MAC Champion Rockets Head to Boca Raton to Face Liberty

TOLEDO, Ohio – The Toledo Rockets and Head Coach Jason Candle are hoping their upcoming trip to Boca Raton will be as memorable as their first.

The Rockets will play Liberty University in the 2022 Roofclaim.com Boca Raton Bowl at FAU Stadium in Boca Raton, Fla. The contest will kick off at 7:30 p.m. ET on Tuesday, Dec. 20 and will be televised on ESPN.

Toledo (8-5) is the champion of the Mid-American Conference following its 17-7 victory over Ohio at the MAC Championship Game in Ford Field at Detroit on Dec. 3. Liberty (8-4) is a FBS independent, with victories over Arkansas, BYU and Southern Miss to its credit this season.

This will be the Rockets' second trip to the Boca Raton Bowl. Toledo defeated No. 24 Temple, 32-17, in a driving rainstorm on Dec. 22, 2015. That contest was Candle's first game

as head coach of the Rockets. Candle was named head coach just 20 days prior to the contest after having served seven seasons as a Toledo assistant.

Candle and his Rockets earned their trip to Boca Raton with a MAC Championship run that was not without its challenges. But the Midnight Blue and Gold triumphed when it mattered most, winning four of five MAC West Division games and then handling a very tough Ohio team in the MAC Championship Game.

Toledo is led by arguably the best defense in the Mid-American Conference. The Rockets are No. 1 in the MAC in total defense (331.8), interceptions (12), defensive passing efficiency (110.05) and passing yards allowed (185.5).

The defense is led by four first-team All-MAC players: senior defensive tackle Desjuan Johnson (16.5 tackles for loss), junior linebacker Dallas Gant (113 tackles), sophomore cornerback Quinyon Mitchell (five interceptions, 20 breakups) and sophomore safety Maxen Hook (73 tackles, two interceptions). Mitchell, who leads the nation with 25 passes defended, was named Walter Camp second-team All-America. Mitchell gained national attention when he had four interceptions and two pick-sixes vs. Northern Illinois on Oct. 8.

Making second-team All-MAC for the defense were senior defensive end Jamal Hines (6.5 sacks), senior linebacker Dyontae Johnson (103 tackles, 8.5 TFL) and junior safety Nate Bauer (57 tackles, two interceptions).

The leader of the offense is sophomore quarterback Dequan Finn, who has battled through shoulder and ankle injuries to earn second-team All-MAC honors and Offensive Player of the Game accolades in the MAC Championship Game. Finn has thrown for 2,127 yards and 22 touchdowns but is just as dangerous with his feet, rushing for 608 yards and eight scores.

Finn's top targets are sophomore Jerjuan Newton (48 receptions, nine TDs), junior Devin Maddox (38 receptions) and sophomore DeMeer Blankumsee (37 receptions). The rushing attack is a three-headed monster of sophomores Jacquez Stuart (659 yards), Peny Boone (418 yards) and Micah Kelly (376 yards). The Rockets are No. 1 in the MAC in scoring offense (32.1).

ROCKET UPDATE

• Toledo is 8-5 and champions of the Mid-American Conference.

• Toledo (West Division champion) defeated Ohio (East Division champion) 17-7 in the MAC Championship Game at Ford Field in Detroit on Dec. 3.

• The Rockets were 5-3 in Mid-American Conference play, co-champion of the MAC West Division along with Eastern Michigan. Toledo advanced to the MAC Championship Game due to its 27-24 victory at EMU on Oct. 29.

•Toledo has now won or shared 12 MAC Championship titles as well as 12 West Division crowns.

• This was Toledo's seventh appearance in the MAC Championship Game and first since 2017. Toledo is 4-3 alltime in the MCG.

• Toledo will be playing in its 20th bowl game and sixth under Candle. Toledo has an 11-8 bowl record since its very first appearance in the Tangerine Bowl in 1969.

• This will be the Rockets' second trip to the Boca Raton Bowl. Toledo defeated No. 24 Temple, 32-17, on Dec. 22, 2015. That contest was Jason Candle's first game as head coach of the Rockets. Candle was named head coach just 20 days prior to the contest after having served seven seasons as a Toledo assistant.

• Toledo is bowl eligible for the 13th consecutive season, the longest streak in the MAC.

• Toledo and Liberty have played three times, with the Rockets holding a 3-0 advantage.

• Toledo's defense ranks first in the MAC in total defense (331.9), passing yards allowed (185.5) and defensive passing efficiency (110.05). The Rockets are ninth in the nation in defensive passing efficiency, 15th in passing yards allowed and 25th in total defense.

• Toledo's offense ranks first in the MAC in scoring (32.1), and third in total offense (405.8) passing efficiency (133.10) and rushing (178.0). • Toledo ranks first in the MAC and 25th in the country in fourth-down conversions (16-26/61.5%).

• Toledo has 10 All-MAC players on its roster, including a league-best five on the first team.

• Sophomore cornerback Quinyon Mitchell was named second-team All-America by Walter Camp and Pro Football Focus. He is the nation's leader with 1.9 passes defended per game (20 breakups, 5 interceptions in 13 games).

• Senior defensive tackle Desjuan Johnson was named honorable mention All-America by Pro Football Focus. His 16.5 tackles for loss ranks fourth in the MAC and 19th in the nation.

• Junior linebacker Dallas Gant, an Ohio State transfer, leads the team with 113 tackles. His 8.7 tackles per game is ninth among MAC players and 38th in the country.

TOLEDO'S LAST APPEARANCE IN THE BOCA RATON BOWL

Toledo is 1-0 in the Boca Raton Bowl, having defeated No. 24 Temple, 32-17, in 2015.

Senior Phillip Ely threw for 285 yards and two touchdowns and Toledo used a smothering defense to shut down the Owls.

Ely, playing in his final game as a Rocket, returned to his native Florida to lead the Rockets to victory in Jason Candle's first game as head coach. Candle, a seven-year assistant at UT, took over the head coaching position just 20 days before the game following Matt Campbell's departure to Iowa State.

Ely, a transfer from Alabama, was named the game's Offensive MVP. He completed 20-of-28 passes despite throwing in driving rain most of the night. Ely announced after the game that his appeal for a sixth season due to injury hardship was turned down by the NCAA. Thus the bowl victory served

ROCKETS WIN 12TH MAC CHAMPI-ONSHIP

Toledo won its 12th MAC Championship with its 17-7 win over Ohio on Dec. 3. It was their second title under Head Coach Jason Candle, who also led the Rockets to victory in 2017.

Prior to 1997, the MAC champion was determined by league record. The league was divided into East and West divisions in 1997, the year of the first MAC title game.

2022 MAC CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

A smothering defense and a gutty performance by sophomore quarterback Dequan Finn launched the Toledo Rockets to a 17-7 victory over Ohio in the MAC Championship Game at Ford Field in Detroit on Dec. 3.

Holding a 10-7 lead in the fourth quarter, Finn hit sophomore wide receiver DeMeer Blankumsee for a 16-yard touchdown pass with 10:36 left in the game. Toledo's defense then did its job, holding the Bobcats scoreless on their final three drives.

Finn, who missed two games in November with a sprained ankle, was 16-of-25 for 154 yards and added 86 yards on the ground. Toledo's running game totaled 236 yards, led by sophomore Jacquez Stuart, who had 93 yards and the game's first touchdown, a 29-yard run on Toledo's opening drive. Sophomore Jerjuan Newton was Finn's top target, snagging six passes for 77 yards.

Toledo's defense, ranked No. 1 in the MAC much of the season, dominated the Bobcats for most of the game, holding Ohio to the fewest points by any team in MAC Championship Game history. Ohio gained 262 yards of total offense, including just 69 yards in the second half. Junior linebacker Dallas Gant led Toledo with 10 tackles and junior Nate Bauer had an interception.

NOTES FROM THE MAC CHAMPION-SHIP GAME

• The victory gave Toledo its fourth MAC Championship Game title and 12th MAC title overall. Toledo is 4-3 in MAC title games, last winning in 2017 vs. Akron.

• Toledo's victory gives it an 8-5 record and guarantees a winning season for the 12th time in the last 13 years. The only exception came in 2019 when the Rockets went 6-6.

Ten players from the University of Toledo were selected to the 2022 All-MAC Football team in a vote by the league's head coaches, the Mid-American Conference announced on Nov. 30.

Toledo had five first-team selections, the most in the conference, and five second-team picks. Six Rockets made All-MAC for at least the second time. Senior defensive end Jamal Hines, a second-team pick, earned all-league honors for the fourth time. Senior defensive tackle Desjuan Johnson earned All-MAC for the third time, making the first-team after second-team selections in 2020 and 2021.

QUINYON MITCHELL NAMED SEC-OND-TEAM ALL-AMERICA BY WAL-TER CAMP AND PFF, THIRD-TEAM ALL-AMERICA BY ASSOCIATED PRESS

Toledo sophomore cornerback Quinyon Mitchell was named Walter Camp second-team All-America in a ceremony at The Home Depot College Football Awards Show on Dec. 8. He also earned third-team All-America honors from the Associated Press on Dec. 12.

Mitchell is the first Rocket to receive Walter Camp All-America honors since wide receiver Eric Page, who earned first-team honors in 2010. He is the first AP All-American at Toledo since Brett Kern in 2007. Walter Camp and the AP are two of the five All-America teams that are designated by the NCAA for determing "consenus" All-Americans. The other four are the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA), the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) and the Sporting News.

Mitchell was also named Second-Team All-America by Pro Football Focus last week. He had three pass breakups in Toledo's 17-7 win over Ohio in the MAC Championship Game on Dec. 3.

Mitchell is the first Rocket to receive All-America honors since tight end Michael Roberts was named first-team All-America by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) in 2016.

Mitchell is the nation's leader in passes defended with 25 (five interceptions, 20 pass breakups). His 20 breakups is the all-time Toledo record, breaking the mark of 16 set by current San Francisco 49er Samuel Womack last year.

DESJUAN JOHNSON NAMED HON-ORABLE MENTION ALL-AMERICA BY PRO FOOTBALL FOCUS

Senior defensive tackle Desjuan Johnson earned honorable mention All-America honors from Pro Football Focus.

Johnson leads the Rockets with 16.5 tackles for loss, which also ranks fourth in Mid-American Conference and 19th in nation. He has 65 tackles overall and is second on the team behind Jamal Hines with 5.5 sacks. Johnson ranks fourth in Toledo history in career TFL (47.0), one ahead of Hines. He earned All-MAC honors in 2020 and 2021.

THREE ROCKETS NAMED TO CSC ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT TEAM

Three Rockets were named to the Academic All-District team by College Sports Communicators on Nov. 22.

Junior Judge Culpepper, along with sophomores Maxen Hook and Nick Rosi, were all named Academic All-District for the first time in their careers for Toledo.

Culpepper has started all 13 games at defensive tackle and has 43 tackles and 4.0 tackles for loss. Hook has played in nine games and is third on the team with 73 tackles. He had gameclinching interceptions in both the Eastern Michigan and Ball State games. Rosi has started all 13 games at either right guard or right tackle and is part of an offense that ranks first in the MAC in scoring (32.1 points per game).

The 2022 Academic All-District Football Teams selected by College Sports Communicators (CSC), formerly CoSIDA, recognize the nation's top student-athletes for their combined performances on the court and in the classroom.

To qualify for Academic All-District honors, student-athletes must have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.5 and play in at least 50 percent of the team's contests. No student-athlete is eligible until he or she has completed one full calendar year at his or her current institution and been on a college roster in that sport for two years.

Academic All-District honorees advance to the CSC Academic All-America ballot. First, second and third-team Academic All-America honorees will be announced in late December.

HISTORIC DAY FOR QUINYON MITCHELL VS. NIU

Sophomore cornerback Quinyon Mitchell had a game most defensive backs could only dream of in Toledo's 52-32 win at Northern Illinois on Oct. 8.

Mitchell grabbed four interceptions vs. the Huskies, returning two of his three first-half interceptions for touchdowns as Toledo bolted out to a 35-7 lead at the break. Mitchell snuffed out a potential NIU touchdown by grabbing his third pick of the half in the NIU end zone on a pass from three-yard line with 16 seconds left. He gathered up his fourth pick of the game in the third quarter, a diving catch on NIU's opening drive of the half, giving him four interceptions in slightly more than 30 minutes of play.

The four interceptions were the first four of Mitchell's career, tied the school record set back in 1950, and was the first time a Rocket had two pick sixes in one game. The Toledo standard of four interceptions in a game was set by Jerry Palmer vs. Western Reserve in 1950. Mitchell is the only FBS player since 2000 with four INTs and two pick-sixes in a game. The NCAA record for interceptions is five, held by four players, most recently Dan Rebsch of Miami (Ohio) vs. Western Michigan in 1972.

TOLEDO BOWL HISTORY

1969 TANGERINE BOWL TOLEDO 56, DAVIDSON 33

The Rockets headed to Orlando with much at stake: the first undefeated season in the history of the football program. The Rocket offense racked up 324 yards in total offense and put 42 points on the board in the first half. It all led to a 56-33 victory over Southern Conference champion Davidson in the 24th annual Tangerine Bowl.

Quarterback Chuck Ealey, voted the game's most valuable back, ran nine times for 83 yards and a touchdown and threw for 147 yards and three scores on 10-of-13 passing. Don Fair caught four passes for 78 yards and Charles Cole carried 22 times for 152 yards.

The Rockets were later rewarded with a No. 20 national ranking in

The Rockets looking to repeat as Tangerine Bowl champs and post a second consecutive undefeated season, but Lou Holtz's William & Mary team had other ideas and looked primed for an upset when it jumped out to a 6-0 lead and trailed by one point, 7-6, at halftime.

But it was all Rockets in the second half as they scored on their first four possessions.

The Rockets churned out 326 yards rushing, paced by Charles Cole (132 yards) and Tony Harris (101 yards). Toledo finished12th in the nation in the final A.P. poll, 14th in the Football News and 17th by UPI.

1971 TANGERINE BOWL TOLEDO 28, RICHMOND 3

For the first 15 minutes of the game, Richmond looked as if it had the ability to end Toledo's winning streak at 34 games, taking a 3-0 lead. But then quarterback Chuck Ealey and the No. 1 defense in the nation went to work.

The Rocket defense limited the Spiders to just 51 total yards of total offense in the second half,

including none through the air. Richmond punted on five of its seven possessions in the second half, was stopped on fourth down on one and intercepted on the other.

Ealey completed 14-of-23 passes for 176 yards and scored from one yard out. With the victory, the Rockets ran their winning streak to 35 games, to this day the second-longest in major college football.



They said it couldn't be done. There was no way that Toledo could beat a San Jose State team ranked 20th in the final UPI coaches poll. Yet when the first-ever California Bowl game was over, it was Toledo who left the field victorious, 27-25. Tony Lee's 41-yard field goal with just seconds left gave Toledo the victory.



Toledo had led in the game, 21-3, in the third

quarter, but let that slip away. The Spartans took a 25-24 lead with just 52 seconds remaining, on a 35-yard touchdown pass and a two-point conversion

The Rockets were faced with 80 yards of field ahead of them and no time outs remaining. Quarterback Maurice Hall cooly marched his offense down to the Spartan 24-yard line to set the stage for Lee's winning field goal.

1984 CALIFORNIA BOWL UNLV 30, TOLEDO 13*

The Rockets came up short, 30-13, against Randall Cunningham, Ickey Woods and the rest of the Runnin' Rebels. Cunningham had a stellar game, completing 18-of-28 passes for 270 yards. Woods, just a freshman at the time, led UNLV with 53 yards and a TD.



Rocket running back Steve Morgan was

named Toledo's outstanding offensive player after totaling 154 yards on 31 carries, while quarterback A.J. Sager was 12-of-31 for 137 yards with one TD.

*NOTE: The contest was later forfeited to Toledo by the PCAA due to use of ineligible players by UNLV earlier that season. UNLV has never accepted the ruling.

1995 LAS VEGAS BOWL TOLEDO 40, NEVADA 37 (OT)

In a game that featured the first overtime in Division I-A football history, Toledo prevailed over Nevada, 40-37, electrifying a national TV audience on ESPN. After a field goal gave the Wolf Pack a 37-34 lead, its first of the game, the Rockets'Wasean Tait, who set four bowl records and was named co-MVP, scored the winning points on a two-yard run.

Tait set Las Vegas Bowl standards for rushing yards (185), all-purpose yards (238) and TDs (four).

The two teams battled to stand-still through regulation, with Nevada tying the game with a late field goal. Toledo won the overtime coin toss and elected to go on defense first. Nevada settled for a field goal, setting up Tait, who got the call on three of UT's four plays, the last one the game-winner. He was buried under a sea of Rockets in the victory

2001 MOTOR CITY BOWL TOLEDO 23, CINCINNATI 16

Chester Taylor ran for a Motor City Bowlrecord 190 yards and scored the go-ahead touchdown on a 24-yard run with 3:23 left as Toledo defeated Cincinnati, 23-16. But it was a big play by the defense that clinched the victory for Toledo.



Cincinnati drove to the UT five-yard line, but

couldn't convert on fourth-and-4 with 50 seconds left. Cincinnati's Ray Jackson bobbled a deflected pass in a crowded end zone, and senior free safety Andy Boyd then wrestled Jackson—and the ball—to the ground to seal the victory for Toledo.

Quarterback Tavares Bolden was 14-of-28 for 135 yards, but it was his legs that helped Toledo the most. He ran for 41 yards on a draw on the first play of the second half that led to a UT field goal. He tied the game late in the third quarter when he sprinted 28 yards untouched for a touchdown. For the game, Bolden ran for 99 yards, which helped the Rockets set a Motor City Bowl record with 322 yards rushing.

2002 MOTOR CITY BOWL BOSTON COLLEGE 51, TOLEDO 25



Boston College scored on its first six possessions on its way to a 42-18 halftime lead, effectively putting the game away and preventing the Rockets from defending their Motor City Bowl title. Toledo cut the Eagles' advantage to 21-10 when Trinity Dawson scored on a two-yard run

with 10:47 remaining in the first half but UT never got any closer.

Down 28-10 with less than six minutes to go in the first half, Toledo gambled, going for it on a fourth-and-1 from its own 40, but Brian Jones' pass fell incomplete. Boston College took possession, and on the next play, Grant Adams caught Brian St. Pierre's pass across the middle, eluded a defender and raced into the end zone for a 35-10 lead. A one-yard TD run by Brandon Brokaw with 1:31 to go in the half made it 42-10.

2004 MOTOR CITY BOWL UCONN 39, TOLEDO 10

Quarterback Bruce Gradkowski was game. Unfortunately, his broken right hand was not. Gradkowski, who broke his throwing hand in the MAC Championship Game, tried to play in the Motor City Bowl but was ineffective and clearly in pain. As a result, the Rockets' offense stalled, and Connecticut had its way with Toledo,



39-10. Gradkowski finished 6-of-12 for 43 yards before being replaced by Marques Council. By the time Council got in the game to start the second half, UConn was up, 30-7. Council set career highs in attempts (28), completions (16) and passing yards (160).

Toledo entered the game as the favorites, but without a healthy Gradkowski it was no contest. UConn scored on six of its first seven possessions as the Rockets were held to a season-low 10 points.

Gradkowski wasn't the only Rocket to go down. Senior All-MAC free safety Patrick Body broke his right arm in the second half. Lance Moore, Toledo's all-time leading receiver, left the game in the second half with a dislocated shoulder.

2005 GMAC BOWL TOLEDO 45, UTEP 13

Quarterback Bruce Gradkowski ended his storied collegiate career with an exclamation point, throwing five touchdown passes to lead Toledo to a convincing 45-13 win over UTEP. Fellow senior and roommate Trinity Dawson ran for 132 yards.



Toledo's defense shut down UTEP's offense

at almost every turn. Linebacker Mike Alston contributed two big tackles for the Rockets to end the first half, when UTEP was threatening to cut into a 28-13 deficit. It was the last time the Miners appeared set to mount a rally.


Gradkowski, who completed 18-of-32 passes for 298 yards, was chosen as the game's MVP while Dawson (offense), Alston (defensive) and Steve Odom (special teams) also won game honors. After the game, Gradkowski summed up the sentiment of the team.

"It's been an honor to be here this week," said Gradkowski. "We were treated unbelievably by the city of Mobile. The southern hospitality has been awesome. We've never experienced anything like this. We wanted to give back to Mobile by performing the way we did. I hope we satisfied the fans out there.

"It's been a pleasure. What a way to go out. This is our championship. We are GMAC Bowl Champions."

2010 LITTLE CAESARS PIZZA BOWL FIU 34, TOLEDO 32

Florida International capped a secondhalf comeback with a 34-yard field goal as time expired to give the Panthers a dramatic 34-32 victory over Toledo at the Little Caesars Pizza Bowl at Ford Field in Detroit.



FIU's game-winning field goal overshadowed Toledo's own comeback that gave the

Rockets a 32-31 lead with 1:14 to play. Redshirt freshman quarterback Terrance Owens scrambled in for a 14-yard TD and then completed a pass to sophomore wide receiver Eric Page for the two-point conversion. But on its final possession FIU converted a fourth-and-17 from its own 41-yard line to keep its drive alive and set up the eventual gamewinning field goal by Jack Griffin.

Toledo held a 24-7 lead early in the second half but FIU scored 24 unanswered points to take a 31-24 lead with 3:18 to play. Junior Adonis Thomas led the Rockets with a career-high 193 yards rushing and two touchdowns. Thomas' second TD run was an 87-yard bolt in the second quarter, the longest run of his career, the fourth-longest rush in Toledo history and tied for the longest run in Little Caesars Bowl history. He finished the season with 1,098 yards, the 13th-highest total in school history.

TOLEDO BOWL HISTORY

2011 MILITARY BOWL TOLEDO 42, AIR FORCE 41

Toledo used its powerful offense and the defense came up with a big play in an exciting 42-41 victory over Air Force in the Military Bowl. The Rockets never trailed in a see-saw affair in which there were three ties and UT's largest lead was 14 points.



With 52 seconds left in the game, Air Force

scored what appeared to be the game-tying touchdown when Falcons receiver Jonathan Warzeka caught a wide open 33-yard pass from guarterback Tim Jefferson.

Air Force lined up for the extra-point but opted to go for two points on a trick play. Holder David Baska took the snap and headed for the end zone, but sophomore defensive end Jayrone Elliott stripped the ball loose from Baska. The ball bounced in the direction of Parker Herrington, who tried to scoop up the loose ball but ending up kicking it out of the end zone leaving the Rockets with a 42-41 advantage and their first bowl victory since 2005.

The victory was a great vindication for a Rocket team that had survived numerous injuries—including three key injuries to its defense in this game. It was also a dramatic debut for head coach Matt Campbell, the Rockets' offensive coordinator who was named head coach just 16 days prior to the game.

2015 GO DADDY BOWL TOLEDO 63, ARKANSAS STATE 44



Sophomore running back Kareem Hunt rushed for a career-high 271 yards and a bowl-record five touchdowns to propel the Toledo Rockets to a 63-44 victory over Arkansas State at the GoDaddy Bowl in Mobile on Jan. 4.

Hunt, who was named the game's Most Valuable Player, set the bowl record for rushing yards, as well. His five TDs ties the Toledo record for touchdowns, and ties the all-time bowl record for rushing touchdowns held by two others, most recently Oklahoma State's Barry Sanders at the

1988 Holiday Bowl.

In a game that featured 107 total points and 1,009 yards of total offense, Toledo's defense played a big role in the victory, scoring two touchdowns in the first half and stopping Arkansas State's potent offense in several key situations. Junior defensive end Trent Voss, who recovered a fumble in the end zone on the game's first play, had a career-high four tackles for loss among his game-high 10 tackles. He was named Defensive Player of the Game.

Sophomore quarterback Logan Woodside completed 21-of-27 passes for 176 yards and a touchdown. Sophomore Damion Jones-Moore added 103 yards and two touchdowns on 15 carries.

2012 IDAHO POTATO BOWL UTAH STATE 41, TOLEDO 15

Despite the loss of two stars, Toledo gave No. 18 Utah State all it could handle before losing, 41-15, at the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl in Boise, Idaho.

Senior linebacker Dan Molls, the nation's leading tackler, was knocked out of the game with a concussion on the game's opening kickoff. A short while later, junior running back David Fluellen reinjured his sore left ankle and never returned.


Despite those losses, Toledo was in the game well into the fourth quarter, trailing just 13-9 before a 63-yard touchdown run by USU's Kerwynn Williams put the game on ice just under the seven-minute mark. Williams then followed with two more scoring runs of five and 25 yards to finish the game with 18 carries for 235 yards.

Senior QB Austin Dantin, who played the first three quarters, completed 12-of-21 attempts for 132 yards with two interceptions for the Rockets. Junior QB Terrance Owens, hobbled by an ankle injury, played most of the fourth quarter and was 5-of-16 for 26 yards. Utah State's Chuckie Keeton threw for 229 yards and completed 21-of-31 pass attempts.

Junior WR Bernard Reedy led the Rockets in both rushing and receiving, finishing with a career-high 10 carries for 50 yards on the ground and six catches for 62 yards through the air. He was honored following the game as Toledo's Most Valuable Player.



2015 MARMOT BOCA RATON BOWL TOLEDO 32, TEMPLE 17



Phillip Ely threw for 285 yards and two touchdowns and Toledo used a smothering defense to knock off No. 24 Temple, 32-17, at the Marmot Boca Raton Bowl at FAU Stadium. Ely, playing in his final game as a Rocket, returned to his native Florida to lead the Rockets to victory in Jason Candle's first game as head coach.

Ely, a transfer from Alabama, was named the game's Offensive MVP. He completed 20-of-28 passes despite throwing in driving rain most of the night. Kareem Hunt led the running attack

with 79 yards and two TDs. Cody Thompson had four receptions for a career-high 119 yards, including a big 80-yard score in the fourth quarter.

While Ely provided the Rockets (10-2) with leadership on offense, the Toledo defense set the tone of the game, holding the Owls to just 17 points and a mere 67 yards of total offense in the first half. Ja'Wuan Woodley, who had a key safety in the first half, was named the game's Defensive MVP. Chase Murdock and Trent Voss paced the front seven with 11 and 10 tackles, respectively.

Toledo's defense controlled the action in the first half, holding Temple (10-4) to just 67 yards of total offense.

2016 RAYCOM MEDIA CAMELLIA BOWL APPALACHIAN STATE 31, TOLEDO 28



Senior Kareem Hunt rushed for 120 yards and two touchdowns to become Toledo's all-time leading rusher, but it wasn't enough as Toledo fell to Appalachian State, 31-28, in the 2016 Raycom Media Camellia Bowl in Montgomery, Ala.

App State scored on a 39-yard field goal with 5:14 left in the fourth quarter to give the Mountaineers a 31-28 lead. Toledo


had its chance to tie the score but Jameson Vest's 30-yard fieldgoal attempt with 1:48 remaining was wide right.

Hunt led the rushing attack with 120 yards, giving him 4,945 career rushing yards, which breaks the all-time record at Toledo previously held by Chester Taylor (4,849 from 1998-2001). It was also the 28th 100-yard game in his career, breaking the school mark of 27 held by Taylor.

Senior Logan Woodside connected 18-of-26 passes and added to his nation-leading total by throwing two touchdown passes to give him 45. Junior Cody Thompson led the team with 99 yards on five receptions, giving him 1,269 on the season and surpassing the Toledo record of 1,194 set by Lance Moore in 2003.

The contest was a close battle throughout the night with neither team leading by more than seven points. The score was tied at 7, 14, 21 and 28.

2017 DOLLAR GENERAL BOWL APPALACHIAN STATE 34, TOLEDO 0



Toledo fell behind early and could never get back in the game in a 34-0 loss to Appalachian State in the Dollar General Bowl in Mobile, Ala.

The Rockets (11-3) trailed 20-0 at halftime and App State outgained Toledo in total offense for the game, 458-146.

Senior quarterback Logan Woodside, playing in his final game as a Rocket, completed 16-of-29 passes for 124 yards. Senior

Terry Swanson led the running attack with 44 yards. Sophomore Diontae Johnson caught two passes for 21 yards, finishing his season with a school-record 1,278 receiving yards.

Appalachian State controlled the first half, taking a 20-0 halftime lead and outgaining the Rockets in total offense, 267-85, in the first 30 minutes. The Mountaineers got on the board on their third possession of the game on a seven-yard TD run by Jalin Moore with 4:06 to play in the first quarter. The 36-yard drive was set up by an ASU interception of Woodside near midfield that was returned 19 yards by Anthony Flory.

2018 MAKERS WANTED BAHAMAS BOWL FIU 35, TOLEDO 32



Toledo scored the game's first points in the first 29 seconds of the Makers Wanted Bahamas Bowl, but couldn't hold off Florida International, falling to the Golden Panthers.

Eli Peters threw for 264 yards and tied a career high with three TD passes. Diontae Johnson caught six passes for 98 yards and a score, while Jon'Vea Johnson added two touchdown catches. Bryant Koback scored the game's first touchdown with a three-yard rush in the first quarter, and both Richard Olekanma and Tuzar Skipper

led the Rockets with eight tackles.

Toledo took the lead early on with 10 points in the first quarter, but FIU's strong rushing attack put the Panthers ahead by 10, 35-25, late in the game. However, Peters found Johnson for the second time in the corner of the end zone for a 43-yard touchdown with two seconds left to keep the Rockets' hopes alive. UT's chances came down to an onside kick, which was recovered by FIU to seal the Panthers' victory.

2021 BAHAMAS BOWL MIDDLE TENNESSEE 31, TOLEDO 24



Toledo came up on the short end of a 31-24 decision to Middle Tennessee State in the Bahamas Bowl in Nassau, Bahamas.

Toledo (7-6) led at halftime, 17-14, but the Blue Raiders (7-6) out-scored the Rockets 17-7 in the fourth quarter to claim the win.

Redshirt freshman quarterback Dequan Finn completed 18-of-39 passes for 212 yards and two touchdowns. He also rushed for 83 yards and one touchdown. Junior running back Bryant Koback led the ground attack with 126 yards on

18 carries, while junior Matt Landers caught four passes for a team-high 137 yards and one score.

Defensively, junior Nate Givhan had a pair of sacks and seven tackles, while classmate Dyontae Johnson tallied a team-best 10 tackles. Junior Samuel Womack also notched his fifth career interception.

Middle Tennessee scored on the first play of the fourth quarter to make it 21-17 on quarterback Mike Diliello's 14-yard rush. The Blue Raiders extended their lead to 28-17 on Jarrin Pierce's touchdown reception with 6:24 remaining. Middle Tennessee added a field goal before the Rockets closed out the game's scoring when Finn found DeMeer Blankumsee in the end zone from 13 yards out with 1:08 to play.

HEAD COACH JASON CANDLE

CHAMPION 2022

FOOTBALL

For the past 14 years, no one has embodied the success of Toledo Football more than Head Coach Jason Candle.

Candle has played a major role in the consistent excellence of the Rockets, first as an assistant coach from 2009-15, and then as head coach for the past seven seasons. He assumed the head coaching role in December of 2015 following a highly successful seven-year stint as a position coach and offensive coordinator. Since then, Candle has taken an already outstanding program to even greater heights.

In seven seasons as Toledo's head coach, Candle's record is 53-32 with two MAC Championship titles and six bowl appearances. No team in the Mid-American Conference has won more games than Toledo during Candle's tenure.

In 2017, the Rockets achieved an 11-3 record and won the Mid-American Conference Championship with a 45-28 victory over Akron in the MAC title game. Candle was named MAC Coach of the Year, leading the Rockets to their first outright MAC West Division crown since 1998 and first league championship since 2004.

This season, Candle's Rockets are 8-5 and won another

MAC Championship Game, defeating East Division champion Ohio, 17-7, in the 2022 MAC Championship Game.

Candle has a tremendous record of developing players, as eight Rockets have been selected in the NFL Draft since 2017. In addition, Toledo has had the No. 1 recruiting class in the MAC five times during Candle's tenure.

Prior to assuming the helm of the Midnight Blue and Gold, Candle had been serving as the program's associate head coach/offensive coordinator. In that time, Toledo went 56-31, won three MAC West Division co-champion-ships and appeared in four bowl games.

Candle moved into the corner office on Dec. 2, 2015, becoming the 27th head football coach in the storied history of Toledo football.

Following his introductory news conference, Candle had less than three weeks to put together a coaching staff and prepare his team for the Marmot Boca Raton Bowl. Twenty days later, Candle and the Rockets celebrated a 32-17 victory over No. 24 Temple in the rain of south Florida. The triumph capped a 10-2 season for the Rockets and gave Candle a head coaching debut to remember.

A Victorious Debut as Head Coach in 2015

Candle's debut as head coach was a memorable one. Despite having only a partial coaching staff and less than three weeks to prepare for No. 24 Temple, the Rockets pulled off a 32-17 victory in the Marmot Boca Raton Bowl. Toledo held the Owls to just three points and 67 yards of offense in the first half and dominated the fourth quarter, too, outscoring Temple, 20-8, in the final 15 minutes.

Next on Candle's agenda was completing his coaching staff and signing the next generation of Rockets. Candle added eight assistants to the staff, as well as a strength and conditioning coach, a director of high school relations and a director of football operations. The newcomers helped Candle

put the finishing touches on a recruiting class that was ranked second in the MAC by ESPN.com.

Gaining National Attention in 2016

In Candle's first full season as head coach, Toledo won nine games and earned a berth into the Raycom Media Camellia Bowl, its sixth bowl berth in the previous seven years. The Rockets also gained national attention with a record-setting offense and three players selected in the NFL Draft following the conclusion of the season.

The 2016 Rockets featured one of the top offenses in the country, ranking in the top 10 in five offensive catego-

ries, including passing efficiency (second), third-down conversions (fifth), total offense (seventh) and passing offense (10th). Toledo set the school record with an average of 517.8 yards per game.

The Rockets' 2016 roster housed a record nine players who were on the official watch lists for national awards. Twelve Rockets made All-MAC, including a leaguehigh seven first-team selections. Junior quarterback Logan Woodside led the nation with 45 touchdown passes and was named a contender for the Heisman Trophy by the Heisman Trophy Trust. Senior tight end Michael Roberts led the nation's tight ends with 16 TD catches and was named first-team All-America by the Football Writers Association of America. Senior running back Kareem Hunt finished his career as Toledo's all-time leading rusher with 4,945 yards. Roberts and Hunt were chosen to play in the 2017 Senior Bowl, while offensive lineman Storm Norton and defensive tackle Treyvon Hester joined Roberts as selections for the East-West Shrine Game.

Following the 2016 season, a record eight Rocket seniors were either selected in the 2017 NFL Draft, signed as free agents or invited to mini-camps. Three Rockets — Kareem Hunt, Michael Roberts and Treyvon Hester —

were drafted, the most since the NFL went to its current sevenround format in 1994. Hunt was a third-round pick of the Kansas City Chiefs. Roberts (tight end) was taken in the fourth round by Detroit, while Hester (defensive tackle) was chosen by the Oakland Raiders in the seventh round. Hunt went on to lead the NFL in rushing as a rookie.

2017: MAC Champions!

Candle took the Rockets to even greater heights in his second season as head coach. Toledo went 11-3 and won its first MAC Championship in 13 years. The Rockets earned a trip to the MAC Championship Game by winning the MAC West Division with a 7-1 mark.

Toledo's offense dominated once again, leading the MAC in total offense (483.9) and finishing second in scoring (36.4). Candle was honored as the MAC Coach of the Year.

Six Rockets earned a total of seven first-team All-MAC honors, including senior quarterback Logan Woodside, who also was honored with the Vern Smith Award (league MVP) and was named the MAC's Offensive Player of the Year. He was also named a contender for the Heisman Trophy by the Heisman Trophy Trust for the second consecutive season. Along the way, Woodside set the school record for career passing yards and touchdown passes.

Toledo also earned an invitation to the Dollar General Bowl, its seventh bowl appearance in the previous eight years.

After the season, Woodside was chosen to play in the NFLPA Collegiate Bowl and the State Farm All-Star Football Challenge. He was drafted in the seventh round by the Cincinnati Bengals, becoming the fourth Rocket in two years to be selected in the draft. Five other Rockets signed free-agent contracts immediately following the draft, the most in school history.

Bahamas Bowl Berth in 2018

In 2018, Candle led the Rockets to their eighth bowl berth in nine years, four with Candle as the head coach, when Toledo was invited to play FIU in the Makers Wanted Bahamas Bowl.

Toledo won four of its last five games to finish the regular season with seven wins, making the Rockets one of only nine FBS schools to have had a winning record in each of the previous nine seasons.

Toledo relied on its high-powered offense, cracking the 50-point barrier a school-record six times. The Rockets ranked first in the MAC in scoring offense (40.4) and second in total offense (443.8). UT featured a balanced attack, with three running backs gaining over 500 yards rushing and three receivers surpassing 500 yards receiving. Junior Diontae Johnson, who earned first-team All-MAC at wide receiver and punt returner, and second-team at kickoff returner, was named the MAC Special Teams Player of the Year. Senior wide receiver Cody Thompson also was a firstteam All-MAC pick for the second time.

Following the season, a pair of Rockets were chosen in the 2019 NFL Draft. Diontae Johnson (Pittsburgh-third round) and cornerback Ka'dar Hollman (Green Bay - sixth round) became the fifth and sixth Toledo players to be selected over the previous three drafts. Four other Rockets signed free-agent contracts immediately following the draft, bringing the total number of Toledo players who were drafted or signed as free agents to 15 over the previous three years.

In 2019, the Rockets earned bowl eligibility for the 10th consecutive season. Highlights included a pair of thrilling non-conference victories over Colorado State and

BYU.

Toledo had four players make All-MAC in 2019. Juniors Bryant Koback and Bryce Mitchell made second team, while redshirt freshman Nick Rosi and sophomore Jamal Hines earned third-team honors. Koback's 1,187 yards rushing was the 13thhighest season total by a Rocket.

As a team, the Rockets finished second in the MAC in rushing (224.5) and fourth in total offense (434.1).

Big Changes Pay Off in 2020

Prior to the start of the COVIDabbreviated 2020 season, Candle added four new coaches to his staff.

Craig Kuligowski (co-defensive coordinator/outside linebackers) and Vince Kehres (defensive coordinator/ linebackers) were added to the defensive side of the ball, while Robert Weiner (co-offensive coordinator/

quarterbacks) and Mark Staten (tight ends/offensive tackles) joined the offensive staff.

The Rockets finished the 2020 season with a 4-2 mark, the program's 11th consecutive season without a losing record. Their only losses were by three points each to Western Michigan and eventual MAC champion Ball State.

A positive trend for the Rockets in 2020 was their improved defense. Toledo ranked first in the MAC in total defense (362.2) and opponent third-down conversions (27.4%), and second in rushing defense (129.2). On offense, the Rockets ranked third in the MAC in total offense (494.0) and first in passing offense (325.8).

Six Rockets earned All-MAC selections in 2020. Senior center Bryce Harris earned first-team honors. Senior safety Tycen

Anderson, sophomore safety Nate Bauer, junior outside linebacker Jamal Hines and junior defensive tackle Desjuan Johnson took second team honors, while junior wide receiver Isaiah Winstead made the third team.

Another Bahamas Bowl Appearance in 2021

The 2021 season began with a near-upset of Notre Dame on Sept. and culminated with an appearance in the Bahamas Bowl, the fifth bowl trip for Candle as head coach.

The Rockets took a 29-24 lead over Notre Dame with just 1:35 to play but eventually fell to the No. 7 Fighting Irish, 32-29. Toledo went on to finish with a 7-6 record, with four of those losses coming by three points or less.

The Rockets finished the season strong, winning their final three regular-season games, averaging 44.3 points per game in those three contests. Their strong finish clinched the program's 12th straight season without a losing record and 11th straight season reaching bowl eligibility. The 2021 Bahamas Bowl was Candle's 10th bowl game since joining Toledo's coaching staff in 2009.

The Rockets were the top team statistically in the MAC on both sides of the ball in 2021, ranking first in the MAC in both scoring offense (33.4) and scoring defense (21.8). Those figures ranked 26th and 27th in the country, respectively.

Eleven Rockets earned All-MAC honors in 2021, the most for Toledo since placing 12 players on All-MAC teams in 2016.

Leading the way were five first-team selections, the

most since 2017. Senior offensive lineman Bryce Harris, senior defensive backs Tycen Anderson and Samuel Womack, junior running back Bryant Koback, and junior outside linebacker Jamal Hines were all placed on the first team.

Senior linebacker Jonathan Jones and junior defensive end Desjuan Johnson were placed on the second team, as was sophomore wide receiver Devin Maddox, who was named All-MAC as a return specialist.

Representing the Rockets on the third team were senior offensive lineman Vitaliy Gurman, junior linebacker Dyontae Johnson, and freshman safety Maxen Hook.

Following the season, Anderson (Cincinnati) and Womack (San Francisco) were both selected in the

fifth round of the 2022 NFL Draft. Bryant signed as an undrafted free agent with Minnesota.

Another MAC Championship in 2022

Candle guided the Rockets to a share of the MAC West Division title and the second MAC Championship during

his reign in 2022. Toledo defeated East Division champion Ohio, 17-7, at Detroit's Ford Field. The victory tied Candle with Frank Lauterbur (1969, 1970) and Tom Amstutz (2001, 2004) for the most outright titles in Toledo history.

When Toledo plays Liberty University in the 2022 Roofclaim.com Boca Raton Bowl on Dec. 20, it will mark Candle's sixth bowl game as head coach and 10th overall. Candle will return to the site of his very first game as head coach of the Rockets, the 2015 Boca Raton Bowl. He was named head coach at the end of the 2015 regular season, just 20 days prior to the contest after having served seven seasons as a Toledo assistant.

Candle and his Rockets earned their trip to the 2022 Roofclaim.com Boca Raton with a MAC Championship run that was not without its challenges. But the Midnight Blue and Gold triumphed when it mattered most, winning four of five MAC West Division games and then handling a very tough Ohio team in the MAC Championship Game.

The 2022 Rockets featured arguably the best defense in the Mid-American Conference. The Rockets are No. 1 in the MAC in total defense (331.8), interceptions (12), defensive passing efficiency (110.05) and passing yards allowed (185.5).

The defense is led by four first-team All-MAC players: senior defensive tackle Desjuan Johnson (16.5 tackles for loss), junior linebacker Dallas Gant (113 tackles), sophomore cornerback Quinyon Mitchell (five interceptions, 20 breakups) and sophomore safety Maxen Hook (73 tackles, two interceptions). Mitchell, who leads the nation with 25 passes defended, was named Walter Camp second-team All-America. Mitchell gained national attention when he had four interceptions and two pick-sixes vs. Northern Illinois on Oct. 8.

Making second-team All-MAC for the defense were senior defensive end Jamal Hines (6.5 sacks), senior linebacker Dyontae Johnson (103 tackles, 8.5 TFL) and junior safety Nate Bauer (57 tackles, two interceptions).

The leader of the offense is sophomore quarterback Dequan Finn, who has battled through shoulder and ankle injuries to earn second-team All-MAC honors and Offensive Player of the Game accolades in the MAC Championship Game. Finn has thrown for 2,127 yards and 22 touchdowns but is just as dangerous with his feet, rushing for 608 yards and eight scores.

Finn's top targets are sophomore and second-team All-MAC pick Jerjuan Newton (48 receptions, nine TDs), junior Devin Maddox (38 receptions) and sophomore De-Meer Blankumsee (37 receptions). The rushing attack is a three-headed monster of sophomores Jacquez Stuart (659 yards), Peny Boone (418 yards) and Micah Kelly (376 yards). The Rockets are No. 1 in the MAC in scoring offense (32.1) thanks to an offense line led by first-team All-MAC offensive lineman Nick Rosi.

After a 2-2 start in non-conference play, Toledo won its first three MAC games by 20 or more points to establish itself as the team to beat in the league. But the Rockets" next five games were close battles, with all of them determined by one score. Toledo captured the two they needed

to win, a 27-24 comeback victory at Eastern Michigan on Oct. 29 and a home triumph vs. Ball State on Nov. 8, setting up its MAC Championship showdown with Ohio.

Candle Made his Mark as Receivers Coach

Candle began his career at Toledo in 2009, coaching the slot receivers and tight ends. Among the players in his meeting room was one of the most decorated receivers in Rocket history, freshman Eric Page. Page would go on to catch 306 passes in his career, the most ever by a Division I-BCS receiver in three seasons. A threetime All-MAC player, Page broke virtually every UT receiving record and tied the MAC

record for career receptions. Candle helped guide Page to an outstanding freshman season. Page led all freshmen in the nation in receptions (82) and yardage (1,159) and was named first-team Freshman All-America by Phil Steele Magazine and the College Football News.

In 2010, Candle became the receivers coach, helping the Rockets go 8-5 and gain their first bowl appearance in five seasons. Page caught 99 passes and was a first-team All-MAC honoree at wide receiver, earning All-America honors as a kickoff returner as well.

In 2011, the Rockets went 9-4 and won their first bowl

game in six years, a 42-41 victory over Air Force in the Military Bowl. Sophomore wide receiver Bernard Reedy caught three touchdown passes and was named the game's MVP. Page caught a school-record 125 passes for the season and earned firstteam All-MAC honors.

Guiding the Rocket Offense as Coordinator

Candle became the offensive coordinator in 2012, ushering in a record-breaking era for the Rocket offense. In his debut season as the OC, Candle helped Toledo rank No. 3 on offense in the MAC

with an average of 445.2 yards per game. The Rockets had five offensive players make the All-MAC team, propelling them to a 9-4 mark and a trip to the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl.

In 2013, the Rockets averaged 33.0 points and 447.3 yards of total offense per game. Toledo's running game was especially effective, ranking second in the Mid-American Conference with 240.6 yards per contest. In addition, seven players on the offensive side of the ball earned All-MAC honors, including two-time first-team running back David Fluellen.

In 2014, UT led the MAC in just about every major offensive category, including scoring offense (36.6), total offense (490.5) and rushing offense (256.4). The 2014 season culminated with a nine-touchdown outburst in a 63-44 victory over Arkansas State in the GoDaddy Bowl for the 9-4 Rockets.

Six Rockets earned All-MAC recognition on offense in 2014, with senior center Greg Mancz snagging second-team All-America honors and the Vern Smith Leadership

Award, given annually to the top player in the MAC. Sophomore running back Kareem Hunt ranked 10th in the nation in rushing (1,631 yards) and second in yards per carry (7.96). Candle also skillfully guided the Rocket quarterbacks through a challenging season in which the top three signal-callers were all injured at the same time late in the season.

Candle's final season as the offensive coordinator in 2015 may have been his best. The Rockets were 10-2 that year, and ranked third in the Mid-American Conference in scoring offense (35.0) and total offense (460.9 yards per game).

Four Rockets earned All-MAC honors on offense, including first-team honoree Storm Norton (OL). Junior running back Kareem Hunt came back from injuries to lead the MAC in rushing with 108.1 yards per game. Toledo led the MAC in rushing, averaging nearly 208 yards per contest, and ranked No. 2 in the nation in fewest sacks allowed (five). Toledo went on to beat No. 24 Temple in the Marmot Boca Raton Bowl.

Guiding Players to the Next Level

Going back to his days at Mount Union, Candle has had a tremendous track record of

mentoring players who have gone on to play in the NFL. A total of 28 players who Candle coaches as either and assistant or head coach made it to the professional ranks.

At Mount Union, Candle coached a pair of receivers Pierre Garcon and Cecil Shorts, who had outstanding NFL careers. Garcon played 11 seasons in the NFL with Indianapolis, Washington and San Francisco. He caught 628 passes, including an NFL-best 113 for the Redskins in 2013. Shorts had 229 receptions in six NFL seasons.

Candle has coached 26 Rockets who have made it to the NFL, including eight who were selected in the NFL Draft between 2017-22. Most recently, safety Tycen Anderson (Cincinnati) and cornerback Samuel Womack (San Francisco) were chosen in the fifth round of the 2022 Draft.

In previous drafts, Kareem Hunt (Kansas City-third round), Michael Roberts (Detroit-fourth round) and Treyvon Hester (Oakland-seventh round) were all selected in 2017; Logan Woodside (Cincinnati-seventh round) was taken in 2018, while Diontae Johnson (Pittsburgh-third round) and Ka'dar Hollman (Green Bay-sixth round) were selected in the 2019 draft.

Hunt led the NFL in rushing with 1,327 yards as a rookie in 2017 and has rushed for 3,557 career yards in five seasons with the Chiefs and Browns. Johnson caught 59 passes as a rookie for the Steelers in 2019 and was named All-Pro second-team as a punt returner. In 2020, Johnson caught 88 passes with seven TD receptions, and topped that with 107 catches and eight scores in 2021. He was named to the 2021 Pro Bowl.

Emphasis on Academic Excellence

Academic excellence will always be a top priority for Candle and his staff. The Rockets have surpassed the 3.0 GPA mark four times since Candle became the head coach. The all-time mark came in the spring of 2020, when the Rockets earned a team-record 3.270 grade point average during the first semester of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Rockets also have led the Mid-American Conference in the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate (APR) in six of the past seven years in which the data was released to the public, with marks of 983, 981, 975, 981 and 977 in each of the past five years.

Strong APRs are a good indicator that a program is graduating its student-athletes. In 2021, 21 players competed with their bachelor's degree already in hand, and a record 22 players earned Academic All-MAC honors.

Recruiting the Best in the MAC

Candle and the Rockets have been consistently excellent in adding talent to the program as five of Toledo's last six recruiting classes have been ranked No. 1 in the Mid-American Conference by 247 Sports.

Recruiting excellence is nothing new for Candle, who has a long history of recruiting success. As an assistant coach, Candle was regularly mentioned among the nation's top recruiters, including being nationally recog-

nized by Rivals in 2010. He was one of only nine coaches in the country from Group of Five conferences to be named to the list and the only coach from the MAC. Candle also was named the Mid-American Conference "Recruiter of the Year" by Scout.com in both 2011 and 2012. Toledo's 2011 recruiting class was ranked No. 1 in the MAC by both Scout and Rivals. In 2014, Candle was named one of only two MAC assistants to be named among the top recruiters in the Group of Five conferences by Rivals.

Candle's first recruiting class as Toledo's head coach in 2016 was rated No. 2 in the MAC by ESPN.com despite the fact that he assumed the head coaching job just two months before Signing Day. Even more impressive is the fact that all but two of Candle's assistant coaches were new to the program during the critical final two months of the recruiting season. Candle and his staff went on to recruit the top class in the MAC for five consecutive seasons from 2017-21.

Coaching Origins at Mount Union/Family

Candle joined the Rockets' staff in 2009 after spending both his playing and coaching career under head coach Larry Kehres at Mount Union. In Candle's six years as an assistant at Mount Union, the Purple Raiders went 83-4 and won NCAA Division III national championships in 2005, 2006 and 2008. The 2003 and 2007 teams lost in the national championship game.

A 2003 Mount Union graduate, Candle was an All-Ohio Athletic Conference first-team selection in 2001 as he led the team in receptions (41), yards receiving (778) and touchdowns (9). He was a key member of the 2000 and 2001 national championship teams and finished his career with 57 grabs for 1,037 yards and 11 scores.

Candle, a native of Salem, Ohio, began his coaching career at Mount Union in 2003 as the receivers coach. In the 2004 and 2005 seasons, he worked with Matt Campbell, who was the Purple Raiders' offensive coordinator at the time. Candle took over the post of offensive coordinator in 2007, and also assumed the duties as the program's recruiting coordinator.

In Candle's two seasons as offensive coordinator, the Purple Raiders went 29-1, winning the national championship in 2008 and finishing as runners-up in 2007. Mount Union offensive players earned nine All-American honors in Candle's two seasons running the offense. QB Greg Micheli was honored in 2008 with the Gagliardi Trophy, given annually to the best NCAA Division III player in the nation.

One of those All-American receivers, Pierre Garcon, is a starting wide receiver for the San Francisco 49ers. The other was Cecil Shorts, a fourth-round draft pick of the Jacksonville Jaguars in 2011.

Candle and his wife Nicole have a daughter, Avery (5) and two sons, Cameron (4), and Colton (2).






• The four interceptions were the first four of Mitchell's career, tied the school record set back in 1950, and was the first time a Rocket had two pick sixes in one game.

• Newton led the Rockets with a career-high seven receptions for 94 yards.


• Micah Kelly paced the running attack with a career-high 85 yards.



• Holding a 10-7 lead in the fourth quarter, Dequan Finn hit DeMeer Blankumsee for a 16-yard touchdown pass with 10:36 left in the game. Toledo's defense then did its job, holding the Bobcats scoreless on their final three drives.

• Toledo's defense, ranked No. 1 in the MAC much of the season, dominated the Bobcats for most of the game, holding Ohio to the fewest points by any team in MAC Championship Game history. Ohio gained 262 yards of total offense, including just 69 yards in the second half. Dallas Gant led Toledo with 10 tackles and Nate Bauer had an interception.

• Finn was named the game's Offensive MVP, Dyontae Johnson (eight tackles, 0.5 TFL) was Defensive MVP, and Jonathon Batzke (46.5 punting average) was the Special Teams MVP.

• It was Toledo's 12th MAC Championship title overall, and fourth triumph in the MAC Championship Game. It was also Head Coach Jason Candle's second MAC title. His Rockets won the title in 2017, his second year as Toledo's head coach.
