THE BREAKDOWN

- Friday's game will be the 24th meeting all-time between the Bulldogs and Rebels.
- Fresno State leads the series with UNLV, 16-7. The matchup dates back to 1979, and has been a Big West, WAC and Mountain West battle over the decades.
- Last time the two teams faced off, Fresno State earned a big 40-27 victory over UNLV at Allegiant Stadium in 2020.

THE BONES

- Fresno State Athletics is celebrating its centennial year and the 2021 football season is the 100th season of competition in program history.
- After defeating then-No. 13 UCLA at the Rose Bowl on Saturday night, Fresno State earned spots in both the AP and Coaches Poll this week. The Bulldogs check in at No. 22 in the AP Poll and No. 25 in the Coaches Poll.
- Fresno State is nationally ranked for the first time since 2018. The Bulldogs finished the 2018 season ranked No. 18 in both polls.
- Fresno State senior quarterback Jake Haener was named the Mountain West Offensive Player of the Week after his gritty performance that led Fresno State to its 40-37 win at then-No. 13 UCLA on Saturday night.
- After rallying to win their fourth straight game in the series against the Bruins, the Bulldogs earned Cheez-It Bowl National Team of the Week honor for games of weekend of Sept. 18, as selected by the Football Writers Association of America.
- Friday's game is Fresno State's Mountain West opener. The Bulldogs enter conference play with a 3-1 record, its best record entering conference play since 2018.
- Fresno State enters Mountain West play with three wins under its belt for the first time since the 2018 season when it defeated Idaho, UCLA and Toledo in its nonconference slate. The Bulldogs went on to win seven of their eight regular season conference games, and the Mountain West Championship and Las Vegas Bowl that season.
- Fresno State is still undefeated at home. The Bulldogs opened the season with a dominant 45-0 win over UConn on Aug. 28. Fresno State returned home on Sept. 11 and defeated Cal Poly 63-10.
- Fresno State was picked to finish fourth in the West Division in the 2021 preseason Mountain West poll. The Bulldogs currently the only ranked team in the Mountain West, and are one of two West Division teams with three wins at this point in the season.
- The Bulldogs have made quick work on the offensive scoring drives, having six touchdown scoring drives this season that have been scored in less than 1:00.
- The 455 yards passing by Haener at UCLA were the most by a Group of 5 player in a road win versus an AP Top-15 team during the last 10 seasons.
- Fresno State's victory at No. 13/13 UCLA is the Mountain West's first victory over a top-15 nationally-ranked nonconference opponent since 2014 (Boise State def. No. 10 Arizona in Fiesta Bowl).
- A pair of Bulldog receivers are in the Top 10 in the FBS in receiving yards - Josh Kelly checks in at No. 6 and Jalen Cropper at No. 10. Fresno State is the only school with two receivers represented in the top 10 in the category.

THE REBELS

SCOUTING UNLV

The UNLV Rebels come to Bulldog Stadium with an 0-3 record behind second-year head coach Marcus Arroyo. The losses have come to Eastern Washington, Arizona State and Iowa State.

The Rebels gave Eastern Washington a test in the season opener, falling 35-33 in double overtime at Allegiant Stadium. Last time out, the Rebels were forced to use freshman quarterback Cameron Friel due to injury in the quarterback position room. The Rebels fell to the No. 14 ranked Cyclones, 48-3.

SERIES HISTORY

Friday's game will be the 24th meeting all-time between the Bulldogs and Rebels. Fresno State leads the series with UNLV, 16-7. The matchup dates back to 1979, and has been a Big West, WAC and Mountain West battle over the decades.

The first meeting, in 1979 at Ratcliff Stadium (Fresno), was a 31-28 loss. Fresno State lost four of its first six all-time contests, but have won 13 of its last 16 games versus the Rebels. The teams met 10 straight times in the Big West from 1982-1991 and again in 1996-97 in the WAC. UNLV, one of the founding members of the Mountain West's inaugural 1999 season, left the WAC, a conference affiliation they shared with the Bulldogs for just two seasons (1996-97). There was a gap from that 1997 season until 2013 when the two became conference foes again in the MW (the two schools were not scheduled for competition in the Bulldogs' inaugural 2012 MW season).

LAST TIME VERSUS THE REBELS

Fresno State earned a big 40-27 victory over UNLV at Allegiant Stadium in 2020.

In a city filled with shows, RB Ronnie Rivers was the featured act on Nov. 7, 2020 at the newly minted Allegiant Stadium, piling up 232 all-purpose yards and four touchdowns in Fresno State's 40-27 win over UNLV. The senior running back tallied 133 rushing yards and 99 receiving yards, coming up one yard shy of being the first player to surpass 100 yards in both categories since Dale Messer in 1960.

FRESNO STATE NOTES

HAENER NAMED MW OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Fresno State senior quarterback Jake Haener was named the Mountain West Offensive Player of the Week after his gritty performance that led Fresno State to its 40-37 win at then-No. 13 UCLA on Saturday night.

This is Haener's first weekly honor by the conference. He is the first offensive recognition since WR Jalen Cropper (Nov. 16, 2020). He is the first Bulldog quarterback to earn the award since Marcus McMaryion (Oct. 1, 2018).

Haener finished the game completing 39-of-53 passes for 455 yards, and two touchdowns. The senior had his most passing yards (455), attempts (53) and completions (39) in a game this season.

Playing through some physical pain, Haener successfully led two late scoring drives for the 'Dogs. The first, a 10-play 75-yard scoring drive over 4:32 and the second a six-play 75-yard scoring drive over 40 seconds.

HELLO TOP 25

After defeating then-No. 13 UCLA at the Rose Bowl on Saturday night, Fresno State earned spots in both the AP and Coaches Poll this week. The Bulldogs check in at No. 22 in the AP Poll and No. 25 in the Coaches Poll.

Fresno State is nationally ranked for the first time since 2018. The Bulldogs finished the 2018 season ranked No. 18 in both polls.

CHEEZ-ITS BOWL NATIONAL TEAM OF THE WEEK

The Fresno State Bulldogs held the ball for 40 minutes and had to use all of them to beat No. 13 UCLA, 40-37, as quarterback Jake Haener hit Jalen Cropper with a 13-yard touchdown pass with 14 seconds left at the Rose Bowl.

For rallying to win their fourth straight game in the series the Bulldogs earned Cheez-It Bowl National Team of the Week honor for games of weekend of Sept. 18, as selected by the Football Writers Association of America.

This is just the second time for Fresno State (3-1) to earn this honor from the FWAA and its first recognition since the 2004 season when it upset then-No. 13 Kansas State on the road. Toppling UCLA marked the highest-ranked opponent Fresno State has beaten on the road since.

ONE OF THE GREATS

Fresno State senior quarterback Jake Haener has been named as one of eight quarterbacks named to the Davey O'Brien Great 8 list for his play during week three of the college football season.

Haener is joined by Holton Ahlers (East Carolina), Sean Clifford (Penn State), Matt Corral (Ole Miss), Sam Howell (North Carolina), Tanner Mordecai (SMU), Payton Thorne (Michigan State), and Malik Willis (Liberty).

Any player named to a Great 8 list during the season who was not previously named to the Davey O'Brien Award's Preseason Watch List is officially added to the Midseason Watch List and becomes eligible for the Davey O'Brien National Quarterback Award. Following this week's additions of Haener, Ahlers, Clifford and Thorne, the list is now up to 46 quarterbacks from around the country.

Haener is the first quarterback to be added to the Davey O'Brien watch list since Marcus McMaryion in 2018. That season, McMaryion was a semifinalist for the award. Prior to McMaryion, both David Carr (2001) and Derek Carr (2013) were semifinalists. Kevin Sweeney finished as the runner-up for the 1986 Davey O'Brien Award.

TOP-RANKED VICTORY

Fresno State is fresh off of its 40-37 victory at then-No. 13 UCLA on Saturday. The Bulldogs' win was the highest-ranked opponent the program has defeated since its 45-21 win at then-No. 13 Kansas State on Sept. 12, 2004. The highest team the program has ever defeated was then-No. 10 Oregon State on Sept. 2, 2001.

Fresno State's victory at No. 13/13 UCLA is the Mountain West's first victory over a top-15 nationally-ranked nonconference opponent since 2014 (Boise State def. No. 10 Arizona in Fiesta Bowl). In the Mountain West's 21-year history, Fresno State's win was the seventh by a conference member against an AP Top-13 team.

Friday's game is Fresno State's Mountain West opener. The Bulldogs enter conference play with a 3-1 record, its best record entering conference play since 2018.

Fresno State enters Mountain West play with three wins under its belt for the first time since the 2018 season when it defeated Idaho, UCLA and Toledo in its nonconference slate. DEFEND THE HOME TURF

Fresno State is still undefeated at home. The Bulldogs opened the season with a dominant 45-0 win over UConn on Aug. 28. Fresno State returned home on Sept. 11 and defeated Cal Poly 63-10.

In the last 10 years, Fresno State has had three undefeated seasons at home - 2012 (6-0), 2013 (7-0) and 2018 (6-0). In the history of Bulldog Stadium, there has been 14 unbeaten seasons.

THANKSGIVING DAY KICKOFF INFORMATION ANNOUNCED

Kickoff for Fresno State's Thanksgiving Day matchup at San Jose State has been set for 12:30 p.m. PT. The game will be broadcast on FS1, as announced by the Mountain West on Monday.

The Bulldogs and Spartans will face off for the Valley Trophy in San Jose, Calif. on Thursday, Nov. 25. Monday's announcement fills some missing holes in the Bulldogs' schedule this season. Fresno State now only awaits two kickoff times for this season - at Wyoming (Oct. 16) and vs Nevada (Oct. 23).

WELCOME TO BULLDOG FOOTBALL

Fresno State had a handful of new faces see the field for the first time as Bulldogs in week one. In addition to Ty Jones (WR), Elijah Gates (DB) and Tyson Maeva (LB) who earned the start in their first game, transfers Evan Bennett (DT), DaRon Bland (CB), Jalen Guerrero (OL), Jordan Wilmore (RB) and Ryan Boehm (DT) saw their first game action with Fresno State stitched across their chests that week.

Against Cal Poly, the Bulldogs played nine first-time participants - four offensive, three defensive and two specialists.

- Fresno State has had 23 first-year Bulldogs see game action in four games this season.
- Three first-year Bulldogs have earned starts.

IF SOMETHING GOOD CAME OUT OF IT, IT COULD BE THIS

Sixteen players on the Bulldogs' roster are taking advantage of the extra year of eligibility, granted by the NCAA due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Bulldogs return 15 from a season ago, and add Tyson Maeva and Ryan Boehm who transferred into the program for their sixth seasons.

JUST KICKIN' IT

Fresno State sophomore kicker Abraham Montano saw his first game action as a Bulldog at No. 11 Oregon on Saturday, stepping in for Cesar Silva on the kicking duties against the Ducks. The 'Dogs utilized Montano again against Cal Poly, and he was 9-of-9 on his PAT attempts.

Montano was 3-of-3 in his field goal attempts at Autzen Stadium. The first-year Bulldog scored the first six points for the team that afternoon, drilling a pair of field goals of 33 and 39-yards in the second quarter. Montano would hit on a 22-yard FG connection to give Fresno State its only lead of the game at the 13:03 mark in the fourth quarter.

INSTANT OFFENSE

The Bulldogs have made quick work on the offensive scoring drives, having six touchdown scoring drives this season that have been scored in less than 1:00.

Arguably the most notable one of the season was the game-winning drive that ended with a 13-yard pass from Jake Haener to Jalen Cropper. The scoring drive was 6 plays for 75 yards, and lasted 40 seconds.

Fresno State has already had more scoring drives in under 60 seconds in just four games this season than they had in 2020, 2019, 2016, and 2015. The Bulldogs have had their most since the 2018 season.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

JAKE HAENER, REMEMBER THE NAME

Heads are beginning to turn to what quarterback Jake Haener is doing on the field, but this is nothing new to what the Bulldogs saw all last season. Haener earned his first start as QB1 in the first game of the thrown-together 2020 season, having only three weeks to earn the trust of his offense (and defense) before the first game of the year. Haener led the Bulldogs to the top offense in the Mountain West that season.

Haener got a full offseason of prep with his offense, and it shows. The senior quarterback has completed 106-of-144 attempts in four games this season. Haener has passed at a 73.61 clip, ranking him No. 7 in the NCAA in completion percentage. Haener is the current FBS leader in passing yards (1,464). Haener was the first quarterback in the FBS to surpass 1,000-yards passing this season.

WHERE HE RANKS

Haener ranks in the top 10 in seven statistical categories among FBS players this season. The Bulldog QB is in the top five in four of those areas.

Haener is the FBS leader in passing yards (1,464). He also ranks in the top 5 in passing touchdowns (10), passing yards per game (366), and points responsible for (80).

HAENER AGAINST A GOLIATH

Top-15 teams are supposed to be good. They're typically ranked high for one reason or another. So when a Group of 5 team gets a shot, they're not usually going to put up 569 yards of offense, but that's what Fresno State did under the lights last Saturday at the Rose Bowl against then-No. 13 UCLA. A large chunk of that production came from the arm of Jake Haener who threw for 455 yards on 39-of-53 passing.

The 455 yards passing were the most by a Group of 5 player in a road win versus an AP Top-15 team during the last 10 seasons.

TIME FOR A NEW STREAK

At Oregon, Haener threw for 298 yards - just two yards short of his fifth-consecutive 300-yard passing performance. Haener had four consecutive 300-yard passing games, dating back to the Bulldogs' 35-16 win at Utah State (Nov. 14, 2020). Haener was the first Bulldog to have at least four-straight 300-yard passing performances since Derek Carr in 2013. Haener tied for the fifth-longest streak in Mountain West history.

The Bulldog team captain got himself back on track, passing for 380 yards against Cal Poly. The senior had the best passing performance of the season last time out, passing for 455 yards at No. 13 UCLA.

SITTING AT THE TOP

Senior running back Ronnie Rivers became the program's all-time leading touchdown scorer with touchdown No. 45 of his career against UConn on Aug. 28. Rivers broke the record in a big way, with a personal-best 61-yard receiving touchdown versus UConn. Rivers officially passed Anthony Daigle (1991-93) and sits as the leader in the category. On the same play, Rivers also became the program's all-time leader in career pass receptions by a running back (118) and career receiving yards by a running back (1,119).

Rivers is the nation's active leader with 48 career touchdowns. The senior back is four touchdowns shy of tying for fifth-most in Mountain West history, a spot currently held by San Diego State's Rashaad Penny (2014-17).

MR. DO IT ALL

Rivers has the nation's second-most career all-purpose yards (4,458 yards) among active players. Rivers moved into third all-time in Fresno State history with 161 all-purpose yards on Saturday. The senior back passed his father (Ron Rivers), Robbie Rouse and Rodney Wright on the all-time all-purpose yardage leaders list at Fresno State. He now has 4,458 yards in his career.

RUNNING INTO THE PACIFIC

On Saturday night against UCLA, Ronnie Rivers proved once again what he can do against the biggest opponents in the West. With 162 yards against the Bruins (136 rushing/26 receiving), the senior running back is averaging 135.5 yards in his last four games against the Pac-12 while averaging 6.2 yards per offensive touch.

BIG-TIME BACKFIELD

Yes, Ronnie Rivers is a running back to keep an eye on. But it's not just Rivers in that room who can make plays. Game one saw Jordan Mims, Jordan Wilmore and Malik Sherrod add in positive yardage and scores for the Bulldogs. The RB room totaled 229 yards of total offense, and accounted for two touchdowns in the season-opening win against UConn (Aug, 28).

At No. 11 Oregon, it was Rivers and Mims who carried the RBs. Mims was the Bulldogs' leading rusher with 47 yards. Although the power in the Bulldogs' offense last weekend was mostly in the passing game, Mims had the most explosive play of the game with a 45-yard run to get the Bulldogs in a position to cap a successful scoring drive in the third quarter.

Against Cal Poly, it was Wilmore who scored his first career touchdown as a Bulldog - a 10-yard run.

DEFINITION OF "STACKED"

For three-straight games to open the season, the Bulldog offense showed off its weapons, using 10 different receivers to record positive yardage in the explosive 63-10 win over Cal Poly. Of the 10 receivers against the Mustangs, seven were wide receivers, two were running backs and one was a tight end.

The Bulldogs used nine receivers at then-No. 11 Oregon, not included in that nine is tight end Juan Rodriguez who was the Bulldog who caught the pass on Fresno State's successful 2-point conversion. Including Rodriguez's play, Fresno State has used 10+ receivers in each game this season.

Fresno State showed off its offensive depth and had 11 different Bulldogs catch at least one pass in its season-opening game with UConn. This was the first time the Bulldogs had that many players with a reception since a 56-16 win over Southern Utah at Bulldog Stadium on Sept. 20, 2014.

PUTTING ON FOR THE CITY

Valley natives in Jalen Cropper and Josh Kelly have had outstanding seasons as two of Fresno State's starting receivers. The duo has been consistent in the starting lineup, and it is deserving.

Cropper leads the team in receptions, but it's Kelly who leads the 'Dogs in receiving yards through four games on the year. Cropper has 29 catches for 347 yards and a team-high four receiving touchdowns. The junior is averaging 11.97 yards per catch and 86.75 yards per game on the year.

Kelly, who has 19 catches, makes them all productive ones. The third-year sophomore has racked up 373 yards receiving, and is averaging 19.63 yards per catch and 93.25 yards per game. He has scored two receiving TDs this season.

Both Bulldog receivers are in the Top 10 in the FBS in receiving yards - Kelly checks in at No. 6 and Cropper at No. 10. Fresno State is the only school with two receivers represented in the top 10 in the category.

- Jalen Cropper has scored at least one receiving touchdown in five-straight games, dating back to the 2020 season finale against New Mexico (Dec. 12). With one receiving touchdown on Friday night, Cropper will become the first Bulldog since Davante Adams to catch a touchdown in six-straight games. Adams had a streak of nine games spanning from Oct. 5, 2013 to Dec. 21, 2013.

- Josh Kelly has recorded back-to-back 100-yards receiving in the last two games played. With a 100-yard receiving performance on Friday, Kelly would become the first Bulldog to have three consecutive 100-yard plus receiving games since Cropper did so in 2020. Before that, it was Davante Adams in 2013.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

AYE, AYE CAPTAIN

First year Bulldog linebacker Tyson Maeva has made a name for himself early in his Fresno State career. As a grad transfer from FIU, Maeva came in and has quickly been a pillar of leadership for this Bulldog program.

Earning the title of team captain, as voted on by his teammates, Maeva has been the “quarterback of the defense” to start the season. Sitting as the team’s second-leading tackler, Maeva has 23 stops with 2.0 TFL and 1.5 sack on the year.

ARRON ALWAYS DOING THE MOS(T)BY

Arron Mosby. A name opposing quarterbacks are quickly starting to recognize.

New to the defensive line this season, Mosby has wasted no time getting comfortable in the starting defensive end role. The senior has pressured the quarterback in two games this season, getting off to a hot start in game one with a strip sack, where he recovered the fumble and returned it 31-yards for the touchdown. At No. 11 Oregon, Mosby was credited with a sack for a loss of eight yards. Also at Oregon, the senior defensive end led the team with a career-high 3.5 TFL.

Mosby also forced a fumble in the first two games of the year.

SELECT CIRCLE

Mosby’s touchdown in the Bulldogs’ season-opening game against UConn was the second of his career as a member of the Bulldog defense, and his first since a 95-yard pick-6 against San Jose State in 2018.

Mosby became one of 13 Bulldog defensive players to ever score at least two touchdowns in their career. He is only the third to ever score on an interception return and fumble return for a touchdown in his career, joining J.D. Williams (1986-89) and Travis Brown (2009-12).

THE SILENT ATTACK

Fresno State true sophomore Justin Houston has secured his spot as the Bulldogs’ starting husky. Houston, who earned the starting husky spot as a true freshman last season, has 13 tackles on the year with seven solo stops.

Also seeing time in that husky role this season has been true freshman Emari Pait. Pait has played in all three games this season and recorded five tackles. Pait recorded a career-high two at UCLA.

- The husky was a new position in Fresno State’s 4-2-5 defensive formation, brought in with defensive coordinator William Inge for the 2020 season. It’s a linebacker/safety hybrid that utilizes a player’s athleticism to cover tight ends and wide receivers while also using their size to help in stopping the run.

ROLLIN’ IN AND OUT

Something that the Fresno State defense wanted (and needed) to do this season was create depth within its position groups. It did just that, and it has paid off.

The Bulldogs saw 21 non-starters play on the defensive side of the ball in the season opener, where the defense was the talk of the afternoon. Fresno State had its best defensive performance in a long while, limiting UConn to just 107 yards of total offense - the least amount of yards gained by any team inside Bulldog Stadium.

The defense faced a tough matchup in No. 11 Oregon’s offense, but kept on the attack, limiting the Ducks to 358 total yards. Oregon averaged 412 yards per game a season ago.

The ‘Dog D kept Cal Poly scoreless in the second half, the second time the defense has held its opponent off the board for at least 30 minutes this season.

A selfless mentality instilled into the defense has been the backbone of the “next man up” opportunity for the team. The coaches and team are confident that the “next man up” will play just as hard as the man coming off the field.

SACK CITY

The Bulldogs' defense continues to prove its experience and veteran talent. The 'Dogs have gotten to the opposing quarterback 11 times this season, with three coming against Cal Poly. Fresno State's total sack number is the seventh-most by a team in the FBS this season.

The Bulldogs have had 4.0 sacks in a game six times in 10 games under defensive coordinator William Inge.

They had 4.0 sacks in a game six times in 33 games dating back to 2017 before Inge and the defensive staff installed the 4-2-5 scheme.

Fresno State's 11 sacks have come from seven different players. Defensive tackle Kevin Atkins leads the team with 3.0 sacks for a loss of 11 yards. Atkins had two sacks against Cal Poly, the most in a game for the senior this season.

OUR FAVORITE KIND OF LOSS

Fresno State's defense has registered at least 10.0 tackles for loss in two of four games played this season. The Bulldogs are second in the FBS in total tackles for loss (33.0) and are averaging 8.2 TFL per game this season.

Defensive end Arron Mosby is third in the NCAA in total tackles for loss, recording 6.5 in four games this season. The senior had 2.0 last time out at UCLA.

LEADER OF THE LOSSES

Kevin Atkins has 4.5 TFLs in the first four games this season, just 2.5 off his single-season career-high of 7.0 set in 2019. Atkins is off to a strong start as a senior leader on the defensive line, and has the most TFLs by a Fresno State interior defensive lineman since 2005.

STOPPING THE RUN. THATS THE KEY.

Fresno State's defense had a tough challenge going in to the Rose Bowl, looking to face a UCLA offense who averaged 227 rushing yards per game.

The Bulldogs limited the Bruins to only 117 net rushing yards, and no rusher with more than 67 yards in the game. The Bruins' leading rusher on Saturday was quarterback Dorian Thompson-Robinson. Fresno State is ranked No. 32 in the FBS in rushing defense, limiting opposing offenses to under 100 yards rushing per game. The Bulldogs are allowing 2.72 yards per rush this season, and have faced a strong running duo at UCLA.

A season ago, the Bulldogs' run defense seemed to be an area of weakness. Fresno State finished the 2020 season ranked 106th in rushing defense, allowing 212.3 rushing yards per game. Fresno State was giving up 5.22 rushing yards per play a season ago.

THE GATEKEEPER

Senior transfer Elijah Gates has made his presence known in the Bulldogs' secondary this season. He has totaled 17 tackles (14 solo), 2.0 TFL and four pass breakups.

He played his best game of the season in the upset over his former team UCLA last Saturday. The Bulldogs only allowed 14 completed passes of 24 attempts out of UCLA in the game. Gates logged four tackles and two crucial pass breakups to help Fresno State win the dog fight against the Bruins.

BRING THE JUICE, 32!

It is easy to find safety Evan Williams on the field, displaying infectious energy that the Bulldogs' defense feeds off of. Williams is having a breakout season, leading the Bulldogs in tackles with 32 (17 solo).

The junior has proven that no one is safe as he has also tallied 1.5 TFLs, one pass breakup, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery.

Williams thrives on the big stage. Against then-ranked No. 11 Oregon, owned a team-high and career-high 12 tackles (5 solo) and one pass breakup. Two weeks later, he dominated in the upset over then-ranked No. 11 UCLA with a repeat performance of 12 tackles. The safety showed his versatility by getting to the quarterback on a pivotal 4th & 1, dropping him at the line of scrimmage to turn the ball back over to Fresno State.

Through the first four games of the season, he is averaging an impressive eight tackles per game.

The 2021 season marks Kalen DeBoer's (pronounced duh-BOR) second season as head coach for the Fresno State Football program. He was named the 20th head coach in Fresno State history on Dec. 17, 2019, succeeding Jeff Tedford.

While he embarked on his first season at the helm of the program a year ago, he is no stranger to the Valley as he first arrived in 2017 with Tedford, hired as his offensive coordinator. DeBoer coached the Bulldogs for two seasons before departing for a one-year stint in 2019 at Indiana in the same capacity.

DeBoer earned his first career Division I victory as a head coach on Oct. 29, 2020 at Bulldog Stadium in a 38-17 win against Colorado State following one of the most challenging offseasons in recent memory, for any program, due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Fresno State finished with a 3-3 record in 2020, playing its first two games at home and final four on the road in an unprecedented year. The team sported 10 postseason All-Mountain West selections, highlighted by first-team running back Ronnie Rivers. The Bulldogs' offense shined in 2020 producing a conference-best 479.3 yards total offense per game. The Bulldogs' defense showed growth in a new 4-2-5 scheme, utilizing a large contingent of underclassmen and newcomers that caused havoc for opposing quarterbacks. Fresno State finished tops in the Mountain West, and third in the NCAA in sacks per game (4.17).

IU sported an 8-5 record in 2019 with DeBoer as its offensive coordinator, a resurrection season said by some in the Midwest, as it was the Hoosiers' best regular season in 26 years. Indiana posted a winning conference record for the first time since 1993 (5-3) and was nationally ranked for the first time in 25 years, breaking the oldest such drought in the country. The Hoosiers' offense, a catalyst of the success, excelled under DeBoer ranking inside the top five in the 14-team Big Ten conference in passing offense (302.4, second), first downs (23.4, second), time of possession (33:43, third) turnovers lost (15, third), total offense (432.8, third), passing efficiency (150.6, fourth), third down conversion percentage (.469, fourth) and scoring offense (31.8, fifth).

DeBoer's two years as the Bulldogs' offensive coordinator was one for the ages that concluded with a Mountain West Championship and Las Vegas Bowl win to cap a 22-6 run during the 2017-18 seasons. Those two seasons included double-digit winning seasons each year, coming off a 1-11 campaign by the 2016 team. That feat led to Fresno State becoming the first program in FBS history to secure back-to-back double-digit winning seasons following a double-digit loss season.

Fresno State reached unprecedented heights in year No. 2 with DeBoer as the OC as the Bulldogs posted a school-record 12 victories, and finished ranked No. 18 in both the AP Top 25 and Coaches poll. The offense ranked 26th nationally in scoring offense (34.6) and 29th in passing offense (267.1), and produced five all-conference honorees. The Bulldogs finished eighth nationally in team passing efficiency (156.58), tied for 15th in turnovers lost (14), tied for 19th nationally in red zone offense (89.5 percent) and 25th in third-down conversions (44.6). Up front, the Bulldogs' offensive line ranked in the top six nationally in fewest sacks and tackles for loss allowed per game in 2018 (6th, 5th).

Efficiency was the key in year one for the Bulldog offense under DeBoer as transfer quarterback Marcus McMaryion completed 62.1 percent of his passes, third-best in the Mountain West. Providing time for his quarterback was an offensive line that allowed only 10 sacks in 14 games (0.71 per game), which ranked third in the FBS and was 21 less sacks allowed than the previous year. The 'Dogs held six opponents without a sack in 2017. Fresno State also ranked third in the FBS in tackles for loss allowed per game at just 3.29 per outing.

Prior to joining the Bulldogs' staff, DeBoer spent three seasons as the offensive coordinator at Eastern Michigan where he helped guide the Eagles to their first bowl bid since 1987 following a 7-5 regular season. EMU tied the FBS mark for biggest turnaround in 2016, improving on its win total from one win in 2015. His offense shattered the school record for total yards with 5,917 yards, breaking the previous record of 5,010. School records were also set for points scored (385), passing yards (3,849), touchdown passes (25), first downs (303), pass completions (309), plays (999) as well single-game plays (99). His squad racked up the second-most touchdowns (47) and rushing TDs (21) in a season and the second-most single-game touchdowns (8) and first downs (35).

Prior to his three-year stint at Eastern Michigan, DeBoer spent four seasons as the offensive coordinator at Southern Illinois (2010-13) while also overseeing the wide receiver unit. In total, the Salukis beat 10 Top-25 opponents during DeBoer's tenure. In 2013, the Saluki offense led the Missouri Valley Football Conference (FCS) with 231.8 passing yards per game, the fourth highest total in school history. SIU's 25 passing touchdowns on the season tied for the third highest total in school history.

DeBoer served as the head coach at the University of Sioux Falls (2000-09), where he led one of the most dominant NAIA programs in the nation. DeBoer was named a three-time NAIA National Coach of the Year and compiled an astonishing 67-3 (.957) record while guiding USF to three national championships in five seasons. He won four Great Plains Athletic Conference Championships, 50-straight home games and 29-straight games overall in his final two seasons. He also boasted a 17-2 record in the playoffs. His teams won back-to-back NAIA National Championships in 2008 and 2009, and adding in his 2006 national championship, DeBoer had as many national championships as games lost during his five-year tenure as USF's head coach.

A graduate of USF, DeBoer played for the Cougars from 1993-96, where he was an All-American wide receiver. He set school records for receptions (234), receiving yards (3,400) and touchdown catches (33). Following his playing days, he became a student assistant for Sioux Falls under coach Bob Young in 1997. From 2000-04, he served as USF's offensive coordinator and succeeded Young as head coach in 2005.

FRESNO, Calif. – The Fresno State football team opened the 2021 season with a dominant 45-0 win over UConn, the first shutout for the Bulldogs since 2017, as senior running back Ronnie Rivers rewrote the record books becoming the program's leader in career touchdowns scored.

HOW IT HAPPENED

Following a slow start for both sides, Arron Mosby woke everyone up, stripping Jack Zergiotis and picking up the fumble before racing 31 yards into the end zone late in the first quarter. Fresno State doubled its lead less than three minutes into the second quarter. After a 17-yard completion to Jordan Mims got the 'Dogs down to the nine-yard line, Haener tossed his first touchdown of the season to the corner of the end zone to Ty Jones to put the 'Dogs up 14-0 with 12:30 on the clock.

Late in the quarter, the senior signal caller connected on a pair of 60-plus yard touchdowns. With four minutes remaining in the period, Haener found Rivers on a slant and the senior running back did the rest, scoring the 45th touchdown of his career on a 61-yard reception. Two minutes later, on the first play of the Bulldogs' eighth possession, Haener hit Cropper over the middle. The junior wideout spun off a defender and away from two others, got to the sideline and raced out to an 86-yard score. Cesar Silva tacked on a 24-yard field goal in the waning seconds to put Fresno State up 31-0 at the break.

The Bulldogs added two more touchdowns in the second half, the first an 8-yard rush from Mims in the third, and the second coming in the fourth quarter, a 1-yard pass from Logan Fife to Raymond Pauwels Jr.

EUGENE, Ore. – The Fresno State football team showed what it can bring to the table Saturday afternoon, pushing No. 11 Oregon to its limit on its home field at Autzen Stadium. The Bulldogs fell 31-24 in front of 43,276 fans in attendance at the season opener in Eugene.

HOW IT HAPPENED

Oregon got out to an early advantage on Saturday, getting a 14-0 lead before the Bulldogs could get on the board with a 33-yard field goal by Abraham Montano with 14:16 remaining in the half. It was Montano who would again score for the 'Dogs, this time on a 39-yard field goal to make it 14-6 in favor of the home team.

Oregon scored another touchdown with just over a minute to go in the half, but Fresno State responded with a 17-yard touchdown pass from Jake Haener to Jalen Cropper with seven seconds remaining. The score at the half was 21-13, Oregon.

Fresno State came out firing in the second half with an explosive 85-yard scoring drive. After taking over on downs, Jordan Mims got the 'Dogs into Duck territory with a 45-yard run. Three plays later, Haener broke into the endzone on a two-yard score. Fresno State completed the 2-point conversion on a pass by Haener to Juan Rodriguez to tie the game at 21-21 with 6:45 left in the third.

Montano nailed a 22-yard field goal to give Fresno State its only lead of the game with 13 minutes left on the clock.

The Bulldog defense held Oregon to a field goal mid-way through the fourth quarter, tying the game at 24. The Bulldog offense surrendered a fumble to the Ducks late in the fourth quarter, and they capitalized. No. 11 Oregon scored the go-ahead touchdown on a quarterback keeper score with 2:57 remaining in the game.

FRESNO, Calif. -- Fresno State's offense lit up the scoreboard on Saturday evening as the Bulldogs piled on a 63-10 win over Cal Poly on Heroes Night at Bulldog Stadium.

Fresno State totaled 671 yards of total offense, its most in a game since 2014.

HOW IT HAPPENED

Following a slow start that saw Fresno State punt on its opening two possessions, the Bulldogs got on the board in the final minute of the first quarter with a two-yard run from Jake Haener.

That drive started a string of eight-straight offensive possessions with a touchdown by the 'Dogs as the game went from 7-0 to 56-10. Haener accounted for six of those touchdowns during the stretch, two on the ground and four through the air to four different receivers (Jalen Cropper - 24, Josh Kelly - 14, Zane Pope - 62, Kerik Wheatfall - 53).

Kelly caught touchdown passes on the final two possessions of the first half, a 51-yard reception from Cropper and a 14-yard pass from Haener. The 'Dogs held a 35-10 lead at the half.

Fresno State kept Cal Poly off the scoreboard in the second half, outscoring the Mustangs 28-0 during the final 30 minutes.

PASADENA, Calif. - The Fresno State football team had yet another impressive performance on Saturday, defeating the 13th-ranked UCLA Bruins 40-37 at the Rose Bowl to improve to 3-1 on the season. The Bulldogs won their fourth-straight meeting with UCLA, dating back to 2003.

Senior quarterback Jake Haener did just what he was expected to do on Saturday night. Throwing for a season-high 455 yards, Haener showed true toughness and grit to lead the Bulldogs to their last-minute scoring drive to secure the victory.

HOW IT HAPPENED

Fresno State struck first as Ronnie Rivers broke into the endzone on a one-yard carry with just under six minutes to go in the first quarter. Fresno State was unsuccessful on its 2-point conversion attempt, adding only six points to the board on the score. UCLA answered on its following drive, and took a 7-6 lead into the second quarter.

The 'Dogs outscored the Bruins 17-3 in the second quarter behind touchdowns from Jalen Cropper and Rivers, and a field goal from Abraham Montano. The Bulldogs took a 23-10 lead into the locker room at the break.

UCLA gained some momentum after the half, coming out in the third quarter and scoring on its opening drive to cut the lead. Montano had another field goal to give Fresno State a buffer heading into the fourth.

UCLA took advantage of a Bulldog fumble, recovering it and responding with a touchdown on its following drive to cut the lead to two, 26-24. Fresno State fumbled again on its following drive, and UCLA would recover and respond with another score to take a 30-26 lead with 7:27 to go.

Staying poised under pressure, Haener capped a 10-play 75 yard scoring drive on a 19-yard touchdown pass to Erik Brooks. Fresno State led 33-30 with 2:55 remaining. Defense held tough, but UCLA's Dorian Thompson-Robinson hit Kyle Phillips in the end zone to retake the lead, 37-33 with 54 seconds left in the game.

Behind smart play calling, Fresno State made its way down the field and quickly into UCLA territory. Haener had passes of 10, 27, and 26 yards to set the Bulldogs up at the UCLA 38-yard line. Haener used a 13-yard pass to Cropper to score the game-winning touchdown.
