Things to Look For This Week...

Temple will play an FBS independent school for the first time since Sept. 24, 2022, which resulted in a 28-0 win over UMass.

This matchup will also mark the first time Temple faces a former American Athletic Conference team since their departure from the conference.

The Owls are looking for their third-straight win over the Huskies.

Dante Wright leads the AAC in receptions per game and receiving yards per game.

D.J. Woodbury Sr. ranks second in the American with 48 total tackles, while Tyquan King is fourth with 38 total tackles this season.

Three Owls will be returning to their home state of Connecticut, marking the first time all three will play their first collegiate game there. They are LB Tyquan King, LS Andrew McIlquham, and LB Antwone Santiago.

Game 6: Temple (1-4, 0-2) vs. UConn (3-2)

Pratt & Whitney Field at Rentschler Stadium | East Hartford, CT

October 5, 2024 | 3:30 p.m. ET

THIS WEEK

Temple travels to East Hartford, Connecticut, to take on the UConn Huskies on Saturday, October 5. Kickoff is set for 3:30 p.m. and will air on CBS Sports Network.

LAST WEEK

The Owls fell to Army last Thursday, 42-14. Black Knights QB Bryson Daily led the way, rushing for 152 yards and scoring three touchdowns on the ground. RB Kanye Udoh contributed for 128 of Army's 417 rushing yards and added a rushing touchdown as well.

Temple QB Evan Simon threw for 224 yards and two passing touchdowns, one of which went to true freshman TE Daniel Evert on a 54-yard catch and run for Evert's second touchdown in as many weeks. WR Dante Wright contributed eight receptions for 98 yards. With 450 receiving yards this season, the graduate student is just 57 yards shy of matching his total from a season ago.

Defensively, LB Tyquan King led the Owls with 14 total tackles, including nine solo. LB D.J. Woodbury added 10 total tackles and leads Temple in total tackles this season with 48.

LAST TIME VS. UCONN

Temple last played UConn on November 30, 2019, at Lincoln Financial Field. The Owls won 49-14, with WR Branden Mack having a career day, racking up 171 receiving yards and two touchdowns. LB Sam Franklin recorded a pick-six that put the game firmly out of reach in the third quarter.

LAST TIME VS. UCONN AT RENTSCHLER STADIUM

Temple last traveled to East Hartford on November 24, 2018, in a game the Owls won 57-7. They amassed 516 total yards and led 40-7 at halftime. WR Isiah Wright returned a kickoff for a touchdown, and CB Christian Braswell recorded a pick-six.

UP NEXT

Temple will be on its first of two byes next week, with the Owls' next contest being against Tulsa in the annual homecoming game on October 19. The kickoff time and broadcaster is TBA.

THIS WEEK

HEY MISTER DJ

Linebacker D.J. Woodbury Sr. has recorded 10+ tackles in four consecutive games. This marks the first time a Temple player has tallied double-digit tackles in four straight games since 2015, when Tyler Matakevich did it en route to winning the Bednarik Award and Nagurski Trophy, signifying the college defensive player of the year.

Woodbury Sr. has been having himself an impressive senior season. He ranks second in the American with 48 total tackles and 17th in FBS. Meanwhile, Woodbury Sr.'s 30 solo tackles lead the American and are tied for fifth in FBS.

STAYING WRIGHT ON TRACK

Dante Wright is another Owl who has excelled over the last four weeks. He recorded 98 receiving yards vs. Army, 116 receiving yards vs. Utah State, 99 receiving yards vs. Coastal Carolina, and 101 receiving yards vs. Navy, falling just three yards shy of accumulating 100 receiving yards in four straight weeks. Wright currently leads the American and ranks 14th in FBS receptions per game, while also leading the AAC and sitting 24th in FBS in receiving yards per game. Additionally, he ranks 19th in FBS for total receiving yards.

HELLO UCONN, MY OLD FRIEND

This week's matchup against UConn marks the first meeting between the two teams since the Huskies left the American Athletic Conference in 2020 to become independent. Both teams were original members of the AAC, joining other schools such as Louisville, Rutgers, Cincinnati, Houston, UCF, Memphis, SMU and USF. During their time as conference foes, Temple won five of their seven meetings against UConn.

WINNING INDEPENDENCE

The last time Temple played against an FBS independent team was in Week 4 of the 2022 season, when the Owls shut out UMass, 28-0. This marks the last time that Temple held a team scoreless. Temple WR Adonias Sanders led the team offensively, with 101 receiving yards and a touchdown. Prior to that meeting, Temple's most recent independent opponent was also against UMass in 2017, where the Owls defeated the Minuteman, 29-21.

ROSTER CONNECTIONS

Multiple Owls who are heading back home to the state of Connecticut this week. LB Tyquan King is from West Haven, while LS Andrew McIlquham is from Groton. Temple LB Antwone Santiago, who is from Meriden, attended Platt High School, the same school as UConn LB Roberto Salas. Conversely, UConn DL Brandon Kelly is from the Philadelphia area, where he attended Owen J. Roberts High School in Pottstown.

There are multiple other high school connections between the two rosters. Temple RB E.J. Wilson and UConn WR Exeriah Anderson were teammates at Armwood High School in Seffner, Florida. Franklin High School in Somerset, New Jersey, is where Temple WR Shekuna Kamara and UConn WR Cole Lakatos played their high school football. Additionally, Temple DT Allan Haye and UConn LB Kaleb Stewart both attended Chaminade-Madonna Prep in Hollywood, Florida.

When it comes to hometowns, there are a few connections as well. Temple SAF Andreas Keaton and UConn DB Valerian Agbaw are both from Powder Springs, Georgia. Owls CB Ben Osueke and Huskies WR Bryan Domino are from Richmond, Texas. Lastly, Temple CB Javier Morton and UConn DB Rante Jones both hail from Atlanta, Georgia.

TEAM

TEMPLE TUFF

The phrase "Temple Tuff" is synonymous with the fight and grit of Temple's football team. However, it was coined by legendary Temple basketball coach John Chaney whose teams also were noted for their hard-nosed, lunch-pail passion by which they played. An ever-present figure on Temple's campus, Chaney passed away on January 29, 2021.

POWER 5 PIECES

All three of Temple's coordinators this season have coaching experience at the Power 5 level. OC Danny Langsdorf has coached at Oregon State, Nebraska, Oregon, and Colorado. DC Everett Withers has coached at Texas, North Carolina, Minnesota, and Ohio State. STC Adam Scheier has coached at Wake Forest, Ohio State, Texas Tech, Mississippi, and Rutgers. Temple is the only school in the AAC to have its three coordinators all previously hold their coordinator position at the Power 5 level. In addition to the coordinators, 14 players on Temple's 2024 roster have played at Power 5 schools (DE Diwun Black, DT Allan Haye, WR Kajiya Hollawayne, CB Jaylen Lewis, RB Antwain Littleton, OL Grayson Mains, LS Andrew McIlquham, DT K.J. Miles, TE Landon Morris, SAF Javier Morton, QB Evan Simon, DE Cam'Ron Stewart, WR Ian Stewart, and LB T.K. Wright).

JUCO JAM

Temple features 16 former junior college players on its 2024 roster, with many expected to receive significant playing time: OL Diego Barajas, DE Diwun Black, QB Forrest Brock, SAF Elijah Deravil, WR Kajiya Hollawayne, DE Sekou Kromah, LB Tyler Lepolo, OL Linus Lindberg, CB DeVonta Owens, OL Mause Palu, DT Khalil Poteat, LB Eric Stuart, LB Katin Surprenant, CB Ben Osueke, OL Chris Smith, and DE Tra Thomas.

UNITED NATIONS

Temple has eight countries represented on this year's roster, the most for foreign countries represented by any school in the FBS. Australia (P Dante Atton), Canada (OLs Melvin Siani and Davray Venu), England (TE Peter Clarke and OL James Faminu), Germany (TE Daniel Evert), Nigeria (CB Ben Osueke), Sweden (OL Linus Lindberg), Tonga (OL Mause Palu), and the United States.

WHO'S YOUR DADDY

Temple has two players whose fathers have played in the NFL. DT K.J. Miles is the son of Keith Miles, who played professionally for the Seattle Seahawks. Freshman LB Tyree Alualu's father Tyson is recently retired after playing for the Jaguars, Steelers and Lions.

BROTHERLY LOVE

SAF Ihsim Smith-Marsette's brother, Ihmir, was a fifth round pick for the Minnesota Vikings in the 2021 NFL Draft and won a Super Bowl with the Kansas City Chiefs in 2023. He currently plays for the Carolina Panthers.

PICK-SIX

Just six student-athletes remain on the roster from the time Stan Drayton took over as head coach in December 2021 - WRs John Adams and Zae Baines, TE James Della Pesca, DL Demerick Morris, OL Wisdom Quarshie, and LB D.J. Woodbury.

DO I KNOW YOU FROM SOMEWHERE?

With the progress of the transfer portal in college football, it has become more prevalent that players will matchup against their former team. This season, however, Temple signed players from within the American Athletic Conference. LB Tyquan King previously played for East Carolina, and DT Latrell Jean played at Florida Atlantic.

STAN DRAYTON

STAN THE MAN

Stan Drayton, after serving as an assistant coach at the collegiate and NFL level for 28 years, became the 29th head coach in Temple history on December 15, 2021. Drayton's notable stops include Texas, Ohio State, Florida, the Green Bay Packers, and Chicago Bears. He won national championships at Florida in 2006 and Ohio State in 2014.

CULTIVATING GREATNESS

Stan Drayton has coached many NFL players during his career, including Falcons' RB Bijan Robinson, Cowboys' RB Ezekiel Elliott, and former 49ers' RB Carlos Hyde. One of his earliest and most popular players is former Eagle RB Brian Westbrook, who he coached at Villanova.

PHILLY PHILLY

Stan Drayton also has strong Philly roots. He attended and played at Allegheny College, located in Meadville. He has experience coaching at Penn and Villanova, as well. Drayton and his wife, Monique, also got engaged in Philadelphia.

GROOMED BY CROOM

Stan Drayton first worked with Sylvester Croom when the former was a quality control coach for Green Bay from 2001-03 and the latter was the Packers running back coach. In 2004, when Croom was hired at Mississippi State as the first black head coach in SEC history, Drayton joined him as the running back coach. "I've had a lot of influences in the coaching ranks but Sly is like a father figure to me. He showed me it was possible to become a head coach as a black man and as a running back coach."

CLIMBING THE LADDER

Despite only being in his third season as the Owls head coach, Stan Drayton is tied with SMU's Rhett Lashlee for the third longest tenured head coach in the American Athletic Conference. Only East Carolina's Mike Houston (six), and Memphis's Ryan Silverfield (five) have been in the American and at their schools for more seasons than Drayton. While Rice's Mike Bloomgren (seven) and UTSA's Jeff Traylor (five) have been the head coach at their school for more years than Drayton, both were new to the AAC in 2023. Same goes for Army's Jeff Monken who is in his 11th season at Army but first in the AAC.

OWL SCHOLARS

In an effort to recognize the outstanding academic accomplishments of Temple University's student-athletes, Temple Athletics introduced the Owl Scholars Program in the Fall of 2016. Through team apparel, student-athletes on all of Temple's 19 sports regularly have the opportunity to wear items that represent their athletic lives while on campus or in the classroom; the Owl Scholars Program aims to accomplish the reverse - provide an easily identifiable symbol of academic success for student-athletes to wear on their respective field or court of competition.

The Owl Scholars Patch has been designed to pay homage to the rich history of the Temple

Owls, while invoking images of the infamous speech of Temple University's founder Russell Conwell, Acres of Diamonds. The three stars above the regal owl symbolize the three different ways a student-athlete can earn the honor of having the patch included on their uniform/game warm-up:

- 1) 3.0 semester GPA in previous term
- 2) 3.0 cumulative GPA prior to beginning of semester
- 3) Successfully completed his/her undergraduate degree at Temple

Fifty-one football players will wear the patch this season.



Offense

LANGS LOVES OFFENSE

Danny Langsdorf was named offensive coordinator and quarterback coach for Temple Football in January 2022. He came to Temple after serving two seasons as pass game coordinator and quarterback coach at Colorado. In 2022, Langsdorf oversaw true freshman starting quarterback, E.J. Warner who registered one of the best campaigns in Temple history. Langsdorf has 27 years of experience on the collegiate and professional levels, all on the offensive side of the ball augmented by some extensive special teams coaching. He has 16 years of Power 5 conference experience, including 12 as an offensive coordinator.

OSCILLATING O-LINE

In 2022, Temple started a different offensive line combination from the previous week in all 12 games. In 2023, the Owls were only able to start the same five twice. In the 24 games over those two seasons, 14 players earned at least one start and each position had no less than three starters - RT (3), RG (4), C (4), LG (9), LT (5). In all, Temple started 19 different combinations.

NEW FACE IN THE HUDDLE

For the first time since 2017, Temple does not have a returning quarterback with at least one start in a Temple uniform. In 2016, P.J. Walker, a four-year starter at QB for the Owls, started every game en route to the AAC Championship. Temple has had a revolving door at the position since, with E.J. Warner's 20 starts leading the pack since that time. Redshirt junior Forrest Brock is the only QB on the roster who has seen game action for Temple (one game at Temple, 10 JUCO games) and Evan Simon's two FBS starts for Rutgers (16 games overall) headline the QB room's experience.

HARD WORK PAYS OFF

Being a walk-on is no easy task. It's a selfless position, often requiring players to do whatever they can to help the team win. However, as a walk-on, there is always the possibility that hard work can lead to an eventual scholarship. On August 19, this became a reality for wide receiver John Adams. Adams has faced many challenges in his three seasons at Temple. A coaching change, limited playing time, and most significantly, a devastating leg injury sustained last November. Despite the adversity, Adams never gave up. He worked hard each day to improve, even through the injury. Now fully healthy, Adams is poised to make an impact on the offense this year, and he'll be doing so as a scholarship player.

YOU CAN'T BUY SPEED

Graduate wide receiver Ashton Allen comes to Temple from the University of Southern California, where he was a member of the track and field team. The Maryland native won a national championship as part of USC's 4x100 relay team but wanted to take on a new challenge for his final year of NCAA eligibility. Despite not having played football competitively since high school, Allen has seamlessly fit in on the gridiron. He has shown the team glimpses of what he brings to the table, using his speed to beat defenders and haul in long gains numerous times throughout fall camp. While nothing compares to the intensity of a game, Allen appears ready for the challenge.

BIG PLAY OFFENSE

When Evan Simon connected with Dante Wright for a 91-yard touchdown vs. Utah State it was more than just the longest pass and reception in each of their careers. The play was the second longest pass play and third longest play from scrimmage in Temple history exceeded only by a 96-yard pass from Lee Saltz to Keith Gloster (at Cincinnati, 1985) and a 94-yard run by Jager Gardner (at SMU, 2015).

Defense

EVERETT'S ELITE D

Everett Withers enters his second season as Temple's defensive coordinator. In 2022, he served as chief of staff during Stan Drayton's first year at Temple. He briefly left for an on-field position at FAU in January 2023, but returned to replace D.J. Eliot when he took a job with the Philadelphia Eagles. Withers brings 35 years of coaching experience and his pedigree includes coaching stops at Texas, North Carolina, Ohio State, Minnesota and Louisville, as well as time with multiple NFL teams. Additionally, Withers has experience as a head coach, holding that position at Texas State, James Madison, and North Carolina.

D-BOW WITH THE DBS

Dominique Bowman joined the Temple coaching staff in 2022 when he coached the cornerbacks. Following that season, Stan Drayton made the decision to have Bowman coach all the defensive backs, including the safeties as well. (The subsequent move was to hire an additional defensive line coach.)

NEW LOOK SECONDARY

Speaking of the secondary, Temple's defensive backs will look much different this season. Although a few key players are returning, including cornerback Ben Osueke and safety Elijah Deravil, much of the defensive back room is new to Temple. Transfer safety Andreas Keaton earned a single-digit and is expected to start at safety, while transfer cornerbacks Torey Richardson and Jamel Johnson are breaking camp as the Owls' top two corners.

A CUT ABOVE

There's a common saying in sports that if you look good, you play good. DL Demerick Morris has done his part in helping his teammates achieve this by becoming the Owls' unofficial team barber. The redshirt junior learned how to cut hair just one year ago. Morris has honed the craft so well that he even cuts his own hair now.

Special Teams

ISN'T THAT SPECIAL

Adam Scheier joined the Temple Football staff in January, 2022, as the special teams coordinator and tight ends coach. A native of Bronx, N.Y., Scheier brought 26 years of collegiate coaching experience to Temple, including the previous 22 working with special teams. In 2023, Scheier had standouts in each of his rooms. TEs David Martin-Robinson and Jordan Smith emerged as dangerous targets and developed into pro players, Martin-Robinson was a UDFA with the Titans and Smith earned a tryout with his hometown Dolphins. On special teams, Sam Martin returned a kickoff for a touchdown and earned All-AAC recognition.

AUTOMADDUX

Senior kicker Maddux Trujillo set multiple records with a 64-yard FG in Temple's Week 4 win against Utah State. Not only did Trujillo break the school record of 56 yards set by Don Bitterlich in 1975 at Akron, but it also became the longest FG made in the history of Lincoln Financial Field, surpassing Philadelphia Eagles kicker Jake Elliott's two 61-yard FGs. The senior kicker is now tied for the eighth longest FG in NCAA history and holds the longest made try since 2009.

ANIMAL HOUSE

National Lampoon's Animal House movie was based on writer Chris Miller's fraternity experiences at Adam Scheier's alma mater Dartmouth College. It's title can also describe Scheier's residence. Due in part to his wife, Erica, being a veterinarian and his family's love of animals, the Scheier compound has nearly 20 animals. This menagerie includes dogs, cats, pigs, hedgehogs, lizards, turtles, hamsters, rabbits, and birds. Most of the aforementioned critters have been named after players along Scheier's coaching journey. Edward Saydee became the first Temple player to have an animal named after him, as the Scheier family adopted a dog named Saydee after a win over USF in 2022.

WHAT'S THIS

Sophomore punter Dante Atton came to Temple from Australia. The unique part of Atton's story is that prior to 2023, he had never played a snap of organized football in his life. When he took the field for the Owls as a freshman, it was the first time he had ever punted in a football game.

GIVING BACK

When Stan Drayton arrived at Temple in 2022, he emphasized the importance of getting back to the Temple TUFF mentality. Each letter represents a part of being Temple TUFF, with the "U" standing for unselfish. There may be no one who has embodied this characteristic more than LS Andrew McIlquham. McIlquham was recently named to the watchlist for the AFCA Good Works Team, which recognizes 22 student-athletes and a head coach for community service each season. Additionally, McIlquham has been named to the Wuerffel Trophy Watchlist, given to the FBS player who best exemplifies community service as well as leadership, both on and off the playing field. The award winners will be announced in September and December, respectively.

Miscellaneous

BUILDING THE WHOLE MAN

Stan Drayton preaches the importance of building the whole man. This includes work on and off the football field. Four Owls took that message to heart, working over the summer prior to the season. OL Wisdom Quarshie worked for the Philadelphia 76ers as a Ticket Sales Intern. TE James Della Pesca worked for Slight Edge as an Account Manager. LS Andrew McIlquham worked for Temple Sports Properties as a Client Activation Intern. OL Jackson Pruitt worked for Adobe as a Student Ambassador.

GOLD JACKET

For the third consecutive year, Temple University had an alumnus earn his place in the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio. In 2022, Art McNally became the first-ever official to earn a spot. In 2023, Joe Klecko became the first former player to be inducted. Klecko was a star defensive lineman for the Owls from 1973 to 1976, leading the team in tackles for his last three seasons and earning various collegiate honors. During his 12 seasons in the NFL with the New York Jets and Indianapolis Colts, Klecko earned four Pro Bowl selections, All-Pro selections in 1981 and 1985, and 1981 NFL Defensive Player of the Year. Now in 2024, Merrill Reese, who worked at WRTI as a student cutting his teeth in the broadcast industry, has earned his Gold Jacket. Reese worked at Temple's student radio station before a 40+ year career as "the Voice of the Philadelphia Eagles."

A NEW ERA

On July 31, 2023, Temple University officially unveiled its new athletics logo, signaling a reinvigorated era in North Philadelphia. The cherry and white logo incorporates Temple's traditional "T" above a new Owl mark, encased in a diamond outline. The new athletics logo is Temple made, originating from designs conceived by students and professors at the Tyler School of Art and Architecture.

JUST DO IT.

In the summer of 2020, Temple Athletics signed a three-year deal with Nike which makes it the official outfitter of Temple Athletics. The agreement, which was extended in 2023, makes Nike the exclusive athletics footwear, apparel and accessories provider for the football team as well as the other 18 varsity sports.

YOU CAN'T RECOGNIZE US WITHOUT CAMOUFLAGE

The American Athletic Conference is changing once again in 2024. In 2023, following the departure of Cincinnati, Central Florida, and Houston, the conference shifted from 11 total teams to 14, with the addition of Charlotte, Florida Atlantic, North Texas, Rice, UAB, and UTSA. With SMU's departure this year, the conference added Army as a football only member.

HEAD COACH U

NFL head coach Todd Bowles (Tampa Bay) used Temple as a stepping stone on his path to the NFL. Bowles played for the Owls from 1981-1985. From 2010-2018, Temple placed five straight head coaches into higher paying jobs: Al Golden, Steve Addazio, Matt Rhule, Geoff Collins, and Manny Diaz. Ohio State's Ryan Day, one of the top FBS head coaches, was part of the Owls staff for the 2006 and 2012 seasons. Matt Rhule, who spent two-and-a-half seasons as the head coach of the Carolina Panthers, was hired by Nebraska in 2023.

DID YOU KNOW...

Temple holds an 87-year-old NCAA college football record? In 1937, Temple played in an NCAA-record four scoreless tie games in one season. No school has matched that since.

TEMPLE AT A GLANCE...

Temple is in the 4th largest media market in the country, with over 2.9 million TV homes according to Nielsen. The designated market area (DMA) is 7.6 million.

Temple is located in a region of 6.25 million people, and is only 95 miles from NYC and 120 miles from Washington, D.C. In fact, more than 40% of the US population is within a day's drive from Philadelphia.

Founded in 1884, Temple is among the top 50 largest public universities in the country with over 30,000 students. Temple has more than 600 academic programs including five professional schools of law, medicine, dentistry, pharmacy, and podiatry.

For nearly a decade, Temple has been recognized as an R1 research institution by the Carnegie Classification of Institutions of Higher Education. The classification is given out only to institutions that demonstrate the "highest research activity" which is roughly the top 4% of colleges and universities in the United States.

Temple University placed No. 89 in the 2023 "Best Colleges" U.S. News and World Report ranking of National Universities. This marks the highest ranking ever for the university and the first time Temple has been included

in the Top 100. The university has an overall graduation rate of 75%, and has a full time retention rate for undergraduate students at 84%.

Temple is one of 13 FBS institutions in the country with an average APR of 990 or greater since 2015-16.

Temple's GSR (Graduation Success Rate) is 94 which is tied for 20th among all FBS institutions. That score is tied for second in the American Athletic Conference and one of just eight outside of the Power 5 with a GSR of 94-or-better.

Temple has over 370,000 alumni around the world including just under 200,000 alumni that live in the Philadelphia DMA.

Temple's athletic department has 19 sports and 500 student-athletes.

Temple has been bowl eligible six out of the last 11 years. The Owls finished 10-4, won the AAC Eastern Division and were ranked in the Top 25 twice in the past decade. They won the AAC Championship in 2016 and the Gasparilla Bowl in 2017.

Temple posted the largest attendance gain during the 2015 season, playing in front of an average home crowd of 44,159, an increase of 20,789 per game. This excitement led ESPN to bring their popular pregame show, College Gameday, to Philadelphia.

The Temple game played against Notre Dame in 2015 had a 3.9 national rating and an 18.1 local rating. It was ABC's highest ranking game ever in the Philadelphia area, which is impactful given the market is the fourth largest in the country.

Temple's athletic facilities are among the finest in the country. The football team plays its games in the NFL stadium operated by Super Bowl LII Champion Philadelphia Eagles. The basketball arena is a state-of-the-art facility with a capacity crowd of 10,000. Over the last five years Temple has spent over \$50 million for athletics multipurpose facilities with all the athletic facilities being state-of-the-art.

The University itself has over \$400 million planned for capital projects over the next five years including a \$170 million state of the art library that opened in 2020.

Temple had a school record four players get drafted into the NFL in 2020: Matt Hennessy (Falcons), Harrison Hand (Vikings), Shaun Bradley (Eagles), and Chapelle Russell (Buccaneers) - with four more players getting signed as undrafted free agents. Temple is the only team outside of the Power 5 conferences to have multiple players drafted to the NFL from 2016-20. In all, Temple has 14 current players in the NFL, the most of any school outside of the Power 5. Thirteen of the league's 32 teams will sport some Cherry and White this season. Furthermore, when adding coaches and team personnel into the equation, there are over 50 people in the NFL with ties to Owl Nation.

2024 was the ninth straight year that Temple sent at least one player to the NFL. That marks the second longest streak in school history – Temple sent players to the NFL in every year from 1979-89.

The 2019 Temple Linebacker room had seven NFL players on its unit. The starters were Shaun Bradley, Sam Franklin and Chapelle Russell. Backups included Isaiah Graham Mobley (Panthers), William Kwenkeu (Vikings), and freshmen Jordan Magee (Commanders) and Yvandy Rigby (Ravens). Bradley (Eagles), Magee, and Russell (Buccaneers) were drafted and the others signed as undrafted free agents.

QUARTERBACKS

Quarterbacks coach and offensive coordinator **Danny Langsdorf** oversees the unit in his third season with the Owls. He came to Temple by way of Colorado, where he served as the pass game coordinator and quarterbacks coach, and has NFL experience with the Giants and Saints. The unit will look different from Langsdorf's first two seasons when E.J. Warner started 20 of the 24 games..

Evan Simon has the most FBS experience of the group. He made two starts and played in 16 games overall from 2020-23 for Rutgers. The Mount Joy, Pa., native made his first collegiate start at Lincoln Financial Field against Temple. Simon has started in three straight games, throwing for six touchdowns against Utah State.

The only man in the room with game experience for Temple prior to this season is **Forrest Brock**. He played in one game for the Owls in 2023 while Warner was injured. The Topanga, Calif., was a JUCO transfer who racked up over 2,000 yards and 16 TDs for Santa Monica CC in 2022. He opened the season as the starter but miss the next three games due to injury.

Redshirt freshmen **Tyler Douglas** and **Patrick Keller** joined the team in the 2023. Douglas was part of the 2023 recruiting class and was a mid-year enrollee who participated in spring practice. Keller was a walk-on.

Chris Dietrich [Sparta, NJ / Pope John XXIII] was part of the 2024 recruiting class.

WIDE RECEIVERS

Tyron Carrier begins his first season as wide receivers coach at Temple. The Houston native and University of Houston product, has spent his nine-year coaching career at Baylor, West Virginia, Texas A&M, Grambling State and his alma mater.

Dante Wright, a 2023 transfer from Colorado State, earned a single-digit during this year's fall camp. Wright was the Owls leading receiver a year ago with 39 receptions for 507 yards and four touchdowns. A Freshman All-American in 2019 when he had 57 catches for 805 yards and four touchdowns, Wright added additional national recognition in 2024 with preseason All-AAC accolades.

Temple added three transfers in 2024 with two of them having played for Carrier at Grambling State. **Antonio Jones** played in 11 games in 2023 and registered a career-high 43 catches for 595 yards. **Kajiya Hollawayne** was a former quarterback recruit for UCLA in 2021 but has since moved on to wide receiver at Grambling State and Riverside CC. **Ashton Allen** was a sprinter at USC for the past four years and chose to transfer to Temple and return to football in his final year of eligibility.

Zae Baines, a redshirt junior, gained valuable experience over the past two seasons earning 10 starts in 2023. He finished with 36 catches for 442 yards and one score.

Graduate **Ian Stewart** came to Temple from Michigan State in 2022 but missed most of his first two seasons due to injury. Stewart has impressed on and off the field, earning a single-digit for the 2023 season. Unfortunately, the snake-bitten Stewart suffered a season-ending injury on the final day of summer practices.

John Adams, a former walk-on, earned a scholarship during fall camp. The redshirt junior fought through great adversity after suffering a devastating leg injury last season. Adams

adds size to the receiving room, and plays a large role for the offense.

Two valuable walk-ons - **Shekuna Kamara** and **Elias Collins** (2022), add depth to the position.

The Owls invested heavily in the position adding much needed speed during the 2023 recruiting cycle. **Preston Everhart**, **Xavier Irvin** and **Kian Johnson** all redshirted a year ago but only Irvin saw game action.

Xavier Bryan-Boothe, **JoJo Huntley**, **Kyle Madden** and **Cole Sprague** joined the Owls as walk-ons during 2023.

Bryson Goodwin [Tampa, FL / Jesuit], **Tyler Stewart** [Gray, GA / Jones County] and **Jamar Taylor Jr.** [Lakeland, Fla, / Lakeland] were all part of the 2024 recruiting class.

RUNNING BACKS

Running backs coach **Tyree Foreman** returned to Temple in 2023 after stops at Tennessee Tech and Towson. Foreman spent the 2007-14 seasons at Temple helping Bernard Pierce re-write the Temple rushing record book.

The running back group received a makeover this offseason. Gone are the top two rushers - Edward Saydee and Darvon Hubbard - and just two pieces remain.

Joquez Smith joined the Owls in the 2023 recruiting class and saw his first game action against Rutgers in Week 2, leading to his first start the following week against Norfolk State. That was his coming out party, rushing for 142 yards and adding a 15-yard TD reception.

E.J. Wilson was a 2023 transfer portal addition from Florida International. The senior provides an injection of speed and quickness in the backfield and as a returner.

The 2024 transfer portal additions are: **Antwaune Littleton**, **Tyrei Washington**, and **Terrez Worthy**. Littleton enters 2024 with the most experience. He played in 26 games for Maryland rushing for 708 yards and nine TDs. Washington was a workhorse at CC of San Francisco equally adept at rushing (203-976-11TDs) as catching out of the backfield (36-236-2TDs). While Littleton and Washington are thunder, Worthy is lightening. Last season at Lakawanna, he eclipsed 100-yards in eight games, including a 342-yard, three-TD game against Nassau CC.

Darius Morant (Hempstead, N.Y. / Milford Academy) was added as a walk-on in the 2024 summer.

TIGHT ENDS

The tight end group is coached by special teams coordinator **Adam Scheier**. He came from Rutgers in 2022 where he was their special teams coordinator from 2020-21. The room lost Temple's all-time leading receiver at tight end, David Martin-Robinson, to the Tennessee Titans, as well as Jordan Smith.

Senior **James Della Pesca** has been a solid contributor at tight end and on special teams since his arrival in 2020. One of the leaders on the offense, Della Pesca earned a single-digit this season. He also enters 2024 having played in more games as an Owl (39) than anyone on the roster.

Reese Clark was the first commitment for the 2022 class. After redshirting in 2022, he saw limited action at a crowded position in 2023 managing 18-145-1TD.

Peter Clarke was part of the 2023 recruiting class. He re-

ceived the 2023 Efe Obada Community Impact Award which is the NFL Academy equivalent of the NFL's Walter Payton Man of the Year. As a freshman, he played in 11 games, mostly as a blocking tight end.

Landon Morris is a two-time transfer having spent the 2021 season with Indiana and 2022 at Utah. The redshirt junior sat out during the 2023 season but has now has three years remaining to play at Temple.

Daniel Evert (Regensburg, Germany / Albrecht-Altdorfer Gym.) was part of the 2024 recruiting class and participated in spring practices.

Kendell Gordon joined the team as a walk-on in 2023, and **David Wise** (Philadelphia, Pa. / Neumann-Goretti) walked-on in 2024.

OFFENSIVE LINE

For the third consecutive season and seventh of the last 11 years, the offensive line unit is mentored by **Chris Wiesehan**. He coached at Temple under Matt Rhule and Geoff Collins for five seasons before following Collins to Georgia Tech.

Since returning, Wiesehan has tried to mix-and-match a group and believes that he finally has the pieces to field a top-notch unit.

The literal centerpiece of that is **Grayson Mains**, a red-shirt-sophomore transfer portal pickup from South Carolina. He is expected to play center.

The future of Temple's o-line is tied to a core of young players recruited in 2023 and who cut their teeth in different ways as freshmen. **Luke Watson** started 10 games as a freshman at either left tackle or guard. **Melvin Siani** played in four games, including two starts at left tackle. **Kevin Terry** showed promise on the scout team and earned playing time midway through the season but was quickly injured. **Eric King** is the only one of the four who did not see game action as a freshman, but started at LG twice this season due to injury.

Wisdom Quarshie is an experienced lineman who started 24 games the past three seasons. He was originally recruited as a defensive tackle.

Temple added **James Faminu** via the transfer portal in 2022. He had five starts in 2022 at three different line positions (LT, LG, RG). He was ineligible in 2023.

Redshirt junior **Jackson Pruitt** and redshirt sophomore **Kevin Smithwick** each joined the team in 2022 and continue to add depth.

Temple signed **Diego Barajas** out of Laney CC in the early 2023 signing period and he made an impression during spring practices often lining up with the first unit. Following spring practice the Owls went right back to Laney and signed Barajas' linemate **Chris Smith** who has experience at all five line positions. Each played a bit in 2023 for Temple.

Temple did a similar thing in 2024 adding experienced JUCO transfers **Linus Lindberg** and **Mausa Palu** from the College of the Canyons.

The 2024 freshman class includes: **Evan Dailey** (Gahanna, Ohio / Gahanna Lincoln), **Giakoby Hills** (Morristown (N.J.) High), and **Davray Venu** (Montreal, Canada / John Abbott College).

Lucas Possenti (Aston, Pa./ Garnet Valley), **Carter Sheehan**

(Duncansville, Pa. / Bishop Guilfoyle), and **Shane Toolan** (Philadelphia, Pa. / St. Joe's Prep) all joined the program as walk-ons in the 2024 summer.

DEFENSIVE TACKLES

Kevon Beckwith was added to the coaching staff in 2024 as the defensive tackles coach. The move coincided with the Owls converting to a 4-3 base defense. As such, Temple beefed up the interior of the defensive line in the offseason.

Demerick Morris was part of the 2020 recruiting class and is the elder statesman of the unit. He saw plenty of action in 2021-22 but suffered an injury late in the 2023 fall camp and was limited to just two games. Morris has been a vocal leader for the defensive line, earning a single-digit during fall camp.

The Owls added a pair of transfer portal additions in 2023 who battled through injuries in their first year in Cherry & White. Redshirt junior **Allan Haye** (Miami) was becoming a force inside when he suffered a season-ending injury. Red-shirt sophomore **K.J. Miles** (Georgia Tech) came to Temple with limited on-field experience and missed the entirety of 2023.

Those injuries allowed 2023 freshmen **Conlan Greene** and **Tyrese Whitaker** to get some early experience. Greene, in fact, started eight games as a freshman while Whitaker played in four.

Redshirt junior transfer **Latrell Jean** (FAU) has made an immediate impact for the Owls, earning a single-digit after joining the program only a few months ago. Entering the season, Jean has more college playing experience than anyone on the Owls roster (46 college games).

2024 portal additions also include redshirt sophomore **Joseph Auzenne** (Kilgore CC). Auzenne played in 11 JUCO games throughout his career. Junior **Sekou Kromah** started 11 games a year ago for Monroe College and tallied 15.5 TFLs.

Hugo Gil was added as a walk-on in 2023.

DEFENSIVE ENDS

Leading the defensive line again in 2024 is **Larry Knight** who returned to Temple in 2023 after coaching at Georgia Tech. Knight first came to Temple under Geoff Collins in 2017-18 and followed Collins to GT in 2019.

The playmakers on the defense come from this group. Both redshirt junior and single-digit **Tra Thomas** and redshirt-senior **Diwun Black** have a history of disruptive play. Thomas transferred from Independence CC in 2022 where he made 58 tackles, 10.0 TFLs, 3.0 sacks, in 17 games in 2021. After missing most of 2022 at Temple due to injury, he bounced back with nine starts in 2023 after being converted from line-backer to defensive end. Thomas was voted a single-digit during fall camp. Black starred at Mississippi Gulf Coast in 2019 leading them to a NJCAA championship. After a year at Florida, he came to Temple in 2023 and recorded 9.5 TFLs, 3.5 sacks, two forced fumbles and a fumble recovery in limited playing time.

Temple added two experienced members to the unit through the transfer portal. Junior **Khalil Poteat** arrives from Dodge City CC. Redshirt junior **Cam'Ron Stewart** played three seasons at Rutgers.

Jordan Montgomery was part of the 2023 recruiting class. He redshirted as a linebacker last season and is being converted into a defensive end.

Brandon Enarusai was added in 2023 as a walk-on.

Sultan Badmus [Bowie (Md.) High], is a member of the 2024 recruiting class. The true freshman has impressed the coaching staff early in his collegiate career, earning significant playing time throughout the early season.

Cameron Jones (Lenardtown, Md. / St. Mary's Ryken) and **Russell Sykes** [Rolesville (N.C.) High] were also a part of the 2024 recruiting class.

Kabba Kamara (Sharon Hill, Pa. / Academy Park High School) joined the team as a walk-on in the 2024 summer.

LINEBACKERS

The linebackers are led by **Chris Woods** for the third consecutive season. This position has gone through a major transition with its three most active players all graduating, including Jordan Magee (Washington Commanders) and Yvandy Rigby (Baltimore Ravens) who moved onto the NFL.

D.J. Woodbury enters the season with the only significant playing time in an Owls' uniform. The senior earned a single-digit during fall camp. He was part of the 2020 recruiting class and focused on outside linebacker before making the switch inside in 2023. He was limited to just five games last year due to injury.

The 2022 recruiting class featured **London Hall** and **Antwone Santiago**, Both have seen limited action, mostly on special teams.

The transfer postal additions begin with **Tyquan King** and **T.K. Wright**. King was a productive player at North Carolina A&T his first two college seasons before spending 2023 at East Carolina. Wright was limited to two games in his first two seasons at NC State before transferring to Temple.

Temple went the JUCO route to bring in much needed experience to the position. **Tyler Lepolo** (CC San Francisco), **Eric Staurt** (Foothill College), and **Katin Surprenant** (Mt. San Antonio CC) come from California with plenty of experience. Lepolo started 22 games and made 167 tackles; Stuart played in 17 games with 82 tackles; and Surprenant played in 11 games averaging 4.0 tackles per game.

The 2024 recruiting class brings in **Tyree Alualu** (Wexford, Pa. / North Allegheny) and **Wesley Brown** (Decatur, Ga. / Cedar Grove).

Reggie Jones and **David Kpeglo** were added as freshman walk-ons in 2023. **Aidan Britton** [Scranton (Pa.) Prep] and **Solomon Tripline** (Philadelphia, Pa. / Edgewater) became freshmen walk-ons in 2024.

CORNERBACKS

Dominique Bowman enters his second year coaching the cornerbacks after leading Arkansas' unit in 2022. This season he adds the safeties to his responsibilities as defensive backs coach.

A pair of JUCO transfers - **Elijah Deravil** (Coffeyville), who earned a single-digit during fall camp, and **Ben Osueke** (Blinn CC) - were added in previous seasons and bring experience. Deravil is making the switch from safety and Osueke started five games for the Owls a year ago.

The Owls were very aggressive in the transfer portal adding four corners from other schools - **Jamel Johnson** (Charleston Southern), **Jaylen Lewis** (Arkansas), **DeVonta Owens** (NE Oklahoma A&M), and **Torey Richardson** (UTEP). John-

son started 18 of 19 games in the past two seasons and posted four interceptions as a freshman in 2022. Richardson started all 12 games for UTEP in 2023.

Darrell Sweeting and **Aaron Anderson** were added in 2023 and redshirted.

The 2024 recruiting class provided **Denzel Chavis** [Union City (N.J.) High] and **Adrian Laing** (North Bergen, N.J. / Paramus Catholic).

Quaire Locks (Philadelphia, Pa. / Neumann & Goretti High School) was added on a walk-on in 2024.

SAFETIES

Three players with big time college experience were added to the safety unit through the transfer portal. **Andreas Keaton** had been a tackling machine at Western Carolina and quickly established himself as a defensive leader once arriving at Temple. So much so, that Keaton was the top vote-getter from his teammates during the single-digit voting process. He started 11 games in each of the last three seasons at WCU and averaged more than 60 tackles.

Javier Morton (Nebraska) and **Louis Frye** (Northern Illinois) each played nearly 20 college games and provide experience for a young unit.

The Owls added two freshmen to the position in 2023 - **Zyl Powell** and **Ihsim Smith-Marsette**. Both redshirted but are expected to play a bigger role in 2024.

Temple added freshman **Brandon Taylor** as a walk-on in 2023, and doubled down with **James Praessler** and **Jack Praessler** as walk-ons in 2024. The Praessler brothers played at Council Rock North in Newtown, Pa. James played at Ursinus as a freshman in 2023 and Jack is a true freshman.

Tyrell Jones (Florida Atlantic) was joined the roster as a walk-on in the 2024 summer.

SPECIALISTS

The unit is led by **Adam Scheier** who joined Temple in 2022 after coaching nationally ranked specialists at Rutgers.

Although he never played a down of American football till joining Temple as a freshman in 2023, **Dante Atton** showed nerves of steel during his first season. Scheier has always been a proponent of rugby-style punting and has employed Aussie punters throughout his career.

Maddux Trujillo was signed as a graduate transfer and is an established kicker averaging over 80 points in the last three seasons at Austin Peay.

Carl Hardin walked-on as a freshman provides depth at both kicker and punter, while earning the kickoff chores.

Andrew McIlquham joined Temple as a walk-on in 2022 after spending a season at TCU. McIlquham is the team's primary longsnapper and earned a scholarship entering 2024. Redshirt-junior **Bryan Noonan** joined the Owls in 2023 after two seasons at Wagner.

Lucas Glassburn [Windermere (Fla.) High] was added as a walk-on in 2024.



HEAD COACH

3rd season at Temple

DRAYTON

Stan Drayton, who has won college national championships and coached at the NFL level during his 28-year career, returned to Philadelphia as the 29th head football coach of Temple University on December 15, 2021. In his first season with the Owls, Drayton led the team to a 3-9 (1-7) record on the year.

Drayton came to Temple from the University of Texas where he was the associate head coach and run game coordinator for both Tom Herman (2017-20) and Steve Sarkisian (2021). During his time with the Longhorns, Drayton guided the development of a trio of young running backs - Bijan Robinson, Roschon Johnson and Keontay Ingram. All three made immediate impacts as true freshmen.

Robinson had breakout performances as the 2020 season progressed and tallied 703 rushing yards on just 86 carries to break the school's single-season yards per carry average record at 8.2. He amassed a team-high 915 all-purpose yards (703 rush/196 rec/16 KR) during the 2020 season, making him the first freshman to lead the Longhorns in all-purpose yards since Cedric Benson in 2001.

In year three at UT, Drayton was influential in the growth of Ingram, who totaled 1,095 yards from scrimmage (853 rush/242 rec). Ingram averaged 5.9 yards per carry - nearly a full yard better than his 2018 total (5.0 ypc). He also rushed for more than 100 yards on four occasions.

Drayton also oversaw Johnson's seamless transition from quarterback to running back as a true freshman, a move that took place just one week prior to the season opener versus Louisiana Tech. Under Drayton's eye, Johnson racked up 807 all-purpose yards (649 rush/158 rec) on 146 touches (123 rush/23 rec). He was the ninth true freshman in school history to rush for at least 600 yards. Johnson posted two 100-yard games (121 at WVU, 105 vs. TTU) and was twice named the Big 12 Newcomer of the Week in 2019.

In his second season, Drayton mentored two newcomers in graduate transfer Tre Watson and true freshman Keontay Ingram. The duo combined for 1,494 rushing yards and six touchdowns on the ground, while adding 313 yards receiving with five more touchdowns.

Drayton led a young room of running backs during the 2017 season, as the Longhorns top two backs in 2017 were both true freshmen in Daniel Young and Toney Carter. Young started the final five games of the season, and rushed for 373 yards and three scores. He also caught 13 passes for 153 yards and a touchdown. Carter started two games in 2017 and rushed for 252 yards and three touchdowns. He caught six passes for 31 yards and a score. True sophomore Kyle Porter finished fourth on the team in rushing with 261 yards and four touchdowns.

Prior to Texas, Drayton coached at Ohio State where he won a BCS National Championship in 2014. He joined OSU as a wide receivers coach in 2011, before leading the running backs for the next three seasons. He had previously won a BCS National Championship (2006) while coaching running backs at Florida (2005-07, 2010).

Drayton spent four seasons (2011-14) at Ohio State, including the last two as assistant head coach on offense and running backs coach. In 2014, Drayton helped the Buckeyes win the National Championship as Ezekiel Elliott, who was a sophomore, finished third in the nation and second in single-season school history with 1,878 rushing yards.

Under Drayton's guidance, Elliott capped the 2014 season with three-straight 200-yard rushing games (tied for the most in single-season school history with Eddie George, 1995). Drayton's work with Elliott helped him to be named College Football Playoff National Championship Offensive MVP with 246 rushing yards (tied for third most in single-game school history) and four touchdowns on 36 carries against Oregon. Elliott was also named Offensive MVP of the Sugar Bowl (230 rushing yards and two touchdowns on 20 carries) versus Alabama.

In 2013, Drayton helped senior running back Carlos Hyde finish eighth in the nation with an average of 126.8 rushing yards per game (1,521 yards and 15 touchdowns on 208 carries in 12 contests). Hyde was named the Big Ten's Ameche-Dayne Running Back of the Year as his 1,521 rushing yards were eighth most in school history and his 7.3 yards per carry was the highest in single-season average in school history. Hyde's 246 yards at Illinois that season are tied for third most in single-game school history.

In his first season as Ohio State's running backs coach in 2012, Drayton guided the Buckeyes running backs to 1,536 yards, 21 touchdowns and an average of 5.44 yards per carry during the team's 12-0 campaign. He came to Ohio State in 2011 as the team's wide receivers coach.

During his college coaching career, Drayton has also served as running backs coach at Florida (2005-07, 2010), Syracuse (2009), Tennessee (2008), Mississippi State (2004), Bowling Green (2000), also serving as special teams coach), Villanova (1996-00), Pennsylvania (1995, assistant running backs/director of football operations) and his alma mater Allegheny (Pa.) College (1993). He has also served as a graduate assistant at Eastern Michigan (1994).

Prior to his time at Ohio State, Drayton spent the 2010 season as the running backs coach and recruiting coordinator at the University of Florida, his second stint at the school after serving as the Gators running backs coach from 2005-07. In 2006, Florida won the BCS National Championship as the Gators averaged 160 rushing yards per game. That season, running backs DeShawn Wynn and Kestahn Moore combined for 981 yards and an average of 5.0 yards per carry while losing only two fumbles. Wynn scored his 25th career rushing touchdown, which was the second-most in school history, against Ohio State in the title game. He went on to become a seventh-round draft pick by the Green Bay Packers in 2007.

At Mississippi State, Drayton helped guide Jerious Norwood to a 1,000-yard rushing season in 2004 before he went on to be chosen in the third round of the 2006 draft by the Atlanta Falcons. Another prominent pupil was Villanova two-time All-American Brian Westbrook, who became the first collegiate player on any level to record more than 1,000 yards both rushing and receiving in the same season. He was the winner of the 2001 Walter Payton Award as the Offensive Player of the Year in NCAA Division I-AA and was a third-round pick by the Philadelphia Eagles in the 2002 draft.

On the professional side, Drayton served as running backs coach for the Chicago Bears from 2015-16. He also served as offensive quality control coach/special teams of the Green Bay Packers (2001-03).

In 2016 under Drayton, Jordan Howard, a fifth-round pick out of Indiana, set the Bears single-season rookie rushing record with 1,313 yards, breaking the previous mark held by Matt Forte despite only having 12 carries in the team's first three games. It was also the second-best rushing total of any player in the NFL regular season, trailing only Ezekiel Elliott (1,631), who was coached by Drayton at Ohio State. Another of Drayton's Buckeye protégés, Carlos Hyde finished 14th in the league with 988 rushing yards. After working with Drayton, Elliott went on to be the fourth overall pick of the 2016 NFL Draft by the Dallas Cowboys, while Hyde was a second-round selection by the San Francisco 49ers in 2014.

In 2015, the Bears rushing offense was 11th in the NFL averaging 115.9 yards per game, a 16-spot improvement from their ranking of 27th (90.1 ypg) a year prior to his arrival. Drayton helped running back Jeremy Langford, a fourth-round draft pick, finish fifth among all NFL rookies with seven touchdowns and ninth among rookies with 816 yards from scrimmage. Langford joined Pro Football Hall of Famers Walter Payton and Gale Sayers as the only Bears rookies since at least 1960 with a rushing touchdown in four-straight contests and, along with Payton and Sayers, the only rookies in franchise history to have 100 receiving yards, one rushing touchdown and one receiving touchdown in a single game.

The list of head coaches Drayton has worked under is a who's who of coaching. From his early years in Philadelphia with Penn's Al Bagnoli and Villanova's Andy Talley to successful college coaches such as Urban Meyer, Jim Tressel, Luke Fickell, Tom Herman, and Phil Fulmer, to the NFL's Mike Sherman and John Fox.

Drayton has always been a strong recruiter both in evaluating talent and getting the best players to join him. Among his most high-profile recruits, he is credited with bringing Cam Newton, Mike and Maurice Pouncey to Florida, Robinson to Texas, and he was responsible for bringing Westbrook to Villanova.

A three-time first-team All-America selection as a running back at Allegheny, Drayton is second in the school's record book for rushing (3,272 yards), rushing touchdowns (54) and scoring (336 points) and was a part of the 1990 Division III national championship team. He was also a two-time All-American in track, competing in the 100 and 200 meter dashes. A 1993 graduate with a bachelor's degree in English, Drayton was inducted into the Allegheny College Athletic Hall of Fame in 2005.

Drayton, a native of Cleveland, and his wife Monique, a native of Detroit, have two daughters, Amari and Anaya, who are both elite gymnasts. Amari is a member of the U.S. women's national gymnastics team.

AMERICAN BOWL LINEUP

American Athletic Conference teams are guaranteed at least seven bowl appearances annually as part of the conference's new postseason lineup, which began with the 2020 season and is in place through 2025. The American sent its champion to a New Year's Six bowl eight times in the last 10 seasons of the previous postseason structure. With a 12-team format in place, the American Athletic Conference teams are also eligible for the College Football Playoff if they are among the top 12 teams in the final CFP rankings.

As part of the current bowl cycle, The American will annually send teams to the Military Bowl against an Atlantic Coast Conference opponent, the Fenway Bowl in Boston, also against an ACC team, and a third annual spot which will alternate between the Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl and the Hawaii Bowl.

In the 2024 season, The American will additionally fill four spots from a group of eight bowls: the Birmingham Bowl, the Boca Raton Bowl, the Cure Bowl, the Frisco Bowl, the the New Mexico Bowl, the Myrtle Beach Bowl, the ServPro First Responder Bowl, and Union Home Mortgage Gasparilla Bowl.
