BULLS ENTER SPRING BALL WITH MOMENTUM

The University at Buffalo football team enters its third season under head coach Maurice Linguist and is doing so riding a bit of momentum. The Bulls defeated Georgia Southern in the 2022 Camellia Bowl for their third bowl win in program history.

The Bulls return 15 players that started in the bowl game, including four All-MAC selections.

Leading the way are a pair of defensive first-team All-MAC selections in linebacker **Shaun Dolac** and safety **Marcus Fuqua**, who was also an All-America selection after leading the nation in interceptions. They are two of five starters returning on the defensive side of the ball.

On offense, Buffalo returns six starters led by offensive lineman **Gabe Wallace** who was an All-MAC Third Team pick in 2022. Quarterback **Cole Snyde**r returns under center after starting all 13 games a season ago.

Kicker **Alex McNulty** also returns as the reigning MAC Special Teams Player of the Year and is the program's career leader in nearly every kicking category.

Here is a position-by-position breakdown as the Bulls enter spring drills.

QUARTERBACK

Cole Snyder joined the program just a season ago, but has since developed into a reliable signal-caller for the Bulls. He started all 13 games in 2022 and became just the third quarterback in program history to throw for 3,000 yards.

Snyder, a local product who transferred to UB from Rutgers, threw for 3,030 yards and 18 touchdowns last season, joining Drew Willy and Tyree Jackson as the only quarterbacks to eclipse 3,000 yards in a single campaign.

Snyder will be the grizzled vet in the quarterback room as no other quarterback has taken a single snap for the Bulls.

Redshirt-freshman **Mike DePillo** is the only other returning quarterback. However, he didn't see any action last year.

The Bulls were able to bring in three transfer quarterbacks to help with the depth.

CJ Ogbonna is a transfer from Southeast Missouri State. A junior, Ogbonna spent two seasons with the Redhawks after transferring from Hutchinson Community College. He led the Blue Dragons to the 2020 national title.

Gunnar Gray is a JUCO transfer from San Diego Mesa College where he was a two-time first-team All-Conference selection. Gray threw for 4,048 yards and 40 touchdowns over 18 games.

Richie Watts is a JUCO transfer quarterback who spent last season at the College of San Mateo. In his lone season with the Bulldogs, Watts threw for 2,148 yards, 21 touchdowns to only two interceptions while completing 63 percent of his passes. He helped lead San Mateo to a 12-1 record and a CCCAA Football state title.

Mason Cumbie is a true freshman dual-threat quarterback from Hopewell High School in Virginia. He threw for 1,312 yards and 12 touchdowns as a senior.

RUNNING BACK

The Bulls have significant depth at running back, returning three players who made at least one start in 2022.

Ron Cook is one of the most versatile backs on the Bulls roster and continues to be a key weapon. In 2022, he started the first 10 games of the season before suffering an injury. He rushed for 600 yards and four touchdown and added 16 receptions for 207 yards.

Mike Washington showed promise as a redshirt-freshman in 2022. He led the Bulls in rushing with 625 yards and had a team-high seven rushing touchdowns. He added 23 receptions for 135 yards and a score.

Sophomore Al-Jay Henderson also showed flashes that he's ready to break through as a featured back. In 2022, he rushed for 301 yards and three touchdowns on the season. His 5.1 yards per carry average was tops among UB running backs.

New to the running back room is JUCO transfer **Dylan Kedzior**. The Oklahoma native transferred from Hutchinson Community College







where he was a JUCO All-American after rushing for 1,090 yards and 11 touchdowns in 2022.

Junior **Caron Robinson** has battled through injuries, but enters spring healthy and looks ready to contribute in 2023.

Adding depth at running back include redshirt-freshmen **Mark Anthony Scott** and **Joseph Giggie**.

WIDE RECEIVER

The Bulls will have new faces at the wide receiver position after losing their top two targets, Justin Marshall and Quian Williams, to graduation.

Fifth-year **Marlyn Johnson** is the most experienced returning receiver. He appeared in all 13 games and made four starts in 2022. He had 17 catches for 133 yards on the year.

Graduate student **Cole Harrity** also appeared in all 13 games in 2022 and had 13 receptions for 170 yards and a touchdown on the season.

Bobbie Curry enters his second season with the Bulls after transferring from Arizona. He appeared in eight games a season ago and had six catches for 73 yards. His role will likely increase in 2023.

Buffalo turned to a pair of transfers that it hopes will be able to help immediately.

Darrell Harding is a graduate transfer from Duke where he spent four seasons. He appeared in 42 games and made five starts for the Blue Devils and totaled 35 catches for 452 yards (12.9 ypc) over his career.

Qua Sanders is a JUCO transfer from Jones College. An all-conference selection, he totaled 63 catches for 702 yards and five touchdowns in his time with the Bobcats.

Also returning in 2023 and looking for a more expanded role are senior **Javien Cuff** and redshirt-freshman **Nik McMillan**.

Walk-ons **Tadd Barr**, **Aidan Walline** and **Jeremy Yancy** all add depth to the wide receiver unit.

TIGHT END

Tight end is another area in which the Bulls will have new names as UB doesn't return a single tight end who registered a reception a season ago.

Sophomore **Nicholas Fronczak** saw action in 10 games but primarily on special teams. He was an Academic All-MAC selection.

Cameron Ball is a redshirt-freshman who appeared in one game a season ago.

Senior **Wyatt Molinich** and sophomore **Zach Pilarcek** both return as well.

With the lack of experience at the position, the coaching staff turned to the portal and brought in a pair of transfers.

Ryan Daly is a transfer from the City College of San Francisco. In seven games at CCSF, he had 13 catches for 135 yards and four touchdowns.

Andrew Schnackenberg is a junior transfer from Coffeyville College. He totaled 13 receptions for 144 yards and two touchdowns while averaging 11.1 yards per catch.

Mitch Viviano is a freshman from Fork Union Valley Military Academy where he was a standout as both a tight end and a defensive end.

OFFENSIVE LINE


The Bulls return three starters on the offensive line and have turned to the transfer portal for added veteran experience.

Gabe Wallace has started every game of the last two seasons. He is a versatile offensive lineman who has played both guard and tackle. He was an All-MAC Third Team selection as a guard in 2022.

Junior **Tyler Doty** made a big leap from his redshirt-freshman to sophomore seasons a year ago. He appeared in all 13 game and started the last 10 games at right guard in 2022.

Isaiah Wright made an immediate impact after transferring from Rutgers prior to the 2022 campaign. He started all 13 games at left tackle and will likely return to the role in 2023.

Caelan Shepard is entering his fifth season and continues to de-











velop. He worked his way into the rotation in 2022, appearing in 10 games.

Dom Polizzi appeared in nine games and made one start at right quard in 2022. He has also been taking snaps at center.

Graduate transfer **Sidney Walker** missed last season with an injury but should be healthy and able to help in 2023.

Other returners to the offensive line include Matt Pajuste, James Carrington, Konrad Krzyszton, Andrew Kerwin, Liam Hamilton.

The Bulls did bring in a pair of transfers that could make an immediate impact.

Nick Beans is a transfer from Notre Dame College in Ohio where he was a three-year starter at center. He was a three-time All-MEC First Team selection.

Trevor Brock is a transfer from Iowa Western where he was a first-team All-American. He helped lead the Reivers to the 2022 National Championship.

DEFENSIVE LINE

One of the strengths of the 2023 UB football team should be the defensive line. The Bulls should be especially stout in the middle of the defensive line as they return four players who saw significant action a season ago.

Daymond Williams has had two strong seasons at defensive tackle. A 2021 All-MAC selection, Willliams has had 19 tackles for loss and 10 sacks over the last two seasons.

Jaylon Bass has been a nice compliment to Williams at the other defensive tackle spot. He started all 13 games in 2022 and had 21 tackles, four tackles for loss and half a sack on the season.

A senior, **George Wolo** started at defensive tackle in 2020 and 2021 and is a veteran of the defensive line. He has 67 career tackles as well as 9.5 tackles for loss and eight sacks.

Entering his third year with the Bulls, **Daishon Folsom** has been a reliable reserve over the last two seasons. He has totaled 30 tackles and 4.5 tackles for loss over the last two years.

Redshirt-freshmen **Ja'Mori Coard**, **Devin Morgan** and **Cornell Evans** should all factor into the defensive tackle rotation.

Walk-on **Nick Zikuski** will also add depth at the defensive tackle position.

Like defensive tackle, Buffalo returns depth at defensive end as well.

C.J. Bazile has seen time in the starting lineup in each of the last two seasons. Over those two seasons, Bazile started 11 games and totaled 61 tackles and 7.5 tackles for loss.

Max Michel has also seen time in the starting lineup in each of the last two seasons. In 2022, he played in 10 games and had 16 tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss, a sack and a forced fumble.

Kyler Laing was the Bulls' starting defensive end in 2022, before suffering a season-ending injury in just the second game of the season. He continues to rehab the injury and should be ready for the opener in September.

Kameron Olds made an immediate impact as a true freshman in 2022. He appeared in 11 games and registered six tackles and a tackle for loss.

Sophomore **Solomanie Bambara** and junior **Michael Tetteh** will also look to play a more prominent role in 2023.

JUCO transfer **Devonyal Lofton** is new to the Bulls this season. Over two seasons at East Mississippi Community College, he had 74 tackles, 15.5 tackles for loss and 11 sacks.

Redshirt-freshman **Joey Hawryschuk** and true freshman **Nick Roy** add depth at defensive end.

LINEBACKERS

The linebacker unit is led by All-MAC First Team pick **Shaun Dolac** who is coming off one of the best seasons by a linebacker in program history. The senior led the Mid-American Conference and ranked second in the nation in tackles with 147. He posted a school-record 97 solo tackles which was tops in the nation.

While Buffalo has the fortune of returning one starting linebacker, the Bulls will need to replace three-time All-MAC linebacker James Patterson.

Seniors **Fabian Weitz** and **Caleb Tate** will both look to have more expanded roles in 2023 and could challenge for a starting role. Both have seen action primarily on specials teams.

Khalil Murdock redshirted last season as a freshman but did appear in five games and looks to be ready for a more expanded role.

Walk-ons Jake Zimmer and Justin Piwowarczyk add depth to the position.

The coaching staff utilized the transfer portal and were able to bring in an FCS All-American in **Joe Andreessen**. A local product, Andreessen spent five seasons at Bryant where he set a school record with 116 tackles in 2022.

Dion Crawford is a freshman linebacker who enrolled at UB in January.

Junior Jalen McNair and redshirt-freshman Pershaun Fann will likely battle for the nickelback job.

DEFENSIVE BACKS

The defensive backfield is led by safety **Marcus Fuqua** who is coming off one of the best seasons by a safety in program history. Fuqua led the nation in interceptions with seven en route to earning Associated Press All-America Third Team honors.

Injuries forced **Devin Grant** into a more prominent role as a true freshman in 2022. He appeared in eight games and was UB's starting safety in the Camellia Bowl.

Solomon Brown, entering his second season after transferring from Minnesota, played in nine games a season ago.

Demetrius Harris, a graduate transfer from Cornell, should also factor in at safety. He played in 30 games over three seasons with the Big Red.

Also adding depth at safety include walk-ons **Jonathan Capo**, **Caleb Arena** and **Brennan Clasgens**.

At cornerback, the Bulls return one starter, **Caleb Offord**, who appeared in 12 games and made nine starts. He had 30 tackles, two tackles for loss, an interception, a team-best eight pass breakups and a fumble recovery on the season.

One of the most intriguing stories heading into 2023 in **Clevester Hines**. Originally recruited as a wide receiver, injuries forced the coaching staff to move Hines to cornerback for the Camellia Bowl. Hines was up for the challenge and against Georgia Southern, totaled seven tackles and three pass breakups in his first career start at the position.

Jayden Oliver started three games in 2022 before suffering a season-ending injury. He is healthy and will likely challenge for a starting role in 2023.

Sophomore **Demarco Cuffey** and redshirt-freshman **Blake Hiligh** both saw action in 2022 and could have a more expanded role in 2023.

The Bulls dipped into the transfer portal to help sure up the cornerback position. Joining UB in 2023 are **Marquis Cooper** a junior transfer from Colgate and **D'Andre Greely**, a sophomore transfer from Colorado State.

In addition, **Charles McCartherens**, a freshman from Kennesaw, GA, enrolled at UB in January.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Buffalo has the benefit of returning one of the strongest special teams units in the Mid-American Conference.

Alex McNulty returns for his fourth season as the Bulls starting kicker. He had arguably the finest season by a kicker in program history, making a single-season school record 24 field goals in 2022. He became the first UB player to be named MAC Special Teams Player of the Year.

Punter **Anthony Venneri** was a pleasant surprise for the Bulls. After walking on to the team, he started the final 10 games of the season and averaged 43.0 yards per punt - a single-season school record. He was named to the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) Freshman All-America Team.

Jackson Baltar has seen time at kicker and punter for the Bulls and has shown to excel at both positions.

Evan Davis is back for his fifth season as long snapper.









MAURICE "MO" LINGUIST

HEAD COACH BAYLOR, 2006 THIRD SEASON

Maurice Linguist is in his third season as head coach of the UB football program. Considered by many as one of the top young minds in all of college football, Linguist was named the University at Buffalo's 26th head coach on May 8, 2021. It was a homecoming of sorts for Linguist who was the Bulls' defensive backs coach in 2012 and 2013.

In 2022, only his second season with the program, Linguist led the Bulls to a 7-6 record, capped by a 23-21 victory over Georgia Southern in the Camellia Bowl. It was just the third bowl win in program history. He led Buffalo to a 5-3 record in Mid-American Conference play, the seventh time, since the joining the league in 1999, the Bulls had a winning record in MAC play.

A coach with extensive experience on the defensive side of the ball, it was of little surprise several of UB's defensive players had standout seasons. Safety Marcus Fuqua led the nation with seven interceptions and became just the third UB player to be named an Associated Press All-American. Linebacker Shaun Dolac ranked second in the nation with 147 tackles, including a school-record 97 solo stops which were more than any player in the FBS.

The Bulls had seven players named All-MAC, including kicker Alex McNulty who became the first player in program history to be named MAC Special Teams Player of the Year.

In his first season as the helm, Linguist led the Bulls to a 4-8 record with an injury-riddled squad.

Seven Bulls were named to the All-MAC team, including James Patterson who was a first-team selection at middle linebacker. A program-best 19 Bulls were named to the Academic All-MAC team, including offensive lineman Jack Klenk who was also an CoSIDA Academic All-District selection.

Linguist is regarded as one of the nation's top recruiters and has excelled in coaching at both the Power Five level and the NFL. He came to UB from Michigan where he served a brief stint as defensive backs coach/co-defensive coordinator since January. He joined the U-M coaching staff after spending the 2020 season as corner-backs coach with the NFL's Dallas Cowboys.

In Dallas, Linguist directed a secondary that forced 10 interceptions while allowing the fifth-fewest passing first downs in the league (180). The Cowboys were also ranked in the top half of the league in pass yards allowed (11th), completion percentage against (10th), and takeaways (ninth). Linguist coached rookie cornerback Trevon Diggs (three interceptions) to a strong first season in the league.

Three of Dallas' four leading tacklers in 2020 were starters in the secondary, including former Wolverine Jourdan Lewis who set a careerhigh with 59 stops.

Linguist has worked with college secondaries at nine programs. Prior to heading to the NFL, he coached cornerbacks at Texas A&M (2018-19), defensive backs at Minnesota (2017), safeties at Mississippi State (2016) and defensive backs at Iowa State (2014-15)

At A&M, Linguist's secondaries limited opportunities for opponents and played tight coverage in key situations. Teams converted just 31.2 percent of third down tries (102-of-326) over his two seasons and A&M ranked ninth nationally in that category in 2018. The Aggies intercepted their opponents 19 times in his two seasons and made a habit of getting off the field. During the 2018 season, the defense was top-15 nationally in first downs allowed (221) and faced the fewest snaps against among all SEC teams.

Linguist helped the Aggies produce back-to-back top-six recruiting classes nationally in 2019 and 2020. He was the lead recruiter for five-star safety Jaylon Jones, the first five-star defensive back to sign with Texas A&M.

In his season at Minnesota, Linguist's secondary helped anchor a defense that finished No. 11 nationally with 174.5 yards allowed per game after listing 73rd in the NCAA a year earlier. The unit surrendered 16 touchdowns, a top-25 figure nationally and also ranked among the nation's best in first downs allowed (11th) and total de-



fense (30th). Linguist was the lead recruiter for Rashod Bateman, the Big Ten's Wide Receiver of the Year. Linguist was promoted to assistant head coach following the 2017 season before accepting a position at Texas A&M.

At Mississippi State, Linguist led the safeties group which was responsible for seven of the team's 14 interceptions. Three safeties eclipsed the 50-tackle mark for the Bulldogs: Brandon Bryant (62, three PBUs), Kivon Coman (58, four PBUs), and Mark McLaurin (51, seven PBUs) were among the team's leading tacklers. The defense scored four touchdowns (No. 8, NCAA) and totaled 14 interceptions (No. 35, NCAA) during the 2016 season.

Prior to his time in Starkville, Linguist coached defensive backs at lowa State (2014-15). He coached players to three All-Big 12 honors in his two seasons at lowa State, including safety Kamari Cotton-Moya, a first-team All-American freshman team selection by the Football Writers' Association of America (FWAA). Cotton-Moya led the team in tackles and was named the conference's Freshman of the Year on defense. Linguist would help direct cornerback Brian Peavy to be a finalist for the award the following year.

In his time at UB, Linguist helped the Bulls finish second in the MAC East and reach the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl in 2013, at the time, the program's second bowl appearance. The unit ranked second in the league in interceptions (15), points per game allowed (24.4), and yards per game allowed (382.2). Linguist coached Najja Johnson to first-team all-conference honors and a career total of 38 pass breakups, second in program history. Johnson led the MAC in interceptions the year earlier as part of a Bulls unit that was tops in the conference in pass completion percentage allowed while ranking second in pass defense.

Linguist spent three years at James Madison, helping the program pull in the top FCS recruiting class during the 2012 cycle while the team reached the second round of the NCAA Football Championship Series Playoffs. Linguist's first full-time position was at Valdosta State, working with defensive backs and special teams. The Blazers went 9-3 and earned a No. 12 national ranking in Division II.

Linguist began as a graduate assistant at Baylor, his alma mater, working as a graduate assistant with the strong safeties and rover backs. During his career at Baylor, he was a defensive MVP and honorable mention All-Big 12 selection. He made 24 starts in 42 appearances as a strong safety from 2003-06. A native of Dallas, Texas, Linguist graduated from Baylor with degrees in communications (2006) and a master's in health, human performance and recreation (2007). He was an Academic All-Big 12 honoree.

Linguist and his wife, Stacie, have one daughter, Maura, and two sons, Lance and Leon.
