THURSDAY'S PREVIEW...

UNLV opens its 54th season of football by hosting **Eastern Washington** for the first time in history Thursday night in the first college football game with full-capacity ever staged at Allegiant Stadium ... The Rebels played in their new home last fall but two of those games were limited to just 2,000 fans while a third allowed no fans at all because of Covid-19 protocols ... The game will be shown by Stadium and available online at unlvrebels.com and on various Sinclair stations, including Cox channel 90 in Las Vegas ... UNLV head coach **Marcus Arroyo** looks for his first win leading the Rebels ... UNLV is 10-7 all-time in games played on Thursday, including taking its last two ... The Rebels are 24-29 all-time in season lid-lifters, including 19-9 when they happen at home ... UNLV's Super Senior RB **Charles Williams** needs 60 more yards to become just the fourth Rebel to reach 3,000 on the ground in a career ... The Chuck Wagon heads into the season with the most career net rushing yards gained on the FBS level among all current players. Only former Georgia Southern and current Louisville QB **Shai Werts** has more (two current FBS RBs also have more yards but a majority of them were gained on the FCS level before transferring).

REBELS vs. EAGLES NOTES...

UNLV takes on EWU on the football field for the first time Thursday and the Rebels open a season by playing a first-time opponent for the first time since hosting Minnesota of the Big Ten in 2012 ... UNLV's season debut takes place on a non-Saturday for the first time since hosting Jackson State on a Labor Day Weekend Thursday in 2016 ... The Rebels are 36-15-1 all-time vs. teams currently making up the Big Sky Conference, including taking their most-recent meeting vs. Southern Utah to open the 2019 campaign, 56-23 ... UNLV faces a team nicknamed the Eagles for the first time since staging a home-and-home series vs. Eastern Michigan in 1994-95 ... The only other Eagles to take on the football Rebels were the Tennessee Tech Golden Eagles in 1985 ... The Cal State Los Angeles Golden Eagles were known as the Diablos when UNLV played them in football three times in the early 1970s.

REBELATIONS...

UNLV's roster includes nine Super Seniors made possible when the NCAA did not count 2020 against player eligibility because of Covid-19. The unusual group of Rebels includes four sixth-year players and one -- offensive lineman **Clayton Bradley**, who transferred to Las Vegas as a sixth-year graduate of USC a year ago and chose to play one more fall -- who is one of 18 players lining up for their SEVENTH season across the FBS this fall ... Of UNLV's 13 touchdowns last fall, five came on drives longer than 80 yards and only two were shorter than 70. In fact, the Rebels staged 13 drives consisting of double-digit plays, including at least one TD drive of 10 or more plays and 74 yards or longer vs. all six opponents) ... UNLV features four new full-time assistant coaches in 2021 (OL coach TJ Woods, WRs Jonathan Krause, CBs Clay Jennings and TEs Nate Longshore, the latter of whom spent 2020 as offensive analyst) and the staff continues to bring impressive combined on-field experience to Las Vegas. Not only is head coach **Marcus Arroyo** the first former Power Five coordinator to take over the Rebels, of his 10 current full-time assistant coaches, five came directly from P5 programs spread out among the Pac-12 (3) and Big 12 (2). UNLV's head coach, offensive coordinator and defensive coordinator also boast NFL experience on their resumes. Arroyo was the interim offensive coordinator for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2014, defensive coordinator **Peter Hansen** spent three years with the San Francisco 49ers in between stints at Stanford, and offensive coordinator **Glenn Thomas** spent

six years with the Atlanta Falcons ... UNLV has not returned a punt for a touchdown in 20 years -- the longest drought in the nation. The last Rebel to do it was **Troy Mason**, who went 52 yards vs. San Diego State on Oct. 13, 2001, at Sam Boyd Stadium ... When either **Doug Brumfield** or **Justin Rogers** takes the first snap Thursday, he will become the 13th different quarterback in 18 years to start a UNLV season opener ... UNLV attracted no less than five Power 5 transfers from the portal this off-season: Former USC lineman **Connor Murphy** and former Arizona lineman **Kylan Wilborn** are both grad transfers set to make their first start at UNLV while WR **Jordan Jakes** (Indiana), RB **Jayvaun Wilson** (Oregon) and walk-on QB **Tate Martell** (Ohio State & Miami) are competing for time.

2021 REBEL FOOTBALL

HEAD COACH @COACHARROYO



Marcus Arroyo was formally introduced Dec. 13, 2019, as the 12th head coach in the history of UNLV Football. Arroyo then used his next two months to hire a staff, win a Rose Bowl and then secure a record-setting recruiting haul of future Rebels.

Case in point: on Feb. 5, 2020, Arroyo announced his first UNLV recruiting class and the impressive group set multiple program records, including earning the No. 1 ranking in the Mountain West by Rivals and No. 2 by 247Sports. One year later, the 2021 class turned heads nationally, ranking eighth among all Group of 5 schools. Its standing of 67th overall was a stunning 36 spots higher than the average ranking for UNLV's classes in the decade previous to Arroyo's arrival on campus (averaged 103rd from 2010-19). In addition, the Class of 2021's average 247Sports per-player rating of .8324 shattered Year One's school-record mark of .8145. This also marked the first time since the introduction of the recruiting rankings that the Rebels finished in the top two of the Mountain West in consecutive years.

Arroyo, who turned 41 in January, took over the Rebels after most recently serving as assistant head coach and offensive coordinator at the University of Oregon. Behind his play-calling, the Ducks won 2019 Pac-12 Conference Championship and then defeated Wisconsin in the Rose Bowl, which marked the eighth bowl game of Arroyo's

career. During his time in Eugene, the Ducks went 28-12 overall, including winning 15 of their last 17 outings.

Arroyo was instrumental in the development of quarterback **Justin Herbert**, the MVP of the Rose Bowl who became the No. 6 overall NFL draft pick and went on to be named the NFL Rookie of the Year after setting multiple league records for a first-year player. Another one of Arroyo's players, offensive lineman **Penei Sewell**, became the first Oregon player to win the Outland Trophy, which is awarded to the most outstanding interior lineman in college football. Arroyo joined Oregon after spending two years as the running backs coach at Oklahoma State, and brought experience as a coach for every offensive position except the offensive line. Prior to going to Stillwater, Arroyo spent the 2014-15 season in the NFL as interim offensive coordinator and play-caller for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. Before making the move to the NFL, Arroyo spent the 2013 college football season as the offensive coordinator and outside receivers coach at Southern Mississippi. Arroyo's first stint in the Pac-12 saw him spend 2011 and 2012 as the passing-game coordinator and play-caller at California. He spent the 2009 and 2010 campaigns at Wyoming as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach, developing quarterback **Austyn Carta-Samuels** into the Mountain West Freshman of the Year in 2009. In fact, with UNLV rookie receiver **Kyle Williams** earning Freshman All-America and MW Freshman of the Year honors in 2020, Arroyo has now coached four freshman honorees in the last decade alone: WR Williams (UNLV), QB Carta-Samuels (Wyoming), QB **Nick Mullens** (C-USA All-Freshman Team at Southern Miss) and RB **Justice Hill** (Freshman All-America and nation's top rookie rusher at Oklahoma State).

Prior to his time in Laramie, Arroyo was the co-offensive coordinator for two seasons and quarterbacks coach for three campaigns at his alma mater, San Jose State. He was the quarterbacks coach and play-caller for the Spartans in 2006, and added co-offensive coordinator duties from 2007-08 under head coach **Dick Tomey**.

Arroyo began his coaching career with the Spartans in 2003 as an undergraduate assistant coach. He was the offensive coordinator at Prairie View A&M in 2004 before returning to SJSU as a graduate assistant in 2005.

A native of Colfax, California, Arroyo was a three-year letterman at San Jose State, where he played quarterback from 1998-2002. In 2000, he passed for 2,334 yards and 15 touchdowns while leading the Spartans to seven wins, their most in eight seasons. Arroyo graduated from San Jose State in 2003 with a degree in kinesiology. He is married to the former **Kelly Thoni** and the couple has one daughter, Cruz, born in Hattiesburg, Mississippi, in 2013, and recently welcomed a son, Noble Fox Arroyo, in July 2021.

A veteran tailback who is one of nine Rebels returning for a Super Senior season this fall, **Charles Williams** is the 2019 regular-season rushing champion of the Mountain West and an honors candidate in what is his sixth and final campaign ... Has led the team in rushing in three different seasons ... In July he became the first Rebel football player ever named a CoSIDA Academic All-America Team member as he was one of four RBs on the 2020-21 list ... Named 2021 Second Team Preseason All-MW by Athlon and Mountain West Wire ... His 2,940 career rushing yards gained on the FBS level are the most for any returning running back in the nation (only Louisville quarterback **Shai Werts** has more with 3,090) ... The "Chuck Wagon" heads into 2021 ranking fourth on the school's career rushing list and is just 793 yards short of UNLV record-holder **Tim Cornett**, who posted 3,733 from 2010-13 ... Williams is also tied for fifth among all Rebels with 10 career 100-yard rushing games and ninth with 19 all-time rushing touchdowns ... A year ago he was a unanimous choice for Preseason All-MW by preview magazines after becoming just the fourth Rebel to lead a conference in rushing yards during the regular season, joining former UNLV backs Dominique Dorsey (2004), Ickey Woods (1987) and Kirk Jones (1984) ... The top freshman running back in the conference in 2016 earned the starting spot as a sophomore in 2017 but suffered a season-ending injury in the opener and was instead awarded a medical redshirt while Lexington Thomas emerged as the team's top runner for the last two seasons ... Also an impressive student who already earned his bachelor's degree in May 2020 in journalism & media studies and is currently pursuing a master's in general studies.

When **Max Gilliam** (pictured) bolted to a career-high 139 net yards rushing (despite being sacked six times) against Fresno State in 2020, he became the 11th different UNLV quarterback to post a century-mark game on the ground. There have been only 18 such games in history but a full 10 of those have happened since the start of the 2016 season. The list includes five from former Rebel **Armani Rogers** -- highlighted by a

school-record 193-yard effort in a win at New Mexico in 2017. Rogers and **Jason Thomas** (three) are the only Rebel signal-callers to reach the mark more than two times in a career.

STATES OF THE PROGRAM

From Hawaii to Florida, from Alaska to Australia -- the 2021 Rebels come from hometowns spread across the continent and beyond. In fact, no less than 19 different states and two countries are represented on this year's roster. While a vast majority of Rebels naturally hail from California (45) and Nevada (12), a state that continues to become even more fertile recruiting ground is Texas as a dozen UNLV players are products of the Lone Star State. Six Hawaiians are here as part of the Ninth Island. Meanwhile, Arizona and Georgia are home to no less than five current Rebels and talent-rich Louisiana and Oregon state supply four apiece. Washington and South Carolina both have three while Tennessee volunteered two Rebels. Florida, Alaska, Colorado, Illinois, Iowa, Michigan, New Jersey and Utah all are home to one UNLV player. In addition, punter **Charlton Butt** is the first Aussie to sign a scholarship with the program.

HISTORY MADE: PRIME CHUCK



This summer, running back **Charles Williams** became the first UNLV football player in history to be voted an academic All-American by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). The Chuck Wagon, returns as a Super Senior this fall and was announced as one of four running backs on CoSIDA's 2020-21 Academic All-America® Division

I Football Teams. The native of Fresno, California, and graduate of Bullard High School ranks fourth on UNLV's career rushing list with 2,940 yards and needs 739 more to pass all-time leader **Tim Cornett** (2010-13). Also, named in May as UNLV's Mehdi Bouras Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year, Williams is pursuing his master's degree in general studies after earning a bachelor's in journalism & media studies in 2020. He has earned a spot on the Mountain West Academic All-Conference Team for four consecutive years and was a member of the Dean's Honor List his last four semesters as an undergraduate.

FERTITTA FOOTBALL COMPLEX: A STATE-OF-THE ART FOOTBALL HOME

On October 3, 2019, UNLV Athletics celebrated the official ribbon-cutting of its new, \$34.8 million, state-of-the-art training center the Fertitta Football Complex. Just over three years ago the department announced the largest single gift in its history as the Fertitta Family pledged an initial \$10 million toward the construction. The 73,000-square-foot, two-level complex was built on campus in the north end of the team's practice area and overlooks the Ernie Becker Sr. Football Fields at Bill "Wildcat" Morris Rebel Park. The FFC is now the day-to-day home of the program and includes an academic center, locker rooms, offices, meeting rooms, strength & conditioning center, media room, training table and nutrition bar, athletic training center, player lounge and even a barbershop.

SCHOLARSHIP-HIP-HURRAY

Veteran place-kicker **Daniel Gutierrez** was surprised with a full scholarship during a scrimmage at Allegiant Stadium on August 11. The final play was a field-goal attempt and as expected, the senior nailed it with ease but then something unexpected happened as he was surprised with a highlight video on the stadium's big screen that closed with a special message that he was being put on full scholarship this fall. A two-year returning starter who has earned three letters after walking onto the squad out of Granada Hills Charter High School in California, Gutierrez's combined field goal numbers of 21-of-27 see him enter this campaign ranked third in school history with a career percentage of .777. He heads into this fall an impressive 16-of-17 all-time from 39 yards or closer and rebounded from missing his first field goal and extra-point attempt in the season opener at San Diego State to make the all 16 of his remaining attempts on the year as a junior.



WATCHING THE REBELS



A trio of Rebels made official Watch Lists during the preseason for their on-field talents. Senior wide receiver and kick returner **Tyleek Collins** is one of 57 players up for the 2021 Paul Hornung Award, which goes out annually to the most versatile player in major college football from the Louisville Sports Commission in honor of the late football legend **Paul Hornung**. Collins has led the team twice in kickoff returns and punt returns during his career, including both categories last fall. UNLV sophomore offensive lineman **Leif Fautanu** (LEEF faw-TAH-new) is one of 63 players from 31 FBS schools around the nation named to the 2021 Watch List for the Polynesian College Football Player of the Year Award. Finally, UNLV senior long snapper **Rex Goossen** is one of 31 players on the 2021 Patrick Mannelly Award Watch List, which was named after former Duke University and longtime Chicago Bears long snapper **Patrick Mannelly**. The award goes to college football's top player at the special teams position each year and Goossen is in his third season as the team's starting long snapper.

Even though there were three seasons in between, UNLV has now won two straight OT games after taking a 33-30 thriller in Reno to close 2019. In 2016, the Rebels snapped a two-game losing streak in overtime games with its historic 69-66 victory over Wyoming. It marked the only time that the Rebels won a game that went longer than one overtime period and set a school record for points in extra time with 17. In 2008, the Rebels won back-to-back OT games at No. 13 Arizona State and then at home vs. Big 12 team Iowa State.
