Head coach **Chris Klieman** and two players will be made available to the media at Louis Armstrong International Airport upon arrival. Kansas State players and coaches will first be available to the media on Monday, December 26, upon arrival at Louis Armstrong International Airport. CAESARS SUPERDOME

The Caesars Superdome, commonly known as the Superdome, is a multi-purpose stadium located in the Central Business District of New Orleans, Louisiana. It is the home stadium of the New Orleans Saints.

Plans were drawn up in 1967 by the New Orleans modernist architectural firm of Curtis and Davis and the building opened as the Louisiana Superdome in 1975. Its steel frame covers a 13-acre expanse and the 273-foot dome is made of a lamellar multi-ringed frame and has a diameter of 680 feet, making it the largest fixed domed structure in the world.

The Superdome has routinely hosted major sporting events; it has hosted seven Super Bowl games (and will host its eighth, Super Bowl LIX, in 2025), and five NCAA championships in men's college basketball. In college football, the Sugar Bowl has been played at the Superdome since 1975, which is one of the New Year's Six bowl games of the College Football Playoff (CFP). It also traditionally hosts the Bayou Classic, a rivalry game played between the HBCUs Southern University and Grambling State University. The Superdome was also the long-time home of the Tulane Green Wave football team of Tulane University until 2014 (when they returned on-campus at Yulman Stadium), and was the home venue of the New Orleans Jazz of the National Basketball Association from 1975 until 1979.

CATS, TIDE CLASH IN NOLA ON NEW YEAR'S EVE

Coming off a Big 12 Championship for the first time in 10 years, No. 9 Kansas State (10-3) sails into the Allstate Sugar Bowl seeking a school record-tying 11 wins when it meets No. 5 Alabama (10-2) for an 11 a.m. kickoff on December 31 at the Caesars Superdome in New Orleans, Louisiana.

The Sugar Bowl marks the 24th bowl game for the Wildcats, who are advancing to a bowl for a third time in four years under head coach **Chris Klieman**, whose team is making its the New Year's Six appearance in school history outside of appearances in the Cotton and Fiesta Bowls under the previous BCS format.

The Sugar Bowl will mark K-State's first trip to the Big Easy as the Wildcats face the Crimson Tide for the first time in history.

K-State is looking to post back-to-back bowl victories in consecutive seasons for the third time in school history and the first since it won the 2016 Texas Bowl and 2017 Cactus Bowl. K-State is 10-13 in bowl games and comes off a 42-20 win over LSU in the 2021 Texas Bowl.

The Wildcats are 3-2 all-time against SEC teams in bowl games. That includes a 35-21 win over Tennessee (2000), a 29-16 loss to Arkansas (2011) and a 45-23 loss to Arkansas (2015), a 33-28 win over Texas A&M (2016) and last year's victory over LSU.

A LOOK AT THE WILDCATS

K-State reached double-digit victories for the first time since 2012 with a thrilling 31-28 overtime victory against No. 3 TCU in the Big 12 Championship Game at AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas, on December 3. That earned the Cats their third win over a top-10 opponent this season for the first time in school history.

K-State overcame adversity and injuries during a season in which it was picked fifth in the Big 12. The Wildcats tossed outside expectations aside to record one of the most memorable regular seasons ever in Manhattan.

K-State's three losses were all against teams that finished ranked in the Top 25 of the College Football Playoff Poll. That included an early season 17-10 loss to eventual American Conference Champion Tulane. The Wildcats responded with a 41-34 win at then-No. 6 Oklahoma, then scored a 37-28 win over Texas Tech before posting a hard-earned 10-9 win at Iowa State.

Although transfer quarterback **Adrian Martinez** and running back **Deuce Vaughn** emerged as the top quarterback-running back threat in the FBS, adversity struck when Martinez suffered an injury during a 38-28 loss at TCU on October 22. Junior quarterback **Will Howard** stepped in and didn't miss a beat the remainder of the regular season, throwing 15 touchdowns and just two interceptions. Howard threw a school record-tying four touchdowns in a 48-0 win over then-No. 9 Oklahoma State, which marked the most-lopsided win ever by a ranked team over a higher ranked squad.

The Wildcats bounced back from a 34-27 loss to then-No. 24 Texas to win their final three contests at Baylor (31-3) at West Virginia (48-31) and against Kansas (47-27) to clinch a berth in the program's first Big 12 title game since 2003.

Howard, who stepped in for injured Skylar Thompson in both 2020 and 2021, is slated to make his fourth start of the season against the Crimson Tide. He has completed 61.6% of his passes for 1,423 yards and 15 touchdowns and two interceptions to go along with three rushing touchdowns.

Vaughn, who ranks second all-time in rushing (3,471 yards) in K-State history, heads into bowl season as the only active player in the FBS with 3,000 rushing yards and 1,200 receiving yards. Vaughn has 217 carries for 1,425 yards and eight touchdowns and ranks second on the team with 42 catches for 378 yards and three scores this season. He is one of just two players in the last 15 years to record 1,300 rushing yards and 300 receiving yards in multiple seasons.

K-State has the luxury of three senior wide receivers who have taken turns generating big plays. **Malik Knowles** has 47 catches for 719 yards and two touchdowns, **Phillip Brooks** has 41 catches for 543 yards and four touchdowns, and **Kade Warner** has 41 catches for 408 yards and five touchdowns. The Wildcats have a valuable piece in All-Big 12 First Team tight end **Ben Sinnott**, who has 28 catches for 399 yards and four scores.

Defensively, K-State held every FBS opponent under their season scoring average at the time that they played. Linebacker **Austin Moore** leads five defenders with at least 50 tackles – Moore (85 tackles), safeties **Drake Cheatum** (65), **Josh Hayes** (65) and **Kobe Savage** (58), and linebacker **Daniel Green** (56).

However, the Wildcats' biggest defensive threat is Walter Camp All-American defensive end **Felix Anu-dike-Uzomah**, the Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year, who has 44 tackles, including 11 tackles for loss, with 8.5 sacks and two forced fumbles. Additionally, eight different players have recorded at least one interception for the Wildcats, who are tied for sixth nationally with 16 picks this season.

Knowles averages 27.9 yards per kickoff return in his career to rank No. 1 in the FBS among all active players with at least 50 kickoff returns. Brooks averages 14.9 yards per punt return in his career to rank No. 1 nationally among all active players with at least 50 punt returns.

One of the Wildcat most valuable players this season has been senior **Ty Zentner**, who has handled punts, kickoffs and field goals. Zentner's average of 44.72 yards per punt ranks second in school history. He averages 62.8 yards per kickoff with 49 touchbacks. He has made all nine of his field-goal attempts, including the 31-yard game-winner in overtime to lift the Wildcats to their Big 12 title.

A LOOK AT THE CRIMSON TIDE

No. 5 Alabama has appeared in the Sugar Bowl 16 times with a 9-7 record in those contests. Nick Saban, is 283-69-1 in his 16 seasons. He is 15-6 in postseason games at Alabama. Alabama won four of its last six games in the regular season with its two losses at Tennessee (52-49) and at LSU (32-31) coming on the final play.

The Crimson Tide rank fourth in the FBS in scoring offense (40.8) and ninth in scoring defense (18.0). Bryce Young has completed 64.1% of his passes for 3,007 yards and 27 touchdowns and five interceptions. Running back Jahmyr Gibbs leads the team in both rushing attempts (136) and receptions (42). Gibbs has rushed for 805 yards and seven touchdowns and has 378 yards receiving and three scores.

Linebacker Will Anderson Jr., won the Lombardi Award and Nagurski Trophy after recording 51 tackles, including 17.0 tackles for loss and 10 sacks with one interception and 12 quarterback hurries.

WILDCATS HEADED TO ALLSTATE SUGAR BOWL

- Fresh off a 31-28 victory over No. 3 TCU in the 2022 Big 12 Championship, Kansas State received its 24th bowl berth all time and third under head coach **Chris Klieman** as the ninth-ranked Wildcats will face No. 5 Alabama in the 89th annual Allstate Sugar Bowl on Saturday, December 31.
- Of K-State's 24 total bowl appearances all-time, 22 of those have come in the last 30 seasons.
- The Wildcats hold a 10-13 record in bowl games and are looking to win their fourth bowl game in their last five appearances. It would be the first time in school history the Wildcats won four bowls in five tries.
- This will mark the eighth different state in which K-State has traveled to bowl games. The most frequent are Arizona (4-Copper/Insight/Buffalo Wild Wings/Cactus, 3-Fiesta) and Texas (3-Cotton, 3-Texas, 2-Alamo).

K-STATE IN LOUISIANA

- Kansas State is looking to turn around its fortune in the Pelican State as the Wildcats are 0-4 all-time in games played in the state of Louisiana.
- Included in that stretch is a 0-1 mark in New Orleans having lost at Tulane, 20-16, in 1988 inside the Superdome.
- K-State's last game in the state of Louisiana came in 2009 when it lost to Louisiana, 17-15, on a last-minute field goal in Lafayette.

CATS AND CRIMSON TIDE

- Kansas State and Alabama will meet for the first time ever on the gridiron in the Allstate Sugar Bowl.
- It will be just the sixth time the Wildcats have faced a team from the state Alabama, going 1-4 in the previous five games.
- The Wildcats defeated Troy at home in 2003, while they are 0-4 all-time against Auburn. The Tigers are the last team from the state of Alabama the Wildcats have faced, which came in a 20-14 setback at home in 2014.

K-STATE AND THE SEC

- K-State will be playing its 139th game all-time against current members of the SEC, but 107 of those meetings were against either Missouri or Texas A&M as Big Eight/12 foes.
- It marks the second-straight season the Wildcats will face an SEC team in bowl play and the fourth in the Wildcats' last six bowl games. K-State has won each of its last two bowl meetings with SEC teams, defeating LSU in last year's Texas Bowl (42-20) and Texas A&M in the 2016 Texas Bowl (33-28).
- Under head coach **Chris Klieman**, Kansas State is 3-0 against SEC opponents. The Wildcats won at Mississippi State, 31-24, in 2019, defeated LSU in last year's Texas Bowl, and took down Missouri, 40-12, earlier this season.

- The Wildcats are one of four Big 12 teams to accomplish the feat, joining Baylor, Oklahoma and Oklahoma State.
- Since 1993, Kansas State has advanced to 23 bowl games, which is tied for 16th nationally and fourth in the Big 12.

BIG 12 CHAMPS

- Kansas State earned its third Big 12 title with a 31-28 overtime victory over No. 3 TCU in the 2022 Dr. Pepper Big 12 Championship on December 3.
- The victory was the second for the Wildcats in a conference championship game as they took down No. 1 Oklahoma, 35-7, in 2003.
- Kansas State earned its first conference title since finishing with an 8-1 record in 2012 as there was no conference championship game conducted that year.
- It was the fourth ever conference title for the Wildcats, who also won the Big Six in 1934 with a 5-0 record.

- The Wildcats are also third in the conference in winning percentage since round-robin play began in 2011. They sit at 59.3% (64-44), trailing only Oklahoma (77.6%; 83-25) and Oklahoma State (64.8%; 70-38).

SEVEN CONFERENCE WINS

- K-State finished the regular season with a 7-2 mark in Big 12 play. It was the seventh time the Wildcats won seven conference games and the first time they hit that mark since 2014.

TRYING TO TIE A RECORD

- Kansas State will be in search of its 11th victory this season during the Sugar Bowl, which would tie a school record.
- The Wildcats have won 11 games on seven occasions, most recently in 2012. The Wildcats also won 11 games in 1997, 1998, 199, 2000, 2002 and 2003.
- Kansas State has already clinched its 11th season with double-digit victories. The other campaigns with 10 or more wins other than those listed above include 1910, 1995 and 2011.

QUICK STARTS

- Kansas State enters bowl season leading the Big 12 in first-half scoring (276 points) and ranking second in league in first-half scoring differential (+126).
- Second on the list in first-half points is TCU with 256, while Texas is close behind with 255.
- The Wildcats and Texas are the only two Big 12 teams with a first-half scoring differential of over 100 points.

TAKING DOWN TOP-10s

- K-State earned its third victory over an AP Top-10 team this season when it knocked off No. 3 TCU in the Big 12 Championship. It is the first time in school history the Wildcats have taken down multiple AP Top-10 teams in one season.

- Kansas State also defeated then-No. 6 Oklahoma, 41-34, in Norman on Sept. 24, while they shut out then-No. 9 Oklahoma State, 48-0, at home on Oct. 29.
- The Wildcats are now 6-3 in their last nine games against top-10 teams dating back to Nov. 18, 2017, a span that began with a 45-40 victory at No. 10 Oklahoma State. Prior to that, the Cats were just 1-15 in their previous 16 tries.
- Under head coach **Chris Klieman**, the Wildcats have defeated five teams ranked in the top 10 by the Associated Press.

A WINNING HISTORY

- A proven winner with a championship history, **Chris Klieman** holds a 102-32 career record, as his 76.1% career winning percentage ranks third among current FBS coaches that are in at least their 10th season. He is also one of just 16 current Power 5 head coaches with at least 100 victories.
- Klieman, who is 30-19 since arriving at K-State, came to Manhattan after capping his five-year stint as head coach at North Dakota State by winning his fourth national championship in 2018. He guided the 2018 Bison to a perfect 15-0 record.
- Klieman is 7-6 in his career against teams ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 with six of the victories coming at K-State.

TAKING CARE OF THE BALL

- A staple of K-State football over the past decade has been committing very few turnovers, as the Wildcats are second in the nation among Power 5 teams in fewest turnovers since 2012 (164).
- That figure leads the Big 12 as the Wildcats are 17 better than the next closest program (Oklahoma, 181).
- The Wildcats enter the bowl season ranked fifth nationally and tops in the Big 12 in turnover margin (+1.08 / game). They are plus-14 on the year with 24 takeaways and 10 turnovers.
- K-State has not finished in the top 10 nationally in turnover margin since 2016 when it finished fourth (+1.00 per game). The current turnover margin would be K-State's best since it finished at +1.46 per game in 2012 to rank third nationally.

TOP-NOTCH DISCIPLINE

- K-State has been one of the most disciplined teams in the Big 12, ranking third with 43.2 penalty yards per game.
- The Wildcats have been under 40 penalty yards in eight contests and 30 yards or fewer four times.

CATS TOPS IN

NON-OFFENSIVE TOUCHDOWNS

- K-State is the nation's best in non-offensive touchdowns over the last 23 seasons as it has 129 since 1999, seven more than the next closest team (Alabama – 122).
- Kansas State has three non-offensive scores this year. The Wildcats began the year with a blocked punt return touchdown by **Desmond Purnell**.
- The next week against Missouri, **Phillip Brooks** took a punt 76 yards for a score.
- Then, at West Virginia, **Cincere Mason** returned an interception 37 yards for a touchdown, the Wildcats' first pick-6 since 2020.

- Of the 129 non-offensive scores since 1999, 43 have been punt returns, 40 interception returns, 33 kickoff returns, 11 fumble returns and 2 missed/blocked field goal returns.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

KLEIN IS ONE OF FOUR

- A 2012 Heisman Trophy finalist and one of the best signal callers in school history, **Collin Klein** is in his first season as K-State's offensive coordinator.
- Klein is one of just four Power 5 offensive coordinators to play quarterback at the school in which they worked in 2022. The other three are Brandon Streeter (Clemson), Tommy Rees (Notre Dame) and Tavita Pritchard (Stanford).

SCORING SURGE

- K-State has averaged 38.7 points per game over the last six games, a mark that ranks first in the Big 12 and ninth nationally among Power 5 schools.
- When looking at Big 12-only games, K-State ranked second in the league in scoring, averaging 35.2 points per Big 12 game.
- The Wildcats have scored at least 34 points seven times this season, their most since the 2015 campaign.
- K-State topped 45 points each of the final two weeks of the regular season — scoring 48 points at West Virginia and 47 points against Kansas. It was the first time the Wildcats totaled at least 45 points in consecutive Big 12 games since scoring 55 in back-to-back games against West Virginia and Texas Tech in 2012.

TOTAL OFFENSE

- K-State totaled at least 375 yards in all nine conference games in addition to the Big 12 Championship. It marked the first time ever in Big 12 play (since 1996) that the Wildcats totaled at least 375 yard in every league game.
- Overall, the Wildcats have averaged 420.2 yards of offense, which currently ranks fifth in school history.
- With 280 yards in the Sugar Bowl, the Wildcats will rank second in school history in total offensive yards.
- K-State averaged 6.57 yards per play in Big 12 games, which was just 0.02 yards per play shy of first.

EFFICIENCY ON THE GROUND...

- The Wildcats enter the Sugar Bowl ranked 17th nationally and 11th among Power 5 teams with 209.6 rushing yards per game.
- This year's squad has 2,725 rushing yards to rank fifth in school history, while their 5.14 yards per rush ranks third.
- The Wildcats had a season-high 343 rushing yards against Texas Tech, their most in a Big 12 game since posting 345 yards against Oklahoma State in 2016.

...AND THROUGH THE AIR

- Although the Cats do not air it out as much as their Big 12 brethren, they are efficient and have some explosive plays.
- K-State's current 63.3% completion percentage ranks sixth in school history, while the Wildcats have thrown only four interceptions this season to rank fourth nationally. K-State's current 1.13% interception clip is the lowest in school history.
- Additionally, K-State holds a team passing efficiency mark of 145.5 to rank eighth in school history.
- Since the Oklahoma State game in Week 9, the Wildcats hold a 156.8 passing rating to rank sixth among Power 5 teams and first in the Big 12.

WHERE THERE'S A WILL...

- Quarterback **Will Howard** has thrown for 15 touchdowns in his last six games played, tied for the most in five-consecutive games by a Wildcat in which they played (Ell Roberson, 2003).
- He enters bowl season ranked sixth in the Big 12 in passing touchdowns (15), tied for seventh in touchdowns responsible for (18) and 10th in total passing yards (1,423) despite only playing in six contests.
- Impressively, two of Howard's games have come in relief, throwing for two scores at TCU and three more at Baylor.
- In Howard's first start of the season — a 48-0 win at Oklahoma State — he tied the school record with four touchdown passes while also setting a career high with 296 passing yards.
- It was the first time a Wildcat had four passing touchdowns in a game since Jesse Ertz in the 2017 season opener against Central Arkansas, while it was the first against a Big 12 opponent since Jake Waters against Kansas in 2014.
- Each of his scoring strikes against the Cowboys came in the first half, marking the third time in school history a player had four in a half. The other two were by Michael Bishop (1997 vs. Northern Illinois) and Paul Watson (1988 vs. Louisiana Tech).

VERY EFFICIENT

- **Will Howard** enters the Sugar Bowl with a season passing efficiency mark of 162.2, which is currently the top mark in school history (minimum 100 attempts).
- Second on the list is Michael Bishop, who had a 159.6 mark in 1998.
- Howard's 134.5 career pass efficiency rating is seventh in school history. That number has been given a big boost this year as he entered the season with a 114.1 mark.

VAUGHN BACK AT IT

- A First Team All-American, **Deuce Vaughn** ranks 11th nationally and second in the Big 12 with 1,425 rushing yards.
- Vaughn also ranks 10th nationally and second in the Big 12 in scrimmage yards (rushing plus receiving) per game at 136.9.
- A threat virtually every time he touches the ball, Vaughn has gone for at least 10 yards on 139 of his 745 career scrimmage touches (18.7%) and at least 20 yards 51 times (6.8%).

ALL-PURPOSE BACK

- The high marks by **Deuce Vaughn** are not only due to his prowess as a runner, but he has been one of the best backs in the nation on the receiving end as he has 3,471 rushing yards and 1,280 receiving yards over his 36 career games.
- He was the fastest player in Big 12 history to go over 3,000 rushing yards and 1,000 receiving yards in a career, reaching those marks in his 32nd career game. He was also tied for the fastest to get there by any player in the country since 1996 with Penn State's Saquan Barkley and Boise State's Jeremy McNichols.

GOING 70

- Deuce Vaughn** has five career games in which he has totaled at least 70 rushing yards and 70 receiving yards, including this year against Texas (73 rush/86 rec) and Kansas (147 rush/82 rec).
- In the Big 12 era, no other player has more than three such games in their career, which includes former Wildcat Darren Sproles.
- Besides the Texas and Kansas games, Vaughn's other 70/70 games have come against Kansas (2020 and 2021) and Texas Tech (2020).

HITTING 1,000 AGAIN

- Deuce Vaughn** reached the 1,000-yard mark for a second-straight year as he currently has 1,425 yards to rank fourth in school history.
- He is just the third player in school history with multiple 1,000-yard rushing seasons, joining Darren Sproles (2002, 2003, 2004) and Daniel Thomas (2009, 2010).

NOT JUST A BLOCKER

- Sophomore tight end **Ben Sinnott** has been on fire as of late, combining for 286 yards and four touchdowns on 17 catches over the last six games. Included in that stretch were career highs in catches (7), yards (89) and touchdowns (2) at Baylor.
- It was the first time a K-State tight end had multiple touchdowns in a game since Jarrett Grosdidier against Indiana State in 1996, while it was the most receptions by a Wildcat tight end since Rashaad Norwood also had seven at Baylor in 2006.
- His 399 receiving yards this season are the eighth most in school history by a tight end.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

A BIG TURNAROUND

- The K-State defense switched from a four-man front to a 3-3-5 alignment in 2021, and the change has paid off.
- In the 25 games since the defensive switch, the Cats are allowing just 20.5 points per game, which ranks 21st nationally and second in the Big 12. Additionally, they are allowing only 355.4 yards per game over that time, which ranks second in the league.
- Over the 2019 and 2020 seasons, K-State allowed 26.1 points per game and 401.6 yards.

LOCKDOWN DEFENSE

- K-State has held its opponent out of the end zone on four occasions this season, including three in Big 12 play.
- The last time the Wildcats did not surrender a touchdown in four games overall was 2002 (Western Kentucky, Louisiana-Monroe, Kansas and Missouri).
- The last time the Wildcats did give up a touchdown in three Big 12 games was 2001 (Kansas, Iowa State, Missouri).

STOUT IN THE SECOND HALF

- Kansas State's second-half adjustments on defense have been masterful over the last six games as the Wildcats have only surrendered a combined 33-second half points against Oklahoma State (0), Texas (3), Baylor (0), West Virginia (6), Kansas (6) and TCU (18).
- For the season, K-State is allowing an average of just 8.5 points in second halves.

UNDER AVERAGE

- K-State held all of its Big 12 opponents this year under their season averages coming into the game.
- Since head coach **Chris Klieman**'s first year of 2019, the Wildcats have held 30 of their 37 Big 12 opponents under their season average at the time it faces the Wildcats.

PICK ME, PICK ME

- K-State has recorded 16 interceptions to rank sixth in the nation and tops in the Big 12. They have multiple interceptions in six games this year, carding four against Missouri and two apiece against Tulane, Texas Tech, Oklahoma State, Baylor and West Virginia.
- Five of the 16 interceptions have come from linebackers, the most from that position group for a season since 1998 when Jeff Kelly (3) and Mark Simoneau (2) combined for five.

THIRD/FOURTH DOWN DEFENSE

- A year after ranking 78th nationally and sixth in the Big 12 by allowing a 35.4% conversion rate on third down, K-State enters bowl season ranked 25th in the country and third in the conference with a 33.7% rate.
- The Wildcats have allowed their opponents to convert on third down under 50% of the time in 10 of 13 games this season, including the Big 12 Championship game when TCU was just 2-of-15 on third downs.
- On fourth downs, K-State ranks 20th nationally by allowing a 39.4% clip, which is its lowest rate allowed since 2018 (37.5%).

KING FELIX

- After making a name for himself in 2021, **Felix Anudike-Uzomah** has kept things going in 2022 as he was named an All-American by multiple outlets and was the Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year by both the coaches and the Associated Press.

- A Lott IMPACT Trophy finalist and semifinalist for the Bednarik and Rotary Lombardi awards, Anudike-Uzomah has 8.5 sacks this season to lead the Big 12 in total sacks, while he has a pair of forced fumbles to tie for third in the Big 12.
- A product of Kansas City, Missouri, Anudike-Uzomah has 20.5 career sacks to tie for sixth in school history. He also has eight career forced fumbles, as he is just one shy of the school record currently held by three others.
- Anudike-Uzomah is ranked 21st on the Pro Football Focus 2023 NFL Draft Big Board, which is impressive considering he came to K-State in 2020 ranked as the 114th-best weakside defensive end and 2,421st overall player (247Sports).

OLD FACE, NEW PLACE

- Safety **Josh Hayes** is in his sixth year of college football and third school after transferring in the spring from Virginia.
- However, Hayes, a product of Lakeland, Florida, reunited with head coach **Chris Klieman** and defensive coordinator/safeties coach **Joe Klanderman** in Manhattan after the trio were together at North Dakota State. Hayes played as a true freshman and sophomore in 2017 and 2018 under Klieman before he became the K-State head coach for the 2019 season.
- Hayes has played in 67 career games, which is tied for second in the nation among active FBS players and tops in the Big 12.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES SCORING IN THE THIRD PHASE

- One of the main reasons the Wildcats have been a successful program the last three decades is a knack for momentum-swinging plays in the return game.
- Since 2005 (18 seasons), the Wildcats have a combined 60 kickoff- and punt-return touchdowns, 21 more than second-place Alabama (39) and 26 more than the next closest Big 12 team (Oklahoma State – 34).
- Of the 60 total returns, a nation-leading 31 are on kickoff returns. The next closest team is San Diego State with 20.
- With two punt-return touchdowns this season, K-State has now tallied a punt-return score in every season since 2014, as the nine-year stretch is the longest in school history.

DEFENSE ON KICKOFF RETURNS

- Kansas State has not allowed a kickoff return for a touchdown since the 2013 season, going the last 380 returns without allowing opponents to find paydirt on a kickoff return.
- The streak is the longest in the Big 12, 31 more than the next closest team (TCU – 349).
- Since K-State allowed its last kickoff-return touchdown, the Wildcats have scored 14 of their own.

A TRIPLE THREAT

- Senior **Ty Zentner** handled both punting and kickoff duties for the Wildcats throughout the season, while he has been the primary place kicker in the last six games.
- Zentner is one of only three players in the nation – and the only one at a Power 5 school – to handle all three disciplines. The other two are Ryan Coe (Cincinnati) and Jack Browning (San Diego State).

ZENTNER GREAT AT PUNTING...

- **Ty Zentner** has taken advantage of his second senior season in 2022 as the 2022 All-Big 12 Second Team performer is trying to leave K-State near the top of multiple top-10 lists.

- A product of Topeka, Kansas, Zentner was named a semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award. He enters bowl season ranked 17th nationally, second in the Big 12 and second in school history with a 44.7-yard average this season. Additionally, he is second in K-State history in career average (43.4).
- Those averages are held up by eight career games with an average of at least 45.0, including a 54.2-yard average against Missouri, which ranked as the second-highest punting average game in school history (minimum 4 attempts).
- Zentner, who held a 62.7-yard average on three punts against Kansas, boomed a career-long 72-yard punt. It is the longest punt in the Big 12 this season and the longest by a Wildcat since James Garcia hit a 78-yarder at Texas in 1998.

... AND PLACEMENTS

- Ty Zentner's prowess as a punter is impressive considering that he has also handled placements over the last six games and continued to kick off.
- Since taking over placements starting with the Oklahoma State game, Zentner has gone 9-for-9 on field goals and 29-for-29 on extra points.
- His latest field goal will be remembered in K-State lore as it was a 31-yarder in overtime to send K-State to a 31-28 victory over No. 3 TCU in the Big 12 Championship.
- At West Virginia, Zentner hit a 53-yarder right before halftime, which was tied for the 10th-longest field goal in school history and one yard shy of the longest in the Big 12 this season.
- On kickoffs, Zentner has totaled 49 touchbacks on 82 attempts this year (59.8%), while he is 129-for-217 (59.4%) in his career.

KNOWLES WITH A KNACK

- **Malik Knowles** is the latest Wildcat with a knack for kickoff returns as he is tied for fourth in school history in career kickoff return touchdowns thanks to scores last year in back-to-back weeks at Oklahoma State and against Oklahoma in addition to one at Mississippi State in 2019.

- A product of Mansfield, Texas, Knowles currently ranks second in school history in career kickoff-return yards (1,674), tied for third in attempts (60), tied for fourth in touchdowns (3) and sixth in average (27.9).

BROOKS BACK IN THE END ZONE

- **Phillip Brooks** recorded his fourth career punt-return touchdown against Missouri, a 76-yarder en route to Big 12 Special Teams Player of the Week honors.
- His 76-yard return is the 12th longest in the nation and second longest in the Big 12 this year.
- His four punt-return touchdowns rank second in school history and are tied for sixth in Big 12 history. He also ranks fifth in both punt-return yards (640) and average (15.2), while he is tied for ninth in attempts (42).

WILDCATS IN THE NFL

With the NFL season coming down the stretch run of the 2022 season, 14 former Kansas State players are on NFL rosters. Of the 14 players, eight are on defense and six are on offense. The longest-tenured former Wildcats are **Tyler Lockett** and **Cornelius Lucas** as both are entering their eighth season.



Players from last year's team that are now on NFL rosters include defensive lineman **Timmy Horne** (Atlanta), quarterback **Skylar Thompson** (Miami) and safety **Russ Yeast** (Los Angeles Rams).

HEAD COACH CHRIS KLEIEMAN



"Stack good days on top of good days, and I promise you will be pleased with the process." That has been the message throughout the Chris Klieman era at Kansas State. And let's just say there have been many good days stacked on top of one another.

Klieman, a proven winner with a championship history, was named the 35th head football coach in Kansas State history on December 10, 2018, and in four seasons he has compiled 30 wins, which are the most in school history by a head coach in their first four years. Win No. 30 for Klieman will be one that is forever cherished by Wildcat fans as it culminated a 10-3 record in 2022 following a thrilling 31-28 overtime win over No. 3 in the Dr. Pepper Big 12 Championship. It was K-State's fourth-ever conference championship and third as members of the Big 12.

In addition to the 30 overall wins, Klieman has led the Wildcats to three victories over Oklahoma – ranked No. 6 in 2022, No. 5 in 2019 and No. 3 in 2020 – kept the Governor's Cup trophy in Manhattan with four wins over in-state rival KU and has collected 20 Big 12 Conference wins.

Thanks to his 30 wins in Manhattan, Klieman holds a career head coaching record of 102-32 as his 76.2% winning percentage ranks fourth among current FBS coaches that have led programs for at least nine seasons, trailing only Clemson's Dabo Swinney, Alabama's Nick Saban and James Madison's Curt Cignetti.

The 2022 season was one of the ages as the Cats opened the year 2-1 in non-conference play, defeating regional rival Missouri while dropping a close 17-10 contest to Tulane, who went on to finish the season ranked 16th nationally and earned a berth in the AT&T Cotton Bowl. Road wins at No. 6 Oklahoma and Iowa State jump-started Big 12 play, and following losses to ranked foes TCU and Texas, the Wildcats closed out the conference season with three straight wins (and four of the last five)

to earn a berth in the league title game and rematch with the No. 3 Horned Frogs. The overtime win against TCU propelled the Wildcats to the AllState Sugar Bowl, their first New Year's Six bowl since playing in the 2013 Tostitos Fiesta Bowl.

Quarterbacks Adrian Martinez and Will Howard each provided sparks for the offense as Howard took over behind center following an injury to Martinez. Deuce Vaughn eclipsed the century mark for the third straight year rushing the ball, while Cooper Beebe was named the Big 12 Offensive Lineman of the Year.

On defense, the Wildcats ranked among the nation's best in scoring defense and turnover margin in 2022. Felix Anudike-Uzomah was named both the Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year and Defensive Lineman of the Year.

The 2021 season started with three straight non-conference wins over Stanford, Southern Illinois and Nevada and a top-25 national ranking. Following three Big 12-opening losses to teams that were ranked in the top 10 at some point in 2021, the Wildcats reeled off four straight Big 12 wins, which included a come-from-behind road triumph at Texas Tech, home victories over TCU and West Virginia, and the program's 13th-straight win over in-state rival KU.

Under Klieman's watch, Vaughn became the 11th Consensus All-American in school history as the sophomore was one of three players in the nation to top 1,000 rushing yards and 400 receiving yards on the year, while he ranked in the top 25 nationally in nine different offensive categories. Vaughn was one of 16 Wildcats that earned All-Big 12 honors from the league's coaches, which included four first-team members in defensive end Anudike-Uzomah, offensive lineman Beebe, kick returner Malik Knowles and defensive back Russ Yeast.

Much like his first two years in Manhattan, Klieman's emphasis of "how you do one thing is how you do everything" translated to the classroom as a school-record 34 players received Academic All-Big 12 honors. Vaughn and wide receiver Landry Weber each picked up CoSIDA Academic All-District accolades, while Weber was also a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy.

In Klieman's first year at the helm of the K-State program in 2019, the Wildcats managed to win eight games, finish in a tie for third in the Big 12 after being picked ninth in the pre-season, knocked off No. 5 Oklahoma at home for the first time since 1996, won at Mississippi State – the Wildcats' first win in 11 tries inside an SEC stadium – kept the Governor's Cup in Manhattan following their 11th-straight win over rival Kansas and quickly got back to bowl eligibility after missing out the year prior. The eight wins by Klieman were the most in school history by a first-year coach and also ranked second nationally among first-year Power 5 head coaches in 2019, trailing only Ohio State's Ryan Day.

A total of 15 Wildcats earned All-Big 12 recognition in 2019, led by Special Teams Player of the Year Joshua Youngblood, who became the first true freshman in Big 12 history to be named Big 12 player of the year on offense, defense or special teams. His three kick returns for touchdowns led the nation in 2019 and sparked key Big 12 wins over Texas Tech and No. 23 Iowa State.

The Wildcats placed a school-record 32 players on the Academic All-Big 12 teams, including a league-record 26 first-team members. Headlining the list was Adam Holtorf, who was the Big 12 Scholar Athlete of the Year, a First Team Academic All-American and finalist for the Campbell Trophy.

Kansas State jumped out of the gate in Big 12 play in 2020 by winning its first four games, the first time the Wildcats went 4-0 to start conference play in six years and just the sixth time in the 25-year history of the Big 12. One of those victories was at No. 3 Oklahoma, the first road win over a top-five team in school history. The Wildcats were the first team to win two-straight games against the Sooners since 2013 and 2014 (Baylor) and the first to defeat top-five Sooner teams in consecutive years since 2001 and 2002 (Oklahoma State).

However, battling through the COVID-19 pandemic and losing senior starting quarterback Skylar Thompson for the season during the third game of the year, the Wildcats finished at 4-6. K-State was one of just two teams in the nation (Georgia Tech) to start true freshmen at both quarterback and running back in at least seven games in 2020. The running back turned out to be one of the best in the nation as Vaughn was named the True Freshman of the Year by 247Sports, landed on multiple All-America teams and was the Big 12 Offensive Freshman of the Year. Vaughn was one of nine Wildcats to earn All-Big 12 honors. The Wildcats also had another stellar year in the classroom in 2020 as they broke their own record from the year prior for Academic All-Big 12 honors with 33, which included 26 first-team members.

Prior to arriving at K-State, Klieman capped his five-year stint as head coach at North Dakota State by winning his fourth national championship in 2018. He tied Jim Tressel (Youngstown State) for the most FCS National Championships as a head coach, while he was a part of seven national championships at NDSU, which was the most in FCS history at the time of his departure.

Klieman guided the 2018 Bison to a perfect 15-0 record, just the fifth team in FCS history to go undefeated and untied on the way to a national championship. North Dakota State also claimed that feat in 2013 when Klieman as the defensive coordinator.

A native of Waterloo, Iowa, Klieman is first in NDSU history in winning percentage (.920) and third in victories (69).

Klieman's accomplishments as the Bison head coach came despite losing 23 seniors and welcoming seven new assistant coaches prior to his first season at the helm in 2014. That year, the Bison went 15-1 and won the national championship before going 13-2 with another national championship in 2015, 12-2 with a semifinal appearance in 2016 and 14-1 with a third national title in 2017.

Of Klieman's 69 wins at North Dakota State, 39 (56.5 percent) came over ranked opponents, while he had two wins in two tries over FBS competition – a 34-14 victory at Iowa State in his first game at the helm of NDSU and a 23-21 triumph at 11th-ranked Iowa in 2016. His teams were also stellar in protecting home field as evidenced by his 43-3 home record at NDSU, which includes winning each of his last 19 games at the FargoDome.

The Bison won the Missouri Valley Football Conference each of his five years as head coach and put together a collective 36-4 (90.0 percent) record against conference foes during that time. He was named the Bruce Craddock MVFC Coach of the Year in 2017, while he was the 2014 Rawlings Football/American Football Monthly FCS Coach of the Year and the 2018 AFCA Region 4 FCS Coach of the Year.

Elevated from defensive coordinator to head coach at NDSU on December 15, 2013, Klieman's defensive units during his two-year run as coordinator each included top-10 rankings in scoring defense, total defense, rushing defense and passing defense. Highlighting that run were No. 1 rankings in scoring defense in both 2012 and 2013, and total defense in 2012, the latter when he was named the Football Scoop FCS Coordinator of the Year. NDSU also led the nation in scoring defense when he was the defensive backs coach in 2011.

Klieman began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at his alma mater, Northern Iowa, in 1991 and 1992 before being promoted to an assistant coach in 1993. He went on to Western Illinois as an assistant coach from 1994 to 1996 before serving as a graduate assistant at Kansas in 1997 and an assistant coach at Missouri State in 1999.

Klieman then moved on to Division III Loras College in Dubuque, Iowa, where he was the defensive coordinator from 2002 to 2004 before taking over as head coach for the 2005 season. He returned to Northern Iowa in 2006 as an assistant coach before being elevated to defensive coordinator for the 2009 and 2010 seasons.

Klieman was a three-time All-Gateway Conference defensive back at Northern Iowa and four-year letterwinner from 1986 to 1990. He graduated from UNI in 1990 with a bachelor's degree in health education and a master's degree in physical education in 1992.

Klieman and his wife, Rhonda, are parents of two sons, Devin and Colby, and one daughter, Haley.

- Enters bowl season ranked sixth in the Big 12 in passing touchdowns (15), tied for seventh in touchdowns responsible for (18) and 10th in passing yards (1,423) despite only playing in six games.
- Enters the Sugar Bowl ranked first in school history in season passing efficiency (162.2), while he is seventh in a career (134.5)... His career efficiency mark has jumped over 30 points this season (entered 2022 with a 114.1 mark).
- Has 15 passing touchdowns this season, needing two in the Sugar Bowl to enter the school's top-10 list.
- Has 24 career passing touchdowns, just one shy of tying for 10th in school history.
- Has accounted for 34 career touchdowns to rank 10th in school history.
- Needs 67 passing yards in the Sugar Bowl to become the 15th player in school history with 3,000 passing yards in a career.
- Enters the Sugar Bowl ranked ninth in school history in career passing yards per game (139.7).
- Has 15 touchdown passes over his six games this season, tied for the most touchdown passes ever by a Wildcat over a six-game stretch in which they played (Ell Roberson: 2003).
- Tied a school record with four touchdown passes against Oklahoma State while also setting a career high in passing yards (296) and tying his career high in completions (21).
- It was the 17th time in school history a Wildcat had four touchdown passes in a game, while it was the first time since Jesse Ertz against Central Arkansas in 2017 and the first against a Big 12 opponent since Jake Waters against Kansas in 2014.
- All four of Howard's touchdown passes against the Cowboys came in the first half as he became the third Wildcat to throw four in a half (Michael Bishop – 1997 vs. Northern Illinois and Paul Watson – 1988 vs. Louisiana Tech).
- His four passing TDs are tied for the third most by a Big 12 player this year entering bowl season.

- Enters bowl season ranked eighth nationally among quarterbacks and fifth overall in the Big 12 in rushing touchdowns as he earned All-Big 12 Honorable Mention accolades from the league's coaches in addition to picking up votes for the Big 12 Offensive Newcomer of the Year award.
- Posted a season-high 329 passing yards against Texas, the third-highest total of his career and the most by a Wildcat since Skylar Thompson had 334 yards at Oklahoma in 2020.
- Had an 81-yard pass at Iowa State, 10th-longest pass in school history and the longest in his career.
- Rushed for a career high 171 yards against Texas Tech – the fifth most by a quarterback in a game in school history and the third most by a QB in the nation this year – to go along with three rushing touchdowns.
- Had 148 rushing yards and four touchdowns the week prior at Oklahoma as his 148 yds are the fifth most by a quarterback this year and his four rushing scores are the most.
- One of just three Power 5 quarterbacks over the last 15 seasons with 300 rushing yards and seven rushing touchdowns over a two-game span, joining Lamar Jackson (2016) and Cam Newton (2010).
- Teamed with Deuce Vaughn (116 yards at Oklahoma, 170 yards against Texas Tech) to give K-State two 100-yard rushers in consecutive games for the first time in school history.
- The first K-State QB with consecutive 100-yard rushing games since Jesse Ertz in 2016, and it was the first time in his career he accomplished the feat.
- Has three rushes of 50 or more yards this year, one of just two Power 5 quarterbacks to tally at least three (Riley Leonard, Duke).
- Is the first K-State player with runs of at least 55 yards in consecutive games since James Johnson in 2007 (66 yards against Missouri and 67 yds at Fresno State).
- Earned Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week and Manning Award Star of the Week honors following his performance at Oklahoma in which he accounted for 382 yards of total offense and 5 TDs.
- Led the Cats to 509 yards of total offense at Oklahoma, their most since the 2019 Bowling Green game (521 yards) and most in a Big 12 game since the 2014 Texas Tech game (535 yards).
- Started K-State's 2022 season opener, the first FBS transfer QB to start a season opener since Matt Miller in 1994 (Texas A&M)... Miller sat out the 1993 season due to NCAA transfer rules, making Martinez the first to transfer and start the next year's season opener.

► Game Notes

The attendance for tonight's season opener was 50,469... It was the first sellout for K-State since the 2019 Oklahoma game (50,394)... The 2019 season – which was the first for head coach **Chris Klieman** – had three sellouts as the Baylor (50,448) and Nicholls (51,189) contests were also sellouts... The game against Nicholls was Klieman's first at the helm of the Wildcats.

• K-State shut out South Dakota, as it was the Wildcats' first shutout since the 2019 Bowling Green contest... It was K-State's first shutout in a season opener since also blanking South Dakota, 34-0, in 2015.

• K-State scored its first touchdown 10 seconds into the game on a 75-yard run by wide receiver **Malik Knowles**... It was the fastest score in a game in school history... The previous fastest was an 11-second score against Louisiana Tech in 1988... The previous record for a season-opening score was 12 seconds on a Morgan Burns kickoff return against South Dakota in 2015... It was the first time K-State scored on its first offensive play since a 68-yard touchdown from Skylar Thompson to Dalton Schoen against West Virginia in 2019... Knowles' 75-yard rush tied for the 12th-longest run in school history, a mark he also had at Baylor in 2020.

• **Seth Porter** blocked South Dakota's second punt of the evening, which **Desmond Purnell** scooped up and returned 17 yards for a touchdown... It was the second-straight season K-State had a blocked punt for a touchdown, as the Wildcats had one last year against West Virginia... It is the first time K-State had a blocked punt for a touchdown in consecutive seasons since 2007 and 2008.

WILDCATS BLANK SOUTH DAKOTA IN OPENER

MANHATTAN, Kan. – Kansas State didn't waste any time in getting the fireworks started on its 2022 football season.

It took all of 10 seconds.

Wide receiver Malik Knowles took a handoff and darted 75 yards for a touchdown on the very first play from scrimmage, the fastest opening score in K-State history, and Preseason All-American Deuce Vaughn rushed for 126 yards and one touchdown, as the Wildcats rolled to a 34-0 victory over South Dakota in front of a sellout crowd of 50,469 at Bill Snyder Family Stadium.

K-State, 1-0, outgained South Dakota, 0-1, 393 to 270 overall, and stormed to a 27-0 halftime lead with three rushing touchdowns and another off a blocked punt. The Wildcats, who returned 13 starters and seethed with momentum after a dominant win over LSU in the Texas Bowl, appeared dominant from the start in an opening contest that was never in question ahead of an anticipated contest against former Big 12 Conference member Missouri.

A total of 66 different K-State players saw action as the Wildcats substituted as the game wore on over the final two quarters.

Adrian Martinez completed 11 of 15 passes for 53 yards and added 39 yards on 13 carries and a six-yard touchdown on the ground in his debut in the Wildcats' offense under first-year offensive coordinator Collin Klein. The 6-foot-2, 225-pound transfer from Nebraska completed passes to six different targets, including Knowles, who had three catches for 14 yards. Martinez was efficient, didn't commit a turnover, and managed the game well for his first game in a purple uniform.

Redshirt freshman Jake Rubley played the entire fourth quarter and appeared poised in the pocket during the first action of his career. Rubley went 4 for 4 for 43 yards.

K-State's experienced defense was largely effective as defensive coordinator Joe Klanderman utilized the 3-3-5 alignment throughout the contest. Felix Anudike-Uzomah, the Preseason Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year, recorded the Wildcats' first sack of the season early in the first quarter. Safety Cincere Mason recorded the first interception of the season for the Wildcats late in the first quarter.

It wasn't until Carson Camp completed a 13-yard pass to Javion Phelps with 8:29 left in the third quarter that South Dakota reached 100 yards in total offense. However, the Coyotes saw their 11-play drive end with fourth-down incompleteness.

The Coyotes threatened late when they reached the red zone on their final drive of the game, but Cartez Crook-Jones stuffed Mike Mansaray at the four-yard line on fourth down to preserve the shutout.

While K-State recorded its first shutout since 2019, the Wildcats enjoyed their first opening-play touchdown since against West Virginia in 2019.

Martinez handed the ball off to Knowles, who ran around the left side. Vaughn sprung him with a block. And Knowles raced down the sideline as cheers swept through the stadium during the march into history.

K-State's previous fastest opening score came in an 11-second score against Louisiana Tech in 1988.

Soon after, the special teams punt-block unit enjoyed a victory of its own when Seth Porter swept in and blocked a South Dakota punt and Desmond Purnell scooped up the football and returned it 17 yards for a touchdown with 8:14 left in the first quarter. Amazingly, it marked the Wildcats' 126th non-offensive touchdown since 1999, which leads the FBS over the span. Alabama ranks second with 118 non-offensive touchdowns.

Vaughn scored his first touchdown of the season when he raced around the right side, cut inside, and weaved 39 yards into the end zone with 49 seconds remaining in the quarter for a 20-0 lead.

► Game Notes

• Kansas State improved to 4-0 against non-conference Power 5 opponents under head coach Chris Klieman... The Wildcats won at Mississippi State in 2019 before defeating both Stanford (season opener) and LSU (Texas Bowl) last season... Dating back to his days as the head coach at North Dakota State, Klieman is now 6-0 against non-conference Power 5 opponents, as his Bison team defeated Iowa State in 2014 and Iowa in 2016.

• K-State tallied four interceptions on the day, the first time the Wildcats had at least four picks in a game since the 2014 Texas Tech game... Daniel Green and Nick Allen each had an interception, the first time linebackers had at least two picks in a game since Elijah Lee had two himself against TCU in 2015.

• Deuce Vaughn has rushed for at least 100 yards in eight-straight games dating back to last year, which is the second-longest streak in school history... Vaughn also has a rushing touchdown in nine-consecutive games, which is the fifth-longest streak in school history... With his effort against Missouri, Vaughn went from outside the top 10 to eighth in school history in career rushing yards, a mark that now stands at 2,171... Vaughn now has 28 rushing touchdowns, which is tied for sixth in school history.

• Phillip Brooks returned a punt 76 yards for a touchdown... It was the longest punt return since Isaiah Zuber took one 85 yards for a touchdown in the 2018 season opener against South Dakota... Brooks now has four punt-return scores in his career to move into sole possession of second place in school history.

CATS DOMINATE IN WIN OVER MISSOURI

MANHATTAN, Kan. – Kansas State fans chanted “Big-Twelve-Football” and the marching band blared “Happy Trails” as soggy Missouri fans headed to the exits, and the Wildcats thumped the former Big 12 Conference member 40-12 in the first meeting between the teams since 2011 at rainy Bill Snyder Family Stadium.

Ponchos were the garment of the day among the 51,806 fans — many of whom returned after the initial lightning delay — but wetness did little to extinguish the flame of an old-school rivalry rekindled under the stadium lights in Manhattan. The K-State Marching Band played on, and new K-State men’s head basketball coach Jerome Tang stood in the K-State student section and performed the Wabash, as the Wildcats prevailed in the 98th meeting between the schools on the gridiron.

For the Missouri natives on the K-State team, the game took on a heightened meaning. That includes senior wide receiver Phillip Brooks, a native of Lee’s Summit, Missouri, who returned a punt 76 yards into the end zone to give the Wildcats a 20-3 lead in the second quarter.

Lightning prompted a 57-minute game delay with 7 minutes, 44 seconds left in the second quarter. When the teams returned to the field, Brooks provided the fireworks, and he now has four career punt-return touchdowns, which ranks second in K-State history.

The big storyline during the contest? Which team would better handle the rain. Deuce Vaughn had 145 rushing yards and two touchdowns — a 1-yard run that gave K-State a 7-3 lead late in the first quarter, and a 24-yard score early in the fourth quarter for a 33-6 advantage.

K-State seemed to handle the conditions much better than Missouri which is located 250 miles down Interstate 70. For a second-straight game, K-State senior transfer quarterback Adrian Martinez managed the offense without committing a turnover. He completed 9 of 20 passes for 101 yards and added 52 yards and one score on the ground, as the Wildcats outgained the Tigers 336 to 222 amid sporadic downpours. K-State held a 235-94 edge in rushing yards.

Meanwhile, the K-State defense forced an interception on four consecutive possessions, marking the first four-interception performance by the Wildcats since 2014.

Safeties Kobe Savage and Cincere Mason, and linebackers Daniel Green and Nick Allen each recorded a pick for a defense that also featured 10 tackles for loss, including a sack by Preseason Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year Felix Anudike-Uzomah.

It wasn’t until the final play of the game following a roughing-the-quarterback penalty that K-State surrendered its first touchdown of the 2022 season on a 1-yard touchdown run with no time left on the game clock. K-State shut out South Dakota 34-0 in its season opener and for 60 minutes held Missouri to two field goals — until the untimed play with no time remaining.

After Missouri managed a game-opening 11-play, 44-yard drive that resulted in a 49-yard field goal, the Wildcats’ defense made the Tigers appear largely pedestrian. Ten of the Tigers’ next 13 drives went for 20 or fewer yards. An 8-play, 54-yard drive in the third quarter resulted in a 44-yard field goal. K-State led 20-6 and responded with a pair of Chris Tennant field goals of 35 and 27 yards while scoring the next 20 points.

Redshirt freshman running back DJ Giddens scored the Wildcats’ final points when he raced 28 yards through the middle of the field with 2:33 left.

► Game Notes

• It was the third-straight sellout of Bill Snyder Family Stadium to open the 2022 season... It is the first time since the 2017 season that K-State sold out its first three games (Central Arkansas, Charlotte, Baylor)... That season, the Wildcats sold out the first six games of their seven-game home slate.

• Kansas State intercepted two passes, giving the Cats seven for the season... The seven interceptions in the first three games are the most by the Wildcats since the 2000 squad also had seven against Iowa (1), Louisiana Tech (4) and Ball State (2)... The interceptions on Saturday came from Daniel Green and Kobe Savage, who each carded their second-straight game with a pick.

• Senior linebacker Daniel Green intercepted a second-quarter pass and returned it 49 yards... It was the longest interception return by a Wildcat since Dante Barnett went 51 yards against Michigan in the 2013 Buffalo Wild Wings Bowl... It was the longest return by a linebacker since Alex Hrebec went 51 yards against Iowa State in the 2008 season finale... His two picks this season is the first time a Wildcat linebacker has had multiple interceptions in a season since Da'Quan Patton in 2019.

• Linebacker Austin Moore and safety Kobe Savage each recorded new career highs in tackles... More tallied eight stops, which bettered the six he had last week against Missouri... He also tallied a career-high 2.0 tackles for loss for a second-straight week... Savage finished the game with seven tackles, bettering the three stops he had last week against the Tigers.

TULANE EDGES K-STATE

MANHATTAN, Kan. – Kansas State head coach Chris Klieman earlier in the week insisted that Tulane was a good team. Unfortunately, the Wildcats found out exactly how good the Green Wave was.

Adrian Martinez threw for 150 yards and one touchdown, and Deuce Vaughn added 81 yards on the ground, but the Wildcats found difficulty converting on third and fourth down and an exhausted defense struggled to put the brakes on late in a 17-10 loss to Tulane in front of a sellout crowd at Bill Snyder Family Stadium.

Despite its challenges, K-State was tied 10-10 heading into the final 5 minutes. However, Tulane quarterback Michael Pratt showed his moxie with a 4-yard touchdown pass to Tyrick James with 4 minutes and 27 seconds remaining. The Wildcats were unable to answer, and the Green Wave took control and converted on fourth-and-1 from their own 24-yard line in the final minute to secure their first win over a Power 5 conference team since 2010.

Although K-State and Tulane both had 336 total yards, both offenses struggled in sustaining drives. Tulane went 1 for 12 on third down while K-State went 2 of 15. The Wildcats also went just 1 of 5 on fourth down. None proved more costly than when the Wildcats faced fourth-and-1 at the Tulane 44-yard line late in the game but were unable to keep alive their drive.

That set up Tulane at its own 48. Pratt rushed for 11 yards, completed a 15-yard pass, then scrambled for 21 yards to the K-State 5. A 1-yard rush by running back Iverson Celestine set up Pratt's short touchdown pass for a 17-10 lead.

The Wildcats saw their ensuing drive stall and the Green Wave ran out the clock on one of their biggest victories in two decades.

Vaughn had 20 carries for 81 yards, bringing an unfortunate end to his streak of eight consecutive 100-yard rushing games and a streak of nine straight games with a rushing touchdown.

Pratt went 13 of 26 for 176 yards and one touchdown and two interceptions while adding a career-high 87 rushing yards on 12 carries for the Green Wave, who suffered a 40-35 loss at No. 2 Oklahoma last season in Norman.

Tulane struck first when running back Tyjae Spears, playing as Wildcat quarterback, ran one yard into the end zone to cap a 9-play, 91-yard drive with 3:13 left in the first quarter. It was the longest drive allowed by the K-State defense this season and marked the first time the Wildcats trailed by a touchdown.

Martinez and Kade Warner combined to tie the score at 7-7 with 2:43 left in the second quarter when Martinez threw his prettiest and longest pass of the season — a 21-yard completion to high-flying Warner, who hauled into the ball in the corner of the end zone and showed off his strength and concentration by maintaining possession despite being struck by two different defenders on his way to the turf.

Then the K-State defense sprang into action. Pratt threw a dart down the middle of the field that linebacker Daniel Green picked off and returned 49 yards down the Green Wave sideline with 28 seconds remaining in the second quarter. It marked Pratt's first interception of the season and the second interception by Green in two games.

Martinez took over at the Tulane 23 and got the ball to the 4 before his incompletion through the back of the end zone prompted a Chris Tenant 22-yard field goal as time expired for halftime.

► Game Notes

• Kansas State earned its 11th all-time victory against an Associated Press top-10 team, while it was the fifth in a road game... The Wildcats have now defeated a team ranked in the AP Top 25 in four of the last six seasons, including the third time under head coach Chris Klieman... The Wildcats won vs. No. 5 Oklahoma in 2019 and at No. 3 Oklahoma in 2020.

• K-State totaled 509 yards of total offense, the first time going over 500 yards since last year's KU game (504 yards)... It was the most total offense by the Wildcats since tallying 521 against Bowling Green in 2019 and the most against a Big 12 team since going for 535 yards against Texas Tech in 2014.

• Adrian Martinez threw for 234 yards a touchdown on 21-of-34 aim, while he rushed for 148 yards and four touchdowns on 21 carries... He set a new career high in rushing TDs, bettering the three he had last season against Northwestern while playing for Nebraska... It is the most rushing touchdowns by a Wildcat since Skylar Thompson had three at Oklahoma in 2020.

• Deuce Vaughn rushed 25 times for 116 yards, while he hauled in two passes for 13 yards... He tallied his 15th career 100-yard rushing game, which remains the second most in school history... In each of his three games against Oklahoma, Vaughn has gone for 100 yards in either rushing (2022) or receiving (2020 and 2021).

• Martinez and Vaughn each eclipsed the 100-yard mark on the ground... It is the first time the Wildcats had two 100-yard rushers in the same game since the 2017 Cactus Bowl and the first in a Big 12 game since doing so against Oklahoma in 2017.

MARTINEZ, CATS GO WIRE-TO-WIRE IN NORMAN

NORMAN, Okla. – Kansas State players said that they were hungry after ending their non-conference slate with a loss. The Wildcats opened their Big 12 Conference season by taking a bite out of a familiar foe in record-setting style.

Adrian Martinez threw for 234 yards and one touchdown and added 21 carries for 148 yards and four touchdowns, while Deuce Vaughn added 25 carries for 116 yards, as K-State vaulted past No. 6 Oklahoma, 41-34, in front of a sellout crowd at Memorial Stadium.

It marked the most points K-State has ever scored in Norman in a series that began in 1908.

It also marked the third time in four meetings that K-State beat Oklahoma. That includes the second straight time in Norman, where the Sooners are usually infallible, yet saw their mystique crack at the hands of Martinez & Co., who spoiled the first Big 12 game for Oklahoma head coach Brent Venables in his first game against his alma mater.

Martinez, who threw for nearly 300 yards against Oklahoma last season when he played at Nebraska, was amazing in his first Big 12 game as a Wildcat, engineering five touchdown drives, including two in the fourth quarter when the Sooners tried to keep up on the scoreboard.

K-State never trailed. It stormed to a 14-0 lead when Martinez completed a 6-yard scoring toss to Knowles, then took a 24-17 lead into the locker room, then led 27-20 after three quarters, and led 41-27 with 1 minute, 58 seconds remaining. In a game that was projected to be a defensive battle, K-State and Oklahoma combined for 75 points and 1,059 total yards.

Chris Kleiman improved to 3-1 against Oklahoma, winning 48-41 in 2019 in Manhattan, 38-35 in 2020 in Norman, then losing 37-31 last season before giving K-State its ninth victory over a Top 10 team since 2000 — four of which are against Oklahoma.

K-State outgained Oklahoma 550 to 509. The Wildcats launched a balanced attack — 275 rushing yards and 234 passing — against a Venables-led defense that entered among the fiercest in the FBS. The Wildcats ranked 13th in scoring defense and 20th in total defense in the FBS and proved they could go toe-to-toe against an Oklahoma offense that ranked 20th in scoring offense and 17th in total offense. Back and forth the teams battled, but the Wildcats kept the Sooners out of the end zone on five straight drives in the second half.

Oklahoma quarterback Dillon Gabriel completed 26 of 39 passes for 330 yards and four touchdowns and added seven carries for 61 yards. He threw back-to-back long touchdowns to Theo Wease (56 yards) and Marvin Mims (50) to tie the score at 14-14. Running back Eric Gray had 16 carries for 114 yards.

Martinez struck first and instantly showed flashes of his old self while using his arm and legs on a game-opening 12-play, 75-yard charge. He hit Ben Sinnott with two passes and Kade Warner with another, and rushed four times for 29 yards, including a 6-yard touchdown run for a 7-0 lead.

Sinnott had career highs with four catches for 80 yards. Phillip Brooks had seven catches for 56 yards. Knowles had four catches for 52 yards and one touchdown.

► Game Notes

• Kansas State improved to 2-0 in Big 12 play for the second time in head coach **Chris Klieman**'s four seasons in Manhattan and the eighth time since the Big 12 began in 1996... In each of the previous seven seasons the Wildcats won their first two Big 12 games, they finished with less than six Big 12 win just one time.

• **Adrian Martinez** rushed for a career-high 171 yards and three touchdowns... He tied for fifth in school history in rushing yardage by a quarterback in a game... Coupled with his 148 rushing yards at Oklahoma, it was the first time a K-State quarterback had consecutive 100-yard rushing games since **Jesse Ertz** in 2016 (106 vs. Iowa State; 153 vs. Oklahoma State), while it is the first time in Martinez's career he had back-to-back 100-yard rushing games.

• **Martinez and Deuce Vaughn** teamed for another 100-yard rushing game... It is the first time in school history K-State had two rushes with 100-yard games in back-to-back contests.

• **Felix Anudike-Uzomah and Khalid Duke** each finished the game with 3.0 sacks... It was the first time in school history the Wildcats had two players with 3.0 sacks in the same game... Each player tied for the fourth most sacks in a game in school history... It is the first time two K-State players had at least two sacks in the same game since **Wyatt Hubert** and **Reggie Walker** each carded 2.0 sacks against Texas Tech in 2018... Anudike-Uzomah now has 17.5 sacks in his career, just one shy of entering the school's career top-10 list.

FOURTH QUARTER SURGE PUSHES CATS OVER TECH

MANHATTAN, Kan.— Adrian Martinez earlier in the week said that No. 25 Kansas State had to prove its national ranking. The Wildcats did so emphatically while the star quarterback and running back Deuce Vaughn continue to prove themselves as one of the top tandems in the Big 12 Conference.

Martinez rushed for a career-high 171 yards and three touchdowns, and Vaughn added a career-high 170 rushing yards, as the Wildcats scored 17 unanswered points to outlast Texas Tech, 37-28.

Martinez started things off early. He rushed 57 yards on the first play from scrimmage and then rushed 18 more into the end zone just 40 seconds into the contest.

Although K-State continued its roll while defeating Texas Tech for the 11th time in 12 meetings, it didn't come without a few bumps — and a lively halftime speech from Klieman, who was displeased that his team led just 13-10 at halftime after numerous opportunities to widen the margin.

Martinez completed 12 of 19 passes for 116 yards and one touchdown — an 18-yard scoring toss to Phillip Brooks that made it 20-13. When Texas Tech quarterback Donovan Smith answered by firing a 12-yard touchdown pass to Xavier White to cap a 7-play, 75-yard drive and tie the score at 20-20, Martinez ripped off a 69-yard run into the end zone early in the fourth quarter.

Chris Tennant, who was 3 for 3 on field goals, booted a 32-yarder to give the Wildcats a 30-20 lead with 9 minutes, 7 seconds left in the game.

Martinez put it away with a 12-yard touchdown run with just under 6 minutes to go, which extended the lead to 37-20.

K-State did a magnificent job of bouncing back after essentially going nearly one quarter of playing time without a touchdown.

Texas Tech outgained K-State 473-459 and ran 82 offensive plays after twice posting 100-plus plays earlier this season. The Wildcats held the high-octane Red Raiders to 5.8 yards per play. Smith completed 34 of 48 passes for 359 yards and two touchdowns — completing passes to 13 different players. But he also suffered two interceptions and was sacked six times — three by Khalid Duke and three by Felix Anudike-Uzomah, the Big 12 Preseason Defensive Player of the Year.

When Texas Tech knotted the score a 20-20 late in the third quarter, the Wildcats' defense, which appeared gassed at times, knew it needed to respond. And after Martinez's long run put K-State ahead by a touchdown, the defense buckled down. Texas Tech failed to convert on fourth-and-5 at its own 40-yard line — a critical play as cornerback Ekow Boye-Doe broke up a pass intended for J.J. Sparkman across the middle to give the Wildcats possession.

Shortly after, Tennant's 32-yard field goal lifted the Wildcats to a two-score advantage.

For a second straight week, the K-State offense played lights out, averaging 7.9 yards per play behind Martinez and Vaughn, who became the first duo in school history to reach 100 rushing yards in consecutive games.

Vaughn increased his career rushing total to 2,684 yards, moving to No. 5 on the school's all-time list.



► Game Notes

• Kansas State improved to 3-0 in Big 12 play for the second time in head coach **Chris Klieman**'s four seasons in Manhattan and the seventh time since the Big 12 began in 1996... In each of the previous six seasons the Wildcats won their first three Big 12 games, they finished with less than six Big 12 win just one time.

• The Wildcats are 5-1 halftime through its 12-game schedule... It is the third time in Chris Klieman's four seasons at the helm that the Wildcats won five of their first six games... It is the seventh time K-State has won at least five of their first six games since college football implemented a 12-game schedule in 2006.

• The nine points surrendered by K-State on Saturday was the fewest since allowing just seven points to Stanford in the 2021 season opener... It was the fewest against a Big 12 opponent since the 2018 Texas Tech game (6) and the fewest in a Big 12 road game since the 2016 TCU contest (6)... In a tightly contested series against Iowa State, it was the fewest surrendered to the Cyclones since 2013 (7) and the fewest allowed in Ames since 2003 (0).

• Wide receivers **Phillip Brooks** (119) and **Malik Knowles** (108) each tallied 100-yard receiving games... It is the first time the Wildcats had two 100-yard receivers in the same game since 2017 against Central Arkansas (Byron Pringle: 121 yards; Isaiah Harris: 118 yards)... It is the first time in a Big 12 game since the 2014 Kansas game (Curry Sexton: 141 yards; Tyler Lockett: 199 yards).

CATS OUTLAST CYCLONES

AMES, Iowa – The latest nail-biting installment of the Kansas State-Iowa State rivalry, called Farmageddon, ended shortly after 9 p.m. But for a third-straight Saturday, it was 9AM for another Big 12 Conference opponent.

Adrian Martinez, adoringly called "9AM," took a final kneel down, K-State head coach Chris Klieman pumped his fist on the visitor's sideline, and more than 60,000 at Jack Trice Stadium stood in silence as time ticked down on the Wildcats' fourth-quarter comeback victory.

No. 10 K-State 10, Iowa State 9.

Martinez, who accounted for 669 total yards and nine touchdowns in wins over then-No. 6 Oklahoma (41-34) and Texas Tech (38-27), threw for 246 yards and one touchdown and added 19 carries for 77 yards, and the Wildcats' defense, called countless times to hold down the Cyclones' offense, stiffened again and again.

K-State led 7-6 at halftime, then trailed 9-7 on a 43-yard field goal by Jace Gilbert with 5 minutes, 27 seconds left in the third quarter.

K-State responded in handing Iowa State just its fourth home loss in the last 30 games.

Chris Tennant nailed a 30-yard field goal with 7:14 seconds remaining in the fourth quarter for the 10-9 win, the lowest-scoring game in the series since a 7-7 tie in Ames in 1984.

The defense stiffened one last time when it mattered most, giving K-State its 12th-straight victory over Iowa State when ranked in the AP Top 25.

K-State's 10 points marked its fewest in a conference road win since a 9-3 victory at Iowa State in 1982. It marked the first time since 2016 that K-State held a Big 12 opponent to single digits on the road.

There were an abundance of big moments not necessarily seen upon the scoreboard. That included when the K-State defense forced Iowa State head coach Matt Campbell to go for it on fourth-and-7 at the K-State 49-yard line with 2:29 remaining in the fourth quarter.

The defense forced Hunter Dekkers into an incompletion, the Wildcats took possession, and they ran out of the clock. It put a stamp on the program's first 5-1 start since 2020, and a 3-0 Big 12 record, which makes the Wildcats the only 3-0 undefeated team in the Big 12 league standings.

K-State outgained Iowa State 388 to 276 and held the Cyclones to just 5 of 15 on third downs. That the Wildcats limited Dekkers to just 198 passing yards while completing 22 of 38 passes, and limited the Cyclones to just 78 rushing yards on 24 carries underscored their outstanding performance.

Iowa State entered the game outscoring its opponents 37-7 in the fourth quarter. K-State allowed the Cyclones a field goal in the first, second and third quarters, and then finally delivered the knockout punch and held the Cyclones off the scoreboard over the final 15 minutes.

Phillip Brooks had four catches for a career-high 119 receiving yards and Malik Knowles had five catches for 108 yards. It marked the first time K-State had two 100-yard receivers since Byron Pringle (121) and Isiah Harris (118) on September 2, 2017.

Xavier Hutchinson, the nation's leader in receptions, had eight catches on 17 targets for 100 yards.

K-State struck first and fast, as Martinez found Brooks streaking down the field for an 81-yard catch-and-run touchdown and a 7-0 lead less than 3 minutes into the game. It was the longest K-State completion since 2017 and ended up being the only time K-State or Iowa State reached the end zone.

► Game Notes

• Quarterback **Will Howard** came into the game and threw for 225 yards and two touchdowns on 13-of-20 aim, while he rushed nine times for 31 yards and another score... He tied his career high in passing touchdowns, a mark he originally set against Kansas in 2020 and tied later that year against Texas... It tied his career high in touchdown responsibility, a mark he originally set last year against Nevada (2 rush TD, 1 pass TD).

• Junior running back **Deuce Vaughn** rushed for 83 yards and a touchdown on 12 attempts, while he had 38 receiving yards on four receptions... He now ranks fourth in school history in career overall touchdowns scored, a mark that now stands at 35... He is now second in school history in career receptions by a running back/fullback, a mark that now stands at 93.

• Wide receiver **Malik Knowles** had four catches for 69 yards... He moved into the top 20 in school history in career receiving yards as he is now at 1,476... In terms of kickoff returns, Knowles now has 1,314 yards in his career, moving into fifth place in school history.

• Several K-State defenders notched or equaled career highs... **Julius Brents** had 1.5 tackles for loss, bettering the single TFLs he had last year against Iowa State, West Virginia and Texas, and this season against Texas Tech... **Austin Moore** had nine tackles, bettering his previous high of eight earlier this year against Tulane... **Nick Allen** had 10 tackles to tie his career high originally set last year at Oklahoma State... Safety Cincere Mason carded seven tackles to tie his career high originally set at Monmouth while playing for Kennesaw State in the spring of 2021... Additionally, **Gavin Forsha** logged his first-career sack.

K-STATE DOWNED AT EIGHTH-RANKED TCU

FORT WORTH, Texas — No. 17 Kansas State was forced to use three different quarterbacks, and an injury-plagued defense simply couldn't keep up with one of the top offenses in the FBS, as No. 8 TCU charged to a 38-28 victory over the Wildcats at Amon G. Carter Stadium.

Starting quarterback Adrian Martinez left after the first possession with an injury and junior Will Howard showed incredible poise in leading the Wildcats to touchdowns on four straight possessions, as the Wildcats took a 28-17 lead into the half. When Howard was tackled hard and injured his left shoulder late in the third quarter, redshirt freshman Jake Rubley came into the game.

By the time Howard returned to the field with 12 minutes remaining in the game, the Wildcats faced a 38-28 deficit, which proved to be too much to overcome in the matchup between two top-20 teams for sole possession of first place in the Big 12 Conference standings.

Howard completed 13 of 20 passes for 225 yards and two touchdowns and one interception added nine carries for 31 yards and one score on the ground for K-State, which entered the game just seven points from an unbeaten record.

Malik Knowles had four catches for 69 yards. Deuce Vaughn had 12 carries for 83 yards and one touchdown and had four catches for 38 yards.

Vaughn reached 2,000 rushing yards and 1,000 receiving yards in his storied career, becoming just the 10th player in Big 12 history to do so.

However, TCU showed why its offense ranks near the most efficient in the nation while snapping a three-game losing streak to the Wildcats. The Horned Frogs outgained the Wildcats 495 to 390 and went 10 for 19 on third downs. K-State was held to 3 of 9 on third downs.

K-State, which entered near the top of the nation in scoring defense, did an admirable job limiting TCU, and then — boom — the powerful Horned Frogs scored 28 unanswered points.

TCU rolled to 239 yards in the second half while K-State managed just 82. The Wildcats substituted liberally as injuries on both sides of the ball mounted as the game went on.

Howard was tackled hard on a short run and injured his left shoulder at the TCU 26-yard line with 5:15 left in the third quarter. That brought Rubley under center. However, the Wildcats proved inconsistent against the TCU defense while Max Duggan helped the Horned Frogs light up the scoreboard en route to their fourth straight win against a nationally-ranked opponent.

While Duggan went 17 of 26 passing for 280 yards and three touchdowns, and running back Kendre Miller had 29 carries for 153 yards and two touchdowns. It wasn't until star wide receiver Quentin Johnston hauled in a 55-yard touchdown reception that TCU took the lead at 31-28 with 3:45 left in the third quarter.

The Wildcats, who have held every FBS opponent under its scoring average, could never recover and were held off the scoreboard the entire second half.

► Game Notes

• K-State took down its second top-10 opponent of the season, the other being a win on Sept. 24 at then-No. 6 Oklahoma... It is the first time in school history the Wildcats defeated multiple top-10 teams in a season... The Wildcats are now 5-3 in their last nine games against top-10 teams dating back to Nov. 18, 2017, a span that began with a 45-40 victory at No. 10 Oklahoma State... In the previous 16 meetings with top-10 opponents prior to that Oklahoma State game, the Wildcats were 1-15.

• Kansas State shut out Oklahoma State, as the Wildcats' 48-0 victory was the largest ever shutout win by a lower-ranked team against an AP Top-10 team... It tied for the fifth largest shutout win ever over an AP Top-10 team and the largest since No. 10 USC was shut out 51-0 by No. 1 Notre Dame in 1966... It was the first time the Wildcats ever shut out an AP Top-10 team... It was the Wildcats' second shutout of the season (South Dakota) and the first against a Big 12 opponent since blanking Texas, 23-0, in 2014... It is the first time K-State has had multiple shutouts in a season since 2002 (vs. Kansas and Louisiana-Monroe)... It was the first time K-State shut out Oklahoma State since 1992 (10-0).

• Quarterback **Will Howard** earned his 11th career start, throwing for 296 yards and four touchdowns on 21-of-37 aim... The four touchdown passes tied a school record that had been accomplished 16 other times and was the first since Jesse Ertz had four against Central Arkansas in 2017... All of his touchdown passes came in the first half, the third time in school history a player had four touchdown passes in a half... His 296 yards were a career high topping a 243-yard effort against Kansas in 2020.

CATS SILENCE NO. 9 OKLAHOMA STATE

MANHATTAN, Kan. – The theme for Kansas State Homecoming week was "Wildcat Dreams." K-State in dream-like fashion issued a statement across the college football world with one of the most lopsided victories in top-10 history.

Will Howard threw for 296 yards and four touchdowns, and the defense enjoyed its most dominant effort against a Big 12 Conference opponent this season, as No. 22 K-State throttled No. 9 Oklahoma State, 48-0, in a historic display that ended with students flooding the field and carrying the hero quarterback off on their shoulders at Bill Snyder Family Stadium.

And one week after K-State suffered a 38-28 loss at No. 8 TCU, Howard picked up the Wildcats during his first start of the season in place of injured senior Adrian Martinez. K-State claimed sole possession of second-place in the Big 12 while posing the largest ever shutout victory by a lower-ranked team against an AP top-10 opponent.

K-State, 6-2 overall and 4-1 in the Big 12, captured bowl eligibility for a second straight season and for the third time in four years, hobbling the Cowboys, 6-2 and 3-2, in bareknuckle fashion and shutting out Oklahoma State for the first time since a 10-0 win in 1992.

Oklahoma State became the first top-10 team to suffer a 40-plus point shutout loss since No. 11 California beat No. 10 Syracuse 43-0 in 1968. It also marked Oklahoma State's first shutout loss against a Big 12 opponent since a 27-0 defeat at Oklahoma on November 28, 2009.

Oklahoma State averaged 45.7 points and 466.9 total yards, and left with no points and 217 total yards to the delight of 51,133 that also saw Howard and his wide receivers make a statement as Deuce Vaughn raced up the all-time rushing charts.

Vaughn rushed 22 times for 158 yards and one touchdown and added four catches for 18 yards and a 1-yard touchdown reception with 7 seconds left in the second quarter to lift K-State to a 35-0 halftime lead.

In the process, Vaughn passed Eli Roberson at No. 4 and Daniel Thomas at No. 3 in all-time in rushing at K-State. Vaughn has 2,948 yards. He needs 46 more to pass John Hubert for No. 2 on the all-time rushing list.

Meanwhile, Malik Knowles had the best game of his career with eight catches for 113 yards. Kade Warner finished with five catches for 97 yards and two touchdowns — one a 38-yarder and another on a 41-yard catch-and-run through the teeth of the Cowboys' defense in the first half. Phillip Brooks had two catches for 41 yards and a 31-yard touchdown reception as well.

K-State outgained Oklahoma State, 495-217, and averaged 6.7 yards per play while the Cowboys averaged just 3.4. K-State also held Oklahoma State to just 5-of-15 on third downs.

Howard was sensational from the start, finding Warner for a 38-yard touchdown, hitting Brooks with a 31-yard score, and connecting with Warner for a 41-yard catch-and-run.

In between, Vaughn raced up the all-time rushing charts while darting 62 yards into the end zone. On Vaughn's long run, he passed Roberson and Thomas on the all-time rushing chart.

K-State led 28-0 with 9:06 still remaining in the second quarter.

The Wildcats saved one of their best drives of the first half for last, when Howard took them on a 14-play, 77-yard jaunt that consumed 6:35 and was played to perfection, as they ran time off the clock before Howard hit Vaughn with a 1-yard pass in the end zone for a 35-0 lead with 7 seconds left until halftime. Howard's four touchdown passes tied for the most in school history.

Game Notes

• **Deuce Vaughn** moved into second place in school history in career rushing yards, a mark that now stands at 3,021... In his 32nd career game, he became the sixth player in Big 12 history – and the fastest ever – to reach 3,000 rushing yards and 1,000 receiving yards in a career... Among all players nationally since 1996, he became the 34th player to hit those marks and tied for the fastest to get there with Saquon Barkley (Penn State) and Jeremy McNichols (Boise State)... He also improved his career reception total to 104, the most in school history among running backs/fullbacks.

• **Adrian Martinez** came back from injury to earn his eighth start of the season... His 329 passing yards were the most by a Wildcat since Skylar Thompson had 334 yards against Oklahoma in 2020... His 24 completions were a new season high... Martinez threw his first interception of the season in the first half, which came on his 155th pass of the season to break the record of most pass attempts into a season before throwing an interception... The record was held by Chad May, who went 151 passes without a pick to begin the 1994 season... The only other K-State QB besides Martinez and May to go at least 100 pass attempts into a season without throwing a pick was Michael Bishop in 1998 (107).

• **Malik Knowles** hauled in three passes for 93 yards and returned five kickoffs for 78 yards... He improved his career all-purpose yardage mark to 3,446 yards, which moved him from ninth place to seventh place in school history... He moved into 12th place in school history in career receiving yards, a mark that now stands at 1,682.

SECOND-HALF COMEBACK FALLS SHORT

MANHATTAN, Kan. – Adrian Martinez accounted for 381 total yards and three touchdowns and No. 13 Kansas State battled back from a 21-point deficit to provide a nail-biting finish against Texas, but a turnover with 24 seconds left sealed the Wildcats' fate in a 34-27 loss in front of a sellout crowd at Bill Snyder Family Stadium.

Martinez threw for 329 yards and two touchdowns and one interception, but the senior transfer quarterback appeared to try to do too much when he checked down on his progression in the pocket and tried to make a play late. Keondre Coburn stripped the ball and Jaylan Ford recovered at the Texas 39-yard line to thwart the Wildcats' chances to tie the game and match the largest comeback in school history.

Texas took a 31-10 lead into halftime behind a dominant rushing attack before the Wildcats began their charge. K-State gave up its most first-half points of the season, then outscored the Longhorns, 17-3, in the final two quarters.

Texas came off a bye week following a loss to Oklahoma State in which it squandered a 31-17 lead against the Cowboys. The Longhorns were able to bounce back behind the legs of All-America candidate Bijan Robinson, who gashed the Wildcats for 209 rushing yards on 30 carries and one touchdown.

K-State had an ace of its own in returning Consensus All-American Deuce Vaughn, who had 19 carries for 73 yards. He tied Saquon Barkley of Penn State as the fastest Power 5 player to reach 3,000 rushing yards and 1,000 receiving yards since 1996. Both did so in just 32 games. Vaughn, who has 3,021 career rushing yards, also moved past John Hubert into No. 2 all-time at K-State, trailing only Darren Sproles.

Vaughn also had seven catches for 86 yards and one touchdown, racing into the end zone on a 28-yard catch-and-run play for the Wildcats' opening score. However, those feats were bittersweet.

K-State, which saw Texas score on each of its first three possessions and score on five of its first six, mounted a valiant comeback behind the arm and legs of Martinez, who rushed for a 1-yard score and hit a wide-open Kade Warner for a 25-yard touchdown across the middle of the field to slice its deficit to 31-24.

K-State spent its first half with its mind on halting Texas. K-State outgained Texas, 468-466, for the game but never led on the scoreboard in a matchup that pitted Robinson against Vaughn. Robinson started things off with a 36-yard touchdown run and Vaughn answered with his long touchdown catch before the Longhorns pulled ahead and the Wildcats were forced to play catchup the rest of the way.

K-State's up-and-down night began from the start as the Longhorns scored touchdowns on each of their first three possessions — a 36-yard rush by Robinson, a 9-yard run by Roschon Johnson and a 13-yard reception by Xavier Worthy to cap scoring drives that each covered 75 yards.

The Wildcats initially fired back with a seven-play, 65-yard drive in which Martinez hit Vaughn across the middle for a 28-yard catch-and-run score, which tied the score at 7-7 with 8:41 left in the first quarter, but for as much as the Wildcats scratched, their deficit continued to swell.

► Game Notes

• K-State limited Baylor to just three points, the fewest allowed by the Wildcats in series history and the fewest scored by Baylor overall since the 2020 season finale against Oklahoma State... It was the fewest allowed by K-State in a Big 12 road game since a 45-0 win at Iowa State in 2003... The Bears were averaging 38.3 yards per game entering the contest, as K-State has held all of its Big 12 opponents under its average coming into the season and 27 times in their 34 Big 12 games under head coach **Chris Klieman**.

• Kansas State's 28-point margin of victory was its highest against Baylor since a 51-13 home victory in 2007 and the highest in Waco since a 44-10 win in 2002... It was K-State's highest margin of victory in a Big 12 road game since a 38-10 victory at Kansas in 2019.

• **Deuce Vaughn** carded his seventh 100-yard rushing game this season, which is tied for the seventh most in school history... During the game, Vaughn went over 1,000 rushing yards for a second-consecutive season... He became just the third player in school history with multiple 1,000-rushing yard seasons, joining Darren Sproles (2002, 2003, 2004) and Daniel Thomas (2009, 2010)... He reached the 1,000-yard mark on his 177th attempt of the season as he tied for fourth in school history for the fastest to 1,000 rushing yards... He moved into fifth place in school history in career rushing attempts, a mark that now stands at 556... He has now scored 234 points to rank ninth place in school history.

• **Ben Sinnott** set career highs in catches, yards and touchdowns... It is the first time since at least 1996 that a K-State tight end had multiple receiving touchdowns in a game.

NO. 19 K-STATE ROLLS TO WIN AT BAYLOR

WACO, Texas – Will Howard came off the sideline to throw for 186 yards and three touchdowns, and Deuce Vaughn had 104 rushing yards to reach 1,000 rushing yards for the season, as No. 19 Kansas State raced past Baylor, 31-3, to move into sole possession of second place in the Big 12 Conference at sold-out McLane Stadium.

Howard was thrust into the game early and instantly shifted K-State into gear, as the Wildcats methodically took apart the Bears' defense to snap a four-game skid in the series and stamp their first victory in Waco since 2016.

K-State, 7-3 overall and 5-2 in the Big 12, was emphatic against Baylor, which entered averaging 38.3 points per game. Consider K-State held Baylor to its fewest points in series history, one that spans 20 games.

Baylor's three points also marked the fewest K-State has allowed Big 12 opponent on the road since a 45-0 win at Iowa State on November 8, 2003. Furthermore, Baylor's three points also tied for the fewest points by either K-State or Baylor in a series that dates to 1969.

K-State controlled the game in all three phases, rolled to a 17-3 halftime lead, and then took care of the rest over the final two quarters.

The Bears saw their three-game winning streak swiftly come to an end as the Wildcats took control early and never looked back. K-State outgained Baylor 405-306 in total offense, as the Bears, 6-4 and 4-3, suffered their worst loss since a 42-3 defeat to No. 22 Oklahoma State on December 12, 2020.

Howard guided an offense behind a methodical attack with three scoring drives of at least 11 plays. K-State dictated the game from start to finish while holding onto the ball for 37 minutes and 37 seconds.

Howard's favorite target was tight end Ben Sinnott, who had the best game of his career, lighting up the Bears' secondary twice for touchdowns, and forcing defenders to try and defend him while Vaughn picked apart the defense on the ground.

Sinnott had seven catches for 89 yards with touchdown catches of 15 and 19 yards. Sinnott's second touchdown came when he beat fifth-year senior safety Christian Morgan on a wheel route and made a leaping back-shoulder catch near the front pylon for his second touchdown of the game late in the third quarter for a 24-3 lead.

When Howard wasn't connecting with Sinnott, he was finding Vaughn in space. Vaughn had 25 carries for 106 yards and added eight catches for 50 yards and one touchdown.

Redshirt freshman running back DJ Giddens scored a touchdown of his own with 14:06 left in the fourth quarter and the party was on.

Blake Shapen, who came off the sideline to lead Baylor to a 20-10 win over K-State last season, was largely ineffective against K-State's defense. Shapen went 22 of 38 for 203 yards and two interceptions. Running back Richard Reese, one of the top freshman running backs in the nation, had nine carries for 54 yards.

Kobe Savage and Drake Cheatum took turns intercepting Shapen. The Wildcats now lead the Big 12 with 13 interceptions this season.

Meanwhile, the Bears went just 4-for-12 on third down and went 0-for-3 on fourth down after entering Saturday as one of the national leaders in fourth-down conversions. The Bears were totally limited and held the ball for just 22:23 — a fact that wasn't lost on K-State players.

► Game Notes

• Kansas State remained in second place in the Big 12 standings with its sixth league win... It is the 12th time in school history – and first time since 2016 – that the Wildcats won at least six conference games, with each of those occurrences coming in the Big 12 era (1996)... Saturday's victory was K-State's fourth conference road win this season, marking just the third time in school history the Wildcats won four road conference games (1998, 2012).

• The victory gave head coach **Chris Klieman** his 100th career win... He is one of 28 active FBS head coaches to reach the 100-win mark, including one of 15 who are currently at Power 5 schools... Klieman has 28 victories since taking over at K-State prior to the 2019 season, while he totaled 69 wins in five years at North Dakota State and three wins during the 2005 season at Division III Loras College.

• Kansas State scored 48 points, tying a season high (Oklahoma State)... It was the most in a road conference game since scoring 49 points at Texas Tech in 2013... The Wildcats scored 41 first-half points, their most in a first half since scoring 42 against Florida Atlantic in 2016 and the most against a Big 12 opponent since scoring 43 in the first half of the Kansas game... The Wildcats finished the game with a 113-point scoring margin in first halves this season, the highest in the Big 12.

• Wide receiver **Malik Knowles** carded six catches for 111 yards and a touchdown... It was the fourth 100-yard receiving game of his career and the third this season... He now has 1,811 career receiving yards as he moved into the school's top-10 list, ranking ninth... He now has 123 career receptions to tie for 10th in school history.

OFFENSE SHINES AS K-STATE DOWNS WVU

MORGANTOWN, W.Va. – No. 15 Kansas State scored on six of its first seven possessions and maintained its inside track for a spot in the Big 12 Championship Game with a 48-31 win at West Virginia.

In one of the wildest first halves in a K-State game in years, the Wildcats raced and rolled to a 41-25 lead at halftime, then surrendered just one touchdown the rest of the way to emphatically earn their first victory in Morgantown since 2014.

Will Howard, who started for a second time in place of injured Adrian Martinez, completed 19-of-27 passes for 294 yards and two touchdowns and one interception to help the Wildcats tie the school record by winning their fourth road conference game of the season. The Wildcats previously won at then-No. 6 Oklahoma (41-34), at Iowa State (10-9), and at Baylor (31-3). The Wildcats also won four road Big 12 games in 1998 and 2012.

K-State has now won three of its last four games while Howard has put together several standout performances. He has thrown 11 touchdowns and one interception in the last four games in which he has played.

Playing in sub-30 degree temperatures, K-State seemingly put things on ice from the beginning in scoring four touchdowns on its first five possessions against a West Virginia defense that entered ranked 118th in scoring defense and 101st in total defense.

The Mountaineers are eliminated from bowl contention for a second time in four years under Neal Brown despite a valiant effort from sophomore quarterback Garrett Greene, who in his first-career start went 15-of-27 passing for 204 yards and three touchdowns and two interceptions.

However, K-State's defense, which has been decimated by injury as the season has worn on, stiffened when it needed to, particularly in the second half, after the teams combined for 66 points and 553 total yards in the first two quarters.

West Virginia opened the third quarter and went on a 16-play, 49-yard drive that consumed 8:35 but resulted in no points when Casey Legg missed a 44-yard field goal.

On the prettiest play of the game for the Wildcats, Howard connected with Knowles on a 43-yard touchdown to make it 48-25 with 12:24 left in the fourth quarter. Facing third-and-13, Knowles caught the ball at the 32-yard line, spun around Malachi Ruffin and out-raced Exree Loe down the sideline before diving into the end zone.

K-State tied its season high in points this season, carded its most points in a conference road game since scoring 49 points at Texas Tech in 2013, and also enjoyed its highest-scoring first half since it scored 42 against Florida Atlantic in 2016. West Virginia allowed its most points in an opening half since Baylor hung 56 on the Mountaineers during the first half in 2013.

The Wildcats' scoring barrage began from the first possession when Deuce Vaughn dashed 15 yards into the end zone less than three minutes into the contest. Then Cincere Mason returned an interception 37 yards for a score one minute later for a 14-0 lead.

Game Notes

• The Wildcats have now won each of the last 14 meetings and 27 of the last 32 dating back to 1991... The Wildcats have won each of the last seven home games over the Jayhawks and 15 of the last 16 games played in Manhattan... The Jayhawks now hold a 65-51-5 advantage in the series.

• With the victory, Kansas State will advance to its fourth Big 12 Championship game and first since 2003 (a Big 12 Championship game was not held between 2011 and 2016)... The Wildcats will be in search of their first conference championship since 2012 and fourth overall when they take on TCU next Saturday in an 11 a.m. contest against TCU at AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas.

• Kansas State earned its ninth victory of the season, the 14th time in school history the Wildcats had nine regular-season victories and the first since 2014... The Wildcats finished the regular season with a 7-2 record in Big 12 play... It marked the eighth time in school history K-State had at least seven conference wins, the seventh time in its Big 12 history (since 1996) and the first time since 2014.

• Kansas State picked up its 14th consecutive victory over Kansas to improve the longest streak in the series by either team... Among active uninterrupted winning streaks (must have played and won every year), the Wildcats' 14-game streak over KU is tied for third in the FBS.

• A sellout crowd of 51,861 fans were on hand Saturday evening, the highest-attended game of the year and the seventh-straight sellout... It was the highest-attended game since the 2017 Oklahoma game (52,122).

K-STATE WINS 14TH STRAIGHT OVER KU

MANHATTAN, Kan. — Will Howard threw for 213 yards and two touchdowns and Deuce Vaughn rushed for 147 yards and one score as No. 12 Kansas State punched its ticket to the Big 12 Championship Game with a 47-27 victory over Kansas that gave the Wildcats their 14th consecutive win in the Sunflower Showdown.

Amid persistent rain and mist, K-State relied upon its passing game during the first half and then rode Vaughn and its powerful offensive line to the finish line in front of 51,861 at Bill Snyder Family Stadium. K-State will now face TCU in the Big 12 Championship game.

K-State's only losses this season have been to teams currently ranked in the College Football Playoff Top 25. The Wildcats have essentially otherwise rolled.

K-State won the 2012 Big 12 title but will play in its first Big 12 title game since 2003. The Wildcats could've clinched a spot in the 2022 league title game if Texas had lost to Baylor on Friday. With Texas' win, the Wildcats had to beat the Jayhawks in order to face the Horned Frogs.

Although K-State led by nine points at halftime, the margin seemed smaller. Second-year Kansas head coach Lance Leipold has the Jayhawks playing their best football in more than a decade and they wouldn't go down easily.

However, K-State outscored Kansas, 17-6, over the final two quarters, then celebrated with the Governor's Cup trophy presentation in the locker room.

Howard was 11-of-18 for 213 yards and two touchdowns in the opening two quarters. Then Vaughn had 17 carries for 94 yards and one touchdown in the second half, as the Wildcats belied up and drove the ball down the field.

K-State outgained Kansas 443-307 behind a balanced attack — the Wildcats had 230 rushing yards and 213 passing.

K-State limited the Jayhawks to one scoring drive in the second half — an 8-play, 75-yard jaunt that took 8 minutes, 20 seconds and resulted in a 1-yard touchdown run by quarterback Jalon Daniels to cut the Wildcats' lead to 37-27 with 13:29 left in the fourth quarter. But the Jayhawks failed to capitalize on their momentum and misfired on their two-point conversion.

Moments later, Ty Zentner connected on a 27-yard field goal for a 40-27 lead before the Wildcats pounded the ball on the ground 85 yards on eight plays, capped by DJ Giddens' five-yard run into the end zone with 4:30 remaining.

All that remained was the K-State Marching Band playing "Happy Trails."

K-State and Kansas combined for 51 points and 481 total yards in the first half, as the Wildcats led 31-20 heading into the locker room.

K-State opened the scoring when Kansas muffed a punt and the Wildcats recovered, setting up Knowles for a 5-yard touchdown. However, Kansas responded, going 75 yards in nine plays, as Torry Locklin raced 12 yards into the end zone to tie it at 7-7.

The Wildcats had several exciting plays in the first half, the first of which came when Howard demonstrated his recognition and patience in finding wide-open Wheeler for a 42-yard touchdown.

Moments later, and pinned deep in its own territory, Kansas right tackle Bryce Cabeldue was called for holding in the end zone for a safety and the Wildcats led 16-7. The Wildcats drove again, and Knowles raced four yards for another touchdown and a 23-7 lead.

► Game Notes

• Kansas State earned its fourth conference championship in school history and the third in the Big 12 era... K-State is now tied for second in conference history with three Big 12 titles, joining Baylor and Texas... The Wildcats' first conference championship was in 1934 when they went 5-0 in Big 6 play... K-State won its first Big 12 title in 2003 with a 35-7 victory over No. 1 Oklahoma, while the Wildcats went 8-1 in Big 12 play in 2012 to claim the title as there was no Big 12 Championship Game conducted that season.

• The victory gave the Wildcats their 11th season with 10 or more wins and the first since an 11-win campaign in 2012, which was also the last time K-State won a conference championship... All but one of those campaigns had the Wildcats with 10 victories prior to a bowl appearance.

• K-State took down its third top-10 opponent of the season, the other two being a win at then-No. 6 Oklahoma and a home victory against then-No. 9 Oklahoma State... It is the first time in school history the Wildcats defeated multiple top-10 teams in a season... The Wildcats are now 6-3 in their last nine games against top-10 teams taking back to Nov. 18, 2017, a span that began with a 45-40 victory at No. 10 Oklahoma State... In the previous 16 meetings with top-10 opponents, the Wildcats were 1-15... Head coach Chris Klieman is now 7-6 all-time against AP Top-10 teams, including a 5-2 record at K-State.

• Kansas State earned its fourth all-time overtime victory and first since a 42-35 victory at Texas Tech in 2017... The Wildcats avenged an overtime loss in the 1998 Big 12 Championship against Texas A&M.

OT FIELD GOAL LIFTS CATS TO BIG 12 TITLE

ARLINGTON, Texas – No. 10 Kansas State used a monster fourth-down stop in overtime and Ty Zentner drilled a 31-yard field goal as the Wildcats outlasted No. 3 TCU in a 31-28 thriller to capture the 2022 Big 12 Championship at AT&T Stadium.

In what became an instant classic in K-State lore, the Wildcats captured their first Big 12 title since 2012, their first victory in a Big 12 Championship Game since 2003, and reached the top of the mountain in one of the best conferences in the Football Bowl Subdivision.

Afterward, confetti shot into the air, and K-State head coach Chris Klieman hoisted the Big 12 trophy.

K-State reached double-digit wins for the first time since the 2012 campaign, in which the Wildcats bounced back from a loss at Baylor to beat No. 23 Texas 48-24 in Manhattan. These Wildcats redeemed themselves from a 38-28 loss to the Horned Frogs earlier this season by handing them their first loss of the season. That's something the Wildcats also did in the 2003 title game when they beat unbeaten Oklahoma.

K-State has now beaten three top-10 opponents this season — the others were at No. 6 Oklahoma and against No. 9 Oklahoma State — for the first time in school history.

TCU had fought back to win five games in which it trailed, most in the FBS, and turned an 11-point deficit into a 28-28 tie behind gutsy quarterback Max Duggan, the Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year. Duggan was magnificent — he threw for 251 yards and one touchdown and one interception to go along with 110 rushing yards and one touchdown.

However, K-State received an equally gutsy performance from Will Howard, who threw for 199 yards and two touchdowns. Running back Deuce Vaughn was named Big 12 Championship Game Most Outstanding Player after rushing for 130 yards while dashing 44 yards for a score to put the Wildcats ahead 28-17 with 11 minutes, 27 seconds left in the fourth quarter.

Back and forth the teams battled until the very end. TCU answered Vaughn's long touchdown with a 42-yard field goal by Griffin Kell and then an eight-yard rush by Duggan with 1:51 remaining in the fourth quarter. Jared Wiley caught the 2-point conversion for a 28-28 tie and the game went to an extra period.

K-State put the clamps on TCU's offense with perhaps the most important fourth-down stop in school history. Linebacker Daniel Green and nose tackle Eli Huggins stuffed Kendre Miller for no gain at the goal line, giving the Wildcats possession and a chance to win.

Under overtime rules, K-State began its drive at the TCU 25-yard line. The Wildcats rushed five times to set up Zentner's game-winner.

In the end, it came down to a single kick. And Zentner made arguably the biggest field goal in school history. And then he kissed the ground.
