2022 SPRING NOTEBOOK

BRIAN NEWBERRY NAMED HEAD COACH

- Naval Academy Director of Athletics Chet Gladchuk announced on Dec. 19 that **Brian Newberry** will be the 40th head football coach at the Naval Academy. Newberry has served as the defensive coordinator at Navy for the last four seasons.
- Navy finished third in the nation against the run in 2022, which is even more impressive when you consider it was the only defense ranked in the top 25 that faced 3 of the top-10 rushing offenses in the country. Navy also finished third in fewest first downs allowed, 23rd in sacks, 22nd in fumbles recovered and 32nd in total defense.
- Senior striker John Marshall finished third in the nation in sacks and tackles for loss per game while setting school records for single-season and single-game sacks. Marshall was the only unanimous First-Team All-American Athletic Conference selection in 2022.
- In 2021, the Navy defense acquitted itself well by finishing #32 in the nation in rushing defense, #34 in total defense and #34 in red zone defense. Linebacker Diego Fagot was distinguished with All-America honors, First-Team All-American Athletic Conference and was named All-East. He was also named MVP of the East-West Shrine All-Star Game.
- In 2020, after a slow start due to COVID, the defense finished the year with a flurry, holding Memphis, Tulsa and Army to under 300 yards of total offense. It was the first time a Navy defense had achieved that feat since 1997.
- In 2019, Newberry's first year on the job, Navy made massive improvements on the defense.
- Navy ranked 20th in third down defense (121st in 2018), 10th in rushing defense (90th in 2018), 39th in passing defense (75th in 2018), 16th in total defense (86th in 2018) and 34th in scoring defense (103rd in 2018).
- Newberry, a semifinalist for the Broyles Award, presented annually to the best assistant coach in college football, and his defensive staff installed a "Get 6" culture within the Navy defense that took off. Newberry told the defensive players if they got a combination of six three-and-outs, fourth down stops, turnovers and defensive touchdowns in a game, the Mids would win. In 2019, Navy was 8-0 when it managed to "Get 6."
- The Mids finished 10th in the nation against the run despite facing the #2, #3 and #11 rushing offenses in the country. Navy forced the opposing offense off the field in 3 plays or less in 36 percent of its drives, which was the nation's 10th-best average. Navy also gave up just 15.2 first downs per game, which was tied for third best.
- Prior to his arrival in Annapolis, Newberry served as the defensive coordinator and secondary coach at Kennesaw State from 2015-18, leading the Owls to the FCS quarterfinals in each of his last two seasons.
- Newberry joined the Kennesaw State coaching staff after spending the 2012 season as defensive coordinator at Northern Michigan. Prior to his one season at Northern Michigan, Newberry served as defensive coordinator/linebackers coach at the University of the South in 2011 where the Tigers improved their scoring defense by 16 points per game and total defense by 85 yards a contest.
- Newberry's coaching experience also includes 4 seasons (2007-10) as defensive backs coach at Elon and 5 years (2004-06, 2001 and 2002) as defensive coordinator/defensive backs coach at Washington & Lee. He also served as a graduate assistant/defensive line coach at Rice during the spring of 2004, spent one season (2003) as an assistant defensive backs coach at Lehigh and began his coaching career at Southern Arkansas where he was a graduate assistant coaching the defensive backs and wide receivers in 1999 and 2000.
- In 2004, Newberry's Washington & Lee defense produced a school-record 43 sacks and ranked among the Division III leaders in rushing defense. The Generals' defense led the Old Dominion Athletic Conference in pass defense, rush defense and scoring defense in 2005 and in 2006, Washington & Lee forced 30 turnovers and ranked among the nation's leaders in pass defense.
- Newberry played collegiately at Baylor and graduated in 1998 with a Bachelor of Science in education. He helped lead the Bears to the Southwest Conference Co-Championship and an appearance in the 1994 Alamo Bowl. In 1995, Baylor was ranked #5 in total defense.

BUSIC NAMED FIRST-TEAM ALL-EAST

- Rising senior defensive end **Jacob Busic** was named First-Team All-East by the ECAC last fall.
- Busic finished his junior campaign with 38 tackles, 8.5 tackles for a loss, 6 sacks, forced 2 fumbles and recovered a fumble.

NAVY EARNS 2022 AFCA ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

- Navy, Air Force, Boston College, Northwestern, Stanford, Toledo and Vanderbilt shared the American Football Coaches Association's 2022 Academic Achievement Award, which was presented by the Memphis Touchdown Club.
- All seven schools recorded a 100 percent graduation rate for members of their 2015 freshman football student-athlete classes. The award was presented during the Honors Luncheon at the 2023 AFCA Convention.
- This year's award marks the 11th time the NCAA's Graduation Success Rate (GSR) formula has been used to select the winner. From 1981 to 2007, the award was presented based on a formula used by the College Football Association and the AFCA. From 2008-17, the criteria for the AFCA's Academic Achievement Award was based on the highest NCAA GSR, and a Federal Graduation Rate of 75 percent or better. For 2018 and 2019, the AFCA used the NCAA's single-year APR. The AFCA returns to the NCAA GSR for 2022.
- The GSR is based on a six-year graduation window for student-athletes and holds institutions accountable for transfer students, unlike the federal graduation rate. The GSR also accounts for midyear enrollees and non-scholarship students at schools that do not offer athletics aid. Under GSR calculation, institutions are not penalized for outgoing transfer students who leave in good academic standing. These outgoing transfers are passed to the receiving institution's GSR cohort.
- The Academic Achievement Award was established by the College Football Association in 1981. The award recognized the CFA-member Football Bowl Subdivision institution with the highest graduation rate among members of its football team. When the CFA disbanded in 1997, the AFCA stepped in to present the award.

GIBBONS NAMED ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICAN

- Rising senior safety **Eavan Gibbons** was named a Second-Team Academic All-American by College Sports Communicators. It is the fourth-consecutive year a Navy football player has earned Academic All-America honors.
- Gibbons, who started all 12 games in the fall and recorded 54 tackles, 5 tackles for loss, 1 sack, 1 fumble recovery and 2 forced fumbles, carries a 3.53 grade-point average as an ocean engineering major.
- Gibbons will be among the 9 returning starters next year on a defense that finished third nationally against the run in 2022.

NAVY DEFENSE TOUGH AGAINST THE RUN

- The Navy defense finished the year ranked third in the country against the run, giving up just 88.9 rushing yards per game. It is even more impressive when you take into account Navy played three of the top-nine rushing offenses in the country (#1 Air Force, #2 Army and #9 UCF).
- Navy gave up just 7 rushing touchdowns which was tied for the third fewest in the country.
- The Mids held their opponents to 3.0 yards per carry which ranked sixth nationally. Navy held the opposition to under 100 yards rushing in 7 games in the fall.
- Navy gave up 13 yards on 29 carries to Delaware, 91 yards on 32 carries to Memphis, 103 yards on 28 carries to East Carolina, 200 yards on 47 carries against Air Force (#1 rushing team / avg. 330.9 yds/gm), 25 yards on 18 carries against Tulsa, 105 yards on 21 carries against SMU, 180 yards on 34 carries against Houston, 20 yards on 20 carries against Temple, 55 yards on 20 carries against Cincinnati, 66 yards on 34 carries against Notre Dame, 84 yards on 24 carries to UCF (#7 rushing team / avg. 243.7 yds/gm) and 125 yards on 48 carries to Army (#2 rushing team / avg. 289.4 yds/gm).

- In 2003, Navy led the nation averaging a then school-record 323.2 yds/gm.
- In 2005, Navy led the country in rushing for the second time in three years, averaging 318.7 yds/gm.
- Navy finished the 2006 campaign averaging a nation's-best and then school-record 327.0 yds/gm.
- The Mids rushed for a then school-record 348.8 yds/gm in 2007, becoming the first team in NCAA history to lead the nation in rushing three-consecutive years.

KENT ELECTRIFIES NAVY-MARINE CORPS MEMORIAL STADIUM

- Rising sophomore wide receiver **Nathan Kent** scored on a 70-yard reverse on just his second-career play in Navy's 53-21 win over Tulsa. Kent made a Tulsa player miss in the backfield and then took it to the house untouched.
- Kent is a two-sport athlete for the Mids, as he was also recruited to run track. Kent set the school record at Rocklin High School in Rocklin, Calif. in the 100, 200 and 400-yard dash. Both of his parents were track standouts at Azusa Pacific, including his dad, Roosevelt Jr., who was a three-time All-American triple jumper.

A TRADITION OF EXCELLENCE

- Navy dominates the NCAA record book when it comes to single-season rushing touchdowns by a quarterback.
- Keenan Reynolds ran for 31 touchdowns in 2013, which is the most by a quarterback in FBS history.
- Reynolds is also the NCAA record holder for career rushing touchdowns (by any player) with 88.
- Ricky Dobbs ran for 27 touchdowns in 2009, which is tied with Collin Klein of Kansas State for the second most in FBS history among quarterbacks.
- Will Worth ran for 25 touchdowns in 2016, which is the fourth-most rushing touchdowns by a quarterback.
- Reynolds ran for 24 touchdowns in 2015, which is the fifth-most rushing touchdowns by a quarterback.
- Reynolds ran for 23 touchdowns in 2014, which is tied as the sixth most by a quarterback.
- Malcolm Perry's 21 rushing touchdowns in 2019 are the 11th-most single-season TDs by a QB in FBS history.

HALL SETS ARMY-NAVY GAME RECORD

- Rising junior fullback **Anton Hall's** 77-yard touchdown run against Army was the longest run by a Navy player in the history of the Army-Navy game.
- Hall finished the day with 99 yards rushing on 7 carries.

DABA DABA DO!

- Rising junior fullback **Daba Fofana**, who entered the Tulsa game with 116 career yards rushing and no touchdowns, ran for a 159 yards on 21 carries and scored 3 touchdowns (all career highs).
- Fofana was the first Navy player to rush for over 100 yards since slot back Carlinos Acie rushed for 155 yards in 2021 against East Carolina (Lavatai rushed for 120 yards the next week against SMU).
- He was the first Navy fullback to rush for over 100 yards since Jamale Carothers ran for 188 yards against Houston in 2019.
- Fofana was the first Navy player to score 3 touchdowns in a game since Carothers scored 5 in that same Houston game.
- Fofana rushed for 61 yards on 21 carries the next week against SMU and had 89 yards on 20 carries against Houston. He carried the ball 24 times for 63 yards and a touchdown against Temple.
- Fofana hit the century mark for a second time in 2022, rushing for 133 yards and a touchdown on 15 carries against Notre Dame.
- He followed up the Notre Dame game with another 100-yard day, rushing for 114 yards on 20 carries against UCF.
- Fofana was the team's leading rusher with 769 yards and 6 touchdowns on 186 carries.
- He was the first fullback in the triple-option era to have 20 or more carries in four-consecutive games (21 vs. Tulsa, 21 vs. SMU, 20 vs. Houston, 24 vs. Temple).
- Fofana carries a 3.84 grade-point average as a physics major and plays the cello.

NAVY PLAYS ITS BEST HALF OF FOOTBALL AGAINST NOTRE DAME

- After getting off to a slow start in the first half and falling behind 35-13 against #20 Notre Dame, the Mids put together their best half of football in 2022 and nearly rallied to stun the Irish before losing 35-32.
- Navy outscored Notre Dame 19-0 in the second half, outgained the Irish 166-12 and held them to -26 yards rushing thanks to 5 sacks by the defense.
- The Irish recovered a Navy onside kick with 1:21 remaining to end the Navy comeback.
- The 32 points were the most scored by a Navy team against Notre Dame since 2014 when the Mids scored 39 points in a 49-39 loss at FedExField.
- It was the first time Navy shut out an opponent in the second half since it shut out Army in the second half of 2021's 17-13 win.
- The 66 yards rushing by Notre Dame were its fewest in the series since 2009 when Navy held the Irish to 60 yards on the ground in a game that Navy won 23-21.
- Navy's 363 yards of total offense were the most by the Mids in the series since posting 368 in 2016, a game Navy won 28-27 in Jacksonville.
- Navy's 108 yards passing were the most it has had against the Irish since throwing for 118 in 2014.

NAVY REWARDED FOR ITS MOST COMPLETE EFFORT OF THE YEAR IN UPSET OF UCF

- One week after playing its best half of football, Navy played its most complete game of the year in beating #17 UCF 17-14 in Orlando.
- The Navy offense set the tone early by winning the toss and electing to take the ball for just the second time all year. That move paid off as Navy marched 75 yards in 11 plays, capped off by a one-yard touchdown run by quarterback **Xavier Arline**.
- The Navy defense stiffened in the red zone on two different occasions in the first half, holding UCF to 21 and 31-yard field goals by Colton Boomer.
- The Mids would take a 14-6 into the halftime locker room after moving 84 yards on 13 plays with Vincent Terrell Jr. capping off the drive with an 8-yard touchdown run.
- UCF would tie the game on its first drive of the third quarter, going 75 yards in 5 plays and converting the 2-point conversion to tie the game at 14. But after the initial second half drive, the Navy defense shut down the Knights the rest of the way.
- Striker John Marshall would record the first of his school-record 4 sacks on the very next drive as he hit Mikey Keene from behind, forcing a fumble that was recovered by **Colin Ramos** at the UCF 34-yard line.
- Kicker Bijan Nichols, who was playing in just his second game all year after coming back from a leg injury, converted the UCF fumble into points to give Navy the 17-14 lead.
- The Navy defense would give up just 85 yards of total offense to UCF after the first drive of the second half with **Mbiti Williams Jr.** breaking up a fourth down pass in Navy territory to give the ball back to the Mids with 5:54 left.
- The offense took over from there, picking up 3 first downs to drain the rest of the clock.

- UCF entered the game #8 in the country in rushing offense, averaging 249.5 yards per game, but the Mids held the Knights to just 84 yards rushing. It marked the second time in 2022 Navy has held a top-10 rushing offense well below its season average.
- Navy's 248 yards rushing were the most allowed by UCF all year. Fullback **Daba Fofana** led the way with 114 yards on 20 carries.

NAVY'S BIG OFFENSIVE DAYS AGAINST TULSA AND SMU

- Navy's 53 points against Tulsa were the most by the Mids since scoring 56 at Houston in 2019. The 53 points equaled the Mids' total points scored in its first-four games.
- Navy's 26 points in the second quarter against Tulsa were more points than Navy had scored in each of its first-four games.
- Navy's 455 yards rushing against Tulsa were the 25th most in school history and the most since rushing for 484 yards against Lehigh in 2018.
- Navy's 510 yards of total offense against SMU were the most by Navy since recording 554 yards against Houston in 2019.
- Navy ran 101 plays against SMU, the most since running 106 plays in a triple-overtime loss at Toledo in 2013. The Mids also picked up 32 first downs against the Mustangs, the most since posting 35 in that same Toledo game.

RIETHMAN ON PACE TO SET SCHOOL RECORDS

- Rising junior punter **Riley Riethman** averaged 42.7 yards per punt as a freshman which is the sixth-best punting average in school history for a single-season.
- He averaged 43.8 yards per punt in 2022 which is tied for the third-best average in school history.
- Riethman's 43.2 career average (89 punts, 3848 yards) is currently the best average in school history with a minimum of 50 attempts.
- He has already had two of the five-best single-game performances in Navy history (minimum of 5 punts) averaging 50.6 yards per punt against Notre Dame in 2021 and 50.2 yards per punt against UCF in 2022.

FUTURE ARMY-NAVY SITES ANNOUNCED

- The Army-Navy Football Game presented by USAA, "America's Game," will be played in five different cities over the next five years it was announced by Naval Academy Director of Athletics Chet Gladchuk and Army West Point Director of Athletics Mike Buddie.
- Boston / Foxborough will be the host of the 2023 game on Dec. 9, Washington, DC / Landover, Md. will host the 2024 game on Dec. 14, Baltimore will host the 2025 game on Dec. 13, New York City / East Rutherford, N.J. will host the 2026 game on Dec. 12 and Philadelphia will host the 2027 game on Dec. 11. All five games will be televised nationally by CBS.
- The 2023 game will be hosted in the Boston region in conjunction with the 250th anniversary of the Boston Tea Party and the 225th anniversary of the USS Constitution's maiden voyage. This will be the first time the Army-Navy game has been played in the New England region and Navy will serve as the home team.
- The nation's capital will be the backdrop for the 2024 game, which will also be the 125th playing of the Army-Navy game. This will be just the second time the game has been played in the D.C. region and the first since 2011, a game in which Navy won 27-21. Army will serve as the home team.
- The game will return to Baltimore in 2025 with Fort McHenry, the site where Francis Scott Key penned the lyrics to the national anthem, serving as the backdrop. It will be the seventh time Baltimore has hosted the game and the first time since 2016. The two teams are 3-3 in games played in Baltimore. Navy will serve as the home team.
- New York / New Jersey will host the 2026 game as part of the 25th anniversary of 9/11. It will be the 19th time the game has been played in New York or New Jersey and the sixth time it has been played at the Meadowlands Complex. Navy is 4-1 against Army in games played in East Rutherford, including a 17-13 win in 2021. Army will serve as the home team.
- Philadelphia will host the annual Army-Navy game for the 91st time in 2027. Navy leads the all-time series 45-41-4 in games played in Philadelphia. Navy will be the home team in 2027.

JOHNSON SELECTED TO NATIONAL FOOTBALL FOUNDATION AND COLLEGE HALL OF FAME

- Former Navy football head coach Paul Johnson is the 25th person that either played or coached at the Naval Academy to be selected to the College Football Hall of Fame and the fifth coach joining Gil Dobie (1917-19), William Ingram (1916-18), Wayne Hardin (1959-64) and George Welsh (1973-81).
- Capitalizing on his patented spread option offense – one of the most innovative offensive schemes in all of college football – Paul Johnson took three programs to the top of their respective conferences and the national rankings, winning two national titles, five conference championships and making 18 bowl appearances. The Newland, North Carolina, native now becomes the first coach from Georgia Southern, the fourth coach from Georgia Tech, and the fifth coach from Navy to enter the College Football Hall of Fame.
- In his last stop at Georgia Tech, Johnson went 82-60 during 11 seasons, and the Yellow Jackets appeared in the final national rankings in 2008 (No. 22), 2009 (No. 13), and 2014 (No. 8). He led Georgia Tech to nine bowl games, including two New Year's Six bowls (Orange 2009, 2014). The Yellow Jackets appeared in three ACC Championship games during his tenure and won the ACC Coastal Division four times. His Georgia Tech teams led the ACC in rushing offense every year, and he was named ACC Coach of the Year three times (2008, 2009, 2014). He is the fourth-winningest coach at Georgia Tech behind John Heisman, William Alexander, and Bobby Dodd, who are all in College Football Hall of Fame. He coached two of nine total 10-win seasons and one of five 11-win seasons in Georgia Tech history.
- At Navy, he inherited a program that had gone 1-20 in the previous two seasons. Johnson transformed the program, and during his six seasons in Annapolis, the Midshipmen went 45-29, landing at No. 24 in the Associated Press poll in 2004. He coached Navy to five bowl berths. Johnson went 11-1 in Commander-In-Chief's trophy games, winning five CIC trophies, which represents the annual winner of the Air Force-Army-Navy round-robin. He never lost to Army, going 6-0 against the Black Knights, and in 2007 he led Navy to a victory over Notre Dame for the first time in 43 years.
- In his five seasons at Georgia Southern, the Eagles notched a 62-10 record, making five FCS playoff appearances and winning the FCS championship twice (1999 and 2000). He won the Southern Conference with Georgia Southern every year. He was twice named Southern Conference Coach of the Year (1997 and 1998) while heading the Eagles program. The 1999 team led the nation in scoring, rushing and total offense, and set the NCAA single-season record for average rushing yards per game (419.0) while breaking 197 schools records. Johnson was inducted into the Georgia Southern Athletics Hall of Fame in 2010.
- Johnson coached 11 First-Team All-Americans and one First-Team Academic All-American. He coached 1999 Walter Payton Award winner and 2017 College Football Hall of Fame inductee Adrian Peterson at Georgia Southern and 2010 Burlsworth Trophy recipient Sean Bedford at Georgia Tech.
- Johnson was recognized as the CBS National Coach of the Year in 2008, the Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year in 2004, and the Eddie Robinson Award winner as the I-AA National Coach of the Year in 1998. He was twice named the AFCA NCAA Division I-AA National Coach of the Year (1999, 2000).
- Before becoming a head coach, Johnson served as offensive coordinator at Navy (1995-96), Hawaii (1987-94), Georgia Southern (1985-86) and as defensive line coach at Georgia Southern (1983-84). During his first stint at Georgia Southern, he was part of the coaching team that won consecutive FCS National Championships (1985-86) with the Eagles, and as the offensive coordinator at Georgia Southern, he mentored College Football Hall of Fame inductee Tracy Ham. His coaching career began with roles as an offensive coordinator at Avery County (N.C.) High School from 1979-80 and at nearby Lees-McRae College from 1981-82.
- He has participated in a wide variety of charitable endeavors at each of his schools over the years, including his annual participation in the Bobby Dodd and Chick-fil-A charity golf tournaments, which raises money for the Bobby Dodd Foundation, WinShape Homes and the schools' scholarship funds. Johnson earned his bachelor's degree in physical education from Western Carolina in 1979 and his master's in health and physical education from Appalachian State in 1982.

MCDONALD NAMED SEMIFINALIST FOR JASON WITTEN COLLEGIATE MAN OF THE YEAR

- Rising senior **Xavier McDonald** was among the semifinalists for the sixth annual Jason Witten Collegiate Man of the Year, a group that included 20 of the nation's top leaders in college football.
- Compiled by a subset of the Jason Witten Collegiate Man of the Year Selection Committee, the semifinalists demonstrated a record of leadership by exhibiting exceptional courage, integrity and sportsmanship both on and off the field.
- Sixteen seniors and four juniors made up the list. Among conferences, the Big Ten led the way with six selections, while the ACC had five. The SEC and Pac-12 had three each. The American Athletic had two semifinalists and the Big 12 had one selection.
- McDonald overcame an enormously challenging childhood to become a high achiever in both academics and athletics in high school, while working 30 to 35 hours a week and taking care of four younger siblings. McDonald took on that heavy responsibility as a freshman in high school after both his parents were incarcerated simultaneously. To help support himself and his siblings, McDonald got a job as a cashier at Winn-Dixie. Despite the dire situation, McDonald made it to the United States Naval Academy where he is an operations major. He has played in 19 of Navy's last 22 games and is an assistant tutor for a Thermodynamics class while also completing over 50 hours of community service over the last year.

NAVY SPORTS INFORMATION OFFICE RECOGNIZED BY FWAA FOR THE FIFTH TIME

- Three first-time winners and eight previous ones comprise the 13th Annual Super 11 Awards, which the Football Writers Association of America rewards annually to the best performing sports information departments in the Football Bowl Subdivision.
- Clemson and Colorado each collected a ninth award and Nebraska an eighth. **Navy** won for a fifth time, Kansas State a fourth time, and Iowa, Miami (Fla.) and Ole Miss each a second time. The Navy SID office was also honored by the FWAA in 2016, 2016, 2018 and 2019.
- Sports information offices in some cases were still doing zoom calls for interviews, but there were also many in-person interviews with players, head coaches and assistant coaches observing social distancing and health safety protocols when interacting with the media.
- This year's winners were deemed to have had excellent accessibility during the week of the game and after the game – with a program's players, coaches and assistant coaches – along with the other listed criteria on page 22 of the 2021-22 FWAA Directory.
- FWAA members provided input during the season and made comments in an FWAA Awards survey after the 2021 season. In addition, SID press boxes were judged on how well they were run and maintained in terms of neutrality, pool reporters and noise level that could affect a media person's ability to do his or her job. In recent years, the availability of nearby press parking has become a plus.
- In January 2009, the FWAA formed the first Super 11 Committee. The concept is supported by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). The FWAA has awarded Super 11 to 77 different programs over the years.
- Founded in 1941, the Football Writers Association of America consists of journalists, broadcasters, publicists, photographers and key executives in all areas of college football. The FWAA works to govern media access and game-day operations while presenting awards and honors, including an annual FWAA All-America Team.

Navy finished third in the nation against the run in 2022 (88.9 yards per game), which is even more impressive when you consider it was the only defense ranked in the top 25 that faced three of the top-10 rushing offenses in the country (#1 Air Force, #2 Army and #9 UCF). Navy also finished third nationally in fewest first downs allowed (187), 23rd in sacks (2.8 per game), 22nd in fumbles recovered (11) and 32nd in total defense (339.0 yards per game).

Senior striker John Marshall finished tied for third in the nation in sacks (0.9 per game) and tackles for a loss per game (1.6) while setting school records for sacks in a season (11) and game (4). Marshall was the only unanimous First-Team All-American Athletic Conference selection in 2022 and he was also named the ECAC Defensive Player of the Year.

In 2021, the Navy defense acquitted itself well by finishing 32nd in the nation in rushing defense, 34th in total defense and 34th in red zone defense. Linebacker Diego Fagot was distinguished with All-American honors, First-Team All-American Athletic Conference and was named All-East. Fagot was also named MVP of the East-West Shrine All-Star Game.

In 2020, after a slow start due to COVID, the defense finished the year with a flurry, holding Memphis, Tulsa and Army to under 300 yards of total offense. It was the first time a Navy defense had achieved that feat since 1997.

In 2019, Newberry's first year on the job, Navy made massive improvements on the defensive side of the football.

Navy ranked 20th in third down defense (121st in 2018), 10th in rushing defense (90th in 2018), 39th in passing defense (75th in 2018), 16th in total defense (86th in 2018) and 34th in scoring defense (103rd in 2018).

Newberry, a semifinalist for the Broyles Award, presented annually to the best assistant coach in college football, and his defensive staff installed a "Get 6" culture within the Navy defense that took off. Newberry told the defensive players if they got a combination of six three-and-outs, fourth down stops, turnovers and defensive touchdowns in a game, the Mids would win. In 2019, Navy was 8-0 when it managed to "Get 6."

The Mids finished 10th in the nation against the run despite facing the #2, #3 and #11 rushing offenses in the country. Navy forced the opposing offense off the field in three plays or less in 36 percent of its drives, which was the 10th-best average in the country. The Navy defense gave up just 15.2 first downs per game, which was tied for third best in the country. Safeties Evan Fochtman and Kevin Brennan were named First-Team All-East.

Prior to his arrival in Annapolis, Newberry served as the defensive coordinator and secondary coach at Kennesaw State from 2015-18, leading the Owls to the FCS quarterfinals in each of his last two seasons.

Kennesaw State ranked first in the FCS in fewest first downs allowed per game and second in total defense in 2018. The Owls finished seventh in scoring defense, giving up an average of 15.4 points per game. The Owls also ranked 11th nationally in third down conversion defense.

In 2017, Kennesaw State ranked seventh nationally in scoring defense and third in

turnovers gained. The Owls picked off 24 passes, which ranked second nationally, and led the Big South in rushing defense, pass defensive efficiency and red zone defense, while standing second in sacks (31).

The Kennesaw defense forced an incredible 56 turnovers over Newberry's last two years, including 37 interceptions.

Newberry joined the Kennesaw State coaching staff after spending the 2012 season as defensive coordinator at Northern Michigan.

Prior to his one season at Northern Michigan, Newberry served as defensive coordinator/linebackers coach at the University of the South in Seawann, Tenn., in 2011 where the Tigers improved their scoring defense by 16 points per game and total defense by 85 yards a contest.

Newberry's coaching experience also includes four seasons (2007-10) as defensive backs coach at Elon and five years (2004-06, 2001 and 2002) as defensive coordinator/defensive backs coach at Washington & Lee. He also served as a graduate assistant/defensive line coach at Rice during the spring of 2004, spent one season as an assistant defensive backs coach at Lehigh in 2003 and began his coaching career at Southern Arkansas where he was a graduate assistant coaching the defensive backs and wide receivers in 1999 and 2000.

In 2004, Newberry's Washington & Lee defense produced a school-record 43 sacks and ranked among the Division III leaders in rushing defense. The Generals' defense led the Old Dominion Athletic Conference in pass defense, rush defense and scoring defense in 2005 and in 2006, Washington & Lee forced 30 turnovers and ranked among the nation's leaders in pass defense.

Newberry played collegiately at Baylor and graduated in 1998 with a Bachelor of Science in education. He helped lead the Bears to the Southwest Conference Co-Championship and an appearance in the 1994 Alamo Bowl, as well as a No. 5 national ranking in total defense in 1995.

Newberry and his wife, Kate, are the parents of a son, Max, and a daughter, Lyla.

ASHLEY INGRAM

ASSISTANT HEAD COACH / OFFENSIVE LINE

16TH SEASON AT NAVY

Ashley Ingram is in his 16th year at the Naval Academy coaching the offensive line and his first as the assistant head coach.

Navy has compiled an 109-82 (.571) record during Ingram's tenure, beating Army 10 times, earning 10 bowl bids, winning six bowl games, winning six Commander-In-Chief's Trophies and beating Notre Dame three times. Ingram is also regarded as Navy's top recruiter.

In 2022, Navy finished fourth in the nation in rushing, averaging 241.2 yards per game. The Mids finished third in the country in passing yards per completion (19.0), 25th in fourth down conversions (.605) and second in time of possession (34:38).

In 2021, Navy managed to have the ninth best rushing offense in the country (225.5 yards per game) despite facing six of the top 35 defenses in the country, including three of the top 10. On top of the tough schedule, Navy had to start five different offensive tackles, five different guards and three different centers due to injury. Senior center Pierce Banbury was named All-East.

In 2019, Navy had one of the greatest seasons in school history, winning a school-record tying 11 games against just two losses, winning the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy, sharing the American Athletic Conference West Division title with Memphis and winning the prestigious Liberty Bowl. The Mids' eight-game improvement from 2018 was the second-biggest turnaround in FBS history.

The Mids finished the 2019 campaign ranked 20th in both the *Associated Press* and *USA Today* Coaches Polls. It marked just the second time in the last 56 years that Navy finished in the AP Top 20 (18th in 2015).

A big part of that success was a Navy offense that set school records for total rushing yards (4,687), rushing yards per attempt (6.1), rushing yards per game (360.5), total offense yards per game (455.8) and tied the record for total offensive yards per attempt (6.8). The Mids also led the nation in rushing thanks to an offensive line that will go down as one of the best in school history.

The Mids were also prolific in the passing game, finishing second in the country in average yards per catch (22.51) and seventh in passing efficiency (176.92).

Senior guard David Forney was named First-Team All-American Athletic Conference, while junior offensive tackle Billy Honaker was named Honorable Mention. Forney and senior center Ford Higgins were named First-Team All-East.

Navy finished the 2017 campaign with a 7-6 record, which included a 49-7 rout of Virginia

in the Military Bowl. The 42-point margin of victory was the largest by a Navy team over a team from the autonomy 5 since the Mids beat West Virginia 51-7 in the 1963 season opener. The Mids played eight games against teams that went to a bowl game and played five teams that won 10 or more games. The offense set a school record by averaging 351.4 yards per game.

Navy finished the 2016 campaign with a 9-5 mark and a 7-1 record in the American Athletic Conference despite a season that saw the Mids have 102 missed games by starters or key contributors. The Mids played Temple in the AAC Championship Game and played in a bowl game (Armed Forces) for the 13th time in the last 14 years. The nine wins tied for the fifth most in school history and the team set school records for points (531), touchdowns (73), touchdowns per game (5.2), rushing touchdowns (61), total offense (6,136 yards) and yards per play (6.8) despite playing four different quarterbacks.

Senior offensive guard Adam West was Navy's lone selection on the All-AAC First Team, while senior center Maurice Morris was named to the second team. West was named to the First-Team All-East squad, while Morris and junior guard Evan Martin were named Second Team All-East.

In 2015, Navy won a school-record 11 wins against just two losses, qualified for a bowl game for the 12th time in the last 13 years, won a bowl game for the 10th time in school history (beat Pittsburgh 44-28 in the Military Bowl), won a bowl game for a third straight year for the first time in school history, defeated Army for a series-record 14th consecutive year, won the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy for the third time in the last four years, won the Lambert Trophy as the best team in the East for the first time since 1963, finished 18th in the country in both the Associated Press and Coaches polls and shared the West Division title of the American Athletic Conference with Houston in Navy's first year of being in a conference after being an Independent for 134 years.

Offensive guard E.K. Binns was named a 2015 CoSIDA Second Team Academic All-American and was a finalist for the National Football Foundation Scholar Athlete of the Year award. Binns was named First-Team All-American Athletic Conference and First-Team All-East.

Navy finished the 2014 campaign with an 8-5 record, qualified for a bowl game, won a bowl game (beat San Diego State 17-16 in the Poinsettia Bowl), won a bowl game in back-to-back years for the second time in school history and defeated Army for a series-record 13th consecutive year.

Navy finished the 2013 campaign with a 9-4 record, won the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy for the ninth time in the last 11 years, qualified for a bowl game, won a bowl game (beat Middle Tennessee 24-6 in the Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl) and defeated Army for a series-record 12th consecutive year.

Guards Jake Zuzek and E.K. Binns were named to the All-Independent and All-East team, while Binns was named Capital One Academic All-District.

Ingram helped lead Navy to an 8-5 record in 2012 and a berth in the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl. Navy defeated Air Force 28-21 in overtime and Army 17-13 to win the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy.

In 2011, guard John Dowd was named a First-Team Academic All-American for the second-consecutive year making him the first Two-Time First-Team Academic All-American in school history.

The Mids posted an impressive 9-4 record in 2010, defeated Army, defeated Notre Dame in consecutive seasons for only the third time in school history and appeared in a bowl game for the eighth-straight year.

The 2009 season was one to remember, as the Mids tied a school record for wins with 10, won a school-record seventh-consecutive Commander-In-Chief's Trophy, appeared in a school-record seventh-consecutive bowl game and ran their winning streak against the other two Service Academies to an amazing 15-straight games. The Mids capped the season off with a 35-13 rout of Missouri in the Texas Bowl.

The Mids posted an 8-5 record in 2008 and participated in the EagleBank Bowl. The Mids won the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy thanks to a 33-27 victory over Air Force and a 34-0 win over Army.

Ingram came to Navy from Bucknell, where he served as the offensive coordinator and offensive line coach for two seasons.

In Ingram's first year as offensive coordinator at Bucknell in 2006, the Bison went from one win the previous year to six and ranked fifth in the nation in rushing offense, averaging 235.2 yards per game, and reduced their turnover total from 33 the previous season to 14.

Prior to Bucknell, Ingram was at Rhode Island where the Rams led the Atlantic 10 in rushing five of his six seasons and finished second in the nation in rushing yards in 2003.

A native of Iron City, Ga., and a 1996 graduate of the University of North Alabama, Ingram was a four-year letterman on the offensive line and helped his team win Division II national titles in 1993, 1994 and 1995. He entered the coaching ranks as a graduate assistant, first at North Alabama in 1997, then at Temple University in the spring. After spending a year at

NorthCobb High School in Kennesaw, Ga., in 1998, he became the offensive line coach at the University of West Alabama in 1999, then at Rhode Island in 2000.

Ingram and his wife, Jenifer, are the parents of a daughter, Laura, and two boys, James and William.

GRANT CHESNUT

**OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR / OFFENSIVE LINE
FIRST SEASON AT NAVY**

Grant Chesnut is in his first year at the Naval Academy where he will serve as the offensive coordinator and will also coach the offensive line. Chesnut comes to Navy from Kennesaw State where he had been the offensive coordinator and offensive line coach since 2014.

Chesnut has been at Kennesaw State since 2013 when the program was started under former Navy assistant Brian Bohannon. Behind a spread option offense, the Owls have produced impressive offensive numbers that have helped Kennesaw State to an overall record of 68-24 and five wins in the FCS playoffs.

Kennesaw State has ranked in the top three in the FCS in rushing offense in six of the last seven years, including leading the nation in 2017 and 2019. The Owls set the program record with 352.9 rushing yards per game on the ground in 2018, which was good for second in the nation.

In 2021, Chesnut's offense ranked third in the FCS in rushing yards per game and helped produce All-American quarterback Xavier Shepherd. With Chesnut's play calling, Shepherd led the FCS in rushing touchdowns with 23 and also set school records for passing yards in a season (1,341), passing touchdowns in a season (15) and passing touchdowns in a single game (4).

Shepherd was named a STATS Perform FCS First Team All-American, HERO Sports First-Team All-American and Associated Press Third-Team All-American.

After losing 10 of 11 starters on offense from the 2018 team, Chesnut's biggest challenge came in 2019 and he did not disappoint, leading Kennesaw State to the No. 7 scoring offense in the country at 37.9 points per game and the No. 1 rushing attack in the nation at 342.4 yards per contest. The Owls set the school record for rushing touchdowns in a season with 58 as KSU recorded its third-straight 11-win season and made a third-straight appearance in the FCS Playoffs where it knocked off No. 11 Wofford in the opening round.

Chesnut's young offensive line grew up over the course of the 2019 season and blocked for a rushing offense that recorded 400+ rushing yards in a game four times, including a season-high 490 yards against North Alabama.

Led by back-to-back Big South Offensive Player of the Year and Walter Payton runner-up Chandler Burks, the Owls racked up 5,902 yards of total offense in 2018, their second-straight season with over 5,500 yards of offense.

KSU's 2018 success came off a 2017 season in which the Owls ran for an FCS-leading 330.2 yards per game, finishing second in the country in total offense (435.1 yards) and touchdowns (53), all while limiting turnovers to tout the nation's best turnover margin (1.64).

In the much-anticipated 2015 inaugural season, KSU rolled from the get-go, putting up the fifth-highest single-season rushing yards (3,398) in Big South history, rushing for five 300-yard games on the year. The Owls' offense scored 56 points at East Tennessee State in KSU's inaugural game.

A native of Snellville, Ga., Chesnut has been associated with winning programs throughout his career, and prior to taking over as head coach at Central High School he was recognized by the Atlanta Journal Constitution as one of the Top 10 Hires of 2011. His 2013 squad at Central advanced to the Georgia state playoffs for the first time in 10 years.

Chesnut was the offensive coordinator, offensive line and strength and conditioning coach

at Class AAA Mary Persons from 2007-10, the defensive line coach at Camden County High School (2005-06), the co-defensive coordinator and defensive line coach at Thomasville High School (2002-04) and the offensive line coach at Pickens County High School (1999). Chesnut also was a defensive line coach at Presbyterian College in Clinton, S.C. for two seasons (2000 and 2001), where the Blue Hose went a combined 15-6 (.714).

He began his coaching career as the running backs coach and recruiting coordinator at Thiel College.

From there, he joined the staff at Thomas More College in Kentucky, where he coached the linebackers and served as the program's recruiting coordinator.

He is married to the former Amanda Naseef, and the couple has two daughters, Rosie and Ella.

ERIC LEWIS

DEFENSIVE PASSING GAME COORDINATOR / SAFETIES FIRST SEASON AT NAVY

Eric Lewis is in his first year at the Naval Academy serving as the safeties coach and defensive passing game coordinator.

Lewis comes to Navy from Bowling Green, where he had been the secondary coach for the last three years and the defensive coordinator for the last two seasons.

This past year, he helped lead the Falcons to the Quicken Lanes Bowl as the Bowling Green defense tied a school record and finished 16th in the nation with 38 sacks. Defensive end Karl Brooks finished with 10 sacks, which was tied for 13th in the nation and third in school history. Brooks was a First-Team All-American by Pro Football Focus and was PFF's top graded edge rusher in the nation.

In 2021, Lewis' first as the defensive coordinator, the BGSU defense led the MAC as it recorded its best season defensively since 2013, allowing opponents only 373.7 yards per game.

Lewis joined Bowling Green following a stint coaching the defensive backs at Boston College in 2019 and coaching the secondary at Colorado State in 2018.

While at Colorado State Lewis helped the team improve 28 spots nationally in pass defense.

Lewis was a quality control assistant at Tennessee in 2017 after spending the 2015 and '16 seasons at Georgia State. While at Georgia State, Lewis' 2016 secondary ranked sixth in the NCAA in passing efficiency defense and eighth in passing defense, while allowing the fewest passing touchdowns in FBS (8).

In 2015, his Georgia State team was the most improved defense in the country in terms of scoring defense (allowing 15 points per game fewer than the previous season), rush defense and passing defense efficiency.

Other stops for Lewis include the secondary coach at Buffalo (2014), defensive coordinator at Weber State (2012-13), defensive coordinator at Eastern Michigan (2009), cornerbacks coach at Louisville (2008), defensive quality control coach with the Green Bay Packers (2006-07), safeties coach at Ball State (2003-05), defensive backs coach at Bucknell (2002) and graduate assistant at Michigan State (2001).

Lewis earned his bachelor's degree in business administration (finance) from San Diego State, having played for the Aztecs from 1994-98. He was a 2014 inductee into the St. Francis High School Hall of Fame. Lewis was a four-year starter at San Diego State and finished as the Aztecs' all-time leader in career pass pickups.

"I'm very excited to welcome Ricky Brown and his family to Annapolis," said Newberry. "Coach Brown is an outstanding coach and person that will be a great fit with our players and staff. He brings a wealth of knowledge and expertise coaching special teams and outside linebackers. He has coached and played at the highest levels."

"My family and I are very excited to join the Naval Academy football program," said Brown. "I have always admired the Navy football program and I have competed against them as both a player and coach. The Naval Academy is a special place and we are very fortunate to join Coach Newberry's staff."

Brown is coming to Navy from Tulsa, where he was hired by new head coach Kevin Wilson in January as the special teams coordinator and defensive assistant.

Prior to Tulsa, Brown spent one season at Cincinnati as the special teams quality control coach (2022) and two years at Ohio State (2020-21) in the same role.

Prior to coaching at Ohio State, Brown was on the staff at his alma mater, Boston College, from 2016-19. He served in a quality control role on defense and special teams in 2016 before being promoted to special teams coordinator and outside linebackers coach in 2017 for his final three seasons in Chestnut Hill.

In Brown's first season back at Boston College, the defense recorded 47 sacks to rank fourth in the NCAA, while the BC special teams ranked seventh for opponent kickoff return average and 10th for punt returns. In 2017, his special teams unit ranked 11th in the nation in punt returns (13.11 avg.) and 22nd for kickoff return yards (946 yards), while ranking 26th in special teams efficiency.

A year later (2018), Brown coordinated a unit that ranked first nationally with three punt returns for touchdowns, was fifth with five blocked kicks, 16th for average punt return yards, 19th for average kickoff return yards and 30th in special teams efficiency.

Brown began his coaching career in a quality control role on defense at USC from 2014-15. In 2015, USC won the Pac-12 South title and made a second-consecutive appearance in the Holiday Bowl.

Before moving into the coaching profession, Brown worked for Morgan Stanley as a wealth advisory associate in Los Angeles following seven years in the NFL, playing for the Oakland Raiders, New England Patriots and Baltimore Ravens. Brown entered the NFL as an undrafted free agent.

Brown's collegiate career spanned from 2002-05 at Boston College. The outside linebacker was the winner of the Scanlan Award in 2005, the highest honor bestowed upon a BC football player, which recognizes accomplishments on the field, in the classroom and in the community. In four seasons, he recorded 184 tackles (118 solo) with 4.5 sacks. The Cincinnati, Ohio native graduated with a degree in finance in 2006.

Brown and his wife Brynne have two daughters, Brixton (11) and Koby (6), and a son, Niko (9).

**CORNERBACKS
11TH SEASON AT NAVY**

Robert B. Green is in his 11th season at the Naval Academy and his ninth as a coach on the field. He currently serves as the Mids' cornerbacks coach.

Navy finished third in the nation against the run in 2022 (88.9 yards per game), which is even more impressive when you consider it was the only defense ranked in the top 25 that faced three of the top-10 rushing offenses in the country (#1 Air Force, #2 Army and #9 UCF). Navy also finished third nationally in fewest first downs allowed (187), 23rd in sacks (2.8 per game), 22nd in fumbles recovered (11) and 32nd in total defense (339.0 yards per game).

In 2021, despite playing one of the toughest schedules in the country, the Navy defense acquitted itself well by finishing 32nd in the nation in rushing defense (130.4 yards per game), 51st in passing defense (218.2 yards per game), 34th in total defense (348.6 yards per game) and 34th in red zone defense (.778). Cornerback Michael McMorris tied for fourth

in the country in forced fumbles with five and was invited to the FBS All-American Tropical Bowl.

In 2020, after a slow start, the Navy defense finished the year with a flurry, holding Memphis (205 yards), Tulsa (296) and Army (162) to under 300 yards of total offense. It was the first time a Navy defense had achieved that feat since 1997 when the Mids did it seven-consecutive games.

In 2019, Navy had one of the greatest seasons in school history, winning a school-record tying 11 games against just two losses, winning the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy, sharing the American Athletic Conference West Division title with Memphis and winning the prestigious Liberty Bowl. The Mids' eight-game improvement from 2018 was the second-biggest turnaround in FBS history.

The Mids finished the 2019 campaign ranked 20th in both the *Associated Press* and *USA Today* Coaches Polls. It marked just the second time in the last 56 years that Navy finished in the AP Top 20 (18th in 2015).

A big part of that turnaround was the massive improvement Navy showed on the defensive side of the football as the Mids improved in every major category.

Navy finished the 2019 campaign ranked 20th in third down defense (121st in 2018), 10th in rushing defense (90th in 2018), 39th in passing defense (75th in 2018), 16th in total defense (86th in 2018), 34th in scoring defense (103rd in 2018), 68th in pass efficiency defense (117th in 2018), 55th in sacks (129th in 2018) and 53rd in tackles for a loss (129th in 2018).

The defensive staff, led by then-coordinator Brian Newberry, installed a "Get 6" culture within the Navy defense that took off. Newberry told the defensive players if they got a combination of six three-and-outs, fourth down stops, turnovers and defensive touchdowns in a game, the Mids would win. In 2019, the Mids were 8-0 when they managed to "Get 6."

The Mids finished 10th in the nation against the run, giving up just 105.8 yards per game, despite facing the #2, #3 and #11 rushing offense's in the country. The Mids forced the opposing offense off the field in three plays or less in 36 percent of its drives, which was the 10th best average in the country. The Navy defense gave up just 15.2 first downs per game, which was tied for third best in the country.

Navy finished the 2017 campaign with a 7-6 record, which included a 49-7 rout of Virginia in the Military Bowl. The 42-point margin of victory was the largest by a Navy team over a team from the autonomy 5 since the Mids beat West Virginia 51-7 in the 1963 season opener. The Mids played eight games against teams that went to a bowl game and played five teams that won 10 or more games.

The defense improved in all four major categories in 2017: against the run (154.5 yards per game in 2017), the pass (215.8 yards per game), total defense (370.3 yards per game) and scoring defense (26.3 points per game).

Navy finished the 2016 season with a 9-5 mark and a 7-1 record in the American Athletic Conference despite a season that saw the Mids have 102 missed games by starters or key contributors. The Mids played Temple in the AAC Championship game and played in a bowl game (Armed Forces) for the 13th time in the last 14 years. The nine wins tied for the fifth most wins in school history. Outside linebacker DJ Palmore was named First-Team All-East.

Navy finished the 2015 campaign with a school-record 11 wins against just two losses, qualified for a bowl game for the 12th time in the last 13 years, won a bowl game for the 10th time in school history (beat Pittsburgh 44-28 in the Military Bowl), won a bowl game for a third straight year for the first time in school history, defeated Army for a series-record 14th consecutive year, won the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy for the third time in the last four years, won the Lambert Trophy as the best team in the East for the first time since 1963, finished 18th in the country in both the *Associated Press* and *Coaches* polls and shared the West Division title of the American Athletic Conference with Houston in Navy's first year of being in a conference after being an Independent for 134 years.

As a team, the defense finished the 2015 season ranked 32nd in rushing defense (143.0), 40th in total defense (364.9), 26th in scoring defense (21.8), 12th in red zone defense (.737), 13th in turnovers gained (27), first in fumbles recovered (15) and third in turnover margin (+1.46).

Green spent his first two years as the Director of Player Development assisting Coach Niumatalolo and the officer representatives with professional development and molding of Navy football players to assume future positions of leadership in the Navy and Marine Corps.

Green is a 1998 graduate of the Naval Academy where he was a four-year letterwinner and three-year starter on the football team as a defensive back. During the 1996 campaign Navy fashioned its best record since 1978 at 9-3 and registered a 42-38 victory over California in the Aloha Bowl. Consequently, Green was named to the Blue-Gray All-Star Football Classic and was an All-Independent selection.

Green was born and raised in Atlanta, Ga., where he attended Booker T. Washington High School. After graduation, Green attended the Naval Academy Preparatory School in Newport, R.I. before moving on to the Naval Academy. He was commissioned a Second

Lieutenant in the Marine Corps in May 1998, having completed his undergraduate education at the Naval Academy.

Following The Basic School and the Logistics Officer Course, he was assigned to 9th Communication Battalion, 1st Marine Expeditionary Force Headquarters Group in July 1999. During this tour, Green served as the S-4 Alpha, Maintenance Management Officer, and Headquarters Company Commander.

Ordered to Okinawa in June 2002, Green was transferred to Marine Aviation Logistics Squadron 36, 1st Marine Aircraft Wing, Camp Futenma, Japan, where he served as the S-4 Officer.

Upon arriving at 2nd Marine Division Headquarters, Green was immediately deployed to Operation Enduring Freedom and assigned as the Logistics Officer for Regional Support Command - Southwest, NATO Training Mission - Afghanistan at Camp Leatherneck. DEFENSIVE LINE

FIFTH SEASON AT NAVY

Jerrick Hall enters his fifth year at Navy as the defensive line coach. In his first three years he coached the nose guards and defensive tackles and last year he added the defensive ends to his responsibilities.

Navy finished third in the nation against the run in 2022 (88.9 yards per game), which is even more impressive when you consider it was the only defense ranked in the top 25 that faced three of the top-10 rushing offenses in the country (#1 Air Force, #2 Army and #9 UCF). Navy also finished third nationally in fewest first downs allowed (187), 23rd in sacks (2.8 per game), 22nd in fumbles recovered (11) and 32nd in total defense (339.0 yards per game).

Defensive end Jacob Busic was named First Team All-East. Busic finished with 38 tackles, 8.5 tackles for a loss, 6 sacks, forced 2 fumbles and recovered a fumble while teaming up with Marshall to give Navy one of its best pass rushing duos since 2005 when Tyler Tidwell (10) and David Mahoney (8) combined for 18 sacks.

Hall is a 16-year coaching veteran and was a standout player at North Carolina State. He came to Navy from Elon, where he was an assistant for five years in two different stints.

Hall returned to Elon in 2017 and immediately helped the Phoenix to one of the biggest turnarounds in the FCS going from 2-9 the year before to 8-4 and a berth in the FCS playoffs.

In 2018, Elon finished 6-5 and made the FCS playoffs for a second-straight year.

One of Hall's pupils, Marcus Willoughby, recorded 117 tackles over two seasons and was named All-CAA. The Phoenix ranked 15th in the country in quarterback sacks, averaging almost three per game. In 2017, Elon's defensive line was responsible for 18 of the team's 31 sacks. Willoughby signed a free agent contract with the Baltimore Ravens in the spring.

Hall was the defensive line coach at Fordham in 2015 and 2016 and helped the Rams to a two-year record of 17-6.

The Fordham defense led the Patriot League and ranked 10th nationally in both turnovers gained and fumbles recovered in 2015. In 2016, Fordham ranked sixth nationally in passing efficiency defense and seventh in turnover margin. Justin Vaughn was an All-Patriot League selection in 2016 and went on to play in the CFL with the Hamilton Tiger-Cats.

Hall spent the 2014 season at the University of New Haven where he helped guide the Chargers to a 6-3 mark in the Northeast 10. New Haven finished 18th in Division II in rushing yards allowed per game and fourth in tackles for loss per game. One of Hall's players, Drake Harris, was named all-conference in the NE10.

Prior to his year in New Haven, Hall spent four seasons at Elon. In 2011, Hall mentored a defensive line that amassed 141 total tackles, 26.5 tackles for loss and 6.5 sacks. With a young line in 2012, Hall's unit recorded 6.5 of Elon's 16 sacks. Both Jordan Gibson and Brandon Brant were named All-Southern Conference.

From 2007-09, Hall helped coach Campbell University's defensive unit. During that stretch, the 2009 squad tallied 50 tackles for loss, including 12 sacks. Three of the 2008 squad's defensive linemen ranked among the top-25 linemen in the league in tackles per game.

Prior to joining the Fighting Camels, Hall spent three seasons coaching at his alma mater, N.C. State, where he was responsible for defensive film breakdown, scouting reports, coaching the offensive scout team and working with the defensive line. During his tenure, Hall worked with four first-round NFL draft picks, including Mario Williams - the first overall pick in the 2006 NFL Draft.

A 2004 graduate of N.C. State, Hall was a four-year letter winner for the Wolfpack as a defensive tackle and helped the program to three bowl game appearances, including a win over Notre Dame in 2002 Toyota Gator Bowl. His defensive coordinator at N.C. State was former Navy defensive coordinator Buddy Green. He earned a bachelor's degree in Park Recreation and Tourism Management in 2004 and completed his master's degree in Liberal Studies in 2007.

Hall and his wife, Ashley, have four children, twins Ayden and Avery and twins Joshua and Jordan. Ayden will be a sophomore at the Naval Academy this fall and is a member of the football team.

IVIN JASPER QUARTERBACKS / FULLBACKS 24TH SEASON AT NAVY

Ivin Jasper is entering his 24th year at the Naval Academy coaching the quarterbacks and will also coach the fullbacks in 2023, which he also did in 1995 and 1996 when he assisted Paul Johnson with both positions. Over the last 20 years, Jasper has been an integral part of a coaching staff that brought the Midshipmen back into the national spotlight with a 152-102 (.598) record, 15 bowl games, 11 Commander-In-Chief's Trophies and a 15-5 mark against Army.

Navy has won at least nine games eight times in the last 20 years. Before the current streak, Navy had won nine or more games just five times in the previous 77 seasons.

Jasper's quarterbacks rank first (Keenan Reynolds, 31), second (Ricky Dobbs, 27), fourth (Will Worth, 26), fifth (Reynolds, 24), sixth (Reynolds, 23) and 11th (Malcolm Perry, 21) on the FBS single-season rushing touchdowns list by a quarterback. Reynolds is also the FBS record holder for career rushing touchdowns by any player with 88.

In 2022, Navy finished fourth in the nation in rushing, averaging 241.2 yards per game. The Mids finished third in the country in passing yards per completion (19.0), 25th in fourth down conversions (.605) and second in time of possession (34:38).

In 2021, Navy managed to have the ninth-best rushing offense in the country (225.5 yards per game) despite facing six of the top-35 defenses in the country, including three of the top 10. On top of the tough schedule, Navy had to start five different offensive tackles, five different guards and three different centers due to injury.

In 2019, Navy had one of the greatest seasons in school history, winning a school-record tying 11 games against just two losses, winning the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy, sharing the American Athletic Conference West Division title with Memphis and winning the prestigious Liberty Bowl. The Mids' eight-game improvement from 2018 was the second-biggest turnaround in FBS history.

The Mids finished the 2019 campaign ranked 20th in both the *Associated Press* and *USA Today* Coaches Polls. It marked just the second time in the last 56 years that Navy finished in the AP Top 20 (18th in 2015).

A big part of that success was a Navy offense that set school records for total rushing yards (4,687), rushing yards per attempt (6.1), rushing yards per game (360.5), total offense yards per game (455.8) and tied the record for total offensive yards per attempt (6.8). The Mids also led the nation in rushing.

The Mids were also prolific in the passing game, finishing second in the country in average yards per catch (22.51) and seventh in passing efficiency (176.92).

Quarterback Malcolm Perry was simply sensational under the tutelage of Jasper, rushing for a school-record 2,017 rushing yards, which is the most in FBS history by a quarterback and the 24th most in FBS history by a player at any position in a single season. Perry also set school records for rushing yards per game (155.1), total offense (238.5 yards per game) and passer rating (181.5). Perry led the country in explosive runs (runs of 20 yards or more) with 26. He was named the American Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year, the ECAC Offensive Player of the Year and the Liberty Bowl Most Valuable Player.

Perry rushed for an Army-Navy Game record 304 yards and two touchdowns in Navy's 31-7 rout of Army as he helped bring the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy back to Annapolis for the 16th time in school history. Perry capped his career in the Liberty Bowl by rushing for 213 yards on 28 carries in Navy's 20-17 win over Kansas State. In the final four games of his illustrious career, Perry rushed for 858 yards and five touchdowns on 113 carries (214.5 yards per game). Perry also set the school record for passer rating (181.6).

Navy finished the 2017 campaign with a 7-6 record, which included a 49-7 rout of Virginia in the Military Bowl. The 42-point margin of victory was the largest by a Navy team over a team from the autonomy 5 since the Mids beat West Virginia 51-7 in the 1963 season opener. The Mids played eight games against teams that went to a bowl game and played five teams that won 10 or more games. The offense set a school record by averaging 351.4 yards per game.

Quarterback Zach Abey rushed for 1,413 yards, the second most in school history for a single season, and 19 touchdowns, tied for the fifth most in school history. Slot back / quarterback Malcom Perry had games of 282 yards (SMU) and 250 yards (Army) rushing in his first two career starts at quarterback. He is just the third player in FBS history to have two runs of 90 or more yards in a single season.

Navy finished the 2016 campaign with a 9-5 mark and a 7-1 record in the American Athletic Conference despite a season that saw the Mids have 102 missed games by starters or key contributors. The nine wins tied for the fifth most wins in school history and the team set school records for points (531), touchdowns (73), touchdowns per game (5.2), rushing touchdowns (61), total offense (6,136 yards) and yards per play (6.8) despite playing four

different quarterbacks. Navy also won the West Division of the AAC that year.

Quarterback Tagg Smith was poised to have a breakout senior campaign before injuring his knee in the second quarter of the season opener against Fordham and was lost for the year. Senior Will Worth, who had been the holder the previous three seasons, stepped in and was on pace to break most of Keenan Reynolds' single-season records before breaking his foot in the AAC Championship Game. Worth finished with 1,198 rushing yards and 25 touchdowns, while throwing for 1,397 yards and eight touchdowns. His 25 rushing touchdowns were the fourth most in NCAA history for a quarterback, while his 2,595 yards of total offense was a school record.

In 2015, Navy won a school-record 11 games against just two losses, qualified for a bowl game, won a bowl game for the 10th time in school history (beat Pittsburgh 44-28 in the Military Bowl), won a bowl game for a third straight year for the first time in school history, defeated Army for a series-record 14th consecutive year, won the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy for the third time in the last four years, won the Lambert Trophy as the best team in the East for the first time since 1963, finished 18th in the country in both the Associated Press and Coaches polls and shared the West Division title of the American Athletic Conference with Houston in Navy's first year of being in a conference after being an Independent for 134 years.

Quarterback Keenan Reynolds finished his playing career as the all-time leading touchdown scorer (both total and rushing) in FBS history with 88, as well as the all-time leading rusher for a quarterback in FBS history (4,559 yards), the all-time leading rusher in school history and the all-time leader touchdown passer in school history (31). He is just the sixth quarterback in FBS history to rush and pass for 4,000 yards in a career. He finished fifth in the Heisman Trophy voting, was named Third-Team All-American by the Associated Press and was named the American Athletic Conference and ECAC Offensive Player of the Year. He was also named the winner of the James E. Sullivan Award, which is given to the nation's most outstanding amateur athlete and had his number (19) retired. Reynolds was drafted in the sixth round by the Baltimore Ravens.

Navy finished the 2014 season with an 8-5 record, qualified for a bowl game, won a bowl game (beat San Diego State 17-16 in the Poinsettia Bowl) and defeated Army.

Navy finished the 2013 campaign with a 9-4 record, won the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy, qualified for a bowl game, won a bowl game (beat Middle Tennessee, 24-6, in the Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl) and defeated Army.

Reynolds had one of the greatest seasons by a Navy football player in school history in 2013, rushing for 1,346 yards and 31 touchdowns, while throwing for 1,057 yards and eight touchdowns. His 31 rushing touchdowns not only was a school record, but an NCAA record for a quarterback. He is just the fourth player in NCAA history (any position) to rush for 30 or more touchdowns in a single season.

Jasper helped lead Navy to an 8-5 record in 2012 and a berth in the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl. Navy defeated Air Force 28-21 in overtime and Army 17-13 to win the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy.

The Mids posted an impressive 9-4 record in 2010, defeated Army, defeated Notre Dame in consecutive seasons for only the third time in school history and appeared in a school-record eighth-consecutive bowl game.

Quarterback Ricky Dobbs finished his career with 2,665 career rushing yards (sixth all-time at Navy), 2,770 passing yards (ninth all-time at Navy), 49 career rushing touchdowns (second all-time at Navy) and his 13 passing touchdowns in 2010 was a school record for a single-season.

The 2009 season saw the Mids tie a school record for wins with 10, win the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy, appeared in a school-record seventh-consecutive bowl game and ran its winning streak against the other two Service Academies to an amazing 15-straight games. The Mids capped the season off with a 35-13 rout of Missouri in the Texas Bowl.

Navy posted an 8-5 record in 2008 and participated in the EagleBank Bowl. The Mids won the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy thanks to a 33-27 victory over Air Force and a 34-0 win over Army.

The 2007 season saw the Mids post an 8-5 record, win the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy, appear in a bowl game, became the first team in NCAA history to lead the nation in rushing three-consecutive years (rushing for a school-record 348.8 yards per contest) and defeated Notre Dame for the first time since 1963.

In 2006, Navy became just the fifth school in NCAA history to go to four or more consecutive bowl games with a different quarterback each year.

In 2005, Navy led the nation in rushing (318.7 yards per game) as the Mids went 8-4, won the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy and won a bowl game (beat Colorado State 51-30).

In 2004, the Mids won 10 games, won the Emerald Bowl and claim the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy.

In 2003 the Mids led the nation in rushing and set school records for rushing yards per game, total rushing yards, rushing yards per attempt, rushing touchdowns, total offense,

total offense per game and yards per play as Navy went 8-5, won the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy and earned a berth in the Houston Bowl.

Jasper came to Navy from Georgia Southern where he served as the quarterbacks and fullbacks coach for three years and helped lead the Eagles to a 38-6 record and back-to-back NCAA Division I-AA National Championships in 1999 and 2000.

Prior to his appointment at Georgia Southern in January 1999, Jasper served as offensive coordinator at Indiana State during the 1998 season.

Before assuming the offensive coordinator's position at the Naval Academy Prep School in Newport, R.I., in 1997, Jasper spent two seasons as an assistant coach at Navy in 1995 and '96, handling the quarterbacks, fullbacks and slot backs.

Jasper is a 1994 graduate of the University of Hawai'i where he earned his bachelor's degree in sociology/criminology. He was a three-year letterman for the Rainbow Warriors (1991-93) at quarterback and slot back, where he helped lead Hawai'i to a Western Athletic Conference title. A native of Los Angeles, Jasper and his wife, Donna, are the parents of a daughter, Dallas, and sons, Jaylen and Jarren.

TOMMY LAURENDINE

SLOT BACKS

FIRST SEASON AT NAVY

Long-time option coach Tommy Laurendine is in his first year as slot backs coach at the Naval Academy. Laurendine comes to Navy from Mississippi College, where he was the offensive coordinator for the last five seasons.

"I am extremely excited to welcome Tommy Laurendine and his family to Annapolis," said Newberry. "Coach Laurendine is a veteran coach who brings a wealth of experience as a coordinator and head coach. His knowledge of option football is as strong as anybody in the country. He is an outstanding coach and person and will be a great fit with our student athletes and staff."

"I am honored to have the opportunity to coach at the United States Naval Academy under the leadership of head coach Brian Newberry," said Laurendine. "I look forward to contributing to the success of the storied Navy football program."

Mississippi College finished second in the nation in rushing in 2022, averaging a school record 325.1 yards per game, while the Choctaws averaged 274.8 yards per game on the ground over his five years as the offensive coordinator.

Laurendine served as the head football coach and offensive coordinator at Sewanee from 2011-16. Under Laurendine's leadership, Sewanee continued to be one of the top rushing teams in the nation. In his first season as head coach (2011), Laurendine guided Sewanee to its best season since 2005. The Tigers finished with more overall wins in 2011, five, than the previous four seasons combined. For his efforts, Laurendine was honored as the SCAC Co-Coach of the Year.

An Oak Ridge, Tennessee native, Laurendine came to Sewanee from The Citadel, where he served as the offensive coordinator in 2010. In addition, Laurendine coached the quarterbacks and fullbacks for the Bulldogs.

Before his stint at The Citadel, Laurendine served as the offensive coordinator, quarterbacks and fullbacks coach at NCAA Division II Lenoir-Rhyne College for two seasons.

In 2008, his offense improved by more than 126 yards per game and finished the season ranked fifth in Division II in rushing, averaging 295.3 yards per contest.

A year later, Laurendine and the Bears improved to 294.3 rushing yards per game, finishing the year with the second-best rushing average in Division II.

Prior to his stint at Lenoir-Rhyne, Laurendine served as the offensive coordinator at Washington & Lee University in 2007. During his time with the Generals, he coached quarterbacks and wide receivers.

Laurendine also served as the Generals' offensive coordinator from 1995-1997.

From 2001-2006, Laurendine was the assistant head coach and offensive coordinator at Southern Arkansas. While at Southern Arkansas, Laurendine's offenses set a combined 18 school records and earned a berth in the NCAA Division II playoffs in 2003.

The 2005 squad broke records for total offense (4,677), rushing attempts (630), first downs (250), touchdowns (44), rushing offense (296.4 ypg), total offense (425.2 ypg), scoring offense (29.7 points per game), and single game yardage (615).

He also spent the 2000 season as SAU's assistant head coach, offensive line coach and team academic coordinator.

Laurendine also had coaching stops at West Alabama (1997-2000), Northwest Whitfield High School (1994-95), and West Georgia College (1991-94) as a graduate assistant.

Laurendine is a 1990 graduate of Lenoir-Rhyne, having earned a bachelor of arts in education. He was a two-year starter at quarterback and was named the 1988 and 1989

South Atlantic Conference Offensive Player of the Year and was a 1989 Domino's NAIA Player of the Year Finalist. Laurendine was team captain in 1989 and led the Bears to a conference championship in 1988.

A two-year letter winner, he was inducted into the Lenoir-Rhyne and South Atlantic Conference Hall of Fame in 2008. He holds school records in career completion percentage (58.3), single-season total yards (2,409) and career total yards (4,064).

Laurendine began his coaching career as a student assistant coach at Lenoir-Rhyne from 1990-1991, before earning his master's degree in physical education from West Georgia College in 1992.

He and his wife, Shawna, who was the head volleyball coach at Mississippi College, have two daughters, Alexa and Lakin.

VA'A NIUMATALOLO

DEFENSIVE ASSISTANT / DEFENSIVE LINE FOURTH SEASON AT NAVY

Va'a Niumatalolo is in his fourth season at Navy and his first as an assistant defensive line coach after spending time on both sides of the ball as an analyst the previous three years.

Niumatalolo came to Navy from the University of Hawai'i where he served as the offensive intern in 2018 and as a graduate assistant working with the offensive line in 2019.

In his two years at Hawai'i, the Warriors compiled an 18-11 record and participated in two bowl games, winning the SoFi Hawai'i Bowl in 2019 over his alma mater, BYU.

Niumatalolo is a 2018 graduate of Brigham Young University where he played four years on the football team and appeared in 19 games.

Niumatalolo, who graduated from Broadneck High School, and his wife, Kenzie, have two daughters, Aussie and Jada.

MARCUS THOMAS

OFFENSIVE ASSISTANT / FULLBACKS SECOND SEASON AT NAVY

Marcus Thomas is in his first year as an offensive assistant after serving as the Player Personnel Director at Navy in 2022. Thomas will assist Ivin Jasper with coaching the fullbacks.

Thomas came to Navy from UCLA, where he was the offensive analyst for Chip Kelly in 2020 and 2021 and the Director of Strategic Intelligence in 2019.

While at UCLA, Thomas assisted the running backs coach (2020 and 2021) and the tight ends coach (2019) as well as with special teams and was responsible for the opponent personnel scouting report. He helped lead UCLA to the 2021 Holiday Bowl, its first bowl game in four seasons.

In 2021, the UCLA offense ranked 16th in the country in scoring, averaging 36.5 points per game. Thomas contributed to the weekly development of the run game plan for a unit that averaged 215.1 rushing yards per game, which was the 17th-best rushing average in the country. In 2020, the UCLA offense ranked 20th in the nation in scoring, averaging 35.4 points per game and the rushing game improved by more than 70 yards per game.

Thomas is a 2014 graduate of the Naval Academy and earned four varsity letters on the football team. The Mids compiled a 31-20 record in Thomas' four years, won two Commander-In-Chief's Trophies, beat Army all four times and played in three bowl games, winning the 2013 Bell Helicopter Bowl over Middle Tennessee State 25-6.

Thomas was named Second-Team All-Independent as a kick returner in 2011, 2012 Honorable Mention All-Independent, 2013 Honorable Mention All-Independent and 2013 All-East by the ECAC. He was a recipient of the 2013 Napoleon McCallum Award which is presented to the Navy varsity football player of the graduating class who has gained the most all-purpose yards in his career.

Thomas is Navy's all-time leader in kickoff return yardage with 2,338 yards.

Thomas spent five years in the United States Marine Corps, including serving as the Marine Aviation Logistics Squadron 36 Detachment Officer in charge of 55 Marines for the 31st Marine Expeditionary Unit, a forward deployed contingency-response unit in the Pacific theatre and an Aviation Supply Officer in Okinawa, Japan where he led a team of 42 Marines, providing logistics and supply support to more than 2,000 Marines with Marine Aircraft Group 36 consisting of 58 aircraft.

TIGHT ENDS FIRST SEASON AT NAVY

Jon Williams is in his first year at the Naval Academy where he will coach the tight ends. Williams comes to Navy from Miami (Fla.), where he was the Director of Football Operations and the Chief of Staff.

"I am excited to welcome Coach Williams and his family to Annapolis," said Newberry. "Jon is an outstanding person, coach and recruiter. He has a wide range of experience at every level of college football. He brings a wealth of knowledge and a unique perspective into our program."

"The opportunity to serve our Midshipmen in their development in all phases of their lives as student-athletes and future leaders of our country is, without a doubt, the pinnacle of my career," said Williams. "I am humbled and grateful to Coach Newberry for his trust and confidence in me to represent this iconic program. The staff that Coach Newberry has assembled seems to be a microcosm of the Brigade of Midshipmen, which is an elite group of high achievers with strong character that share a passion for winning in all phases of life. I couldn't be more excited to work alongside each of them, as well as the best and brightest student-athletes in the country."

At Miami, Williams served as the senior staffer responsible for oversight of all aspects of the program, including operations and recruiting which netted the highest-rated recruiting class in school history, the #1 class in the ACC (2023) and top 5 in the country.

Prior to Miami, Williams was the Director of Recruiting and Player Development at Rice University in 2021, where he was responsible for revamping the recruiting department which resulted in the highest-rated signing class in program history.

Williams was the tight ends coach at Birmingham Southern in 2019-202-, where he was part of a record-setting squad that had the ninth-ranked offense in Division III and the #1 rushing offense in school history in 2019. The 2020 season was canceled due to COVID.

Williams served as the tight ends coach and recruiting coordinator at Tennessee Martin in 2016, where he helped the team make the Ohio Valley Conference Championship game.

Prior to his stint at Tennessee Martin, Williams was the assistant head coach, tight ends coach and director of player personnel at Southern Miss for Todd Monken, who was the offensive coordinator at Georgia last year when the Bulldogs won the National Championship and was recently named offensive coordinator for the Baltimore Ravens.

At Southern Miss, Williams was an integral part of the biggest turnaround in NCAA history at the time going from 3-9 in 2014 to 9-4 in 2015 and winning the Conference USA West Division. Williams was directly responsible for implementing a recruiting strategy and overseeing all recruiting operations that led to Conference USA's top-rated class in 2015. Williams was part of a Southern Miss offense that finished the 2015 season as one of two programs in NCAA history to have a 4,000-yard passer, two 1,000-yard rushers and a 1,000-yard receiver.

Williams was the head coach at Itawamaba Community College in Mississippi from 2010-13, where he led the program to a 21-16 record in four seasons including a win over National Champion East Mississippi College in 2012. His teams finished in the top 20 twice in his four years at Itawamaba where he produced five NFL players. Williams was also an assistant coach at Itawamaba from 2007-09.

Williams has also served as the head coach at Locust Fork High School in Alabama (2006), assistant head coach and offensive line coach at Mississippi College (2002-05), special teams coordinator at Wayne County High School in Mississippi (2001), head coach at Simpson Academy in Mississippi (1999-00), offensive line coach at East Central Community College (1996-98).

Williams is a 1996 graduate of Wingate University and he received his master's degree from Alcorn State in 2004.

Williams and his wife, Lisa, have a daughter, Jordan, and a son, Cole, who is a long snapper on the Navy football team.

BRENTEN WIMBERLY

DEFENSIVE ASSISTANT / LINEBACKERS FIRST SEASON AT NAVY

Brenten Wimberly is in his first season at the Naval Academy serving as a defensive assistant and will work alongside defensive coordinator P.J. Volker with the linebackers.

Wimberly comes to Navy from Alabama, where he was a graduate assistant for one year. Wimberly helped the Alabama defensive staff put together one of the top defenses in the nation. The Crimson Tide ranked sixth in pass efficiency defense, ninth in scoring defense,

11th in total defense and 36th in rushing defense.

Wimberly came to Tuscaloosa from the Georgia Tech, where he spent the previous two seasons as a defensive graduate assistant (2020-21) and earned his master's degree in building construction and facility management.

Wimberly is a 2018 graduate of Kennesaw State where he played linebacker for two years on the football team.

Wimberly appeared in 25 games and totaled 63 tackles, 1.5 sacks, an interception and a fumble recovery while helping the Owls to a Big South Championship and the FCS playoffs in 2017. His position coach his senior year was current Navy defensive coordinator PJ Volker, while Navy head coach Brian Newberry was his defensive coordinator both years.

After earning a bachelor's degree in integrative studies, Wimberly transitioned into a graduate assistant role at his alma mater, working primarily with the Owls' safeties and nickel backs. He helped lead Kennesaw State to another Big South title (2018) and two more FCS playoff berths (2018 and '19) as a GA.

Wimberly transferred to Kennesaw State after spending his first-two collegiate seasons at Georgia Military College. A native of Albany, Georgia, Wimberly was an honorable mention all-state performer at Westover High School.

MICK YOKITIS

WIDE RECEIVERS 13TH SEASON AT NAVY

Mick Yokitis is in his 13th year at the Naval Academy as the wide receivers coach. Navy has compiled a record of 86-65 (.570) during Yokitis' tenure, beat Army seven times, has gone to seven bowl games, won five bowl games and won the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy four times.

In 2022, Navy finished fourth in the nation in rushing, averaging 241.2 yards per game. The Mids finished third in the country in passing yards per completion (19.0), 25th in fourth down conversions (.605) and second in time of possession (34:38).

In 2021, Navy managed to have the ninth-best rushing offense in the country (225.5 yards per game) despite facing six of the top-35 defenses in the country, including three of the top 10. On top of the tough schedule, Navy had to start five different offensive tackles, five different guards and three different centers due to injury. Wide receiver Mychal Cooper finished his career averaging 19.4 yards per catch, which is the fifth-best average in school history. Cooper was also invited to the NFL Players Association Bowl.

In 2019, Navy had one of the greatest seasons in school history, winning a school-record tying 11 games against just two losses, winning the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy, sharing the American Athletic Conference West Division title with Memphis and winning the prestigious Liberty Bowl. The Mids' eight-game improvement from 2018 was the second-biggest turnaround in FBS history.

The Mids finished the 2019 campaign ranked 20th in both the *Associated Press* and *USA Today Coaches Polls*. It marked just the second time in the last 56 years that Navy finished in the AP Top 20 (18th in 2015).

A big part of that success was a Navy offense that set school records for total rushing yards (4,687), rushing yards per attempt (6.1), rushing yards per game (360.5), total offense yards per game (455.8) and tied the record for total offensive yards per attempt (6.8). The Mids also led the nation in rushing.

The Mids were also prolific in the passing game, finishing second in the country in average yards per catch (22.51) and seventh in passing efficiency (176.92). Quarterback Malcolm Perry set the school record for passer rating (181.6).

Navy finished the 2017 campaign with a 7-6 record, which included a 49-7 rout of Virginia in the Military Bowl. The 42-point margin of victory was the largest by a Navy team over a team from the autonomy 5 since the Mids beat West Virginia 51-7 in the 1963 season opener. The Mids played eight games against teams that went to a bowl game and played five teams that won 10 or more games. The offense set a school record by averaging 351.4 rushing yards per game.

Navy finished the 2016 campaign with a 9-5 mark and a 7-1 record in the American Athletic Conference despite a season that saw the Mids have 102 missed games by starters or key contributors. The Mids played Temple in the AAC Championship game and played in a bowl game (Armed Forces) for the 13th time in the last 14 years. The nine wins tied for the fifth most wins in school history and the team set school records for points (531), touchdowns (73), touchdowns per game (5.2), rushing touchdowns (61), total offense (6,136 yards) and yards per play (6.8) despite playing four different quarterbacks.

Senior wide receiver Jamir Tillman was named First-Team All-East and finished his career second all-time at Navy in career receiving yards (1,620) and seventh in catches (91)

Navy finished the 2015 campaign with a school-record 11 wins against just two losses, qualified for a bowl game for the 12th time in the last 13 years, won a bowl game for the 10th time in school history (beat Pittsburgh 44-28 in the Military Bowl), won a bowl game for a third straight year for the first time in school history, defeated Army for a series-record 14th consecutive year, won the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy for the third time in the last four years, won the Lambert Trophy as the best team in the East for the first time since 1963, finished 18th in the country in both the Associated Press and Coaches polls and shared the West Division title of the American Athletic Conference with Houston in Navy's first year of being in a conference after being an Independent for 134 years.

In 2014, the Mids finished No. 2 in the country in rushing offense (326.7), No. 3 in passing yards per completion (20.0), 22nd in scoring offense (36.8), No. 1 in red zone offense (.948), No. 4 in third down conversions (.503), No. 1 in fourth down conversions (.923), No. 1 in fewest turnovers lost (8), No. 3 in turnover margin (+1.46), No. 1 in fewest penalties per game (3.1) and No. 1 in fewest penalty yards per game (26.1).

Wide receiver Jamir Tillman became the first player in school history to catch a touchdown pass in four straight games, while his 20.59 yards per catch was the nation's ninth-best average.

Navy finished the 2014 campaign with an 8-5 record, won a bowl game (beat San Diego State 17-16 in the Poinsettia Bowl) and defeated Army for a series-record 13th consecutive year.

Navy finished the 2013 season with a 9-4 record, won the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy, won a bowl game (beat Middle Tennessee 24-6 in the Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl) and defeated Army for a series-record 12th-consecutive year.

Yokitis helped lead Navy to an 8-5 record in 2012 and a berth in the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl. Navy defeated Air Force 28-21 in overtime and Army 17-13 to win the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy.

Yokitis was the head football coach and offensive coordinator at the Naval Academy Prep School from 2008-10 where he led NAPS to a 16-7 record.

Yokitis is a 2006 graduate of the Naval Academy where he earned three varsity letters at wide receiver and saw the Midshipmen post a 26-11 record, qualify for three bowl games, win two bowl games and win three Commander-In-Chief's Trophies. Yokitis played in 37-consecutive games for the Midshipmen, including earning a start in all 12 contests as a senior.

After graduation, Yokitis served in the United States Marine Corps before being medically discharged. Mick and his wife, Lindsey, have two sons, Bryce and Nolan, and a daughter, Makenna.

- Nolan Henderson threw a pair of touchdown passes to lead Delaware to a 14-7 win over Navy in the season opener at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium to give Ryan Carty a win in his debut as the Fightin' Blue Hens' coach.
- It was No. 19 Delaware's first win over an FBS team and Navy's first loss to an FCS team since the Blue Hens beat the Midshipmen in 2007.
- Navy, which lost 5 fumbles all of last season, had 3 in the first 18 minutes of the game. On Navy's first play from scrimmage, **Tai Lavatai** lost a fumble on the mesh handoff between he and fullback **Anton Hall Jr.** and Delaware recovered at the Navy 21-yard line. Two plays later, the Blue Hens converted the mistake into points when Henderson hit Bryce de Maille with a 6-yard touchdown pass.
- Henderson found Chandler Harvin deep for a 51-yard score in the third quarter to make it 14-0. That scoring drive was set up by an odd chain of events. On first-and-20 from its own 28, a Delaware offensive lineman was called for a false start to set up a first-and-30, but another official came in and overruled the penalty and called Navy for making disconcerting signals, making it first-and-15 instead. Three plays later, Henderson hit Harvin for the touchdown.
- Navy responded with its only points of the game, moving 56 yards in 10 plays, capped off by a 2-yard touchdown run by Lavatai to make the score 14-7 late in the third quarter.
- The Navy defense made a big play early in the fourth quarter when Delaware surprisingly went for it on fourth-and-two from its own 45. Linebacker **Jianni Woodson-Brooks** dropped running back Khory Spruill for a one-yard gain to give Navy the ball back at the Delaware 46.
- Navy, however, could do nothing with it as the Mids gave the ball to fullback **Daba Fofana** four-straight times for a total of 9 yards. The Navy defense stopped Delaware on 2 more drives, but could not convert.
- Navy's defense allowed just 202 yards of total offense, including 13 on the ground. Navy's 12 tackles for loss in the game were the most since 2005.
- Sophomore linebacker **Colin Ramos** led the Mids with a career-high 9 tackles and forced a fumble, while junior safety **Eavan Gibbons** was in on 8 tackles and two tackles for loss. Senior striker **John Marshall** had seven tackles, 3.5 tackles for loss and 2 sacks.

- Seth Henigan threw for 415 yards and 2 touchdowns and Memphis led all the way in a 37-13 win over Navy in both teams' American Athletic Conference opener.
- The Tigers entered not having won a conference opener since beating Navy 35-23 in 2019.
- Henigan completed passes to 8 different receivers, and half his 24 completions went to Javon Ivory and Gabriel Rogers. Ivory had 7 catches for 89 yards and Rogers caught 5 for 95.
- The highlight play, however, occurred when Henigan threw a 79-yard touchdown to Joe Scates who got behind the defense, caught it in stride and raced untouched into the end zone. It was Scates' only reception of the day. The play gave the Tigers a 20-7 lead with 11:56 left in the third quarter.
- Memphis built a 10-0 lead in the first before Navy quarterback **Tai Lavatai** threw a 62-yard scoring pass to **Anton Hall Jr.** Lavatai later ran it in from the 1, capping a 21-play, 74-yard drive that lasted 11:23 spanning the third and fourth quarters to reduce Navy's deficit to 23-13.

- The teams exchanged field goals in the first overtime before Davies connected again from 29 yards to give Navy the lead. Owen Daffer's 37-yard attempt went wide left. Last year, Daffer's 54-yard field goal at the gun gave the Pirates a 38-35 win in Annapolis.

- The NCAA instituted overtime in 1996, and the series had never had to go a little extra to settle one of the sport's greatest rivalry games.
- Army's Markel Johnson ran 25 yards for a touchdown on the first play of overtime for a 17-10 lead, and Navy matched the Black Knights when **Xavier Arline** tossed a 25-yard touchdown pass to **Maquel Haywood** that made it 17-all.
- It was Navy's first completion of the game and Arline had perhaps the sweetest 1 of 1 for 25-yard game in Navy history. He also rushed for 102 yards.
- Hall Jr. - who earlier raced 77 yards for a TD - lost the ball as he launched himself towards the goal line and was hit inside the one-yard line.
- One of Cade Ballard's rare passing attempts for Army was a success when a pass interference call brought the ball down to the 28 with 4 minutes left on a drive that set up Maretzki's tying field goal. Ballard was 2-of-10 passing for 26 yards.
- Hall Jr.'s run up the middle in the third quarter was the biggest burst of offense of the game for either team -- at that point, that run alone had outgained Army's 69 total yards.
- His run was a double gut punch to the Black Knights after QB Tyhier Tyler had a 40-yard touchdown run wiped out on a penalty on the previous possession.
- The first spark came in the final seconds of the first half when Army's Noah Short blocked **Riley Riethman's** punt and Jabril Williams recovered -- after almost knocking the ball out of the end zone -- for the touchdown and a 7-3 lead.
- With points at a premium, Navy sent out **Bijan Nichols** for a long field goal, and his 44-yarder hugged the inside of the right goal post for a 3-0 lead in the second quarter.
- Army finished the half 0-for-5 passing, failed to convert on 5 of 6 third downs and had 33 total yards in the half.
