With the Bulldogs entering the polls this week, the Rebels will now face three consecutive ranked opponents for the first time in history and three overall in a season for the first time since 2011 ... UNLV is 8-8-1 all-time in games played on Friday ... The Rebels are 13-26 in conference lid-lifters and are looking to win a MW opener for the first time since 2017 ... UNLV comes in after dropping a 48-3 game at home vs. No. 14 Iowa State while FS upset then-No. 13 UCLA, 40-37, at the Rose Bowl ... This game will feature two of the nation's top running backs as UNLV's Super Senior and Fresno native **Charles Williams** heads in with the most career net rushing

REBELATIONS...

UNLV started a different quarterback for the third straight game last week as true freshman Cameron Friel made his collegiate debut vs. Iowa State. That came one week after redshirt lefty Doug Brumfield earned his first start at Arizona State before being knocked out of the game with an undisclosed injury. Former TCU transfer Justin Rogers made his first collegiate start in the opener vs. EWU before Brumfield came off the bench to lead UNLV to 27 of its 33 total points scored ... Friel was the first true freshman to start at QB for UNLV since Omar Clayton on Oct. 20, 2007 ... With Brumfield not available the other quarterback to see action Saturday was walk-on grad transfer **Tate Martell**, a summer addition who starred at Las Vegas' Bishop Gorman High School before signing with Ohio State and then transferring to Miami ... As a rookie in 2020, Brumfield played in the final two games of the season, spelling six-game starting senior Max Gilliam ... During last year's abbreviated six-date schedule, UNLV started the same quarterback (Gilliam) for every game in a season for the first time since local product Jon Denton out of Green Valley High School started all 12 in 1996 ... UNLV RB Charles Williams, who is a 2016 graduate of Fresno's Bullard High School, averages 111 rushing yards per game vs. his hometown Bulldogs in four previous meetings ... The Rebels already have three interceptions (coming from three different players) after only picking

includes nine Super Seniors made possible when the NCAA did not count 2020 against player eligibility because of COVID-19. The unusual group of Rebels includes four sixth-year players and one -- offensive lineman Clayton Bradley, who transferred to Las Vegas as a sixth-year graduate of USC a year ago and chose to play one more fall -- who is one of 18 players lining up for their SEVENTH season across the FBS this fall ... UNLV features four new full-time assistant coaches in 2021 (OL coach TJ Woods, WRs Jonathan Krause, CBs Clay Jennings and TEs Nate Longshore, the latter of whom spent 2020 as offensive analyst) as the staff continues to bring impressive combined on-field experience to Las Vegas. Not only is head coach Marcus Arroyo the first former Power Five

coordinator to take over the Rebels, of his 10 current full-time assistant coaches, five came directly from P5 programs spread out among the Pac-12 (3) and Big 12 (2). UNLV's head coach, offensive coordinator and defensive coordinator also boast NFL experience on their resumes. Arroyo was the interim offensive coordinator for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2014, defensive coordinator **Peter Hansen** spent three years with the San Francisco 49ers in between stints at Stanford, and offensive coordinator **Glenn Thomas** spent six years with the Atlanta Falcons ... UNLV has not returned a punt for a touchdown in 20 years -- the longest drought in the nation. The last Rebel to do it was **Troy Mason**, who went 52 yards vs. San Diego State on Oct. 13, 2001, at Sam Boyd Stadium ... UNLV attracted no less than five Power 5 transfers from the portal this off-season: Former USC lineman **Connor Murphy** and former Arizona lineman **Kylan Wilborn** are both grad transfers on the two-deep while WR **Jordan Jakes** (Indiana), RB **Jayvaun Wilson** (Oregon) and walk-on QB Martell (Ohio State & Miami) are competing for time.



HEAD COACH @COACHARROYO

Marcus Arroyo was formally introduced Dec. 13, 2019, as the 12th head coach in the history of UNLV Football. Arroyo then used his next two months to hire a staff, win a Rose Bowl and then secure a record-setting recruiting haul of future Rebels.

Case in point: on Feb. 5, 2020, Arroyo announced his first UNLV recruiting class and the impressive group set multiple program records, including earning the No. 1 ranking in the Mountain West by Rivals and No. 2 by 247Sports. One year later, the 2021 class turned heads nationally, ranking eighth among all Group of 5 schools. Its standing of 67th overall was a stunning 36 spots higher than the average ranking for UNLV's classes in the decade previous to Arroyo's arrival on campus (averaged 103rd from 2010-19). In addition, the Class of 2021's average 247Sports per-player rating of .8324 shattered Year One's school-record mark of .8145. This also marked the first time since the introduction of the recruiting rankings that the Rebels finished in the top two of the Mountain West in consecutive years.

Arroyo, who turned 41 in January, took over the Rebels after most recently serving as assistant head coach and offensive coordinator at the University of Oregon. Behind his play-calling, the Ducks won 2019 Pac-12 Conference Championship and then defeated Wisconsin in the Rose Bowl, which marked the eighth bowl game of Arroyo's

career. During his time in Eugene, the Ducks went 28-12 overall, including winning 15 of their last 17 outings.

Arroyo was instrumental in the development of quarterback **Justin Herbert**, the MVP of the Rose Bowl who became the No. 6 overall NFL draft pick and went on to be named the NFL Rookie of the Year after setting multiple league records for a first-year player. Another one of Arroyo's players, offensive lineman **Penei Sewell**, became the first Oregon player to win the Outland Trophy, which is awarded to the most outstanding interior lineman in college football. Arroyo joined Oregon after spending two years as the running backs coach at Oklahoma State, and brought experience as a coach for every offensive position except the offensive line. Prior to going to Stillwater, Arroyo spent the 2014-15 season in the NFL as interim offensive coordinator and play-caller for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. Before making the move to the NFL, Arroyo spent the 2013 college football season as the offensive coordinator and outside receivers coach at Southern Mississippi. Arroyo's first stint in the Pac-12 saw him spend 2011 and 2012 as the passing-game coordinator and play-caller at California. He spent the 2009 and 2010 campaigns at Wyoming as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach, developing quarterback **Austyn Carta-Samuels** into the Mountain West Freshman of the Year in 2009. In fact, with UNLV rookie receiver **Kyle Williams** earning Freshman All-America and MW Freshman of the Year honors in 2020, Arroyo has now coached four freshman honorees in the last decade alone: WR Williams (UNLV), QB Carta-Samuels (Wyoming), QB **Nick Mullens** (C-USA All-Freshman Team at Southern Miss) and RB **Justice Hill** (Freshman All-America and nation's top rookie rusher at Oklahoma State).

Prior to his time in Laramie, Arroyo was the co-offensive coordinator for two seasons and quarterbacks coach for three campaigns at his alma mater, San Jose State. He was the quarterbacks coach and play-caller for the Spartans in 2006, and added co-offensive coordinator duties from 2007-08 under head coach **Dick Tomey.**

Arroyo began his coaching career with the Spartans in 2003 as an undergraduate assistant coach. He was the offensive coordinator at Prairie View A&M in 2004 before returning to SJSU as a graduate assistant in 2005.

A native of Colfax, California, Arroyo was a three-year letterman at San Jose State, where he played quarterback from 1998-2002. In 2000, he passed for 2,334 yards and 15 touchdowns while leading the Spartans to seven wins, their most in eight seasons. Arroyo graduated from San Jose State in 2003 with a degree in kinesiology. He is married to the former **Kelly Thoni** and the couple has one daughter, Cruz, born in Hattiesburg, Mississippi, in 2013, and recently welcomed a son, Noble Fox Arroyo, in July 2021.

A veteran tailback who is one of nine Rebels returning for a Super Senior season this fall, Charles Billy Dee Williams Jr. was the 2019 regular-season rushing champion of the Mountain West and an honors candidate in what is his sixth and final campaign ... Has led the team in rushing in three different seasons ... In July he became the first Rebel football player ever named a CoSIDA Academic All-America Team member as he was one of four RBs on the 2020-21 list ... Named 2021 Second Team Preseason All-MW by Athlon and Mountain West Wire ... His 3,194 career rushing yards gained on the FBS level are the most for any current player in the nation ... The "Chuck Wagon" headed into 2021 ranking fourth on the school's career rushing list and after three games needs 358 yards to move past former teammate Lexington "Lightning" Thomas into second and is only 539 yards short of UNLV record-holder Tim Cornett, who posted 3,733 from 2010-13 ... Williams is also tied for fourth among all Rebels with 11 career 100-yard rushing games and sixth with 21 all-time rushing touchdowns ... He became just the fourth Rebel to lead a conference in rushing yards during the 2019 regular season, joining former UNLV backs Dominique Dorsey (2004), Ickey Woods (1987) and Kirk Jones (1984) ... The top freshman running back in the conference in 2016 earned the starting spot as a sophomore in 2017 but suffered a season-ending injury in the opener and was instead awarded a medical redshirt while Lexington Thomas emerged as the team's top runner for two seasons ... STATES OF THE PROGRAM

From Hawaii to Florida, from Alaska to Australia -- the 2021 Rebels come from hometowns spread across the continent and beyond. In fact, no less than 19 different states and two countries are represented on this year's roster. While a vast majority of Rebels naturally hail from California (45) and Nevada (12), a state that continues to become even more fertile recruiting ground is Texas as a dozen UNLV players are products of the Lone Star State. Six Hawaiians are here as part of the Ninth Island. Meanwhile, Arizona and Georgia are home to no less than five current Rebels and talent-rich Louisiana and Oregon state supply four apiece. Washington and South Carolina both have three while Tennessee volunteered two Rebels. Florida, Alaska, Colorado, Illinois, Iowa, Michigan, New Jersey and Utah all are home to one UNLV player. In addition, punter **Charlton Butt** is the first Aussie to sign a scholarship with the program.

HISTORY MADE: PRIME CHUCK



This summer, running back Charles Williams became the first UNLV football player in history to be voted an academic All-American by the College Sports Information Directors of America (Co-SIDA). The Chuck Wagon, returns as a Super Senior this fall and was announced as one of four running backs on CoSIDA's 2020-21 Academic All-America® Division

I Football Teams. The native of Fresno, California, and graduate of Bullard High School ranks fourth on UNLV's career rushing list with 2,940 yards and needs 739 more to pass all-time leader **Tim Cornett** (2010-13). Also, named in May as UNLV's Mehdi Bouras Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year, Williams is pursuing his master's degree in general studies after earning a bachelor's in journalism & media studies in 2020. He has earned a spot on the Mountain West Academic All-Conference Team for four consecutive years and was a member of the Dean's Honor List his last four semesters as an undergraduate.







FERTITTA FOOTBALL COMPLEX: A STATE-OF-THE ART FOOTBALL HOME

On October 3, 2019, UNLV Athletics celebrated the official ribbon-cutting of its new, \$34.8 million, state-of-the-art training center the Fertitta Football Complex. Just over three years ago the department announced the largest single gift in its history as the Fertitta Family pledged an initial \$10 million toward the construction. The 73,000-square-foot, two-level complex was built on campus in the north end of the team's practice area and overlooks the Ernie Becker Sr. Football Fields at Bill "Wildcat" Morris Rebel Park. The FFC is now the day-to-day home of the program and includes an academic center, locker rooms, offices, meeting rooms, strength & conditioning center, media room, training table and nutrition bar, athletic training center, player lounge and even a barbershop.


SCHOLARSHIP-HIP-HURRAY

Veteran place-kicker Daniel Gutierrez was surprised with a full scholarship during a scrimmage at Allegiant Stadium on August 11. The final play was a field-goal attempt and as expected, the senior nailed it with ease but then something unexpected happened as he was surprised with a highlight video on the stadium's big screen that closed with a special message that he was being put on full scholarship this fall. A two-year returning starter who has earned three letters after walking onto the squad out of Granada Hills Charter High School in California, Gutierrez



responded by turning in a career night in the opener vs. EWU, nailing all four of his field-goal attempts, including a personal-best 51-yarder and earning a spot as a Lou Groza Star of the Week. After hitting one attempt each at ASU and vs. ISU, Gutierrez is currently tied for fifth in the nation with 2.0 FG per game and is one of just six kickers in the country to be perfect with more than five attempts. His career field goal numbers of 27-of-33 rank him first in school history with a percentage of 81.8 and he also heads into this week an impressive 19-of-20 all-time from 39 yards or closer. In 2020, he rebounded from missing his first field goal and extra-point attempt in the season opener at San Diego State to make all 16 of his remaining attempts on the year, which means he now has made 24 straight combined kicks overall.

WATCHING THE REBELS





A trio of Rebels made official Watch Lists during the preseason for their on-field talents. Senior wide receiver and kick returner Tyleek Collins is one of 57 players up for the 2021 Paul Hornung Award, which goes out annually to the most versatile player in major college football from the Louisville Sports Commission in honor of the late football legend Paul Hornung. Collins has led the team twice in kickoff returns and punt returns during his career, including both categories last fall. UNLV sophomore offensive lineman Leif Fautanu (LEEF faw-TAH-new) is one of 63 players from 31 FBS schools around the nation named to the 2021 Watch List for the Polynesian College Football Player of the Year Award. Finally, UNLV senior long snapper Rex Goossen is one of 31 players on the 2021 Patrick Mannelly Award Watch List, which was named after former Duke University and longtime Chicago Bears long snapper Patrick Mannelly. The award goes to college football's top player at the special teams position each year and Goossen is in his third season as the team's starting long snapper.





NON-SATURDAY SUCCESS

In its 53-year history, UNLV has played 18 Thursday games, 17 Friday contests, one Sunday matchup, one Wednesday outing and one Monday game on Labor Day 2005 at New Mexico. The Rebels boast an 8-8-1 record on Fridays and a solid overall non-Saturday record of 18-19-1.

In 2008, the Rebels won back-to-back OT games at No. 13 Arizona State and then at home vs. Big 12 team Iowa State.


GARCIA WINS WIESNER

A Wisconsin native and three-time letterman on the Badger football team, Mr. Wiesner sought his fortune out West and became one of the Las Vegas' leading businessmen, philanthropists, politicians and ambassadors. The founder of the successful restaurants that are part of Big Dog's Hospitality Group, Mr. Wiesner helped guide Rebel Athletics from their infancy and was inducted into the UNLV Athletics Hall of Fame as a Distinguished Contributor in 1994. Also a member of the Nevada Board of Regents, he died in 2002 at the age of 63 after a battle with Leukemia.

Former TCU transfer Justin Rogers made his first career start at quarterback as UNLV led 6-3 at halftime. Freshman Doug Brumfield replaced him in the third quarter after EWU scored 17 unanswered points. The hosts kicked two field goals and then a 16-yard Charles Williams rush to draw within two before Brumfield threw a two-point conversion to Courtney Reese to knot the game.

The teams traded touchdowns twice in overtime but EWU made its two-point attempt to force the Rebels to go for two on what became the final play of the game.

REBEL OF THE GAME: Senior place-kicker Daniel Gutierrez tied a school record with four made field goals, including a career-long 51-yarder, which saw the former walk-on score his team's first 12 points, allowing them to mount the big comeback. Gutierrez was awarded a scholarship during fall camp.

STAT OF THE GAME: Senior running back Charles Williams finished with his second-most rushing yards as a Rebel, carrying the ball 27 times for 172 yards and the two scores.

REBEL NOTES

- Gutierrez improved to 25-of-31 on field goals in his career, which raised his career percentage to 80.6, which is the highest in school history
- The Chuck Wagon's big night gave him 3,112 yards in his career, making him just the fourth Rebel in history to reach the 3,000-yard mark
- Williams' 11th career 100-yard rushing game moved him into a tie with Dominique Dorsey (2001-04) in fourth place all-time at UNLV
- Williams' two rushing touchdowns moved him up two spots on the school's career list as his 21 all-time scores pushed him to sixth place
- UNLV got two interceptions vs. the Eagles, one by Phillip Hill and one by true freshman Cameron Oliver, to match the team's entire pick total from the short 2020 season

NO. 23 ARIZONA STATE PULLS AWAY LATE

TEMPE, AZ (UNLVRebels.com) - UUNLV (0-2) held two modest leads before seeing No. 23 Arizona State (2-0) ultimately post a 37-10 victory Saturday night in front of 42,918 fans at Sun Devil Stadium in only the second all-time meeting between the schools located just 300 miles apart.

The Rebels, who won here in overtime in dramatic fashion back in 2008, led 3-0 and then 10-7 during the first half and were trailing 14-10 with under a minute left in the third quarter. That's when ASU scored back-to-back rushing touchdowns to pull away as UNLV's starting quarterback, Doug Brumfield, was knocked out of the game with an undisclosed injury. The hosts would score three total

touchdowns in a nine-minute span in the second half.

Brumfield, a redshirt freshman making his first collegiate start, jumped into the end zone for a four-yard score in the second guarter to post the Rebels' lone touchdown on a 10-play drive. UNLV was sparked early when cornerback Nohl Williams thwarted the Sun Devils' opening drive by intercepting Jayden Daniels in the end zone. The Rebels then made their way down field on a 16-play drive and scored first with a 28-yard field goal by Daniel Gutierrez

REBEL OF THE GAME: Brumfield had zero turnovers and led the team both in passing (60) and rushing yards (43) despite not playing for much of the second half.

STAT OF THE GAME: When Nohl Williams intercepted Jayden Daniels in the end zone on the game's opening drive, it marked the third pick of the young season for the Rebels, which already exceeds the squad's total of two from 2020's sixgame campaign.

big gathering at Allegiant Stadium Saturday night. In fact, the crowd of 35,931 marked the seventhlargest ever to watch a UNLV football game in Las Vegas.

Playing a ranked opponent for the second consecutive week for the first time since 2010. UNLV started a different quarterback for the third time in as many weeks as Cameron Friel from Hawai'i made his collegiate debut. He became the first true freshman to start at QB for the Rebels since Omar Clayton on Oct. 20. 2007. Graduate transfer and Las Vegas native Tate Martell also logged time to mark four Rebel signal-callers seeing the field in the season's first three games. Friel finished 8-of-13 passing for 67 yards and one interception.

The Cyclones, who were the highest-ranked team to face the Rebels in Las Vegas since No. 13 UCLA in 2015, led by 31 points before UNLV staged its best drive of the night, going 66 yards in 14 plays over 7:18, capped by a 30-yard field goal by Daniel

ISU's two big names were both impressive as quarterback Brock Purdy only missed on three of his 24 pass attempts for 288 yards and a trio of touchdowns while running back Breece Hall finished with 100 yards and two more scores for the visitors.

STAT OF THE GAME: PK Daniel Gutierrez improved to 6-for-6 on field goals this season and 27-of-33 in his career, which raised his career percentage to 81.8 -- the highest in school history
