure touchdown. As Plumlee tried to hit Kobe Hudson on a slant, Wilson stepped in to give ECU at least one forced turnover in 25 of the last 28 games and suddenly shift the momentum.

"If they score right there to go up seven to nothing or three to nothing, or whatever it really puts them in control momentum-wise, but Jireh was able to get that interception right there was obviously a big start to the ballgame," Houston said.

Wilson now has two picks this season and three for his career.

"We knew they like to run the glance route, but it's not really a staple in their offense like it is for a lot of other teams," he said. "As I came over, I read the quarterback, and he threw it right to me and I had to make a play."

A methodical 16-play drive followed and reached the 11 before stalling, and Conrad came on to boot a 28-yard field goal.

Julius Wood and Wilson combined to stop the Knights' next drive. On second-and-11, Plumlee broke free on a keeper and had picked up a first down, but Wood, who returned an interception for a score in last week's four-overtime win over Memphis, raked the ball out of the quarterback's right hand, and Wilson scooped it up.

The Pirates needed 10 plays and 5:21 to march 80 yards for a 10-0 lead with Ahlers bowling in from the 3 on a third-down run. A 12-yard toss to Johnson on third down and a 24-yard pass to Tyler Savage set the Pirates up at the 10.

Ahlers gained 9 yards on 1st down then scored two plays later.

Malik Fleming's interception of Plumlee on a fourth-and-5 play from the ECU 37 kept the momentum rolling. Ahlers dumped off a quick pass to Winstead against an all-out blitz for a 19-yard gain on third-and-12 then hooked up with Johnson, his former high school teammate, for 39 yards and a 17-0 lead.

The touchdown pass marked 87 for Ahlers, moving him past Shane Carden as ECU's leader.

"Obviously, he's an all-time great here, so I'm just blessed to be in that category," Ahlers said. "But I've just got to keep working. My goal is to win these games. I'll look at the records when it's all said and done."

UCF avoided a shutout in the first half for the first time since Halloween of 2015 against Cincinnati by quickly driving for a Colton Boomer 26-yard field goal as time expired.

The Knights then showed some life coming out of halftime, scoring on a 3-yard run by Isaiah Bowser to get within 17-10, but they could never get the stop they needed.

ECU responded with a nine-play, 75-yard drive with Mitchell scooting in from the 6, boosting the lead to 24-10 and eclipsing the most points UCF had given up all year. Conrad's 26-yard field goal after a UCF punt made it 27-10.

After a UCF field goal, ECU recovered an onside kick, and Mitchell scored two plays later on a 37-yard dash.

Gerard Springer's interception at the 1 polished off the win.

"We talked this morning and we said there were two things we wanted to see: we wanted to see the hands team have to take the field in the fourth quarter, and we wanted the last snap of the game to be the victory offense," Houston said. "... I think that makes it ECU 11, UCF 10, so the next time we see them it will be in our favor before the game. It breaks a little bit of a streak they had going with us. I think getting the win at home in Dowdy-Ficklen, that's pretty special too."

PROVO, Utah – Not even the Friday night magic of BYU and Lavell Edwards Stadium could pull the plug on East Carolina's momentum.

Andrew Conrad's 33-yard field goal as time expired – a low line drive that split the goal posts – gave the Pirates a dramatic 27-24 victory in an intense, back-and-forth duel on a chilly Friday evening with snow-capped mountains in the background.

With its third win in a row and a second straight win over a team headed to the Big 12 Conference next season, ECU improved to 6-3 for the first time since 2014 and secured its eligibility for a bowl berth. BYU came in with a five-game winning streak in Friday night games and had won 23 of its last 24 Friday night games but dropped its fourth straight game this season to fall to 4-5 overall.

"I knew this was going to be a tough environment, and we were going to have to show a lot of character and courage," said fourth-year head coach Mike Houston, who recorded his 100th career win and was presented the game ball in the locker room. "We got punched in the face in the first half, but our kids never flinched and kept battling. What a performance by so many guys right there. This is a huge win for our program, on the road, in a tough environment against a really good football team."

That environment included a boisterous crowd of 55,525 in the stands – by far the largest road crowd of the season – combined with a stiff challenge of BYU's beefy offensive line that paved the way to a nearly eight-minute advantage in time of possession. ECU countered with speed, poise and making the decisive plays at the end.

"What a win in an environment like this," said senior quarterback Holton Ahlers,

who became the school's all-time leader in touchdowns responsible for with 111.

Ahlers ran for a pair of touchdowns to give him 24 for his career, which ties Shane Carden's mark. He added 197 yards passing, completing 15 of 22 passes with no interceptions. He also provided some late-game energy on the sideline as the defense came up with key stops.

"We knew coming into this it was us against the world and that little section with about 200 or 300 people," Ahlers said, referring to the group of ECU fans who traveled to Provo. "I knew we were going to have to use every energy we had. I joked with Coach Houston just now, I said, 'If we went to overtime, I don't know how much energy I would have had left.'"

A third overtime this season looked quite likely as ECU faced a fourth-and-9 from the BYU 48 with less than a minute to play. Houston opted to keep the offense on the field, and the Pirates picked up a first down Kaleb Hayes was flagged for pass interference on a deep ball to Isaiah Winstead.

Houston said he didn't want to punt and give BYU a final chance in regulation.

"Do you want to win the ballgame or not?" he said. "I just thought, on the road, in a tough environment, I thought if we punted it back to them, we took all of our opportunities to win away really until overtime. But you still give them an opportunity with that quarterback to win the ballgame."

Instead, the Pirates handed the ball to freshman Marlon Gunn twice to set up Conrad, who earlier hit from 28 and missed from 42. The freshman from Kernersville came through with his career-long field goal, capping off an evening of matching scores in the first half, fourth-down defensive stands in the second half and a final gamble that paid off.

"He was really ticked at himself for missing the 42-yarder," Houston said. "He hit it good, he just pushed it a little bit. I do have confidence in the kid. He's a gutsy little kid, and he's going to be a really good player."

Conrad's opportunity came thanks in part to another big night from Keaton Mitchell, who cranked out 176 yards on 20 carries for his fifth 100-yard game this season and 11th of his career. Mitchell broke loose for nine runs of at least 10 yards, including three of at least 21.

"All week the coaches were telling us we had to beat them with speed," Mitchell said. They were big up front. You just can't stop speed."

BYU rushed for 244 yards – more than double the 112.4 yards the Pirates have allowed this season but failed on two big fourth-down attempts. The Pirates stuffed a fourth-and-2 play at the 12 early in the fourth quarter then stopped quarterback Jaren Hall on a keeper on fourth-and-1 with 6:47 to play.

"You almost don't believe it when it happens, but it's just our guys," Houston said of his defense, which has turned in five goal-line stands this season. "That quarterback sneak, it was fourth and a yard, and they've been very efficient at that all year, but I thought our guys were able to get the call really quick and knew it was coming. They did a great job of getting underneath the BYU offensive line which was much bigger and stopped the quarterback just short."

There was little stopping either team early as each scored on three first-half possessions to go to the break in a 17-17 tie.

The Cougars took a 3-0 lead on their opening drive, benefiting from a fourth-down roughing penalty before settling for a 36-yard field goal from Jacob Oldroyd.

ECU quickly answered with Mitchell ripping off runs of 11 and 10 yards before scoring on a 31-yard dash.

BYU drove 92 yards in 10 plays to regain the lead, converting three third downs along the way. An offside penalty cost the Pirates' a fumble recovery after Hall coughed up the ball on a hit from Chad Stevens. Lopini Katoa, who rushed for 116 yards, got loose on a 24-yard run for the score and a 10-7 lead.

ECU once again countered, moving into BYU territory on a 52-yard strike from Ahlers to Jsi Hatfield before Conrad booted a 28-yard field goal.

Hall used both his legs and arm to put the Cougars up 17-10, scrambling on consecutive runs of 15 and 23 yards before hooking up with Puca Nacua for a 30-yard touchdown.

ECU averted near disaster on the ensuing kickoff by pouncing on a fumble, then scored on a 1-yard keeper by Ahlers. Mitchell's 35-yard run sparked the drive.

The trading of punches continued in a third quarter that featured just three possessions. Hall tossed a 2-yard pass to Chase Roberts for the score, giving him 21 touchdown passes on the season and putting the Cougars up 24-17.

ECU tied it at 24-24 on a 4-yard run by Ahlers following a 26-yard pass to C.J. Johnson and a 21-yard run by Mitchell.

That's when the defenses made their stands. BYU gambled on fourth down from the 12, opting not to kick a field goal, and was stopped. After Conrad missed from 42, the Pirates stopped another fourth-down try but were then turned away at the 9.

ECU's defense then forced a punt to give the offense and Conrad one last shot.

"That may be the ugliest game-winning field goal in history," Houston said. "We may have topped Tennessee (in its win over Alabama) on that one, but it doesn't matter. It went through the uprights."

CINCINNATI, Ohio – East Carolina's dream of playing for an American Athletic Conference championship and taking down yet another team headed for the Big 12 vanished late Friday night in Cincinnati.

But the inspired Pirates did not succumb without taking the two-time champion Bearcats to the brink before falling 27-25 in a physical, intense and at times nasty slugfest at sold-out Nippert Stadium. ECU erased a 21-5 deficit to forge a 25-24 lead before Ryan Coe's 20-yard field goal provided the deciding points, extending the Bearcats' home winning streak to 32 straight and strengthening their bid to play in a fourth straight AAC title game.

The loss ended a three-game win streak for the Pirates (6-4, 3-3 AAC) and denied them their first win in the Queen City since 2001. Cincinnati (8-2, 4-1 AAC) won its fifth straight over the Pirates and evened the series at 13-13 as it exits to the Big 12, joining league members UCF and Houston.

"It's tough; our hearts hurt," senior quarterback Holton Ahlers said. "All of our goals (were in) winning this game and trying to get to a conference championship, something this team has never done in the American before."

ECU, coming off a bye week after wins over UCF and BYU, did essentially everything it needed to send Cincinnati off to the Big 12 with a departing loss, dominating the favored Bearcats with a short, efficient passing game and stout defense.

The Pirates piled up more yards (454-310), controlled the ball with a 79-57 advantage in plays and 36:43-23:17 in time of possession, and did not commit a turnover. Cincinnati managed a mere 66 yards rushing, and a vaunted defense that led the nation in tackles for loss at 9.0 per game registered only two and did not sack Ahlers.

When the Bearcats did strike, they struck quickly, scoring on a 100-yard kickoff return and passes of 55 and 76 yards.

"You just can't give up those explosive plays and the kickoff return," said fourth-year ECU coach Mike Houston, who dropped to 0-4 against Cincinnati. "That's it. That's the ballgame right there. You can't not make those plays."

Six penalties, including three crucial holding calls, also hampered ECU, one of the least penalized teams in the nation. Another damaging blow came late in the third quarter when a vicious hit – penalized for targeting -- by Bryon Threats knocked dynamic ECU running back Keaton Mitchell out of the game.

ECU scored on the next play to take a 25-24 lead but lost its most potent weapon for the remainder of the game.

Cincinnati limited Mitchell to 34 yards on 10 carries in the first half, but he racked up 78 yards on just six carries in the second half to finish with 112 for his fourth consecutive 100-yard game and the 12th of his career. The sophomore needs just 25 more yards to reach 1,000 for a second straight year and moved up to seventh on the school's career list with 2,550 yards.

Freshman Marlon Gunn Jr. replaced Mitchell and finished 48 yards on 11 carries.

"It hurts us not having him," Houston said of Mitchell. "Obviously he's one of the best players in the league. I thought Marlon came in played very, very well. I'm just really proud of him and how he competed. I just hate losing Keaton like that."

Before Mitchell got cranked up, Ahlers kept the offense moving and finished 26 of 46 for 280 yards with a pair of touchdowns to give him 89 for his career. The left-hander surpassed 3,000 yards for the season (3,012) and 13,000 for his career (13,131). He also passed Shane Carden on the school's career completion list with 1,061.

Cincinnati quarterback Ben Bryant misfired much of the night, completing 14 of 30 passes with one interception, but got the ball in the hands of his playmakers just enough.

A sack of Bryant by Jeremy Lewis staked ECU to a 2-0 lead, then Andrew Conrad knocked through a career-best 47-yard field goal for a 5-0 lead.

The first of the Bearcats' fireworks exploded on the ensuing kickoff when Jadon Thompson bumped into a teammate, slipped through the arms on one Pirate then emerged from a crowd in the middle of the field on the way to a 100-yard return.

Tre Tucker and Tyler Scott then turned short passes into long scoring runs, first Tucker on a 55-yard tunnel screen followed by Scott on a 76-yard slant for a 21-5 lead. Scott finished with seven catches for 140 yards, recording his fourth 100-yard game and ninth touchdown catch this season. He now has 14 scoring catches in his career – all covering at least 20 yards.

ECU answered when C.J. Johnson, who was injured on the game's final play, snared a pass from Ahlers and warded off three defenders for a 72-yard score. Coe's 37-yard field goal with 1:48 left in the half put Cincinnati up 24-12.

The Pirates immediately seized the momentum in the second half, surging ahead 25-24 on Mitchell's 4-yard run and a 15-yard strike from Ahlers to Jalen Johnson.

The Bearcats pieced together what proved to be the winning drive early in the third quarter, driving to the ECU 3 before Coe booted a 20-yarder.

The Pirates' last gasp stayed alive when Ahlers, in the grasp of a Cincinnati defender, flipped a 12-yard pass to Johnson on fourth down. But ECU could not convert a fourth-and-8 from the 41 as Ahlers' pass sailed over the hands of Johnson.

"I thought we just let one get away," Houston said. "They made a couple of plays in the first half. If we make those plays, make the tackle on the kickoff return, it's a different ballgame. The way the kids battled back in the second half, got the lead, we just need to be able to finish it off there at the end."

"We had the ball at the end with a chance to drive and score; just really disappointed we weren't able to score there at the very end," Houston said.

GREENVILLE, N.C. - Senior Day hardly turned out the way Holton Ahlers and his East Carolina teammates envisioned. Instead, they will take solace in the legacy they will leave in bringing the program back to respectability and securing a second straight bowl bid.

But simply was not the Pirates' day.

Houston, behind an unstoppable offense and a shocking effort on defense, crashed the party on a breezy, sun-splashed Saturday afternoon in Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium by rolling to a 42-3 victory. A second consecutive loss leaves ECU 6-5 overall and 3-4 in the American Athletic Conference heading into the regular-season finale at Temple and then a long-awaited bowl trip.

The Cougars (7-4, 5-2 AAC), headed to the Big 12 next season, denied ECU its fifth home win of the year as they extended their streak to four in the series and overall edge to 9-7.

"We just didn't have a good day," Ahlers said moments after walking off the home turf for the last time. "Pretty much everything that could have went wrong went wrong. It was a tough one. I would have done anything to win that game. That's one thing about sports. It doesn't really care about anything. You've got to go out there and show up, and we did not show up."

That particularly irked fourth-year head coach Mike Houston, who leaned heavily on the now-departing seniors to resurrect the program.

"Unfortunately, this is not what they deserve," Houston said. "I hate that perfor-

mance. That's just not ... I hate that performance. This senior class had established a standard, and that's not the way we played. I hate that that was what their Senior Day was."

Senior linebacker Miles Berry certainly did not want to go out this way.

"It was mostly embarrassing for me and the team," he said. "That's just how I feel right now, just to end off like that. But it's not the end of our season."

An expected shootout between two quick-strike offenses and a duel of the league's two most prolific quarterbacks never materialized.

ECU sputtered from the start, punting after consecutive three-and-out possessions then turning the ball over on downs twice in Houston territory as it dug a 21-0 hole that it could not escape.

Ahlers, a Greenville native who stayed home to play for ECU, never found his rhythm and completed just 15 of 35 passes - well below his 68.4 percent average - for a season-low 182 yards. He was sacked twice but faced constant pressure from Houston's aggressive front.

"They were doing some things different than what they had shown on film, but still we've got to be able to handle that," Houston said. "We just had too many one-on-one breakdowns that ended up with too much pressure on the quarterback."

Ahlers did surpass the 3,000-yard mark for the third consecutive year and now has 3,094 for the season. Running back Keaton Mitchell provided the lone offensive threat and rushed for 128 yards on 14 carries for his fifth straight 100-yard game and the 13th of his career. Mitchell also became the first ECU back with consecutive 1,000-yard seasons since Tay Cooper (2012-13), raising his season total to 1,103.

"That shows that maturity, character, focus is in the right place," Houston said of Mitchell. "Guys like that, consistently you know what you're going to get. It was good for him to have another great day today, but I'll promise you he ain't celebrating anything right now. That's not what he wants to be a part of either. None of us do."

A Houston defense that surrendered 36.2 points per game, including giving up 77 in a loss at SMU, and had allowed at least 20 points in every game this season, limited ECU to season-lows of 315 total yards and 13 first downs. ECU converted just 3-of-14 third downs and failed to convert on four fourth-down attempts. A fifth straight game without a turnover and no penalties meant little.

"That was obviously an uncharacteristic performance by our team, and it obviously starts with me," Houston said. "Our mental preparation and our mind-set were not where it has been traditionally, so very disappointed in the performance."

The Cougars, meanwhile, put on a dazzling display of offense behind quarterback Clayton Tune and the receiving duo of junior Nathaniel "Tank" Dell and freshman Matthew Golden. Tune matched a career high with four touchdown passes, completing 32 of 44 passes for 435 yards - his third career 400-yard game.

Dell and Golden combined for 17 receptions for 303 yards. Dell had nine catches for a career-high 176 yards with one touchdown. Golden set career bests with eight catches for 127 yards and a pair of scores.

"Clayton Tune did a really good job, and Houston did a really good job of executing their offense," Berry said. "They found a lot of gaps in our defense, especially passing the ball. Hats off to them."

Tune tossed a pair of first-half touchdowns, and Brandon Campbell scored on a 5-yard run for a 21-0 halftime lead. The Pirates were shut out in the first half for the first time since Dec. 1, 2018, at N.C. State.

A 26-yard pass from Tune to Golden on the opening drive of the second half all but sealed ECU's fate. The Pirates got on the board on Andrew Conrad's 21-yard field goal, extending a string of 310 consecutive games without a shutout but doing little to stop the Cougars' surge.

After two more Houston touchdowns, Ahlers spent the final minutes on the sideline as Mason Garcia took over, then took his final walk out of Dowdy-Ficklen.

"I would do anything to go out there right now and play for a win," Ahlers said. "Obviously it's been a long career here. That 2018 class that came in here to change this thing, we've been through tons of ups and downs. We've been through stuff like this before."

"I'm definitely disappointed in the way we played and disappointed in myself that I couldn't give a win to the seniors who deserve it. I'd do anything for those guys and just appreciate where we got this program."

PHILADELPHIA, Pa. — East Carolina headed north to face Temple with a clear mission: cleansing the bad taste of last week's disappointing Senior Day performance and building momentum for a long-awaited bowl game.

It took a superhuman effort from running back Keaton Mitchell and a clutch game-winning drive to pull it off.

Mitchell put his dazzling speed on display as he matched his career high with 222 yards rushing and scored four times, and senior quarterback Holton Ahlers tossed a 38-yard touchdown pass with 1:11 to play to lift the Pirates to a 49-46 win over Temple before a sparse crowd on a splendid fall afternoon Lincoln Financial Field.

In bouncing back from a 42-3 loss at home to Houston, the Pirates ended a two-game slide and clinched their second consecutive seven-win season. ECU (7-5, 4-4 American Athletic Conference) now awaits its bowl destination and the chance to actually play after Covid canceled last year's Military Bowl.

"To go seven and five this year — I know we're all disappointed that we're not getting ready for the conference championship game next week — but another step forward

by this program and by these seniors," fourth-year head coach Mike Houston said. "It kind of puts last week to bed. We got over it, we played well now. Now we're back in bowl season again this year. Don't know where we're going, but the goal now is to go win a bowl game."

The Pirates escaped despite allowing a season-high 46 points and 575 yards in frenzied shootout that featured 1,109 total yards, 13 touchdowns and seven lead changes. ECU, which led by 11 on three occasions, seized the lead for the final time with an 89-yard drive in the final three minutes, scoring on Ahlers' 38-yard strike to Jaylen Johnson.

Temple (3-9, 1-9 AAC), which came in averaging 19.7 points per game, could not muster a final drive as E.J. Warner's last three passes of a record-setting day fell incomplete.

"What a great job by our offense, winning the ballgame there with that last drive and then the defense getting the stop," Houston said.

Mitchell and Warner traded punches in a big-play bonanza that exploited the deficiencies of each defense and racked up 26 plays of at least 10 yards. Mitchell shredded Temple with his speed and elusiveness on 27 carries, matching the 222 yards and three touchdowns he had against Memphis last season and adding a 73-yard catch-and-run score.

Mitchell eclipsed 100 yards for the sixth straight game and for the 14th time in his career, which ranks third in school history.

"Today coach asked me how many I wanted to get, and I told him 200," Mitchell said. "I've got to have at least one 200-yard game this year. The coaches trusted me, and I trusted the O-line, and we did what we had to do."

Mitchell ripped off six runs of at least 11 yards and scored on runs of 2, 8 and 49. He raised his season total to 1,323 yards, second only to Leonard Henry's 1,432 yards in 2001, and has 2,900 yards for his career, one shy of fourth-place Carlester Crumpler.

Mitchell accounted for 27 of ECU's 32 rushing attempts against the Owls. His last carry sparked the final drive, picking up 22 yards on a third-and-10 from the ECU 36.

"We thought we would be able to run the football, and holy cow, Keaton Mitchell," said Houston, who is 15-5 at ECU with a 100-yard rusher. "I know he had 222 rushing, and then he had the long pass he took for a touchdown. What a day."

"If you get Keaton going, the opponent's in trouble," Houston said.

Perhaps no one appreciates that more than Ahlers, who played through multiple injuries to complete 25 of 37 passes for 314 yards and three touchdowns. ECU did not commit a turnover for the sixth-straight game and yielded just one sack to a Temple team that came in with 37 on the season.

"Keaton Mitchell's special, but that O-line is giving him some holes," said Ahlers, who has passed for 3,408 yards this season and now has 92 career TD passes. "You know Keaton, as long as he gets one hole he's gone."

ECU needed everything Mitchell and Ahlers produced — and more — to overcome a sensational performance by Warner, the son of NFL Hall of Fame quarterback Kurt Warner. The true freshman repeatedly found holes in the Pirates' secondary and set school records for completions with 45 and passing yards with 527. His 63 passing attempts tied a school record, and his five touchdowns fell just one shy of the mark set in 2008.

Warner completed 15 of his passes for at least 15 yards. His scoring tosses covered 6, 15, 21, 38 and 40 yards to four different receivers.

"He is a heck of a competitor," Houston said of Warner. "I've watched him do that to several teams, and I was hoping he wouldn't do that to us. He did a great job of being composed and making the throws. He is going to be a really good player in this league."

Warner's primary target, Jose Barbon, finished with career-bests of 13 catches and 160 yards. Tight end David Martin-Robinson added nine receptions for 93 yards.

For the Pirates, Isaiah Winstead collected a team-high seven catches for 63 yards, boosting him 1,013 for the season and giving the Pirates a 3,000-yard passer, 1,000-yard receiver and 1,000-yard runner in the same season for the first time since 2013.

C.J. Johnson added six catches for 60 yards. Jsi Hatfield ignited the special teams with a pair of big kickoff returns, a 43-yarder to open the game and a 97-yarder that gave ECU a 21-17 edge late in the second quarter.

ECU scored on four-straight possessions after consecutive three-and-outs and led 28-24 at the half but missed an opportunity to extend it when Andrew Conrad's 29-yard field goal attempt sailed wide.

Malik Fleming's interception — the only turnover of the game — provided a glimpse of defense, but the offensive onslaught continued. Temple took its last lead at 46-42 on Martin-Robinson's 15-yard catch with 6:11 to go, then Temple had a chance to put the game away just one yard away from a first down at midfield.

Elijah Morris swatted away a Warner pass on third down. ECU took over at the 11 after a punt, then drove for the winning score. Ahlers fired the decisive pass to Jaylen Johnson after eluding pressure and rolling to his left.

"We work that drill every week, the scramble drill," Houston said. "Holton knows where they are going to be, and Jaylen did a good job of being where he was supposed to, then Holton found him."

Ahlers said he saw Johnson break free as he scrambled.

"You're really not supposed to throw it across your body, but he was wide open," Ahlers said. "I saw the coverage they were giving us, and I knew where he was going to be if I had some time. I threw it up, and he attacked the ball and made a really good play there."
